The Redbirds have lost two straight and four straight away from Redbird Arena dating back to last season. Southern Illinois has won three of the last four meetings at SIU Arena. Series History: This is the 119th meeting between the two schools and Southern Illinois leads the series 60-58.

It is the longest series in the history of both programs. The two teams split the season series last season with both teams winning at home. Illinois State has won three of the last four meetings.

Last Meeting: Shawn Jeppson led a balanced attack with 22 points to lead Illinois State past Southern Illinois 84-70, at Redbird Arena on Feb. 16, 2002. Gregg Alexander and Shedrick Ford each tossed in 17 points, while Baboucarr Bojang dumped in 13 points and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds. Kent Williams led SIU with 27 points and Rolan Roberts chipped in 22. The 'Birds shot 61 percent from the field in the first half.

the Dawgs won 20-straight at SIU Arena between Feb. 11, 1992 and Dec. 16, 1993.

For Road Openers ...

Since starting Missouri Valley Conference play in the 1981-82 season, the Redbirds own a 9-12 mark in league road openers. Under head coach Tom Richardson, ISU is 1-2 in conference road starters.

Home Sour Home

With eight more home games on the schedule, the Redbirds are already one loss away from tying the second-most losses at Redbird Arena with six. In 1998-99 and 1999-2000, the 'Birds dropped six games in Redbird Arena, The 1990-91 Illinois State team finished with a 3-10 mark at home for the worst home record.

Watching Out For No. 1

The Redbirds are still looking for their first win on an opponents floor. Thus far, Illinois State is 0-3 in enemy arenas. The latest the 'Birds have gone in a season until recording their first road win is January 25. The 1979-80 edition of the Redbirds got their first road win of the season over Howard 72-61, on Jan. 25, 1980. That team finished 20-9 on the year and the Howard game was only the fifth road game of the season.

It's Easy Being Greene

Kermit the Frog might not agree, but for point guard Vince Greene it is easy when he gets his teammates involved. Greene ranks fourth in The Valley in assists with 4.6 dishes per game. In his last seven games, Greene has handed out 33 assists, while only turning the ball over 17 times. In the last three contests, Greene has posted 17, 16 and 14-point scoring efforts and has six double-digit scoring games on the season.

Consistently Inconsistent

The Redbirds have six players that have started six or more games, but head coach Tom Richardson is still looking for a consistent scoring trend. Of the six players, each one has scored at least 11 points in a game, while also tossing in as few as three tallies in a game. The six have also combined for 12 games where they have scored three points or less.

It's a Small World

With 6-foot-9 Baboucarr Bojang being tabbed a preseason first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, head coach Tom Richardson is probably surprised that his top three scorers are 6-4 or smaller. Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, leads the team with 12.4 points per game, while 5-9 sophomore Vince Greene is second with 10.3 points per contest. Gregg Alexander, a 6-4 sophomore, ranks third on the squad with 9.8 tallies per game.



Greenbirds

Prior to this season, the 13 players currently on the Illinois State roster had combined for a total of 240 game played, or just 18.5 games per player, or roughly half of one season. Moreover, of the 13 now playing, seven had never played in an ISU game prior to this season and six had never played in a college game.

On Guard

The Redbirds, offensively, have definitely been driven by guard play so far this season. Sophomores **Trey Guidry**, **Gregg Alexander** and **Vince Greene** have accounted for 41.6 percent of Illinois State's scoring this season. The threesome has also combined for 53 treys and is shooting 41.1 percent from behind the arc.

'Tis the Season

It is the time for giving and the Redbirds have been extremely charitable lately. Both sophomores **Trey Guidry** and **Vince Greene** have dished out career-high 11 assists this season. Guidry passed out the gifts at Kent State, while Greene delivered his presents against Jacksonville. Both Greene and Guidry's 11 assists were the most by a Redbird since Randy Rice's 13 dishes against Evansville on Feb. 12, 2001.

Time and the Minutes Are On Their Side

Just slightly less than 75 percent of the minutes (72.3%) logged so far this season (1,301 of a possible 1,800) are by players that have at least two years of eligibility AFTER this season. The top three minute-getters are **Gregg Alexander** (269), **Trey Guidry** (266) and **Vince Greene** (248) – all sophomores.

If History Repeats Itself – Buy Season Tickets Now

In the 74-50 win over Jacksonville, the Redbird underclassmen accounted for 56 points of Illinois State's scoring total. The 56 tallies was the highest total by a group of Redbird sophomores and freshmen since Dec. 9, 1995, when underclassmen totaled 57 points in the Redbirds' 79-59 win over Fairleigh-Dickenson. That group included names like **Rico Hill, Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley, LeRoy Watkins, Rob Gibbons, Kyle Cartmill** and **Kenneth Pierson**. During the 1995-96 season this band of underclassmen didn't have a junior class, either, and eventually went on to participate in two NCAA Tournaments as upperclassmen.

Block Party

Opponents have experienced more rejection from the 'Birds this season than in recent years. Through nine games, the 'Birds are averaging 3.4 blocked shots per game, which ranks No. 5 all-time in the Illinois State record book. Freshman **Marcus Arnold** leads the way with eight blocks, while **Andy Strandmark** and **Baboucarr Bojang** have seven and six, respectively. The Redbirds' swat per game average is the highest by the Redbirds since the 1998-99 season, when Illinois State ended with 3.7 blocks per contest.

Resistance Has Been Futile

Illinois State's 2-3 zone limited Jacksonville to 31.6 percent shooting, but against SMS, the ISU defense was torched for a shooting percentage of 50% or better in the second half for the eight time in nine games. In the eight losses, ISU foes have shot 108-for-185 in the second half – for an insuperable 58.4%.

Big Men Breakout Bids

The Illinois State careers of current big man **Andy Strandmark** and former Redbird center Brian Kern (1991-95) up to this point are extremely similar and head coach **Tom Richardson** hopes that they continue along the same path. Through his first three seasons, Strandmark has averaged 2.5 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. In that same stretch, Kern averaged 2.9 points and 1.7 boards per game, but in his senior season posted 10.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per contest. Strandmark is currently averaging 6.3 points and 5.1 boards per game, with three double-digit scoring efforts in eight games.

Rebound Revival Rooted

The Redbirds had won the rebound battle in back-to-back games after starting the campaign being outrebounded by their foes in the first five games. That string has come to an end in the last two outings against Northern Illinois and SMS. The Redbirds are averaging 28.2 rebounds per game, which is the lowest total in Illinois State's Division I history, and have been out-rebounded 6.2 boards per contest.

93 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

Illinois State heads into today's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 93 straight games. In fact, in the **Tom Richardson** era the Redbirds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on December 12, 1999. Since Richardson took the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 73 of 100 games.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Redbirds Upend SIU, 84-70

NORMAL, III. – Shawn Jeppson led a balanced attack with 22 points to lead Illinois State past Southern Illinois 84-70 in a battle of two first-division teams in the Missouri Valley Conference Saturday at Redbird Arena.

Jeppson's play was backed by Gregg Alexander and Shedrick Ford with 17 points and Baboucarrr Bojang with 13 and a team-high nine rebounds. Kent Williams led the Salukis with 27 points and Rolan Roberts had 22, but the Salukis had to battle an energized Illinois State team which scored a season-high 84 points, made 27 of 33 free throws, plus an active crowd of 9,451, largest of the year at Redbird Arena, celebrating a tribute to State Senator John Maitland.

The Redbirds, 14-12 overall, 10-5 in the Valley, won for the eighth time in their last nine games and avenged a 79-58 drubbing Jan. 5 in Carbondale. Southern Illinois, 21-6 overall, 11-4 in the Valley, has lost back-to-back games for the first time this season. The Salukis now trail league-leader Creighton by two games. The two teams meet Wednesday in Carbondale.

Illinois State shot 61 percent from the field in the first half as Jeppson made all five of his field goals to help the 'Birds to a 43-30 halftime lead. ISU held that lead at 47-34 when Southern Illinois made its move, going on a 14-2 run to cut the margin to 49-48 on Kent Williams' layup with 12:56 left.

Apparently the Missouri Valley Conference's success in the NCAA Tournament is starting to gain the league national recognition and the Redbirds are reaping benefits from it as well. *Sports Illustrated's* forecast of the 65-team NCAA Tournament field included Illinois State at No. 50, while Southern Illinois was No. 30 and Creighton was tabbed for No. 48. The Valley has posted seven NCAA Tournament victories in the last four years, including two teams advancing to the Sweet 16.

Bojang One of Valley's Elite

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

Slightly Above Average Valley Year

With 12 league victories last season, it was an "average" year for Illinois State. Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

International Flair

The 2002 trip to Australia marked the third international tour for ISU. The team traveled to Europe in both 1992 and 1997, before the Australian tour this year. Overseas, the 'Birds have had their share of success with a 12-8 overall mark, but the real story comes in their record after returning home. ISU posted a combined 44-16 (.733) record with two Valley regular-season titles in the seasons following the first two trips.

FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourthstraight season. This year the Redbirds are a little below the plateau with a 68.4 percentage through the first nine games. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

We Have a Winner

With a 17-14 record last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Neil Plank transferred to ISU from Wisconsin, but cannot play for the 'Birds until the 2003-04 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. In 27 games, Plank scored 25 points in 173 minutes for UW.

The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

On November 13, 2002, the Illinois State basketball team added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, III • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, III. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period. The Redbirds have one scholarship left to fill.

Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 7-0 record when playing on January 4, one of Illinois State's seven wins happened in 1998 and it is today's Redbird Flashback: **Jan. 4, 1998 • Normal, III.** – Illinois State got 19 points from Dan Muller as the Redbirds topped Pacific and eventual NBA No. 1 draft pick Michael Olowakandi 64-63 at Redbird Arena. With the Redbirds leading 59-58, Kyle Cartmill added a 3-pointer with a minute left to push the ISU lead to 62-58. Jamar Smiley added a pair of free throws to seal the win. Olowakandi finished with a game-high 20 points to lead Pacific, while Cartmill chipped in 11 points and LeRoy Watkins added nine.

SIU-Edwardsville was led by Ron Jones with 19 points, 17 of which came in the second half. Rob Baumgardner and Ben Garwitz each contributed 13 points, and Baumgardner also led the Cougars in rebounding with six boards. The Cougars never led in the entire game and after the initial 12-point deficit never got closer than seven points.

Illinois State opened up the game with a 12-0 run, highlighted by two three-pointers and a cross-over lay-up by Greene. The 'Birds defense forced eight Cougar turnovers in the first 12 minutes of the game, including the team's first two possesssions.

Greene led all scorers in the first half with 10 points, while Gregg Alexander chipped in eight first half points on 3-for-4 shooting. ISU shot 61 percent from the field in the first half, including 5-for-8 from beyond the arc

Down 45-24 at halftime, the Cougars came out firing in the second half and outscored the 'Birds 26-15 over the first 8:30 minutes led by nine points apiece by junior Ron Jones and freshman Logan Glosser narrowing the Redbird lead to 10. Following a timeout with 11:05 remaining in the game, the 'Birds went on a 13-0 run to extend their lead back to 23, which tied their largest lead of the night

Redbirds Fall 68-53 to Utah State

NORMAL, III. - Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (.125) free-throw attempts.

Desmond Penigar led Utah State with 22 points, going 4-for-4 from three-point range. Point guard Mark Brown scored 19 points for the Aggies. Utah State shot 50 percent from the field in the game, including 50 percent from beyond the arc on 6-for-12 shooting.

Illinois State (0-1) got off to a slow start offensively, scoring only four points in the game's first nine minutes and dug itself into a 11-4 deficit. However, Guidry hit a three-pointer with 10:35 left in the first half that sparked a 13-5 Redbird run that gave Illinois State its only lead of the first half at 17-16. Guidry scored 11 of the 'Birds 13 points during the run, including three shots from beyond the arc.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah State run with nine points, including three lay-ups. The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their

first 17 second-half points from beyond the arc. Guidry helped lead the charge with three three-pointers, while Gregg Alexander contributed two. Illinois State used the offensive surge to shred the Aggies' halftime lead and close to within two points, 43-41, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game.

Illinois State went into a scoring draught, however, over the game's next six minutes, which allowed the Aggies to build a 10-point lead at 51-41. Penigar led Utah State during the 8-0 run with seven points. Greene scored the Redbirds' next seven points, but Utah State was able to keep Illinois State from getting any closer than eight in the game's closing minutes

NORMAL, III. – Trey Guidry had four three-pointers in the second half and finished with a game-high 19 points, but Illinois State could not overcome a 17-point second half deficit and fell to Northern Illinois, 72-65, in non-conference basketball action at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Redbird to score in double figures with 16 points. Freshman Marcus Arnold finished with nine points and six rebounds, but the Birds committed 18 turnovers and were outrebounded by the Huskies, 38-30.

Freshman Todd Peterson had a career-high 18 points on six threepointers for Northern Illinois. Former Redbird PJ. Smith scored 16 for the Huskies, including three from beyond the arc. Jay Bates also scored in double figures for NIU with 17 points.

ISU jumped out to an early 7-2 lead sparked by a three-pointer by Greene. However, turnovers hampered the 'Birds in the first half and the Huskies were able to pull ahead 14-12 on a three-point basket by Anthony Maestranzi with 11:41 remaining before halftime.

The two teams battled back-and-forth for the lead over the game's next seven minutes, but with just over four minutes remaining Todd Peterson hit a three-pointer to spark a 13-4 Huskie run to end the half and give NIU a 31-24 advantage heading into the break. Greene led the Redbirds into the lockerroom with nine first-half points on perfect 3-for-3 shooting from the field, including 2-for-2 from the line.

The Huskies came out firing in the second half outscoring the 'Birds 13-4 in the first five minutes and keeping Illinois State without a field goal. Peterson hit two three-pointers to pace the NIU run. Greene hit a jumper from the left baseline to give the Redbirds their first field goal and bring ISU to within 14 points, 44-30, with 14:34 remaining in the game.

ISU Suffers Worst Defeat at Redbird Arena

NORMAL, III. – Vince Greene and Marcus Arnold each scored 14 points, but Illinois State suffered its worst defeat ever in Redbird Arena falling 76-48 to Southwest Missouri State in the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both teams.

Illinois State (1-8, 0-1 MVC) shot only 37 percent (15-of-41) from the field in the game and Greene and Arnold were the only two Redbirds in double figures. The Birds were outrebounded 33-18 and committed 18 turnovers.

SMS (4-5, 1-0 MVC) made 28 of its 47 shot attempts (60 percent) and was able to score 27 points off of Redbird turnovers. Terrance McGee led the Bears with 17 points and five assists, while Merrill Andrews contributed 13 points. Nine different players on the SMS roster scored at least three points in the game.

SMS opened the game with eight unanswered points, including two three-pointers by McGee. Greene got the Redbirds on the scoreboard with a trey at the 16:33 mark, but the Bears continued to put up the points outscoring ISU 21-7 in the game's first ten minutes.

Rebert Harris came off the bench and hit a jumper with 6:08 remaining in the first half to spark a 5-0 run for the 'Birds, but ISU could only manage free throws the rest of the way and went into halftime down, 38-18, following a 3-point bucket by Jason Gilbert as time expired.

The Redbird offense came alive in the second half scoring 10 points in the first three minutes, including six points by Arnold. However, the 'Birds could not keep the points coming and SMS went on a 10-1 run over next five minutes to give the Bears their largest lead of the game at 23 points, 52-29.

The Bears were able to extend their lead to over 30 points during the remainder of the game before sealing the 28-point victory.
