Last Time Out --Illinois 62, Arkansas 58

Illinois improved its record to 5-0 on the young season, defeating Arkansas 62-58 in Little Rock on Saturday. Brian Cook led all scorers with 18 points in a season-high 39 minutes of action. Freshman James Augustine added 10 points and six rebounds off the bench, coming up with two key defensive boards in the game's final minutes with the Illini clinging to a 59-58 lead. Cook made a free throw to put the Illini up two with 8.4 seconds left, and Arkansas then turned the ball over on the ensuing possession. Dee Brown sank a pair of free throws with 1.9 remaining to seal the victory.

Brian Cook named Co-Big Ten Player of the Week

Brian Cook was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 9 after leading the Illini to victories over North Carolina and Arkansas. He shares the award with Indiana's Tom Coverdale.

Cook scored a game and season-high 22 points in Illinois' 92-65 victory over No. 12 North Carolina. He connected on 8-of-12 shots from the field, grabbed a game-high eight rebounds and tied his career high with five assists. Cook was also the leading scorer in Illinois' 62-58 win over Arkansas, scoring 18 points in 39 minutes of action, the most playing time logged by an Illini player this season. Cook made 7-of-14 field goals and added four rebounds and four assists vs. the Razorbacks. On the week, Cook averaged 20 points, six rebounds, and 4.5 assists per game on combined 58 percent shooting.

Bench Play

The Illinois bench has begun the season very productive, averaging 32.6 points and 11.8 rebounds, while limiting the opponents' bench to 14.6 points and 7.0 rebounds. Illinois' bench is outscoring the opponents' by 18 points per game and is outrebounding the opponents by nearly five boards per game.

Un-Self-ish Play

The Fighting Illini have begun the 2002-03 season with unselfish play. Illinois leads the Big Ten in assists (19.8 per game), highlighted by a season-high 24 assists vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff and 23 against both Western Illinois and North Carolina. On the season, Illinois has recorded assists on over 60 percent of its baskets (99 assists on 164 FG). Guards Dee Brown and Deron Williams rank second and fifth, respectively, in the Big Ten in assists with Brown averaging 5.4 and Williams averaging 4.0. In three of the five games, all nine Illini players who have played in the first half have scored.

That's a Three ... Sean Harrington

Senior Sean Harrington has been hot from behind the arc this season. He has made 14of-23 treys, ranking third in the Big Ten in 3-point field goal percentage at 60.9 percent. Harrington nailed a career-high six 3-pointers in Illinois' win over North Carolina on Dec. 3 en route to a career-high 20 points.

Cook Keeps on Cookin'

After sitting out the first two games of the season (along with teammate Jerrance Howard) as an NCAA penalty for playing in an unsanctioned summer basketball tournament, senior Brian Cook has returned and immediately established himself in the Illini lineup. In his first game back vs. Western Illinois on Sunday, Cook scored a game-high 17 points and grabbed six rebounds. He was Illinois' top scorer and rebounder in the win over North Carolina, scoring a season-high 22 points and pulling down eight boards. He then scored a game-high 18 points with four boards vs. Arkansas. Cook ranks second in the Big Ten in scoring, averaging 19.0 points on combined 56.4 percent shooting. He ranks second on the team in rebounding, averaging 6.0 boards.

Dee - Lightful

Who is the best freshman point guard in college basketball? While it's far too early in the season to begin that debate, it's hard to find a rookie guard that has made more of an impact than Illinois' Dee Brown. Brown has started every game and leads the Illini in minutes played. He has reached double figures in three of five games and is third on the team in scoring, averaging 11.0 points. He ranks second in the Big Ten in assists with

Illini Head Coach Bill Self

Bill Self is in his third season at the helm of the Illini program following three years at Tulsa where he earned National Coach of the Year honors from the John & Nellie Wooden Foundation and *The Sporting News* in 2000.

At Illinois, he became the second coach in Big Ten history, and the first since 1912-14, to win Big Ten titles in his first two years in the league. He is the first coach in Illinois history to reach 50 wins in his first two seasons. Self has led teams to at least the NCAA Sweet Sixteen each of the last three seasons, including two trips to the Final Eight.

After leading Tulsa to a 32-5 record and Regional Final appearance in 2000, Self became just the second coach to lead two different schools to Final Eight appearances in consecutive seasons when he took the Illini to the Regional Final in 2001. Prior to his stop at Tulsa, Self spent four years at Oral Roberts where he built a program from 6-21 his first season to 21-7 in his fourth year.

A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self has worked under Larry Brown at Kansas and Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State.

In his first season at Illinois, Self led the Illini to 27 victories, the second-most in school history and became just the fourth Big Ten coach since 1950 to defeat every conference school in his first season. He also became just the ninth coach in Big Ten history to win a Big Ten title in his first season.

Self was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, finishing fourth in voting, and a was a nominee for the Naismith College Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002.

Augie Hot

Another member of the heralded Illini freshman class to shine has been newcomer James Augustine. He has bolstered the UI frontcourt, averaging 8.4 points and leading the Big Ten in field goal percentage at 70.8 percent. He has scored in double figures twice, with a season-high 12 points vs. Arkansas Pine-Bluff. Augustine also leads the Illini and ranks 10th in the league in rebounding, averaging 6.2 boards. He has been Illinois' top-rebounder in three of five games, highlighted by back-to-back nine rebound performances vs. Lehigh and Ark.-Pine Bluff.

Powell Makes the Most of his Playing Time Roger Powell has been one of Illinois' most productive players on the court this season. He has scored in double figures in four of five games and ranks second on the team in scoring behind Brian Cook, averaging 12.8 points. Powell is shooting nearly 59 percent from the field, having connected on 27-of-46 FGs. He is also Illinois' third-leading rebounder, averaging 5.8 boards per game. Powell's lofty numbers come despite averaging under 23 minutes per game.

High-Scoring Illini

Illinois has opened the 2002-03 season by averaging 85 points in five wins, shooting a combined 53.4 percent from the field. Illinois has outscored its four opponents by an average of nearly 30 points per game.

Illinois leads the Big Ten in scoring average (85.0), scoring margin (+29.4) and field goal percentage (.534), while ranking third in 3-point field goal percentage (.408). Illinois' top eight scorers are all shooting at least 46 percent from the field, with five of the top six shooting better than 56 percent. The Illini have three of the top five field goal percentage leaders in the Big Ten (Augustine, 1st-.708; Harrington,

Did you Know ...

... Dee Brown and Brian Cook. They share a common bond, being named Mr. Basketball in the state of Illinois. Brown won the award in 2002 and Cook in 1999.

... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 12 McDonald's All-Americans and two are currently on the Illini roster. Dee Brown made the All-America team in 2002 and Cook in 1999. Illinois ranks 11th alltime in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.

... Illinois has the 16th best all-time winning percentage (.645) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.

... Illinois has an all-time record of 1437-789. The 1437 wins rank 18th on the Division I list.

... Illini Head Coach Bill Self helped Oklahoma State to a Big 8 Conference Tournament Championship in 1983.

... Illini Head Coach Bill Self and his coaching staff is one of just two staffs in the nation to have a current streak of four-consecutive conference championships.

... Nine Illini players have been firstround draft selections, including Nick Anderson and Kendall Gill from the 1989 Final Four team and recently departed Frank Williams to the New York Knicks in 2002.

... Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten behind Indiana in total NCAA appearances.

... Illinois is second among Big Ten schools in all-time victories and third in all-time winning percentage. In all-time Big Ten play, the Illini are third in conference wins and winning percentage behind Purdue and Indiana.

... The Orange Krush student group is more than just a Fighting Illini cheering section. The students raised over \$150,000 last year which went to the University of Illinois general scholarship fund, the Fighting Illini Scholarship Fund (to the Matthew Heldman Scholarship Fund) and a variety of charities. Over the last four years, Orange Krush has distributed more than \$375,000 to charities.

allowing opponents an average of just 55.6 points. The Illini also rank second in the Big Ten in rebounding margin (+9.4) and steals per game (8.0).

Freshmen Bask In Season Opener

For the first time in school history Illinois opened the season with three freshmen in the starting lineup when James Augustine, Dee Brown and Deron Williams were on the floor for the opening tip vs. Lehigh on Nov. 24. Two sophomores, Roger Powell and Nick Smith, rounded out the starting lineup as the youngest in school history. The five starters had combined for a total of four starts (all by Nick Smith) to begin the season.

The previous time Illinois started three freshmen in any game was Feb. 20, 1991 when Rennie Clemons, Scott Pierce, and Tom Michael started vs. Ohio State.

In the opening two wins of the season, the five Illinois freshmen scored 104 of Illinois' 186 points (56 percent), while grabbing 42 of the Illini's 90 rebounds (47 percent).

Five freshmen will give an entirely new look to the Fighting Illini this season. The Illini recruiting class was a consensus Top 10 group and includes McDonald's All-American **Dee Brown**, a 6-foot guard from Proviso East High School in Maywood, Ill., **Deron Williams**, a 6-3 guard from The

Tip-Ins...

Illinois' 26 wins in 2002 tied as the thirdwinningest season in school history ... The 2001-02 season was the second time in school history that the Illini posted back-toback 26 win seasons. The last time was in 1984 and 1985 ... After starting the 2002 season with five straight road losses, Illinois finished with five straight road wins, including four straight Big Ten road victories ... The last time Illinois won four straight Big Ten road games in the same season was in 1956 ... Illinois' nine-game winning streak to end the 2002 regular season was its longest since opening the 1995-96 season with a 9-0 record ... Illinois won at least 10 games in conference play for the third straight season, and fifth of the last six years ... Back-To-Back Titles

During the 2001 and 2002 seasons, Illinois won back-to-back Big Ten titles for the first time in 50 years (since 1951-52) and for just the third time in school history. The Whiz Kids posted back-to-back titles in 1942 and 1943. Illinois has never won three straight Big Ten titles.

Self Wins Second Big Ten Title in Two Years

Bill Self became just the second Big Ten coach in conference history, and first since Wisconsin's Walter Meanwell did so his first three seasons from 1912-14, to win Big Ten basketball titles in his first two seasons in the league.

Last season, Bill Self became the first coach in 22 years, just the ninth all-time in the Big Ten, and second Illini coach to win a Big Ten championship in his first season as coach at a conference school.

League rookies earning hardware are Wisconsin's Meanwell in 1912, Guy Lowman in 1918 and Harold Foster in 1935, Iowa's Sam Barry in 1923, Michigan's George Veekner in 1929, Illinois' Doug Mills in 1937, Minnesota's Bill Musselman in 1972, Purdue's Lee Rose in 1979, Self in 2001 and Wisconsin's Bo Ryan in 2002.

Frank Williams became Illinois' first, first-round NBA draft pick since 1990 when the New York Knicks chose him as the 26th pick of the 2002 NBA Draft. Teammate Robert Archibald soon followed as the 32nd pick by the Memphis Grizzlies. Archibald is the first native of Scotland to be drafted by an NBA team.

Top 25 Streak Continues

Illinois began last week ranked No. 20 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, extending its streak to 42 consecutive polls in which the Illini have been ranked, including every poll during Bill Self's tenure. Illinois also jumped into the AP Top 25 at No. 25 for the first time this season.

The Illini had a record-streak of 30 straight polls in the Top 10 snapped last January, but never dropped out of the Top 25.

National Exposure

For the 2002-03 season, Illinois is scheduled to appear at least 13 times on national television with five games on ESPN, four games on ESPN2 and four games on CBS.

Quick Shots ...

• **Ingram Transfers From Tulsa**: Jack Ingram, a 6-10 forward/center from San Antonio, Texas, transferred to Illinois from Tulsa this past summer and will sit out the 2002-03 season per NCAA transfer rules.

• **Future Illini:** Three future student-athletes signed national letters of intent with the University of Illinois and Bill Self during the early signing period in November. The class includes 6-foot-3-inch guard **Richard McBride** of Springfield (Ill.) Lanphier High School, 6-8 forward **Brian Randle** of Peoria (Ill.) Notre Dame High School and 6-9 forward **Warren Carter** of Lake Highlands High School in Dallas, Texas. Both McBride and Randle are two-time all-state picks entering their senior seasons.

Sophomore Roger Powell had 15 points and nine rebounds to lead five underclassmen in double figures for Illinois in a 90-56 win over Lehigh.

Illinois (1-0) started three freshman and two sophomores in its first regular season game because of injuries and suspensions to two of its players, and the inexperience showed early on.

But after a few rocky minutes, the Illini's youngsters eventually settled down and easily pulled away from Lehigh (1-1).

Illinois trailed 15-12 before going on an 18-3 run that was capped by a crowd-pleasing dunk by freshman Aaron Spears. The 6-9 center caught a pass four feet from the basket, spun around a defender and slammed the ball with one hand for his first career points at Illinois.

After a basket by Lehigh, Illinois outscored the Mountain Hawks 17-4 behind three 3-pointers from 6-8 Kyle Wilson and took a 47-24 halftime lead.

Illinois shot 56 percent for the game, including 46 percent from 3-point range, and held Lehigh to 37 percent shooting.

Cook and reserve guard Jerrance Howard sat out while serving two-game suspensions for playing in a non-sanctioned summer tournament. Wilson scored 14 points and made 3-of-5 3-pointers. Illinois guards Dee Brown and Deron Williams, both freshmen, combined for 26 points and had four assists apiece.

Roger Powell added 15 points and seven rebounds and Luther Head scored 11 in his first appearance of the season after battling a groin injury. Deron Williams chipped in 10 for the Illini (3-0).

Illinois led 42-24 at halftime as Cook scored 13 firsthalf points.

Western's Andre Charles scored six points during a 13-4 run in the second half that cut the Illini lead to 54-46 with just over nine minutes remaining.

The Leathernecks (2-3) got no closer however, as Dee Brown's steal and layup gave Illinois a 10-point lead and the Illini pulled away from there. Sean Harrington hit two 3-pointers that extended the Illinois advantage to 16 and James Augustine scored with 2:30 left to give them a 24-point cushion.

Illinois' bench combined to scored 32 points in making 14 of 15 field-goal attempts. Brown handed out 10 assists for the Illini.

2002-03 Fighting Illini Season-In-Review

The ACC/Big Ten Challenge provided No. 12 North Carolina with its first real road test of the season. It was one they didn't pass as No. 25 Illinois ran away in the final eight minutes and routed the No. 12 Tar Heels 92-65.

A tight seven-point game (64-57) turned lopsided when Illinois finished on a 28-8 run over the final 7:42, sending Carolina to its first loss of the season.

In a game billed as a matchup of talented freshmen - North Carolina started three and Illinois two - Illini seniors Brian Cook and Sean Harrington made the difference.

Cook scored 22 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had five assists, while Harrington had a careerhigh 20 points, making 6-of-8 3-pointers, and came up with five steals.

Freshman Sean May led North Carolina with 21 points, Jawad Williams had 15 and freshman Rashad McCants added 13.

Illinois got a splendid game from first-year point guard Dee Brown, who scored 12 points and played stellar defense against North Carolina's Raymond Felton.

Illinois' defense forced 19 turnovers and held Carolina to 36 percent second-half shooting.

AllTel Arena, NorthLittle Rock,Ark. No. 25 Illinois converted a sea of Arkansas mistakes

into important points and defeated the undersized Razorbacks 62-58 in Little Rock. Point guard Eric Ferguson's turnover with 2.9

seconds remaining, his ninth of the game, killed Arkansas' last chance to tie or take the lead. It was the 22nd turnover of the game for the Razorbacks.

Brian Cook hit the first free throw of a 1-and-1 situation with 8.4 seconds remaining, giving Illinois a 60-58 lead. When Cook, an 87-percent free throw shooter, missed his second, Arkansas freshman Jonathan Modica passed the rebound out to Ferguson.

Ferguson turned up court, took two dribbles and attempted a half-court pass to Dionisio Gomez. The ball sailed out of bounds and Illinois' freshman point guard Dee Brown sank two free throws with 1.9 seconds left to seal the game.

When the Razorbacks had four chances to take a lead in the final minutes, they had no one with Cook's experience to step forward. So the Fighting Illini (5-0) stayed perfect this season while Arkansas (1-4) lost its fourth straight.

Arkansas burned its final time-out with 15:34 remaining and was unable to set up a play in the final 2:25 when it had three chances to take the lead while trailing 59-58.

Illinois led 28-24 at the half and opened the second half with a 10-0 run as Augustine and Brown had four points apiece.
