- Northern Illinois is under the direction of head coach Rob Judson, who graduated from Illinois in 1980. He has a 15-21 record in his second year with the program. Prior to becoming NIU's head coach, Judson served as an assistant coach at Illinois from 1996-2001 and Bradley from 1991-96.
- Northern Illinois returns eight lettermen from last season's team that lost in the first round of the MAC Tournament to Marshall, 97-93. The team has two seniors, four juniors, two sophomores, and five freshmen

Against Jacksonville, Greene registered a career night with 17 points, 11 assists and five rebounds. Greene leads The Valley in dishes with 5.6 assists per game. In his last five games, Greene has handed out 31 assists, while only turning the ball over nine times for a 3.4 assist-to-turnover ratio.

# The Gunning of Alexander

It is highly unlikely that sophomore Gregg Alexander envisions Aaron Burr while delivering a three-pointer, but the Lincoln, III., native is having a duel of his own with the rim. Through seven games, Alexander is shooting 51.4 percent on treys, which would top the Redbird record book for a season. He also has buried 18 triples and is on pace to finish with 72, good for No. 4 all-time.

# Home For the Holidays

Today's game against Northern Illinois is in the middle of the longest homestand for the Redbirds in two seasons and the longest for the remainder of the season - three games. After the Huskies, the 'Birds will open Missouri Valley Conference play at Redbird Arena against Southwest Missouri State on Dec. 29. Under Tom Richardson, Illinois State owns a 19-9 mark in multiple game stretches at home.

# lt's a Small World

With 6-foot-9 Baboucarr Bojang being tabbed a preseason first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, head coach Tom Richardson is probably surprised that his top three scorers are 6-4 or smaller. Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, leads the team with 12.9 points per game, while 6-4 sophomore Gregg Alexander ranks second on the squad with 12.0 tallies per game. Vince Greene, a 5-9 sophomore, is third with 9.0 points per contest.

# 'Tis the Season

It is the time for giving and the Redbirds have been extremely charitable lately. Both sophomores **Trey** Guidry and Vince Greene have dished out career-high 11 assists this season. Guidry passed out the gifts at Kent State, while Greene delivered his presents against Jacksonville. Both Greene and Guidry's 11 assists were the most by a Redbird since Randy Rice's 13 dishes against Evansville on Feb. 12, 2001.

# If History Repeats Itself – Buy Season Tickets Now

In the 74-50 win over Jacksonville, the Redbird underclassmen accounted for 56 points of Illinois State's scoring total. The 56 tallies was the highest total by a group of Redbird sophomores and freshmen since Dec. 9, 1995, when underclassmen totaled 57 points in the Redbirds' 79-59 win over Fairleigh-Dickenson. That group included names like **Rico Hill, Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley, LeRoy Watkins, Rob Gibbons, Kyle Cartmill** and **Kenneth Pierson**. During the 1995-96 season this band of underclassmen didn't have a junior class, either, and eventually went on to participate in two NCAA Tournaments as upperclassmen.

# **Block Party**

Opponents have experienced more rejection from the 'Birds this season than in recent years. Through seven games, the 'Birds are averaging 3.1 blocked shots per game, which ranks No. 6 all-time in the Illinois State record book. Freshman **Marcus Arnold** leads the way with seven blocks, while **Andy Strandmark** and **Baboucarr Bojang** have five and four, respectively. The Redbirds' swat per game average is the highest by the Redbirds since the 1998-99 season, when Illinois State ended with 3.7 blocks per contest.

# Already Worn P.J.'s

When Northern Illinois takes the floor Saturday only one Huskie will have played collegiately in Redbird Arena before, but he used to wear an Illinois State uniform. P.J. Smith lettered for the Redbirds during the 1999-2000 season, **Tom Richardson**'s first year as head coach. Senior **Andy Strandmark** is the only Redbird left that played with Smith during the 10-20 campaign. In 13 games at Redbird Arena, Smith averaged 7.9 points and 3.5 rebounds per game en route to being named to The Valley All-Freshmen Team.

# **Rebounds are on the Rebound**

After being out-rebounded by their opponents in the first five games of the season, the Redbirds have hit the boards in the last two games pretty hard. At Western Kentucky, the 'Birds topped the Toppers 36-33 on the boards, including 15 offensive caroms. Against Jacksonville, Illinois State totaled its highest rebound total of the season with 38 against the Dolphins' 36.

# Haven't Seen This Since the 20¢ Stamp

The last time ISU faced Northern Illinois on the hardwood was 1982. Back then a first-class postage stamp cost 20¢ and the average household income was \$20,171. Kim Carnes had the record of the year with "Bette Davis Eyes" and *Chariots of Fire* won the Academy Award for Best Picture. *E.T. – the Extra-Terrestrial, Tootsie* and *Gandhi* were all in theaters, while Michael Jackson was releasing *Thriller*. Michael Jordan's jumper lifted North Carolina over Georgetown 63-62, in the NCAA Championship game. NIU assistant coach Carl Armato was a starting guard for the Huskies and **Gregg Alexander** was three months old.

# **Big Men Breakout Bids**

The Illinois State careers of current big man **Andy Strandmark** and former Redbird center Brian Kern (1991-95) up to this point are extremely similar and head coach **Tom Richardson** hopes that they continue along the same path. Through his first three seasons, Strandmark has averaged 2.5 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. In that same stretch, Kern averaged 2.9 points and 1.7 boards per game, but in his senior season posted 10.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per contest. Strandmark is currently averaging 6.9 points and 5.3 boards per game, with three double-digit scoring efforts in seven games.

# **Big MAC Attack**

Playing a league member of the Mid-American Conference is nothing new for Illinois State, especially since this is the third this season. Today's game will mark the 248<sup>th</sup> contest against a current affiliate of the MAC. The 'Birds have had their share of success against the MAC with a 151-96 record. The only current member of the 13-team conference that the Redbirds have never faced is Toledo.

# 91 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

Illinois State heads into tonight's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 91 straight games. In fact, in the **Tom Richardson** era the Redbirds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on December 12, 1999. Since Richardson took the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 72 of 97 games.

# **December Drought Ends**

Under head coach **Tom Richardson**, the Redbirds own a 14-12 mark in the month of December. But a 74-50 win over Jacksonville ended a six-game losing skid for the 'Birds during the 12th month of the year. In Redbird Arena, ISU has been dominant under Richardson in the month of December with a 10-3 mark.

# Lamb Leads Illinois State to 54-45 Win

**DEKALB, III.** – Senior center Rick Lamb's 18 points and 14 rebounds Tuesday night at Evans Field House led Illinois State to a 54-45 victory over Northern Illinois.

Lamb's two free throws with 9:20 left put ISU ahead for good before a near-capacity crowd of 6,036, and the Redbirds had eight straight points during a six-minute Huskies' scoring famine to wrap up the decision.

Both teams came in with 1-0 records. The Redbirds had 13 points from Hank Cornley and eight from reserve Raynard Malaine.

The Redbirds shot only 37.5 percent in the first half, when NIU led by as many as five points on Tim Dillon's 12-foot jumper with 7:42 until intermission.

Brad Waller scored 10 points for the Huskies, who missed 10 of 17 free throws while ISU was converting 14 of 17. Northern Illinois had a 34-32 edge in rebounds as Dillon and Bob Thomas grabbed seven each.

Lamb's jumper from the lane seconds before the halftime horn rallied ISU to within 22-21 and his baseline jump shot with 8:49 to play staked the eventual winners to a three-point lead.

Cornley scored from the lane at 5:54 to give Illinois State a 41-36 lead the Huskies didn't again seriously challenge.

Apparently the Missouri Valley Conference's success in the NCAA Tournament is starting to gain the league national recognition and the Redbirds are reaping benefits from it as well. *Sports Illustrated's* forecast of the 65-team NCAA Tournament field included Illinois State at No. 50, while Southern Illinois was No. 30 and Creighton was tabbed for No. 48. The Valley has posted seven NCAA Tournament victories in the last four years, including two teams advancing to the Sweet 16.

# **Bojang One of Valley's Elite**

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

# The Power of Three

As voted by the players, **Gregg Alexander**, **Baboucarr Bojang** and **Vince Greene** will serve as Redbird captains for the 2002-03 season. It is the first time since 1996-97, that Illinois State has had three captains. That year, the 'Birds were led by Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley and Rob Gibbons and went on to earn an NCAA Tournament bid with a 34-6 record.

# Slightly Above Average Valley Year

With 12 league victories last season, it was an "average" year for Illinois State. Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

# International Flair

The 2002 trip to Australia marked the third international tour for the Redbirds. The team traveled to Europe in both 1992 and 1997, before the Australian tour this year. Overseas, the 'Birds have had their share of success with a 12-8 overall mark, but the real story comes in their record after returning home. ISU has posted a combined 44-16 (.733) record with two Missouri Valley Conference regular-season titles in the seasons immediately following the first two trips.

# FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourthstraight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

# We Have a Winner

With a 17-14 record last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

# The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

On November 13, 2002, the Illinois State basketball team added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, Ill • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, Ill. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period. The Redbirds have one scholarship left to fill.

# Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 7-3 record when playing on December 21, one of Illinois State's seven wins happened in 1984 and it is today's Redbird Flashback: **Dec. 21, 1984 • Stockton, Calif.** – In the first round game of the American Savings Classic, Illinois State used 17 points in the overtime period to top Texas A&M 74-66. Lou Stefanovic led the way for the 'Birds with a game-high 25 points and a team-best six boards. Brad Duncan chipped in 16 points for the Redbirds, while Rickie Johnson tossed in 14. The following day, Illinois State topped San Diego in the championship game 77-58, to claim the tournament title.

NORMAL, III. - Vince Greene led all scorers with 16 points, but Illinois State could not pick up the victory, dropping its second and final exhibition game of the season, 66-65, to the EA Sports All-Stars Thursday night at Redbird Arena

Illinois State also got 15 points and 10 rebounds from Baboucarr Bojang, while Andy Strandmark, Gregg Alexander and Trey Guidry each contributed seven points. The 'Birds shot 54 percent from the field in the first half, but managed only 41 percent in the second half on 10-for-24 shooting.

EA Sports, 1-9, only shot 7-for-20 from the charity stripe, including 4-for-15 in the second half. EA Sports was led by former Fighting Illini player Sergio McClain with 13 points, while Doc Taylor, who played at Cleveland State, chipped in 12.

Bojang showed his offensive skills early in the game by scoring nine of the Redbirds' first 11 points, but hot three-point shooting (3for-3) from McClain kept the game tight midway through the first half. ## Redbirds Fall 68-53 to Utah State

NORMAL, III. - Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (.125) free-throw attempts.

Desmond Penigar led Utah State with 22 points, going 4-for-4 from three-point range. Point guard Mark Brown scored 19 points for the Aggies. Utah State shot 50 percent from the field in the game, including 50 percent from beyond the arc on 6-for-12 shooting.

Illinois State (0-1) got off to a slow start offensively, scoring only four points in the game's first nine minutes and dug itself into a 11-4 deficit. However, Guidry hit a three-pointer with 10:35 left in the first half that sparked a 13-5 Redbird run that gave Illinois State its only lead of the first half at 17-16. Guidry scored 11 of the 'Birds 13 points during the run, including three shots from beyond the arc.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah State run with nine points, including three lay-ups. The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their

first 17 second-half points from beyond the arc. Guidry helped lead the charge with three three-pointers, while Gregg Alexander contributed two. Illinois State used the offensive surge to shred the Aggies' halftime lead and close to within two points, 43-41, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game.

Illinois State went into a scoring draught, however, over the game's next six minutes, which allowed the Aggies to build a 10-point lead at 51-41. Penigar led Utah State during the 8-0 run with seven points. ## ISU Loses Third Straight Game, 78-65

NORMAL, III. - Illinois State had five players in double figures, but could not find consistent scoring throughout the game and fell to Illinois-Chicago, 78-65, to lose its third straight game tonight at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State (0-3) was led by Vince Greene and Trey Guidry with 14 points apiece, while Gregg Alexander turned in 12 points for the 'Birds. Freshman Marcus Arnold had a career-high 11 points and six rebounds, while Andy Strandmark was the other Redbird in double figures with 10. Strandmark also led the 'Birds on the boards with a game-high eight rebounds.

UIC (2-1) was led by Martell Bailey with a game-high 20 points, while Armond Williams and Aaron Carr contributed 14 and 11 points respectively. The Flames overpowered Illinois State in the paint winning the scoring battle 38-12 and the rebounding battle 41-27.

Illinois State opened the game on fire shooting 6-for-8 from the field and jumping out to an early 16-7 lead at the 15:58 mark. However, the Illinois State shooting went sour for the remainder of the first half as the Redbirds shot 3-for-19 for the rest of the period.

UIC went on an 11-0 run during the middle stretch of the first half and took its first lead of the game at 21-20 with 7:20 remaining before the break The Flames used the post to their advantage outscoring the 'Birds in the paint 18-4 and winning the rebounding battle as well 24-14 in the first half.

Arnold took Illinois State on his shoulders to open the second half scoring the Redbirds' first eight points to tie the game, 36-36, with 17:24 remaining in the game. Illinois State came out of the locker room with an 11-2 run and a three-pointer by Guidry helped give the 'Birds their first lead since the 7:20 mark of the first half at 39-36. Two more three-pointers by Guidry and Greene respectively kept the game close with just over 14 minutes to play.

Illinois State, however, went into another scoring drought and managed only two points over nearly a six-minute stretch in the middle part of the second half as UIC took back the lead and extended it to nine at 58-49 at the 8:40 mark. The Flames seemed to be unable to miss their field goals in the latter part of the second half and shot 16-for-23 (.696) in the final period, including 10 of their final 11 shots.

# GAME 7

## **Redbirds Shut Down Jacksonville for First Win**

NORMAL, III. – Vince Greene finished with 17 points and a career-high 11 assists as Illinois State got the monkey off its back and earned its first win of the season in convincing fashion 74-50 at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State (1-6) also had Gregg Alexander in double figures with 15 points, including a 3-for-4 performance from beyond the arc. Baboucarr Bojang finished with a game-high eight rebounds, while the 'Birds had three other players score eight points apiece.

The Redbirds were able to get their interior game on the right track outscoring the Dolphins 36-12 in the paint. The Illinois State defense also played exceptionally well keeping Jacksonville without a field goal for over seven minutes in the second half.

Jacksonville (4-6) was led by James Daniels with a game-high 18 points, coming from a career-high tying six three-pointers. Daniels was the only Dolphin in double figures with Kevin Sheppard and Calvin Warner contributing nine points apiece.

Things looked bleak early on as the Redbirds came out flat, connecting on only two of their first 10 shots from the field and falling behind 12-6. However, Greene sparked a 10-2 run with back-to-back jumpers that helped give the 'Birds their first lead of the game at 16-14 with 10:39 remaining before halftime.

Illinois State shot 60 percent (12-for-20) for the remaining 13 minutes of the first half led by 10 points from Alexander, including two three pointers. Greene finished the first half with six assists

and the Redbird defense was able to force 10 Jacksonville turnovers. The second half was all Illinois State as the Redbirds outscored the Dolphins 39-24, including a 26-6 run, and forced nine turnovers.
