**About The Game:** Tonight is the second meeting in the home-and-home series and is the second-straight game in Redbird Arena for Illinois State. Prior to tip-off, the Redbird Department of Athletics will have a ceremony to tribute the life and accomplishments of the late Dr. Milt Weisbecker, who served as the Illinois State director of athletics from 1966-74.

**Series History:** This is the second meeting between the two schools. The Mocs won the meeting last season 70-59, in Chattanooga.

**Last Meeting:** Baboucarr Bojang scored a career-best 26 points, but it wasn't enough as Illinois State fell 70-59 to Chattanooga in the first-ever meeting between the two schools. The Redbirds shot 35.8 percent from the field and Shawn Jeppson was the only other player in double-figures with 10. Toot Young led the charge for Chattanooga with 22 points, while three other Mocs dumped in 10. The Mocs ended the first half with a 16-6 run and opened the second frame with a 10-4 spurt to seal the win.

#### **THE COACHES**

**Tom Richardson** (St. Xavier '77) is 48-46 in his fourth season at Illinois State. He is assisted by Chad Altadonna, Lance Irvin and Kirk Sarff. Richardson is 31-28 against Valley opponents, 17-18 vs. non-conference foes, 31-12 at home, 12-28 on the road and 5-6 on neutral floors.

Jeff Lebo (North Carolina '89) is in his first season at Chattanooga and owns a 78-44 career mark.

#### About the Chattanooga Mocs

- Chattanooga is located in Chattanooga, Tenn., and has an enrollment of 8,485. The Mocs are members of the Southern Conference.
- Jeff Lebo was hired on April 5 to replace Henry
  Dickerson as head coach. Prior to leading the Mocs,
  Lebo was the head coach at Tennessee Tech for five
  seasons. He was a three-time Ohio Valley Conference
  Coach of the Year and led the Golden Eagles to back-to-back OVC titles in 2001 and 2002.
- Tonight's game is the second-straight road game against a Missouri Valley Conference opponent for Chattanooga.
   The Mocs topped Bradley 82-70 on Saturday night in Peoria.
- The Mocs don't return a single starter from last year's team.
- Tonight's game is already the fourth road game for the Mocs this season. They played two in Birmingham, Ala., against Samford and UAB. On this trip, the Mocs stayed in Peoria, Ill., for both games to face Bradley and the Redbirds.
- As a team, the Mocs are shooting 33.3 percent on threepointers and everyone is getting involved. Chattanooga is 29-for-87 on treys and everyone on the team, except for Alphonso Pugh, has attempted at least one shot from behind the arc.
- Senior Tim Parker is coming off of a 31-point game at Bradley on 7-of-9 shooting on treys.

#### The Road to Aberration

There is reason for the disbelief surrounding the Redbirds' 0-3 start to the 2002-03 season. After all in the 33 years of Division I basketball at Illinois State, an 0-3 start has only happened three times. The 'Birds opened the 1990-91 season with 12-straight losses before finishing with a 5-23 mark, while the 1987-88 Redbirds started 0-3 but finished 18-13 and went on to earn a National Invitation Tournament bid.

#### December Drought

Under head coach **Tom Richardson**, the Redbirds own a 13-9 mark in the month of December. But dating back to last season, the 'Birds have lost three straight in the 12th month of the year. In Redbird Arena, Illinois State has been dominant under Richardson in the month of December with a 9-2 record.

#### SoCon has been So-So for 'the Birds'

Since becoming a Division I program in 1970, Illinois State has only faced members of the Southern Conference six times prior to tonight's game. In the six match-ups, the 'Birds own a 2-4 mark with wins over Georgia Southern and Virginia Military, while dropping games to Chattanooga, East Tennessee State, Georgia Southern and Western Carolina.

#### A SI of Relief

Whew! Apparently the Missouri Valley Conference's success in the NCAA Tournament is starting to gain the league national recognition and the Redbirds are reaping benefits from it as well. In the latest issue of *Sports Illustrated*, the magazine's forecast of the 65-team NCAA Tournament field included Illinois State at No. 50, while Southern Illinois was No. 30 and Creighton was tabbed for No. 48. The Valley has posted seven NCAA Tournament victories in the last four years, including two teams advancing to the Sweet 16.

#### One Class Short

These words said by an academic advisor to a student expecting to graduate could force anxiety and stress, but for the Redbirds it's nothing to fret – there just isn't a junior class. With the early retirement of Dirk Williams, due to multiple concussions, the 'Birds are left without a third-year player. The 2002-03 roster consists of four seniors, five sophomores and four freshmen. The last time the Redbirds sent a team out on the floor comprised of just three classes was in 1997-98, when the Redbirds returned everyone from their NCAA qualifying season and didn't have a single freshman on the squad.



#### Who Ya Gonna Call?

Bracket Busters! In an effort to help "mid-major" programs bust into the NCAA Tournament field as an at-large entry, conferences from around the country have joined forces with ESPN to form – Bracket Buster Saturday on Feb. 22, 2003. The event consists of 18 teams with one predetermined match-up with Gonzaga hosting Tulsa. The rest of the games will be announced on Feb. 1, 2003, with the intention of pitting the best-possible match-ups. The Redbirds will face six opponents this season that are a part of Bracket Buster Saturday.

#### 87 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

Illinois State heads into tonight's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 87 straight games. In fact, in the **Tom Richardson** era the Redbirds have only gone one game without a made trey and 82-43 loss at Creighton on December 12, 1999. Since Richardson took the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 69 of 94 games.

#### Instant Impact

No it isn't the latest Steven Seagal movie, instead it is North Carolina State transfer **Trey Guidry** being an immediate factor for the Redbird offense. The sophomore poured in a team-high 20 points against Utah State, his first opponent in an Illinois State uniform. Guidry's effort is the second-best by a Redbird in an Illinois State debut, only behind Billy Lewis' 25 points against St. Louis in 1974.

#### Big Men Breakout Bids

The Illinois State careers of current big man **Andy Strandmark** and former Redbird center Brian Kern (1991-95) up to this point are extremely similar and head coach **Tom Richardson** hopes that they continue along the same path. Through his first three seasons, Strandmark has averaged 2.5 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. In that same stretch, Kern averaged 2.9 points and 1.7 boards per game, but in his senior season posted 10.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per contest. Strandmark is currently averaging 7.7 points and 5.7boards per game, while coming off of his first back-to-back double-digit scoring games.

#### Sweet Home Chicago

The game was played in Normal, Ill., but Chicago native **Marcus Arnold** felt right at home against Illinois-Chicago. Arnold, a freshman who started the second game of his Illinois State career, finished with a careerbest in points (11), rebounds (6) and blocked shots (4) in a career-high 25 minutes of action. Arnold is second on the team in field goal percentage (.556) and rebounds per game (4.0).

#### **Bojang One of Valley's Elite**

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

#### The Power of Three

As voted by the players, **Gregg Alexander**, **Baboucarr Bojang** and **Vince Greene** will serve as Redbird captains for the 2002-03 season. It is the first time since 1996-97, that Illinois State has had three captains. That year, the 'Birds were led by Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley and Rob Gibbons and went on to earn an NCAA Tournament bid with a 34-6 record.

#### A League of Their Own

For a second-straight season, Illinois State non-conference slate will be a challenging one from top to bottom. In fact, if ISU's non-league opponents joined together to form a conference it would be The Winner's League. After all, the 11 non-league foes (including all the possible Bracket Buster opponents) combined for 213 wins last season, or 19.4 each. The squads also combined for 5 NCAA appearances and 2 NIT bids.

#### Slightly Above Average Valley Year

With 12 league victories last season, it was an "average" year for Illinois State. Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

#### THE LAST TIME THEY MET

#### Chattanooga Defeats Illinois State. 70-59

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. – Baboucarr Bojang scored a career-high 26 points to lead all scorers, but the rest of the Redbird offense struggled as Chattanooga defeated Illinois State 70-59 in non-conference men's basketball action, Saturday, in Chattanooga, Tenn.

A 16-6 run by the Mocs, 3-5, late in the first half and a 10-4 run to start the second half proved to be too much for the 'Birds, 4-5, who managed 26 points in the first half on 12 of 30 shooting.

Bojang scored 16 of his 26 points in the first half, shooting seven for eight from the field and hitting two free throws. He also led Illinois State in rebounding with eight. Shawn Jeppson was the only other Redbird to finish in double figures in scoring with 10 points. Shedrick Ford contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Chattanooga led by 10 at the half, 36-26, with Toot Young chipping in half of the Moc's points with 18.

Young finished the game as Chattanooga's leading scorer with 22 points. The Moc's had three other players in double figures with 10 points apiece.

#### International Flair

The 2002 trip to Australia marked the third international tour for the Redbirds. The team traveled to Europe in both 1992 and 1997, before the Australian tour this year. Overseas, the 'Birds have had their share of success with a 12-8 overall mark, but the real story comes in their record after returning home. ISU has posted a combined 44-16 (.733) record with two Missouri Valley Conference regular-season titles in the seasons immediately following the first two trips.

#### FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourth-straight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

#### Put Me in Coach, I'm Ready to Play

**Trey Guidry**, a 6-2 guard, sat out the entire 2001-02 season to meet NCAA transfer rules. The North Carolina State transfer was a spot starter for the Wolfpack in 2000-01 as a freshman and recorded a scoring best of 15 points against Wake Forest.

#### One Newcomer Not So New

Former all-conference and all-area selection at Lockport High School, **Kevin Troc** sat out last season as a redshirt. Troc averaged 14.0 points, seven rebounds and six assists per game as a senior prep. He was able to practice with the 'Birds for the majority of the season, but missed a couple of months after developing a staph infection during the trip to Pittsburgh.

#### No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

**Neil Plank**, a 6-5 swing player, has transferred to Illinois State from Wisconsin, but cannot play for the Redbirds until the 2003-04 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. Plank played in 27 games for the Badgers as a freshman, scoring 25 points in 173 minutes of action.

#### Freshmen Trey-ning

**Gregg Alexander** didn't have any problem adjusting to the next level as a true freshman. The Lincoln, Ill., native finished the season with a team-high 58 made 3-pointers. The 58 threes set the standard for freshman treys by a Redbird eclipsing Dan Muller's 50 during the 1994-95 season. Alexander also shot 39.2% from behind the arc, which topped the previous Redbird freshman best of 37.7% by Markku Larkio.

#### We Have a Winner

With a 17-14 record last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

#### Missed It By That Much

The Redbirds nearly claimed the national title last season. In fact, they only missed the title by less than a percentage point – the national free throw title. The 'Birds 77.5% accuracy from the line trailed only Morehead State (78.4%) and Loyola Marymount (77.7%).

#### The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

On November 13, 2002, the Illinois State basketball team added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, Ill • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, Ill. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period. The Redbirds have one scholarship left to fill.

#### Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 8-4 record when playing on December 2, one of Illinois State's eight wins happened in 1982 and it is today's Redbird Flashback:

Dec. 2, 1982 • Normal, III. – The Redbirds trailed by six points at the half to Western Illinois and by 14 tallies with 14:28 left in the game, but a 23-7 run in the final 13 minutes fueled a 55-53 Redbird victory at Horton Field House. Brad Duncan's only shot of the game fell through the cylinder with only 13 seconds left in the contest to top off the Redbird comeback. Hank Cornley led the 'Birds with 14 points and Dwayne Tyus tossed in 12. Rick Lamb also chipped in five points and seven boards.

Illinois State also got 15 points and 10 rebounds from Baboucarr Bojang, while Andy Strandmark, Gregg Alexander and Trey Guidry each contributed seven points. The 'Birds shot 54 percent from the field in the first half, but managed only 41 percent in the second half on 10-for-24 shooting.

EA Sports, 1-9, only shot 7-for-20 from the charity stripe, including 4-for-15 in the second half. EA Sports was led by former Fighting Illini player Sergio McClain with 13 points, while Doc Taylor, who played at Cleveland State, chipped in 12.

#### **GAME 1**

#### Redbirds Fall 68-53 to Utah State

NORMAL, III. - Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (.125) free-throw attempts.

Desmond Penigar led Utah State with 22 points, going 4-for-4 from three-point range. Point guard Mark Brown scored 19 points for the Aggies. Utah State shot 50 percent from the field in the game, including percent from beyond the arc on 6-for-12 shooting.

Illinois State (0-1) got off to a slow start offensively, scoring only four points in the game's first nine minutes and dug itself into a 11-4 deficit. However, Guidry hit a three-pointer with 10:35 left in the first half that sparked a 13-5 Redbird run that gave Illinois State its only lead of the first half at 17-16. Guidry scored 11 of the 'Birds 13 points during the run, including three shots from beyond the arc.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah

State run with nine points, including three lay-ups.

The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their first 17 second-half points from beyond the arc. Guidry helped lead the charge with three three-pointers, while Gregg Alexander contributed two. Illinois State used the offensive surge to shred the Aggies' halftime lead and close to within two points, 43-41, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game.

Illinois State went into a scoring draught, however, over the game's next six minutes, which allowed the Aggies to build a 10-point lead at 51-41. Penigar led Utah State during the 8-0 run with seven points. Greene scored the Redbirds' next seven points, but Utah State was able to keep Illinois State from getting any closer than eight in the game's closing minutes

#### ISU Loses Third Straight Game, 78-65
