About The Game: The Redbirds are embarking on their longest homestand of the season (three games), starting with a team that has lived on the road. Jacksonville has played seven of nine games away from home, including seven of the last eight. The Dolphins just snapped a four-game losing streak with a 76-68 win over South Carolina State Saturday night.

Series History: This is second meeting between the two schools with Jacksonville claiming the first meeting 95-86 in 1973. Tonight's game is the first trip to Illinois State for the Dolphins.

Last Meeting: Despite 30 points from freshman Robert "Bubbles" Hawkins, Illinois State dropped a 95-83 decision at No. 13 Jacksonville on February 16, 1973. In the only meeting in school history, Doug Collins chipped in 21 points for the Redbirds while Ron deVries added 13 and Calvin Harper tossed in 10 with 12 rebounds.

WJBC also carries Richardson's weekly call-in show, which generally airs each Thursday from 6:07-7 pm, depending on the schedule.

THE COACHES

Tom Richardson (St. Xavier '77) is 48-49 in his fourth season at Illinois State. He is assisted by Chad Altadonna, Lance Irvin and Kirk Sarff. Richardson is 31-28 against Valley opponents, 17-21 vs. non-conference foes, 31-13 at home, 12-30 on the road and 5-6 on neutral floors.

Hugh Durham (Florida State '59) is in his sixth season at Jacksonville with a 68-80 mark with the Dolphins. He is also in his 35th season as a head coach and owns a 595-390 career record.

Head coach **Tom Richardson** will be available at 10:25 a.m. during the teleconference.

About the Jacksonville Dolphins

- Jacksonville is located in Jacksonville, Fla., and has an enrollment of 2,350. The Dolphins are members of the Atlantic Sun Conference.
- The Dolphins are coming off of a home win, but prior to beating South Carolina State 76-68, JU had seven straight games on the road.
- After the opener against St. Leo, the Dolphins played eight games in 16 days, including a stretch of six games in 10 days.
- Head coach Hugh Durham ranks No. 11 among active NCAA Division I coaches with 595 wins and is one of just 11 NCAA Division I coaches to lead two different schools to the NCAA Final Four (Florida State – 1972, Georgia – 1983). He is also only one of three coaches to win 200 games at two different schools.
- The Dolphins joined the Atlantic Sun Conference prior to the 1998-99 season and have appeared in five NCAA Tournaments, including the NCAA Championship game in 1970 against UCLA (L, 80-69).
- JU has fielded a full roster the last two games after having Antwan Robertson (7 games), Calvin Warner (5) and Riley Didion (5) serve NCAA suspensions involving summer leagues.
- The Dolphins court a senior-laden squad, including all five starters.
- Center Ryan Lewis leads the team and the Atlantic Sun with 27 blocked shots on the season.
- Kevin Sheppard heads the Dolphin scoring attack with 17.7 points per game and has scored in double figures in eight of nine games. He also ranks No. 9 in the JU record book for career assists (334).

Home For the Holidays

Tonight's game against Jacksonville starts the longest homestand for the Redbirds in two seasons and the longest for the remainder of the season – three games. After the Dolphins, the 'Birds will host Northern Illinois (12/21) and Southwest Missouri State (12/29). Under **Tom Richardson**, Illinois State owns a 18-9 mark in multiple game stretches at home.

It's a Small World

With 6-foot-9 **Baboucarr Bojang** being tabbed a preseason first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, head coach **Tom Richardson** is probably surprised that his top three scorers are 6-4 or smaller. **Trey Guidry**, a 6-2 guard, leads the team with 14.5 points per game, while 6-4 sophomore **Gregg Alexander** ranks second on the squad with 11.5 tallies per game. **Vince Greene**, a 5-9 sophomore, is third with 7.7 points per contest.

Consistently Inconsistent

The Redbirds have six players that have started four or more games, but head coach **Tom Richardson** is still looking for a consistent scoring trend. Of the six players, each one has scored at least 11 points in a game, while also tossing in as few as five in a game. **Trey Guidry** has the largest variance of 21 with 26 points versus Chattanooga and five at Western Kentucky.

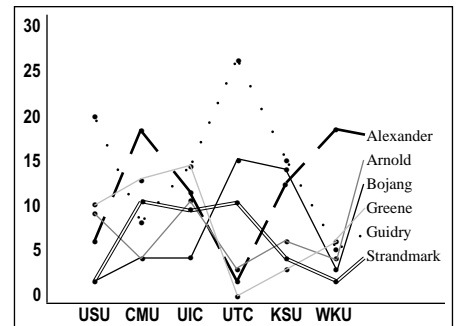
The Serving Trey

Opponents are starting to realize that Illinois State's **Trey Guidry** can score, but at Kent State, Guidry showed how he can help his teammates score. Guidry dished out a career-best 11 assists en route to his first career double-double with his team-high 15 points. Guidry's 11 assists were the most by a Redbird since Randy Rice's 13 dishes against Evansville on Feb. 12, 2001.

Hitting the Boards is on the Rebound

The Redbirds weren't able to capture their first win of the season at Western Kentucky, but ISU did out-rebound an opponent for the first time this season. The Redbirds totaled 36 boards, including 15 off of the offensive glass.

Haven't Seen This Since the 8¢ Stamp

The last time Illinois State faced Jacksonville on the hardwood was 1973. Back then a first-class postage stamp cost 8¢ and the average household income was \$10,512. President Richard Nixon accepted responsibility, but not blame for Watergate on national TV and a cease-fire was signed ending American involvement in the Vietnam War. The Godfather won the Academy Award for best picture, while American Graffiti, The Exorcist and The Sting hit the theaters. Roberta Flack had the record of the year with "The First Time Ever I Saw Your Face" and UCLA topped Memphis 87-66 to win the NCAA Basketball Championship. Assistant coach Chad Altadonna was also born that year, 101 days after ISU and Jacksonville met.

The Road to Aberration

There is reason for the disbelief surrounding the Redbirds' 0-6 start to the 2002-03 season. After all in the 33 years of Division I basketball at Illinois State, an 0-6 start has only happened twice. To start the 1990-91 season, the 'Birds opened the campaign with 12-straight losses before finishing with a 5-23 mark.

Look Boo's Back, Well Maybe

With a slow start out of the gates, Illinois State's Baboucarr Bojang appeared to be back to his old self, but the 6-foot-9 forward left the game in the second half at Western Kentucky and didn't return after suffering a mild concussion. Bojang only scored 3 points against the Hilltoppers, ending his double-digit scoring string.

December Drought

Under head coach Tom Richardson, the Redbirds own a 13-12 mark in the month of December. But dating back to last season, the 'Birds have lost six straight in the 12th month of the year. In Redbird Arena, Illinois State has been dominant under Richardson in the month of December with a 9-3 record.

There Has Been Some Fun in the Sun

Illinois State has had success against members of the Atlantic Sun Conference, but tonight's game is only the fifth game against an Atlantic Sun opponent. The 'Birds own a 3-1 mark, including a 65-54 win last season against Samford. Other Atlantic Sun wins include Stetson in 1969 and Troy State in 1959. The only defeat was to Jacksonville in 1973.

A Sl of Relief

Whew! Apparently the Missouri Valley Conference's success in the NCAA Tournament is starting to gain the league national recognition and the Redbirds are reaping benefits from it as well. Sports Illustrated's forecast of the 65-team NCAA Tournament field included Illinois State at No. 50, while Southern Illinois was No. 30 and Creighton was tabbed for No. 48. The Valley has posted seven NCAA Tournament victories in the last four years, including two teams advancing to the Sweet 16.

One Class Short

These words said by an academic advisor to a student expecting to graduate could force anxiety and stress, but for the Redbirds it's nothing to fret - there just isn't a junior class. With the early retirement of Dirk Williams, due to multiple concussions, the 'Birds are left without a third-year player. The 2002-03 roster consists of four seniors, five sophomores and four freshmen. The last time the Redbirds sent a team out on the floor comprised of just three classes was in 1997-98, when the Redbirds returned everyone from their NCAA qualifying season and didn't have a single freshman on the squad.

90 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

Illinois State heads into tonight's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 90 straight games. In fact, in the Tom Richardson era the Redbirds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on December 12, 1999. Since Richardson took the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 71 of 96 games.

Second-Half Scorchers

Through six games, the Redbird defense has been lit up by opponents in the second half. The 'Birds have offered up final frame field goal percentages like 52.5%, 61.5%, 69.6%, 56.5%, 48.1% and 60.9% in the first six match-ups. Combined, ISU foes have shot 83-for-143 in the second half - for an insuperable 58.0%.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

No. 13 Jax Stops Illinois State, 95-86

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Illinois State took far too few trips to the free throw line Friday and No. 13 Jacksonville, getting the basketball inside where fouls occur, scored a 95-86 win at Veterans Coliseum.

The loss was the fifth in ISU's last six games and left the Redbirds at 11-10 on the season.

The Dolphins, 19-4, received 19 points from Abe Steward and as many from guard Leon Benbow. They converted 15 of 17 free throws - ISU shot just six - and proved too much on the boards for the Redbirds.

Freshman Robert Hawkins had 30 points and Doug Collins 21 for Illinois State.

"I thought Doug should have had the basketball a lot more, though," said Redbird head coach Will Robinson afterwards.

Collins limited Dolphin leading scorer Henry Williams to 10 points and drew raves from Jacksonville coach Tom Wasdin: "You can't completely stop a player who does the job at both ends of the floor. I thought Benbow (who guarded Collins) did a fine job.

"And this was the most physical game we've been in all year," added Wasdin. "This was the best we've gone to the basket."

Calvin Harper pulled down a dozen rebounds for Illinois State, but 6-11 Redbird junior Ron deVries was held to five as Jacksonville taught ISU a boarding lesson.

Bojang One of Valley's Elite

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

The Power of Three

As voted by the players, **Gregg Alexander**, **Baboucarr Bojang** and **Vince Greene** will serve as Redbird captains for the 2002-03 season. It is the first time since 1996-97, that Illinois State has had three captains. That year, the 'Birds were led by Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley and Rob Gibbons and went on to earn an NCAA Tournament bid with a 34-6 record.

Slightly Above Average Valley Year

With 12 league victories last season, it was an "average" year for Illinois State. Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

International Flair

The 2002 trip to Australia marked the third international tour for the Redbirds. The team traveled to Europe in both 1992 and 1997, before the Australian tour this year. Overseas, the 'Birds have had their share of success with a 12-8 overall mark, but the real story comes in their record after returning home. ISU posted a combined 44-16 (.733) record with two Missouri Valley Conference regular-season titles in the seasons immediately following the first two trips.

FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourth-straight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Neil Plank, a 6-5 swing player, has transferred to Illinois State from Wisconsin, but cannot play for the Redbirds until the 2003-04 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. Plank played in 27 games for the Badgers as a freshman, scoring 25 points in 173 minutes of action.

We Have a Winner

With a 17-14 record last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

On November 13, 2002, the Illinois State basketball team added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, Ill • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, Ill. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period. The Redbirds have one scholarship left to fill.

Redbird Flashback

The Redbirds jumped out to a 21-8 lead and never looked back. Dan Muller added 15 points and nine boards, while Maurice Trotter tossed in 13.

Greene Leads 'Birds in Exhibition Win

NORMAL, III. - Sophomore point guard Vince Greene scored a game-high 26 points, including six three-pointers, as Illinois State won its first exhibition of the season, 89-70, over SIU-Edwardsville at Redbird Arena.

Baboucarr Bojang finished with 14 points and six rebounds for the 'Birds, while true freshman Chris Burras came off the bench to score 12.

SIU-Edwardsville was led by Ron Jones with 19 points, 17 of which came in the second half. Rob Baumgardner and Ben Garwitz each contributed 13 points, and Baumgardner also led the Cougars in rebounding with six boards. The Cougars never led in the entire game and after the initial 12-point deficit never got closer than seven points.

Illinois State opened up the game with a 12-0 run, highlighted by two three-pointers and a cross-over lay-up by Greene. The 'Birds defense forced eight Cougar turnovers in the first 12 minutes of the game, including the team's first two possessions.

Greene led all scorers in the first half with 10 points, while Gregg Alexander chipped in eight first half points on 3-for-4 shooting. ISU shot 61 percent from the field in the first half, including 5-for-8 from beyond the arc.

Down 45-24 at halftime, the Cougars came out firing in the second half and outscored the 'Birds 26-15 over the first 8:30 minutes led by nine points apiece by junior Ron Jones and freshman Logan Glosser narrowing the Redbird lead to 10. Following a timeout with 11:05 remaining in the game, the 'Birds went on a 13-0 run to extend their lead back to 23, which tied their largest lead of the night.

ISU Drops Second Exhibition to EA Sports

NORMAL, III. - Vince Greene led all scorers with 16 points, but Illinois State could not pick up the victory, dropping its second and final exhibition game of the season, 66-65, to the EA Sports All-Stars Thursday night at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State also got 15 points and 10 rebounds from Baboucarr Bojang, while Andy Strandmark, Gregg Alexander and Trey Guidry each contributed seven points. The 'Birds shot 54 percent from the field in the first half, but managed only 41 percent in the second half on 10-for-24 shooting.

EA Sports, 1-9, only shot 7-for-20 from the charity stripe, including 4-for-15 in the second half. EA Sports was led by former Fighting Illini player Sergio McClain with 13 points, while Doc Taylor, who played at Cleveland State, chipped in 12.

Bojang showed his offensive skills early in the game by scoring nine of the Redbirds' first 11 points, but hot three-point shooting (3-for-3) from McClain kept the game tight midway through the first half. Back-to-back jumpers from Greene helped ignite a 13-5 run to take the lead at 24-20 with just over seven minutes remaining.

Marcus Arnold hit two low-post jumpers late in the first half and the Redbirds went into the half with a one-point lead, 36-35. Bojang and McClain led their respective teams in first-half scoring with 11 points.

EA Sports scored 14 points of its first 19 points in the second half off lay-ups or dunks and were able to take a 54-47 lead, the largest of the night for either team, with just under nine minutes left in the game. However, the 'Birds went on an 11-2 run over the next 3:37 led by four points from Gregg Alexander to take the lead at 58-56 with five minutes remaining.

Redbirds Fall 68-53 to Utah State

NORMAL, III. - Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (125) free-throw attempts.

Desmond Penigar led Utah State with 22 points, going 4-for-4 from three-point range. Point guard Mark Brown scored 19 points for the Aggies. Utah State shot 50 percent from the field in the game, including 50 percent from beyond the arc on 6-for-12 shooting.

Illinois State (0-1) got off to a slow start offensively, scoring only four points in the game's first nine minutes and dug itself into a 11-4 deficit. However, Guidry hit a three-pointer with 10:35 left in the first half that sparked a 13-5 Redbird run that gave Illinois State its only lead of the first half at 17-16. Guidry scored 11 of the 'Birds 13 points during the run, including three shots from beyond the arc.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah State run with nine points, including three lay-ups.

The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their first 17 second-half points from beyond the arc. Guidry helped lead the charge with three three-pointers, while Gregg Alexander contributed two. Illinois State used the offensive surge to shred the Aggies' halftime lead and close to within two points, 43-41, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game.

Illinois State went into a scoring drought, however, over the game's next six minutes, which allowed the Aggies to build a 10-point lead at 51-41. Penigar led Utah State during the 8-0 run with seven points. Greene scored the Redbirds' next seven points, but Utah State was able to keep Illinois State from getting any closer than eight in the game's closing minutes.
