About The Game: It is final game of the Redbirds' three-game homestand. Illinois State has already dropped four games at Redbird Arena this season. This is the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both squads. SMS had its two-game winning streak snapped at SE Missouri State and is 2-1 on the road this season. Series History: This is the 39th meeting between the two schools and Illinois State holds a 24-14 advantage.

Last Meeting: Despite a 36-23 halftime lead, Illinois State wasn't able to hold on to defeat SMS in Springfield, Mo., on Feb. 2, 2002. The Bears shot 63 percent in the second frame and posted 45 points in the final 20 minutes to rally for a 68-63 win. Baboucarr Bojang led the 'Birds with 13 points, while Gregg Alexander and Shawn Jeppson each dumped in 10. SMS' Scott Brakebill tossed in a game-high 20 points to lead the Bears.

THE COACHES

Tom Richardson (St. Xavier '77) is 49-50 in his fourth season at Illinois State. He is assisted by Chad Altadonna, Lance Irvin and Kirk Sarff. Richardson is 31-28 against Valley opponents, 18-22 vs. non-conference foes, 32-14 at home, 12-30 on the road and 5-6 on neutral floors.

Barry Hinson (Oklahoma State '83) is in his fourth season at SMS. He owns a 56-47 record with the Bears and is 92-70 in his six-year career after a two-year stint Oral Roberts.

About the SMS Bears

- Southwest Missouri State is located in Springfield, Missouri, and enrolls 20,497 students. The Bears are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- SMS is under the direction of head coach Barry Hinson, who graduated from Oklahoma State in 1983. He has a 56-47 record in his fourth year with the program. Hinson has a career record of 92-70 amassed over a period of five years and currently ranks eighth on the SMS coaching win list.
- SMS has been an NCAA Division I program for 21 years and owns a 392-228 mark since.
- The Bears joined the Missouri Valley Conference in 1990 and have posted a 128-86 regular-season record.
- · The Bears have had three games go to overtime so far this season. SMS owns a 2-1 mark in those games.
- SMS has three seniors among the six lettermen that return from last year's team: Travis Walk, Terrance McGee and Jason Gilbert.
- Terrance McGee has been the leader for the Bears through the early part of the season averaging 16.1 points and 5.1 assists per game through the team's first eight games.
- Monwell Randle, a junior center from Country Club Hills, III., has paced SMS on the boards this season averaging 8.4 rebounds per game.

For Openers ...

Since starting Missouri Valley Conference play in the 1981-82 season, the Redbirds own a 11-10 mark in league openers. Under head coach Tom Richardson, the Redbirds are 0-3 in conference starters.

... And For Starters

In eight games, the Redbirds have already courted seven different starting combinations. Eight players have been used to make up the seven various blends with Gregg Alexander being the only player to draw a start in all eight games. The lone starting lineup that was matched joined for a pair of losses against Illinois-Chicago and Chattanooga.

Home For the Holidays

Today's game against SMS is in the third and final game of the longest homestand for the Redbirds in two seasons and their longest for the remainder of the season - three games. After the game against SMS, the Redbirds return to the road to face Southern Illinois and Northern Iowa. Under Tom Richardson, Illinois State owns a 19-10 mark in multiple game stretches at home.

It IS Easy Being Greene

Kermit the Frog might not agree, but for sophomore point guard Vince Greene it is easy when he gets his teammates involved. Greene ranks second in The Valley in assists with 5.0 dishes per game. In his last six games, Greene has handed out 32 assists, while only turning the ball over 12 times. In the last two contests, Greene has posted 17 and 16-point scoring efforts and has five double-digit scoring games on the season.

Consistently Inconsistent

The Redbirds have six players that have started five or more games, but head coach Tom Richardson is still looking for a consistent scoring trend. Of the six players, each one has scored at least 11 points in a game, while also tossing in as few as three tallies in a game.

It's a Small World

With 6-foot-9 Baboucarr Bojang being tabbed a preseason first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, head coach Tom Richardson is probably surprised that his top three scorers are 6-4 or smaller. Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, leads the team with 13.6 points per game, while 6-4 sophomore Gregg Alexander ranks second on the squad with 11.0 tallies per game. Vince Greene, a 5-9 sophomore, is third with 9.9 points per contest.



Greenbirds

Prior to this season, the 13 players currently on the Illinois State roster had combined for a total of 240 game played, or just 18.5 games per player, or roughly half of one season. Moreover, of the 13 now playing, seven had never played in an ISU game prior to this season and six had never played in a college game.

On Guard

The Redbirds, offensively, have definitely been driven by guard play so far this season. Sophomores **Trey Guidry**, **Gregg Alexander** and **Vince Greene** have accounted for 55.4 percent of Illinois State's scoring this season. The threesome has also combined for 51 treys and is shooting 41.5 percent from behind the arc.

'Tis the Season

It is the time for giving and the Redbirds have been extremely charitable lately. Both sophomores **Trey Guidry** and **Vince Greene** have dished out career-high 11 assists this season. Guidry passed out the gifts at Kent State, while Greene delivered his presents against Jacksonville. Both Greene and Guidry's 11 assists were the most by a Redbird since Randy Rice's 13 dishes against Evansville on Feb. 12, 2001.

A Long December

Under head coach **Tom Richardson**, the Redbirds own a 14-13 mark in the month of December. Including a 74-50 win over Jacksonville, the Redbirds have lost seven of their last eight games during the 12th month. However in Redbird Arena, the 'Birds have been dominant under Richardson in December with a 10-4 mark.

Time and the Minutes Are On Their Side

Just slightly less than 75 percent of the minutes (72.3%) logged so far this season (1,157 of a possible 1,600) are by players that have at least two years of eligibility AFTER this season. The top three minute-getters are **Gregg Alexander** (247), **Trey Guidry** (238) and **Vince Greene** (225) – all sophomores.

If History Repeats Itself – Buy Season Tickets Now

In the 74-50 win over Jacksonville, the Redbird underclassmen accounted for 56 points of Illinois State's scoring total. The 56 tallies was the highest total by a group of Redbird sophomores and freshmen since Dec. 9, 1995, when underclassmen totaled 57 points in the Redbirds' 79-59 win over Fairleigh-Dickenson. That group included names like **Rico Hill, Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley, LeRoy Watkins, Rob Gibbons, Kyle Cartmill** and **Kenneth Pierson**. During the 1995-96 season this band of underclassmen didn't have a junior class, either, and eventually went on to participate in two NCAA Tournaments as upperclassmen.

Block Party

Opponents have experienced more rejection from the 'Birds this season than in recent years. Through eight games, the 'Birds are averaging 3.4 blocked shots per game, which ranks No. 5 all-time in the Illinois State record book. Freshman **Marcus Arnold** leads the way with eight blocks, while **Andy Strandmark** and **Baboucarr Bojang** have six and five, respectively. The Redbirds' swat per game average is the highest by the Redbirds since the 1998-99 season, when Illinois State ended with 3.7 blocks per contest.

Resistance Has Been Futile

Illinois State's 2-3 zone limited Jacksonville to 31.6 percent shooting, but against Northern Illinois, the ISU defense was torched for a shooting percentage of 50% or better in the second half for the sixth time in seven games. In the 7 losses, ISU foes have shot 94-for-163 in the second half – for an insuperable 57.7%.

Big Men Breakout Bids

The Illinois State careers of current big man **Andy Strandmark** and former Redbird center Brian Kern (1991-95) up to this point are extremely similar and head coach **Tom Richardson** hopes that they continue along the same path. Through his first three seasons, Strandmark has averaged 2.5 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. In that same stretch, Kern averaged 2.9 points and 1.7 boards per game, but in his senior season posted 10.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per contest. Strandmark is currently averaging 6.6 points and 5.4 boards per game, with three double-digit scoring efforts in eight games.

Rebound Revival Rooted

The Redbirds had won the rebound battle in back-to-back games after starting the campaign being outrebounded by their foes in the first five games. That string of change came to an end against Northern Illinois when the Huskies topped the 'Birds in caroms 38-30. The Redbirds are averaging 29.5 rebounds per game and have been out-rebounded 5.1 boards per contest.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

SMS Comes Alive in Second Half, Defeats Redbirds 68-63

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Southwest Missouri State found their offense in the second half and used it to score 45 points and rally to defeat Illinois State, 68-63, tonight at the Hammons Center in Springfield, Mo.

The Bears, 11-12, 6-5 MVC, shot 63 percent from the field in the second half compared to the 27 percent they shot in the first half. Senior Scott Brakebill led SMS in scoring with 20 points, while senior Mike Wallace just missed a double-double with 17 points and nine rebounds. Junior Terrance McGee chipped in 16 points and six assists for the Bears.

Illinois State, 10-12, 6-5 MVC, was led in scoring and rebounding by Baboucarr Bojang with 13 points and nine boards respectively. Gread Alexander and Shawn Jeposon each contributed 10 points.

The Birds had a 36-23 lead at halftime and shot 63 percent from beyond the arc in the first half, but managed only 36 percent from the field for the rest of the game.

92 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

Illinois State heads into tonight's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 92 straight games. In fact, in the **Tom Richardson** era the Redbirds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on December 12, 1999. Since Richardson took the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 73 of 98 games.

A SI of Relief

Whew! Apparently the Missouri Valley Conference's success in the NCAA Tournament is starting to gain the league national recognition and the Redbirds are reaping benefits from it as well. *Sports Illustrated's* forecast of the 65-team NCAA Tournament field included Illinois State at No. 50, while Southern Illinois was No. 30 and Creighton was tabbed for No. 48. The Valley has posted seven NCAA Tournament victories in the last four years, including two teams advancing to the Sweet 16.

Bojang One of Valley's Elite

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

The Power of Three

As voted by the players, **Gregg Alexander**, **Baboucarr Bojang** and **Vince Greene** will serve as Redbird captains for the 2002-03 season. It is the first time since 1996-97, that Illinois State has had three captains. That year, the 'Birds were led by Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley and Rob Gibbons and went on to earn an NCAA Tournament bid with a 34-6 record.

Slightly Above Average Valley Year

With 12 league victories last season, it was an "average" year for Illinois State. Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

International Flair

The 2002 trip to Australia marked the third international tour for the Redbirds. The team traveled to Europe in both 1992 and 1997, before the Australian tour this year. Overseas, the 'Birds have had their share of success with a 12-8 overall mark, but the real story comes in their record after returning home. ISU has posted a combined 44-16 (.733) record with two Missouri Valley Conference regular-season titles in the seasons immediately following the first two trips.

FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourthstraight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

We Have a Winner

With a 17-14 record last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

On November 13, 2002, the Illinois State basketball team added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, Ill • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, Ill. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period. The Redbirds have one scholarship left to fill.

Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 7-8 record when playing on December 29, one of Illinois State's seven wins happened in 1987 and it is today's Redbird Flashback: **Dec. 29, 1987 • Oklahoma City, Okla.** – Powered by Jeff Harris' career-high 30 points, Illinois State overcame a 16-point deficit in the second half to beat No. 14 Iowa 89-88, in the first round of the All-College Tournament. Harris, who had trouble breathing because of bronchitis, and Matt Taphorn, who was battling a stress fracture in his right leg, combined for 12-of-19 shooting on treys. Taphorn finished with a career-high 25 points, including the game-winning three-pointer with three ticks left on the clock.

Greene Leads 'Birds in Exhibition Win

NORMAL, III. – Sophomore point guard Vince Greene scored a game-high 26 points, including six three-pointers, as Illinois State won its first exhibition of the season, 89-70, over SIU-Edwardsville at Redbird Arena.

Baboucarr Bojang finished with 14 points and six rebounds for the 'Birds, while true freshman Chris Burras came off the bench to score 12.

SIU-Edwardsville was led by Ron Jones with 19 points, 17 of which came in the second half. Rob Baumgardner and Ben Garwitz each contributed 13 points, and Baumgardner also led the Cougars in rebounding with six boards. The Cougars never led in the entire game and after the initial 12-point deficit never got closer than seven points.

Illinois State opened up the game with a 12-0 run, highlighted by two three-pointers and a cross-over lay-up by Greene. The 'Birds defense forced eight Cougar turnovers in the first 12 minutes of the game, including the team's first two possessions.

Greene led all scorers in the first half with 10 points, while Gregg Alexander chipped in eight first half points on 3-for-4 shooting. ISU shot 61 percent from the field in the first half, including 5-for-8 from beyond the arc.

Down 45-24 at halftime, the Cougars came out firing in the second half and outscored the 'Birds 26-15 over the first 8:30 minutes led by nine points apiece by junior Ron Jones and freshman Logan Glosser narrowing the Redbird lead to 10. Following a timeout with 11:05 remaining in the game, the 'Birds went on a 13-0 run to extend their lead back to 23, which tied their largest lead of the night.

NORMAL, III. – Vince Greene led all scorers with 16 points, but Illinois State could not pick up the victory, dropping its second and final exhibition game of the season, 66-65, to the EA Sports All-Stars Thursday night at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State also got 15 points and 10 rebounds from Baboucarr Bojang, while Andy Strandmark, Gregg Alexander and Trey Guidry each contributed seven points. The 'Birds shot 54 percent from the field in the first half, but managed only 41 percent in the second half on 10-for-24 shooting.

EA Sports, 1-9, only shot 7-for-20 from the charity stripe, including 4-for-15 in the second half. EA Sports was led by former Fighting Illini player Sergio McClain with 13 points, while Doc Taylor, who played at Cleveland State, chipped in 12.

Bojang showed his offensive skills early in the game by scoring nine of the Redbirds' first 11 points, but hot three-point shooting (3for-3) from McClain kept the game tight midway through the first half. Back-to-back jumpers from Greene helped ignite a 13-5 run to take the lead at 24-20 with just over seven minutes remaining.

Marcus Arnold hit two low-post jumpers late in the first half and the Redbirds went into the half with a one-point lead, 36-35. Bojang and McClain led their respective teams in first-half scoring with 11 points.

EA Sports scored 14 points of its first 19 points in the second half off lay-ups or dunks and were able to take a 54-47 lead, the largest of the night for either team, with just under nine minutes left in the game. However, the 'Birds went on an 11-2 run over the next 3:37 led by four points from Gregg Alexander to take the lead at 58-56 with five minutes remaining.

Redbirds Fall 68-53 to Utah State

NORMAL, III. – Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (.125) free-throw attempts.

Desmond Penigar led Utah State with 22 points, going 4-for-4 from three-point range. Point guard Mark Brown scored 19 points for the Aggies. Utah State shot 50 percent from the field in the game, including 50 percent from beyond the arc on 6-for-12 shooting.

Illinois State (0-1) got off to a slow start offensively, scoring only four points in the game's first nine minutes and dug itself into a 11-4 deficit. However, Guidry hit a three-pointer with 10:35 left in the first half that sparked a 13-5 Redbird run that gave Illinois State its only lead of the first half at 17-16. Guidry scored 11 of the 'Birds 13 points during the run, including three shots from beyond the arc.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah State run with nine points, including three lay-ups. The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their

The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their first 17 second-half points from beyond the arc. Guidry helped lead the charge with three three-pointers, while Gregg Alexander contributed two. Illinois State used the offensive surge to shred the Aggies' halftime lead and close to within two points, 43-41, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game.

Illinois State went into a scoring draught, however, over the game's next six minutes, which allowed the Aggies to build a 10-point lead at 51-41. Penigar led Utah State during the 8-0 run with seven points. Greene scored the Redbirds' next seven points, but Utah State was able to keep Illinois State from getting any closer than eight in the game's closing minutes.

NORMAL, III. - Illinois State had five players in double figures, but could not find consistent scoring throughout the game and fell to Illinois-Chicago, 78-65, to lose its third straight game tonight at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State (0-3) was led by Vince Greene and Trey Guidry with 14 points apiece, while Gregg Alexander turned in 12 points for the 'Birds. ISU was led by Gregg Alexander who had 18 points, the only Redbird player to post double digits. Vince Greene chipped in six and Trey Guidry had five. WKU was led by Nate Williams, who led all scorers with 20 points, and Patrick Sparks added 10.

The Redbirds scored 20 points in the first half and trailed 25-20 at halftime, but the Hilltoppers came out on fire in the second, taking a commanding 13-point lead before the 'Birds scored their first field goal of the half.

The Redbirds came to within 10 with twelve minutes to play but Western Kentucky answered, going on a seven-point run, leading 44-27 with nine left in the game.

ISU shot 27.6% from the field on the game, including 25% in the second half. They were 16-of-58 from the field.

NORMAL, III. – Vince Greene finished with 17 points and a career-high 11 assists as Illinois State got the monkey off its back and earned its first win of the season in convincing fashion 74-50 at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State (1-6) also had Gregg Alexander in double figures with 15 points, including a 3-for-4 performance from beyond the arc. Baboucarr Bojang finished with a game-high eight rebounds, while the 'Birds had three other players score eight points apiece.

The Redbirds were able to get their interior game on the right track outscoring the Dolphins 36-12 in the paint. The Illinois State defense also played exceptionally well keeping Jacksonville without a field goal for over seven minutes in the second half.

Jacksonville (4-6) was led by James Daniels with a game-high 18 points, coming from a career-high tying six three-pointers. Daniels was the only Dolphin in double figures with Kevin Sheppard and Calvin Warner contributing nine points apiece.

Things looked bleak early on as the Redbirds came out flat, connecting on only two of their first 10 shots from the field and falling behind 12-6. However, Greene sparked a 10-2 run with back-to-back jumpers that helped give the 'Birds their first lead of the game at 16-14 with 10:39 remaining before halftime.

Illinois State shot 60 percent (12-for-20) for the remaining 13 minutes of the first half led by 10 points from Alexander, including two three pointers. Greene finished the first half with six assists and the Redbird defense was able to force 10 Jacksonville turnovers.

The second half was all Illinois State as the Redbirds outscored the Dolphins 39-24, including a 26-6 run, and forced nine turnovers.

Redbirds Fall to Northern Illinois

NORMAL, III. – Trey Guidry had four three-pointers in the second half and finished with a game-high 19 points, but Illinois State could not overcome a 17-point second half deficit and fell to Northern Illinois, 72-65, in non-conference basketball action at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Redbird to score in double figures with 16 points. Freshman Marcus Arnold finished with nine points and six rebounds, but the Birds committed 18 turnovers and were outrebounded by the Huskies, 38-30.

Freshman Todd Peterson had a career-high 18 points on six threepointers for Northern Illinois. Former Redbird P.J. Smith scored 16 for the Huskies, including three from beyond the arc. Jay Bates also scored in double figures for NIU with 17 points.

ISU jumped out to an early 7-2 lead sparked by a three-pointer by Greene. However, turnovers hampered the 'Birds in the first half and the Huskies were able to pull ahead 14-12 on a three-point basket by Anthony Maestranzi with 11:41 remaining before halftime.

The two teams battled back-and-forth for the lead over the game's next seven minutes, but with just over four minutes remaining Todd Peterson hit a three-pointer to spark a 13-4 Huskie run to end the half and give NIU a 31-24 advantage heading into the break. Greene led the Redbirds into the lockerroom with nine first-half points on perfect 3-for-3 shooting from the field, including 2-for-2 from the line.

The Huskies came out firing in the second half outscoring the 'Birds 13-4 in the first five minutes and keeping Illinois State without a field goal. Peterson hit two three-pointers to pace the NIU run. Greene hit a jumper from the left baseline to give the Redbirds their first field goal and bring ISU to within 14 points, 44-30, with 14:34 remaining in the game.
