About The Game: Illinois State enters today's game winners in eight of its last nine games, while Wichita State has lost six of its last eight. This is the second meeting of the season between the two teams. The teams met on January 7, and Illinois State won in Redbird Arena 81-71. The Shockers have won seven of their last eight in Wichita and own a 9-3 record at home this season. If the league standings stay in place, these two teams would face each other in the first round of the conference tournament.

About Wichita State

- Wichita State is located in Wichita, Kan., and enrolls 14,810 students. The Shockers are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Head coach Mark Turgeon is in his second season at Wichita State. He owns a 22-32 record with the Shockers after serving as a head coach at Jacksonville State for two seasons. Prior to becoming a head coach, Turgeon was an assistant at Oregon for five seasons and Kansas for five seasons.
- Wichita State has lost two straight with an overtime loss at Northern Iowa (83-75) and last-second defeat at Creighton (69-67).
- Freshmen Randy Burns and Jamar Howard lead the Shockers offensive attack. Burns averages 12 points per game and is shooting 41.2% on treys. Howard chips in 10.9 points and 5.4 boards per game. His rebounds rank second overall.
- Burns has the most 3-point attempts on the team with 119. Three-pointers account for 49% of his shot attempts.
- Howard leads the team with 133 free throw attempts, but he's only converted 63.6% of them.
- Terrell Benton is third on the club in scoring with 10.5 points per game.
- Benton, Burns and CC McFall account for 67% of the team's 3-point shots. The Shockers are the second-best 3-point shooting team in the conference.
- McFall leads the team with 80 assists, while only committing 44 turnovers for a 1.82 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Troy Mack leads the Shocks with 6.7 rebounds per game. He has 174 on the season with 74 coming on the offensive glass. The Shockers, as a team, have done a good job of denying opponents offensive rebounds. They rank second in the league with 32.4 defensive boards.

The Series

Tonight's game is the 48th meeting between the two schools. The Redbirds lead the series 31-16 and have won the last three meetings. In Wichita, the Shockers lead the series 11-10. Illinois State won the first meeting this season with a 81-71 win at Redbird Arena.

Cosmic Connection???

If Redbird freshman phenom **Greg Alexander** ends the first half tonight with 20 points it just might be in the stars. It's a stretch, since Alexander's career-high is 24 points for an entire game, but if he pulls this feat off, when the halftime boxes are handed out at, say, 8:02 p.m., they would read 20-02 (20 points for 02 – Alexander's number), on 20.02 (20th of February), 2002 (the year) at 20:02 (8:02 p.m. in military time).

A Larger Portion of Rice ...

In the last 13 games, if the Redbirds have looked a little different it might be because of a change in their diet. Lately, the offensive appetite of the 'Birds has been fueled by Rice – **Randy Rice** that is. The senior is averaging 8.2 points per game during that span on 35-for-79 shooting (.443). Not only has Rice been scoring, he also has 21 steals, 42 rebounds and 66 assists with only 24 turnovers.

... Plus a Half-Order of Rice

At Indiana State, **Randy Rice** scored all 15 of his points in the second half to lead all scorers and the Redbirds to a 67-61 win. Also during the final 20 minutes, Rice handed out six of his game-high nine assists and was 9-for-9 from the free throw line. As a result of this feat and his play in the Bradley game, Rice was named the State Farm/Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week.

Making a Run at the National Title

Not many know it, but the Redbirds are in the hunt for a national title – the national free throw title. The 'Birds enter today's game as the third-best free throw shooting team in the nation. The Redbirds are sinking charity shots at a 77.6% clip, only two percentage points behind the nation's leader Morehead State (79.6%). Oregon (77.7%) stands in second.

FT Four-Peat ???

The Redbirds are shooting 77.6% from the charity stripe and are in good shape to eclipse 70% for a fourth straight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line last season, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of that length since it bettered 70% for a four-season span from 1982 through 1985.

Shot by Jepp ... Yep

For the most part, what senior **Shawn Jeppson** throws up usually comes down through the net. Such was the case Saturday, as he led the Redbird offensive attack in the 84-70 win over Southern Illinois with a team-high 22 points. Jeppson was on fire from the field converting 7-of-9 field goals and sinking 7-of-7 free throw attempts.

Tom "The Toolman"

Imagine trying to build a house without a hammer or a nail. That's how **Tom Richardson** felt earlier this season after losing his "hammer" **Tarise Bryson**, who averaged 22.8 points per game. Later in the year, Richardson had another tool taken away in **Dirk Williams**, who had helped the 'Birds "nail" a four-game winning streak. But, like all great carpenters, or in this case, head coaches, Richardson has made due with what was left in his toolbox. He has crafted a 10-3 record in the last 13 games and has built a 10-5 mark in the conference all attributes worthy of being named "Craftsman of the Year."

Sensational From the Stripe

Not only will the Redbirds 77.6% shooting from the free throw be four straight seasons at 70% or better, it currently ranks as the second-best percentage by an Illinois State team in school history by one tenth of a percentage point. Only the 1983-84 team has shot better from the line at 77.4%.

Freshman Trey-ning

True freshman **Gregg Alexander** is adjusting the next level nicely. In fact through 26 games, Alexander has 49 made 3-pointers and needs only one more trey to match the Redbird freshman record of 50 set by Dan Muller during the 1994-95 season. Alexander is also shooting 38.0% from behind the arc, which is better than the freshman best of 37.7% by Markku Larkio.

Richardson's 11

With the season-ending injuries to **Tarise Bryson** and **Dirk Williams**, head coach **Tom Richardson** is left with dressing 11 players, including two walk-ons **Brett Gillan** and **Kenneth Hill**. Bryson, the nation's top returning scorer, the reigning Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year and Redbirds leading scorer for the last three seasons, dislocated his right wrist and suffered severe ligament damage to his shooting hand in the season opener against Weber State. Williams broke the first cuneiform bone in his left foot during practice.

The Redbird .500

With the win at Indiana State, Illinois State bumped its record to 12-12 on the season and reached the .500 mark for the first time since mid-December when the Redbirds defeated Central Michigan to move to 4-4 on the year.

Wait a Minute

It has been well noted that **Greg Alexander** is expected to surpass former Redbird great Dan Muller's freshman minute record of 953, but if the 'Birds make a run in the conference tournament Alexander could also top the highest minute total by a – sophomore. As a super soph, Muller logged 1,142 minutes in 34 games for a 33.6 average. Currently, Alexander has 840 minutes in 26 games and is averaging 32.3 minutes on the season, but is clocking 33.3 in league play.

61 Limit Strictly Enforced

In the last 11 games, the 'Birds have posted a 9-2 mark thanks to enforcing a 61-point limit on their opponents. In the 11 contests, the Redbirds have allowed their opponent to score more than 61 points just three times – two losses and a 84-70 win against Southern Illinois. Otherwise Illinois State has eight wins by holding Indiana State (56 & 61), SMS (60), Bradley (55 & 51), Drake (54), UNI (55) and Evansville (55) to 61 points or less.

The New Boo Review

If **Baboucarr Bojang** isn't the front runner for the league's newcomer of the year award, he is at least in the running and here's why. Bojang posted his eighth double-double of the season in the 'Birds win at Evansville. Against UNI, Bojang tossed in 23 points, his fourth 20-point plus effort of the year, and hauled in a career-best 15 boards along with four blocks. Bojang has been a consistent offensive threat all season, scoring double figures in 22-of-26 games.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Illinois State Finds Offense; Defeats Wichita State 81-71

NORMAL, Ill. – Seniors Shawn Jeppson and Randy Rice each scored career highs as Illinois State defeated Wichita State 81-71 at Redbird Arena. The victory snapped a five-game losing skid for the 'Birds.

Jeppson made five three-point baskets in the game to break his previous career mark of four and led the 'Birds in scoring with 27 points. Rice scored 16 points in the contest, his previous high was 10.. He also set career highs in steals with six and blocked shots with three.

Baboucarr Bojang and Gregg Alexander also had strong performances for Illinois State. Bojang scored 15 points and led the team on the boards with seven. Alexander chipped in 13 points, including 3-for-6 shooting from behind the arc.

The Shockers, 7-7 (1-2 MVC) were led by senior Terrell Benton with 16 points. Wichita State had three other players in double figures. Senior Troy Mack led the Shockers in rebounding with nine and also put in 11 points.

The second half saw the Redbirds pull away, outscoring the Shockers 30-15 through the first 11 minutes behind three three-pointers from Jeppson. The 'Birds took their largest lead of the game at 59-41 with 8:49 remaining in the game.

Driven By Ford Lately

The Redbirds have won eight of their last nine thanks in a large part to **Shedrick Ford**. But Ford hasn't been pacing the 'Birds in his usual role. In all nine games, Ford has played with emotion off the bench and is averaging 11.8 points per contest during the streak. In addition to scoring, Ford is getting to the free throw line. In nine games, Ford is 46-for-54 (.854) from the charity stripe.

Movin' On Up

George and Weezy's dry cleaning business can't even compare to the Redbird's improvement in field goal defense. For the first half of the season, the 'Birds ranked last in the league allowing a near 50 percent success rate on their opponents shots. However in the last nine games, Illinois State foes are shooting a lowly 41.4% from the field, while the Redbirds have posted a 8-1 record. Currently the 'Birds rank eighth in the league at 46.6% and are chasing the pack.

Rain Check for Redbird Turnovers

It's a good thing the Redbirds aren't operating a bakery, because they haven't had a surplus of turnovers. Against Bradley, the 'Birds only coughed up five turnovers during the 40-minute span which is the lowest total by an Illinois State team since Feb. 28, 1987 (5 vs. Ind. St.).

Jeppson Joins 1,000-Point Club

Of all the organizations on the Illinois State campus, the 1,000-Point Club must rank as one of the most exclusive with only 35 members in the last 104 years. The Redbirds' newest member is **Shawn Jeppson** after scoring 10 points at Southwest Missouri State. Jeppson's trey, two and a half minutes into the game sealed his membership. He now has 1,067 points.

Ah, There are the Comeback Wins

Through 17 games, the Redbirds had one victory (vs. Samford) in games in which they trailed at halftime. But second-half rallies against Southwest Missouri State, Bradley and Indiana State boosted that win total to three. Last season, the 'Birds had 11 come-from-behind wins.

Non-Conference Slate as Tough as Advertised

Heading into the season head coach **Tom Richardson** knew that Illinois State's 11-game non-conference schedule was going to be challenging. As if the Redbirds 4-7 record wasn't enough proof, Illinois State's non-conference opponents have posted a 170-97 (.637) mark this season. In addition to the overall winning percentage, Redbird non-conference foes have posted wins over Arkansas, Ball St., Boston College, Gonzaga, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio St., Pepperdine, St. Bonaventure, St. John's and Utah St. (twice), which College RPI all rank in its top 50.

Picked to Win the League? Chances Are You Played Illinois State

ISU played 11 non-conference games this season. Of the Redbirds' 11 non-Missouri Valley Conference foes, seven of the teams were selected in the preseason polls to win their respective leagues. The seven preseason favorites are Weber State (Big Sky), UC-Irvine (Big West), UT-San Antonio (Southland), Illinois (Big Ten), Georgia Southern (Southern) and Central Michigan and Kent State, which are both favored to win the two divisions of the Mid-American Conference.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, has transferred to Illinois State from North Carolina State, but cannot play for the Redbirds until the 2002-03 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. Guidry was a spot starter for the Wolfpack last season as a freshman and recorded a scoring best of 15 points against Wake Forest.

Double-Double Debut for Mr. Bojang-Ies

Baboucarr Bojang played his first game in a Redbird uniform against Weber State and it was worth an encore. Bojang tapped his way to posting his first double-double, as the SMS-West Plains Junior College transfer tossed in 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. It was the first time since November 23, 1990, that a Redbird had a double-double performance in an opening game. The late Reggie Wilson poured in 22 points and hauled in 13 rebounds in the season opener at Dayton. It was also Wilson's first game as a Redbird after transferring from Lincoln Community College.

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) – It was a case of too much paint for Illinois State's basketball team Tuesday night at the Assembly Hall. No. 7-ranked Illinois scored 36 of its 50 second-half points in the paint to cover up ISU, 87-73, before a sellout crowd of 16,500 people.

Baboucarr Bojang had 15 points for the Redbirds.

The schools, located approximately 50 miles apart, played for just the seventh time, the first since 1982.

The Illini won the last meeting 67-60, and has lost to the Redbirds once, in 1906.

Kent Williams led the Salukis with 27 points and Rolan Roberts had 22, but the Salukis had to battle an energized Illinois State team which scored a season-high 84 points, made 27 of 33 free throws, plus an active crowd of 9,451, largest of the year at Redbird Arena, celebrating a tribute to State Senator John Maitland.

The Redbirds, 14-12 overall, 10-5 in the Valley, won for the eighth time in their last nine games and avenged a 79-58 drubbing Jan. 5 in Carbondale. Southern Illinois, 21-6 overall, 11-4 in the Valley, has lost back-to-back games for the first time this season. The Salukis now trail league-leader Creighton by two games. The two teams meet Wednesday in Carbondale.

Illinois State shot 61 percent from the field in the first half as Jeppson made all five of his field goals to help the 'Birds to a 43-30 halftime lead. ISU held that lead at 47-34 when Southern Illinois made its move, going on a 14-2 run to cut the margin to 49-48 on Kent Williams' layup with 12:56 left.
