Dolphin Notables...

- Tough Stretch ... The Dolphins finally returned home after seven straight road games to defeat South Carolina State, 76-68, on Saturday night. JU played its first eight games in 16 days, including a stretch of six games in 10 days. In addition, the Dolphins played their first five games with just nine eligible players. All totaled, JU plays eight of its first 10 games on the road. The Dolphins' five losses have come against opponents with a combined 26-10 (.772) record, including No. 22 Mississippi State.
- Sheppard Shines ... Senior point guard Kevin Sheppard continues his steady play, leading the team and ranking fourth in the A-Sun with 17.7 points per game. He also leads the team with 4.2 assists per game, including a season-high eight against Montana St. He now ranks ninth all-time at JU with 334 career assists. Sheppard has also moved up the all-time steals list, ranking seventh with 116 career steals, alongside former Dolphin and current Jacksonville Jaguar Micah Ross (116).
- Warner Starts Strong ... Senior forward Calvin Warner started his season late, but has come on strong in his first four games. Warner is averaging 16.3 points and a team-high 8.0 rebounds a game after scoring 25 points and grabbing six boards against South Carolina St. He was was named to the Gazette Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament Team after averaging 13.0 points and 8.5 rebounds in games against Southern Miss and Montana St.
- McBride to Sit ... Junior forward Nolan McBride will miss the Illinois State game after being ejected from the South Carolina St. game following an altercation underneath the goal.

Head Coach Hugh Durham

Head coach Hugh Durham is in his sixth season at Jacksonville, his 35th season overall as a collegiate head coach. The 65-year-old Durham, who is in his sixth decade of coaching, has posted a 68-80 (.459) record in his five-plus seasons at JU, and has a career record of 595-390 (.604) in 34-plus seasons. Durham currently ranks 11th among active NCAA Division I coaches with 594 wins, and is one of just 11 NCAA Division I coaches to lead two different schools to the NCAA Final Four (FSU, 1972 & Georgia, 1983). He also ranks fifth among active coaches in seasons as a head coach (34) and sixth among active coaches in games coached (985). Durham is the all-time winningest coach in the 97-year history of the University of Georgia basketball (297 wins) and ranks first all-time at Florida State with a .708 winning percentage (230-95). He is also one of only three coaches ever to win 200 games at two different schools: Ralph Miller (Oregon St. & Wichita St.) and Norm Sloan (Florida & N.C. State)

Durham Approaches 600 Wins

Head coach Hugh Durham continues to move up the NCAA list of career victories for active coaches. **Durham, who moved up to 11th on the active list for Division I coaches with 595 wins, is just five wins shy of becoming the 11th active coach in Division I with 600 career wins.** He is also just 15 games shy of becoming the fifth active Division I coach to have coached 1,000 career games.

Durham's Impact at JU

Durham has spearheaded JU's basketball resurgence leading the Dolphins to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1995, including the most wins over a two-year period (36) in 15 years. JU has also started to re-write the record books and has re-established its home court advantage. Durham has also been a sign of stability at JU. Only two other coaches have remained at JU as long as Durham, who is in his sixth season with the Dolphins. Bob Wenzel also coached six years at JU from 1981-87, while Rollie Rourke spent seven years as the Dolphins head coach from 1953-60.

- Held opponents to a school-record low 41 percent shooting in 2000-01
- Held opponents to 63.7 ppg in 2000-01 second in A-Sun and 30th nationally
- Opened the 2000-01 season 7-0 JU's best start since 1979-80
- · Has posted 36 wins in last two seasons, the most in 15 years
- Led JU to back-to-back winning seasons for first time since 1995
- Led JU to seven road wins in 2001-02 the most since 1973-74
- Posted a +5.5 rebounding margin in 2001-02 the largest since 1979-80
- Started 6-0 at home in 2001-02 the best start at home since 1973-74
- Won 12 conference games in 2001-02 tied for most all-time at JU (1994-95)

Jacksonville University Basketball

JU is in its 55th season of basketball with an overall record of 768-649 (.542), dating back to the 1948-49 season. The Dolphins competed at the junior college level from 1948-57 and as a four-year NAIA institution from 1957-65. JU began NCAA Division I play in 1965-66 as an independent and was a charter member of the Sun Belt Conference in 1976. The Dolphins, who joined the Atlantic Sun Conference prior to the 1998-99 season, have appeared in five NCAA Tournaments and advanced the NCAA Championship game in 1970 before falling to UCLA, 80-69. JU is the smallest school by enrollmment (3,000 in 1969-70) to have ever appeared in the NCAA Championship Game. Notable almumi include Artis Gilmore, Dee Brown, Otis Smith and James Ray.

JU vs. Illinois State

The Dolphins are 1-0 all-time against Illinois State having defeated the Redbirds, 95-86, on Feb. 16, 1973 at the Veteran's Memorial Coliseum in Jacksonville. JU beat Wichita State from the Missouri Valley Conference last year, 67-65, in Wichita to improve to 7-3 all-time against teams from the MVC. Nine of the 10 games played by JU against the MVC have been played before or in 1973 (1964-73). Hugh Durham is 2-1 against Illinois State in his career and 8-4 against teams from the MVC. JU assistant coach Bobby Kennen is familiar with the Missouri Valley, having served as an assistant at Wichita State in 1999-2000.

McBride To Miss Illinois State Game

Junior forward **Nolan McBride** will miss the Illinois State game after being ejected with 26 seconds to play in the first half of the Dolphins' 76-68 win over South Carolina State. McBride and Bulldog forward Dustin Braddick exchanged blows following a play underneath the goal and were immediately ejected from the game. **The incident, which lasted less than five seconds, was termed a "fight" by the officials forcing McBride and Braddick to sit out the next game, per Atlantic Sun and NCAA policies.**

Warner Settles In Groove

After sitting out the first five games of the season for NCAA Summer League violations, senior forward Calvin Warner has returned to form quickly. Warner scored a game-high 25 points and grabbed six rebounds in the Dolphins' 76-68 win over South Carolina St. He hit 8-of-14 shots from the floor, including 3-of-4 from outside the arc and 6-of-8 free throws. Warner also dished out three assists, blocked two shots and had a steal. With the Dolphins clinging to a four-point lead midway through the second half, Warner scored eight-straight points to spark JU. Warner was named to the All-Tournament Team at the Gazette Hawkeye Challenge after averaging 13.0 points and 8.5 rebounds in the two games. For the season, Warner is averaging 16.3 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. He has 16 career double-doubles, including 61 double-figure scoring games and 22 double-figure rebounding efforts. Warner also eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau last year after scoring a team-high 396 points in his first season at JU.

Dolphin Quick Hits...

- Kevin Sheppard moved into ninth place on the Dolphins all-time assist chart (330) and is just six assists shy of moving into eighth place all-time at JU alongside Dee Brown (336). He also moved into a tie for seventh place alongside Micah Ross with 116 career steals.
- After hitting just two three-pointers during the Dolphins' four-game losing streak, **James Daniels** hit five three's against South Carolina State. Daniels opened the season by hitting 13 treys and averaging 15.8 ppg in the first four games before cooling off.
- JU's 16 assists against South Carolina State were the most since the Dolphins dished out 22 assists in the season opener against St. Leo.
- The Dolphins have three games with less than 30 rebounds this season. Last year, JU had only one game all season (26 at Belmont) with less than 30 rebounds.
- JU has held seven of its nine opponents to 70 points or less, including a season-low 47 by Savannah State.
- JU recorded 10 steals against South Carolina State marking the third game for the Dolphins this season with double-digit steals, but the first since the second game of the season.
- The Dolphins' 10 three-pointers against South Carolina State were the most since JU hit 13 treys in the season opener against St. Leo.
- JU has hit just 27-of-47 (57 percent) free throws in the last three games after shooting 72 percent (106-148) in the first six contests.
- The Dolphins have at least one 3-pointer in 109 straight games.
- Dolphin opponents have hit just 12-of-43 (28 percent) three-pointers in the last three games.
- Kevin Sheppard has failed to score in double figures only once this season against Montana St. but handed out a season-high eight assists with just two turnovers.
- JU's four-game losing streak was the Dolphins' longest since dropping the final six games of the 1999-2000 season.
- JU's 24 rebounds against Mississippi State are the fewest rebounds for a Dolphin team since Feb. 24, 2000 when the Dolphins had 18 boards in a 83-79 loss at Stetson.
- New Orleans connected on 38-of-77 field goals against the Dolphins, marking the most field goals allowed since Texas Pan-American hit 38-of-57 (.667) shots against JU in a 101-78 win on Jan. 8, 1998.
- The Dolphins have shot 195 free throws in nine games, an average of 21.7 attempts per game.
- 10 of the 11 Dolphins who played this season have at least three steals, including four players with six steals, while 10-of-11 Dolphins have 10 or more rebounds.
- Senior walk-on guard **Chip White** has played a total of 72 minutes in five games this season. He entered the year having played a total of 40 minutes in his first three years.
- Senior guard **James Daniels** had no rebounds in the first two games, but has 35 boards (5.0 rpg) in the last seven outings, including a career-best nine against Savannah State.
- The Dolphins had six players score in double figures against Grambling State. The last time the Dolphins had six players in double figures was Feb. 27, 1992 in a 102-85 win over South Alabama.
- Senior center **Jeff Howard** is averaging 5.4 points and 2.9 rebounds in 15.1 minutes per game off the bench, while shooting a teambest 61 percent from the field. Last year, Howard averaged less than a point and a rebound per game and played just 5.3 minutes per contest.
- **Tabari Brown** tied a career high with 12 rebounds against Grambling State and recorded his first career double-double (13 points, 12 rebounds).
- Kevin Sheppard hit his first 10 shots of the season before finally missing against Cal State Northridge.
- The Dolphins had 22 assists on 30 baskets in their season-opening 85-55 win over Saint Leo, marking the most assists for JU since 2000.

JU Defense Gets Going

The Dolphins are finally back at full strength and their signature pressure defense is starting to show the effects. JU has limited opponents to just 29 percent (12-41) shooting from outside the arc in the last three games, while forcing a combined 52 turnovers (17.3/game). The Dolphins have also registered 26 steals in the last three contests. After allowing 100 points to then No. 23 Mississippi State and 90 points to New Orleans, JU has allowed just 64.7 points per game the last three times out.

Rested Legs Means Shooting Touch is Back

After shooting less than 40 percent in two games at the Hawkeye Challenge, the Dolphins finally got their legs back under them following a week off for exams. JU shot 51 percent from the floor (26-51), including 56 percent (10-18) from the three-point line in its 76-68 win over South Carolina State. The Dolphins had hit just 9-of-35 three's (26 percent) the previous two games, while shooting 38 percent from the field. James Daniels led the way from outside hitting 5-of-8 three pointers against SCSU after hitting just 2-of-13 three's in the previous four contests. Calvin Warner also hit 3-of-4 from beyond the arc as JU enjoyed its best shooting game since the season opener.

Dolphins Struggle on Boards

The Dolphins were one of the top rebounding teams in the Atlantic Sun last season, leading the league and ranking 26th nationally with a +5.5 rebounding margin. This season has been a different story. **JU is -0.2 in rebounding margin (35.3/35.6) and has been outrebounded in five of nine games this season.** The Dolphins average 40.2 rebounds per game in their four wins, but just 31.4 boards per game in their five losses. **After outrebounding Grambling St. and Savannah St. by a combined 100-64, JU has been outrebounded 190-158 in the last five contests.** The Dolphins, which are 3-1 this season and 29-9 the past two-plus seasons when outrebounding their opponent, have posted less than 30 rebounds in three games this season, as opposed to just once all of last year (26 at Belmont).

Sheppard a Steady Burn

Senior guard **Kevin Sheppard** continues his steady play, leading the team and ranking fourth in the A-Sun in scoring with 17.7 points per game, while leading the team and ranking seventh in the league with 4.2 assists per contest. **Sheppard has scored in double figures in 8-of-9 games, including a career-best 30 points against the No. 23 Mississippi State and All-SEC point guard Derrick Zimmerman.** He hit 4-of-5 from outside the arc and a career-best 12-of-13 from the free throw line against the Bulldogs. Following that performance, Sheppard was named A-Sun Player of the Week after averaging 23.0 points, 3.7 rebounds and 3.7 assists in three games. **The preseason all-conference selection scored just eight points against Montana St., but handed out a season-best eight assists.**

Sheppard Shines In Record Books

Senior point guard Kevin Sheppard continues to move his way up the charts in the Dolphin record book. With his five assists against Saint Leo in the season opener, Sheppard became just the 10th JU player to eclipse 300 career assists. He currently ranks 9th all-time with 334 career assists, just two shy of moving into eighth place with Dee Brown (336). Sheppard also ranks sixth all-time at JU with 126 three-pointers and third all-time with 369 three-point attempts. His steal against South Carolina St. moved him into a tie for seventh all-time alongside Micah Ross with 116 career steals. Here is a look at how Sheppard ranks in the JU record books:

Senior forward Calvin Warner scored a game-high 25 points and grabbed six rebounds as JU snapped a four-game losing streak with a 76-68 win over South Carolina State at Swisher Gymnasium. Moses Malone, Jr. led the Bulldogs (1-4) with 22 points, including a perfect 12-of-12 from the line. It was the Dolphins' (4-5) first home game since Nov. 22 after playing seven straight on the road.

Senior point guard Kevin Sheppard added 17 points and four assists for the Dolphins, while James Daniels hit five three's to finish with 15 points, three steals, three assists and two blocks. JU, which forced 28 turnovers and limited South Carolina St. to just 41 percent shooting from the field, hit 10-of-18 from outside the arc. Senior center Tabari Brown gave the Dolphins a spark off the bench with eight points and seven rebounds in 23 minutes of action.

JU fell behind 6-0 in the first three minutes, but rebounded to take its first lead, 11-10, at the 9:26 mark of the first half. The Dolphins led 21-18 when Sheppard scored seven-straight points, including a pair of three-pointers, to spark a 15-2 run and give JU a 36-20 lead with 2:45 to play in the half. South Carolina St. ended the first half with five-straight points, including a 45-foot three-pointer by Malone to cut the JU lead to 38-25 at the break.

The Bulldogs whittled the lead down to four, 55-51, with 10:09 to play, but JU answered with eight-straight points from Warner to extend the lead to 63-53. Malone connected on a three-point play with 1:11 to play to bring South Carolina St. within four, 71-67, but the Dolphins connected on 4-of-5 free throws in the final 1:10 to seal the victory.

JU's Nolan McBride and South Carolina St.'s Dustin Braddick were ejected with 26 seconds to play in the first half after getting tangled underneath the basket.

Robertson Shines in Debut

After sitting out the first seven games of the season for NCAA Summer League violations, senior forward **Antwan Robertson** had a strong debut in the Dolphins' 64-55 loss to Montana State. **Robertson scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds in 30 minutes of action.** He tied a career high hitting 6-of-11 field goals, including his only three-point attempt. Robertson played both wing and power forward and was immediately inserted into the starting lineup.

JU Slows Down at the Line

After shooting 72 percent (106-148) from the line in the first six games this season, the Dolphins have slowed down the last three contests. **JU** has shot just 57 percent from the line the last three games, connecting on just 27-of-47 free throws. The Dolphins were averaging more than 26 free throw attempts per game, but averaged just 15.7 attempts the last three times out.

The Proof is in the Numbers...and defense

After opening the season 3-1, JU lost four straight games before rebounding with a 76-68 win over South Carolina State. The Dolphins are averaging just 58.6 points per game in their five losses as opposed to 75.8 points per game in JU's four wins. Meanwhile, the Dolphins are allowing 76.6 points per game in losses and just 59.5 points per game in wins Here is a look at some key stat differences in JU's wins and losses:

Lewis Mans The Middle

Senior center Ryan Lewis has picked up where he left off last year when he was the top shot blocker in the Atlantic Sun. Lewis leads the A-Sun and ranks ninth nationally with 27 blocks (3.0 bpg) in nine games this season, including seven against Saint Leo in the season opener, five against then No. 23 Mississippi State and seven against New Orleans. The 6-foot-9 Lewis led the A-Sun and ranked 43rd nationally last year, averaging 1.96 blocks per game (56 blocks). As a team, JU leads the league and ranks 27th in Division I with 5.7 blocks per game.

Dolphins Finally at Full Strength

The Dolphins are finally at full strength after playing the first seven games of the season without their full roster available. Senior forward Calvin Warner and redshirt freshman guard Riley Didion missed the first five games of the season for violations involving summer league play. Warner was suspended by the NCAA for violating summer league geographical limitations rules, while Didion participated in five games of a non NCAA-certified league while home in Wisconsin for the summer. The Dolphins, who played the first five games with just nine eligible players, returned to full strength in the second game of the Gazette/ Hawkeye Challenge against Montana St., when senior forward Antwan Robertson returned from a seven-game suspension. Robertson played in the same summer league (Kenny Smith Summer League) as Warner while staying with his uncle in Atlanta.

Home Sweet Home

Since moving back on-campus prior to the 1999-2000 season to the friendly confines of historic Swisher Gymnasium, the Dolphins have been one of the toughest home teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. JU is 24-7 (.774) at home over the past two-plus seasons, including a 6-0 start in 2001-02, which was the best start at home since the 1973-74 season when the Dolphins started the season 7-0 at Veteran's Memorial Coliseum. The Dolphins went 12-2 in 2000-01 - its best home record since a 13-2 mark in 1994-95 and the most wins ever at Swisher Gymnasium - and 10-3 in 2001-02. In addition, JU won 12 straight at Swisher prior to last season's loss to Samford. JU is 122-39 (.758) all-time at Swisher Gymnasium in 16-plus seasons. The Dolphins played their home games at the Jacksonville Veteran's Memorial Coliseum from 1971-99.

Lee Leaves Team

Sophomore guard **David Lee** has decided to leave the team for personal reasons without playing in a regular-season game. Lee, who averaged 3.7 points during his freshman season and played in the Dolphins' two exhibition games, was forced to sit out the first two regular-season games because of NCAA violations involving summer league play. Lee was slated to be James Daniels' back up at shooting guard.

JU Suffers Back-To-Back Lopsided Defeats

The Dolphins' 90-57 loss at New Orleans marked the second-straight 30-plus point loss for JU, which lost at then No. 23 Mississippi State, 100-65, on Nov. 30. **The combined 68-point losses (35, 33) are the worst back-to-back losses in school history.** JU lost by a total of 61 points in consecutive losses to Georgia Tech (97-77) and Florida State (106-65) in 1968.

JU Back To Longe-Range Tricks

The Dolphins continued their torrid shooting from 3-point land in the season opener. JU tied a school record by hitting 13 three's, including a perfect 4-for-4 by Kevin Sheppard and 4-of-7 by James Daniels. Freshmen Desmond Copeland and Jarred Stockton each hit a pair as the Dolphins shot 54 percent (13-24) from outside the arc. JU has hit at least one 3-pointer in 109 straight games and set a school record with 200 treys last season.

Bulldogs Hand JU Lopsided Defeat

JU's 100-65 loss at then No. 23 Mississippi State was the worst loss since the Dolphins lost at South Florida, 78-43, on Dec. 7, 1997. It was also the first time JU has surrendered 100 points in a game since Nov. 8, 1998, when the Dolphins lost 101-78 at Texas-Pan American. The 35-point margin of defeat ranks seventh all-time at JU and is the worst loss since the Dolphins lost 111-69 to Arizona State on Nov. 22, 1996.

70 is the Magic Number

The Dolphins have not been hard to figure out over the past two years. Just think 70. JU is 32-9 when holding opponents to 70 points or less the past two seasons, including a 15-1 mark in 2000-01. On the other hand, the Dolphins are 26-6 when scoring at least 70 points, but just 13-21 when failing to score 70. JU is just 7-18 when opponents score 70 or more points. The Dolphins are also 21-2 when holding opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field the past two seasons.

Dolphin Tails...

- Senior center **Tabari Brown** is the older brother of **Kwame Brown**, who plays for the Washington Wizards and was the No. 1 selection in the 2001 NBA Draft. In addition, Brown's cousin, **Jabari Smith**, played at LSU and with Sacramento and Orlando in the NBA.
- Freshman center **O.J. Gilmore** is the son of former JU and NBA great, **Artis Gilmore**, who led the Dolphins to the 1970 National Championship game against UCLA. Artis Gilmore is still the NBA's all-time leader in career field goal percentage (.599) and holds the NCAA record for rebounds per game (22.7).
- Former Dolphin basketball standout **Micah Ross (1995-98)** is in his second season playing for the Jacksonville Jaguars in the NFL as a wide receiver and on special teams.
- JU is the smallest school by enrollment (3,000 in 1970) to have ever appeared in the NCAA Championship Game.
- In 1969-70, JU was the first team in NCAA history to average more than 100 points per game (100.4 ppg).
- On Nov. 29, 1984, Doug and Hugh Durham became only the fourth father and son combination in NCAA history to compete against each other as head coaches in basketball when Georgia (Hugh) faced Georgia Southern (Doug).
- JU selected its nickname "Dolphins" in 1947, making it the first collegiate or pro team to select the moniker.

Have Game, Will Travel

JU will once again hit the road this season in preparation for the A-Sun conference schedule, logging nearly 16,000 miles by the end of the regular season. The Dolphins will play eight of their first 10 games on the road, including seven straight after opening the season against Saint Leo at Swisher Gymnasium. JU traveled 5,990 miles to Eugene, Ore., and back for the John Thompson Challenge and then the Dolphins logged 2,482 miles to play in the Gazzette/Hawkeye Challenge at lowa. In addition, JU will play at Illinois St. (2,040 miles), Mississippi St. and New Orleans (1,404 miles). All totaled, JU will travel 12,059 miles before beginning conference play in January.

Durham Demands Defense

The Dolphins' success the past two seasons can be attributed to one thing – DEFENSE. JU was again one of the top defensive teams in the A-Sun in 2001-02, limiting opponents to just .418 shooting from the field, which ranked second in the league and second all-time in the Dolphin record books. JU also led the league and set a school record by limiting opponents to just .309 shooting from 3-point range, while ranking second in the A-Sun in scoring defense allowing just 66.0 points per game. In 2000-01, JU led the Atlantic Sun and set a school record by limiting opponents to just 41 percent shooting from the field, while ranking 30th nationally and second in the A-Sun in points allowed per game (63.7 ppg).

Challenging Schedule

Head coach Hugh Durham has put together the Dolphins' toughest schedule since his arrival in 1997. JU's schedule features seven defending conference champions, four NCAA Tournament teams from a year ago and three NIT teams. Early season challenges include a meeting with Mississippi State, as well as a trip to Eugene, Ore., to play in the John Thompson Foundation Challenge, which is being hosted by Oregon. The ninth-ranked Ducks advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight last season and sport one of the top point guards in the country, All-American Luke Ridnour. No. 13 Mississippi State, which returns the nucleus of a team which won the SEC Tournament Championship last season and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tourney, sports one of the top centers in the nation, Preseason All-American Mario Austin. The Dolphins will also play at the Gazette/Hawkeye Challenge at Iowa, and at Ilinois State and New Orleans. JU hosts UNC Wilmington, which won the Colonial Athletic Association title last year and then upset Southern Cal in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Seahawks return the CAA Player of the Year, Brett Blizzard, who is one of the best shooting guards in the country.

Looking for 18... Again

With its 18-12 mark last season, JU recorded its second-straight 18-win season and back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in seven years. The 36 wins in 2000-01 (18-10) and 2001-02 (18-12) are the most wins over a two-year period in 15 years. The last time the Dolphins had three consecutive winning seasons was 1993-94 through 1995-96 when JU went a combined 50-33 over three seasons. The Dolphins have not posted 18 or more wins in three consecutive seasons since 1970-73, when JU went 63-18 and made two NCAA and one NIT appearance.

Sheppard & Warner Earn Preseason Honors

Senior guard Kevin Sheppard and senior forward Calvin Warner both earned multiple preseason honors. They both were voted to the Atlantic Sun Preseason All-Conference Team by league head coaches, making JU the only school with multiple players on the squad. Sheppard was also tabbed preseason all-conference by five national publications (*Lindy's*, *Street & Smith*, *Athlon*, *The Sporting News* and *Basketball News*) and was called the "Best Playmaker" in the A-Sun by *The Sporting News*. Warner was selected preseason all-conference by *Lindy's* and was tabbed the "Best Dunker" in the league by *The Sporting News*. Sheppard was also a preseason all-conference selection last year and went on to earn Second-Team All-Atlantic Sun honors following his junior year.

Sheppard Has International Flavor

Senior point guard Kevin Sheppard has made the most of his summer vacations the past two years, especially in 2001. The 6-foot native of St. Croix in the Virgin Islands, spent the summer traveling the world as a member of the Virgin Islands National Basketball Teams. Sheppard was the captain of the University Team, which played in the Tournament of the Latin Americas in Argentina and then won the consolation bracket of the 21st World University Games in Beijing, China. He was also a member of the Olympic-level national team, which competed in the Centro Basketball Tournament in Mexico City in mid-July. In 2002, Sheppard led the Virgin Islands to the Carribean Championship and helped them qualify for the 2003 Pan American Games.

A-Sun Goes To Divisional Play

With the Atlantic Sun expanding to 12 teams for the 2002-03 season with addition of Gardner-Webb, the conference will split into two divisions for just one season. Next year, Samford and Jacksonville State are leaving the league to join the Ohio Valley Conference, while Lipscomb will be added as an 11th member of the A-Sun. JU will play in the South Division along with UCF, Florida Atlantic, Mercer, Stetson and Troy State. The North Division will be comprised of Belmont, Campbell, Gardner-Webb, Georgia State, Jacksonville State and Samford. The top two teams in each division, plus four wild card teams (by record regardless of division), will advance to the A-Sun Championship March 6-8 in Atlanta. Gardner-Webb is not eligible for the postseason tournament in 2003.

Senior guards James Daniels and Kevin Sheppard scored 18 points apiece to lead four Dolphins in double figures as JU opened the season with an 85-55 win over Saint Leo at Swisher Gymnasium. It is the seventh-straight win for the Dolphins (1-0) in home openers dating back to the 1991-92 season.

Freshman Jarred Stockton added 13 points in 17 minutes off the bench in his first action for the Dolphins, while senior center Jeff Howard scored a career-best 13 points, grabbed four boards and had three steals in a career-high 25 minutes off the bench. JU shot 54 percent for the game, including a blistering 62 percent in the first half and registered 22 assists on 30 buckets. The Dolphins tied a school record by connecting on 13 three-pointers. Sheppard went a perfect 7-for-7 from the field as he and Daniels combined to shoot 14-for-18 from the field, including 8-of-11 from outside the arc.

Defensively, JU limited the Lions (0-1) to just 33 percent shooting from the field, while forcing 22 turnovers and recording 16 steals. It was the most steals for the Dolphins since Feb. 6, 1999, when JU had 16 steals in a 72-51 win over Jackson-ville State. Senior center Ryan Lewis failed to score, but grabbed four rebounds and had seven of JU's nine blocked shots.

The Dolphins jumped out to a 13-0 lead, as Saint Leo did not hit its first basket until the 14:05 mark of the first half. JU extended the lead to 26-2 at the 10:51 mark and led 47-19 at the break. Howard scored 12 first-half points to lead eight Dolphins in the scoring column. The JU lead never got below 21 in the second half.

Tabari Brown added nine points and eight rebounds for JU, while senior guard Chip White scored a career-best six points and grabbed three boards in a career-high 19 minutes off the bench.

Reserve guard Justice Graham came of the bench to score 11 points to help Cal State Northridge shake off a slow start and come back to beat Jacksonville, 67-55, in the first round of the John Thompson Foundation Challenge at McArthur Court in Eugene, Ore. The shorthanded Dolphins (1-1), playing without two starters and two key reserves, got in early foul trouble and turned the ball over 23 times, including 17 in the first half.

Senior guard Kevin Sheppard scored a career-high 30 points to lead all scorers, but 23rd-ranked Mississippi State proved to be too much for the shorthanded Dolphins with a 100-65 win at the Humphrey Coliseum in Starkville. JU (3-2), which was playing its fifth game in eight days, allowed 100 points for the first time since a 101-78 loss at Texas Pan-Am on Jan. 8, 1998 and suffered its worst loss since a 78-43 loss at South Florida during the 1996-97 season.

Senior forward Calvin Warner scored 14 points, grabbed nine rebounds and blocked three shots in his first game of the year, but the Dolphins committed 25 turnovers and New Orleans shot 50 percent in a 90-57 win over JU at the Lakefront Arena. It was the sixth game in 10 days for the shorthanded Dolphins (3-3), who were playing their fifthstraight road game. New Orleans (4-0) won its 10th-straight regular-season game to avenge a 15-point loss to JU in 2001.

Kevin Sheppard added 15 points and four assists, while Ryan Lewis had six points, five rebounds and seven blocks for the Dolphins. JU hit just 2-of-10 three-pointers and connected on a season-low 7-of-14 from the line. The Privateers outrebounded the Dolphins, 43-32, including 20 offensive rebounds. New Orleans also his 9-of-14 three-pointers and outscored JU, 37-9, off the bench.

Preseason All-American Hector Romero paced UNO with 21 points, five rebounds, three assists and three steals. Freshman Billy McDade added 19 points, including five three-pointers, as the Privateers connected on 38-of-77 field goals. JU jumped out to an early four-point lead and trailed by just one with 2:12 to play in the first half, but UNO closed the half on a 9-0 run behind five quick points from McCade and three JU turnovers to take a 45-35 halftime lead. The Privateers opened the second half on a 20-8 run by hitting three consecutive three's, two from McCade, and led 65-43 at the 12:29 mark. The Dolphins never got closer than 20 the rest of the way as New Orleans hit 4-of-6 three-pointers and forced 11 turnovers in the second half.

Senior guard Kevin Sheppard scored 20 points and had four steals, but the road-wearied Dolphins connected on just 24-of-61 shots and couldn't hold off Southern Miss in a 62-61 loss in the opening round of the Gazette Hawkeye Challenge at the Carver-Hawkeye Arena. JU, which did not arrive in Iowa City until four hours before the game, dropped its third-straight game on the road.

The Dolphins jumped out to an early 12-point advantage and led 33-26 at the half, but Southern Miss switched to a zone defense in the second half and JU managed to hit just 4-of-17 three-pointers and 9-of-17 free throws for the game. Calvin Warner scored eight of his 10 points in the first half and grabbed a game-high eight rebounds as JU out-rebounded the Golden Eagles, 40-35, and committed a season-low 12 turnovers.

Southern Miss used a 13-4 run to open the second half to take a 41-37 lead at the 14:11 mark. JU answered with a 7-0 run on a back-to-back lay-ups from Tabari Brown and Sheppard, and a three-pointer from Desmond Copeland to regain the lead, 44-41, with 10:55 to play. With the game tied at 56-56 at the 1:36 mark, Greg Johnson scored inside to give Southern Miss a two-point lead. Warner was fouled but missed the front end of a one-and-one on JU's next possession and then Mario Myles scored underneath to give the Golden Eagles a 60-56 lead with 16 seconds to play. Ryan Lewis hit a lay-up and was fouled on JU's next possession. With the Dolphins trailing, 60-58, Lewis missed the free throw and Nolan McBride grabbed the offensive board and quickly missed a seven-foot put-back with seven seconds to play. Following two Southern Miss free throws, Sheppard hit a three-pointer at the buzzer from 40 feet.

Gazette Hawkeye Challenge

Senior forward Calvin Warner scored 16 points and grabbed nine rebounds, but the Dolphins shot just 37 percent from the field and 28 percent from the three-point line in a 64-55 loss to Montana State in the consolation game of the Gazette Hawkeye Challenge at the Carver-Hawkeye Arena. It was the fourth-straight loss for JU, which was playing its seventh-straight road game and its eighth game in 16 days.

Senior forward Antwan Robertson added 13 points and five rebounds in his first appearance of the season, while senior point guard Kevin Sheppard scored a season-low eight points on 3-of-12 shooting, but handed out a season-best eight assists. JU held the Bobcats to just 10f-11 shooting from outside the arc, but Montana St. hit 19-of-23 free throws, including 16-of-19 in the second half, and outscored JU, 29-13, in bench points.

JU fell behind by eight early in the game, but went on an 11-2 run behind five layups and a free throw to take a 16-15 lead at the 11:40 mark of the first half. Warner and Tabari Brown each scored underneath and then Robertson fed Warner again in the paint to cut the lead to four. Sheppard added back-to-back fastbreak lay-ups and the Dolphins had their first lead since the 16:51 mark. Montana St. center Bo Segeberg hit a lay-up at the first-half buzzer to give the Bobcats a 28-26 haftime lead.

JU hung around in the second half trailing by as much as seven on three occasions before Montana St. stretched the lead to 53-43 on a pair of buckets underneath with 3:49 to play. A Desmond Copeland three-pointer and Robertson turnaround cut the deficit to five with 2:12 remaining, but the Bobcats hit eight free throws in the final two minutes to seal the win. Segeberg led Montana St. with 23 points and nine rebounds, including 11-of-12 from the line.
