Illinois and Wisconsin are meeting for the 164th time in series history with the Illini holding a 99-64 advantage. Wisconsin, however, owns a 47-36 advantage in games played at Madison. Illinois has won five of the last seven in the series, including the only meeting between the Illini and the Badgers last year–a come-from-behind 68-67 win at the Assembly Hall on Marcus Griffin's game winning basket with 0.8 seconds left.

Illini Head Coach Bill Self

Bill Self is in his second season at the helm of the Illini program following three years at Tulsa where he earned National Coach of the Year honors from the John & Nellie Wooden Foundation and *The Sporting News* in 2000.

After leading Tulsa to a 32-5 record and into a Regional Final appearance in 2000, Self became the first coach to lead two different schools to a Final Eight appearance with the Illini in 2001. Prior to his stop at Tulsa, Self spent four years at Oral Roberts where he built a program from 6-21 his first season to 22-6 in his fourth year.

A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self has worked under Larry Brown at Kansas and Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State.

In his first season at Illinois, Self led the Illini to 27 victories, the second-most in school history and became just the fourth Big Ten coach since 1950 to defeat every conference school in his first season. He also became just the sixth coach in Big Ten history to win a Big Ten title in his first season.

Self was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, finishing fourth in voting, and a was a nominee for the Naismith College Coach of the Year.

For Openers...

Illinois enters the Wisconsin game with a six-game winning streak, its longest streak since winning seven in a row (all in Big Ten play) from Feb. 2 to Feb. 27, 2000...With its victory over Minnesota on Wednesday, Illinois has now won its Big Ten opener the past three seasons...Allthough this is Bo Ryan's first season coaching at Wisconsin, this is not his first game against the Illini. Illinois defeated Ryan's Wisconsin-Milwaukee squad 85-44 last season at the Assembly Hall...Illinois has lost its last two games at the Kohl Center and is trying to win in Madison for the first time since a 53-47 overtime victory on Feb. 7, 1998.

Last Time Out : Minnesota

Illinois extended its current winning streak to six games with a 76-53 victory over Minnesota Wednesday night at the Assembly Hall. For the first time in the winning streak, Frank Williams was not Illinois' leading scorer. Williams took only six shots and finished with eight points (all in the first half), but Illinois' big men picked up the scoring slack. Brian Cook had a game-high 16 points and eight rebounds, while Robert Archibald added 14 points, five rebounds, two blocks and two steals. Cory Bradford also finished in double figures with 14 points.

Illini Prevailing Despite Injuries

With the number of players on the Illini roster battling injuries, trainer Rod Cardinal has been doing almost as many media interviews as Bill Self the last few weeks. Lucas Johnson is currently rehabing his surgicallyrepaired right knee after suffering a torn ACL. He will be fitted for a knee brace on Jan. 7 and will begin practice (non-contact) and continue conditioning once the brace arrives. Brett Melton has missed the last six games and is still unavailable after suffering a severe ankle sprain against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 1. Damir Krupalija has missed the last three games and has practiced just twice since mid-December due to a deep bruise on his left foot. Robert Archiabld missed the Loyola-Chicago game and has also missed practice time to rest his ailing back. Archibald returned to the court and was productive Wednesday against Minnesota, earning a start and registering 14 points, five rebounds, two blocks and two steals in 26 minutes of action.

A Look at Illinois' RPland SagarinRatings

Illinois currently ranks No. 2 in the nation in the ratings percentage index (RPI) with an RPI of .6804. The only team with a stronger RPI is Arizona (.7001), while Duke is ranked third (.6798) behind the Illini. Rounding out the top five are Kansas (4th, .6797) and Kentucky (5th, .6694). The only other Big Ten teams in the RPI's Top 25 are Indiana and Iowa, at 9th and 15th, respectively. Illinois' strength of schedule is currently ranked sixth in the country.

The Illini are ranked No. 4 in the nation in Jeff Sagarin's latest rankings with a rating of 90.50. In the Sagarin rankings,

Duke is No. 1 (96.43), followed by Cincinnati at No. 2 (94.79) and Oklahoma State an No. 3 (93.84). Kansas is fifth (90.42) behind the Illini.

Illini Strong in the Second Half

Throughout the season, Illinois has finetuned its performance in the second half. Through 14 games, The Illini have outscored opponents by 132 points (613-to-481) in the second half, compared to a scoring advantage of 83 points (553-to-470) in the first half. In recent games, Illinois' field goal shooting has also been better in the second half. The Illini have shot better in the second half compared to the first half for the past six games.

Williams Running the Show

All-America candidate Frank Williams was one of the most productive players in the nation in the month of December. Williams, second in the Big Ten in scoring at 18.4 ppg, averaged 24.7 points in six of Illinois' last seven games on combined 48 percent shooting from the field (44-91). He was finally slowed down in the Big Ten opener against Minnesota Wednesday, taking just six shots and finishing the game with eight points, all coming in the first half.

Williams tied his career high with 30 points against Arizona on Dec. 4, then scored a team-high 25 points in the win over Arkansas Dec. 8. Against the Razorbacks, Williams attempted a career and school-record 24 free throws, making a career-high 18, just one shy of the school record. Williams scored 17 points against Western Illinois on Dec. 16 and finished just one shy of his career high with 29 points in the win over Illinois State Dec. 18. Williams tied his

career high with 11 field goals, including a career-high four three-pointers to fuel his scoring spree against the Redbirds. In the win over Missouri Dec. 22, Williams scored a game-high 22 points, with 13 coming in the game's final 10 minutes. Against Loyola-Chicago, Williams had a game-high 25 points, tying his career high with four 3-pointers.

Top 10 Matchups

When No. 9 Illinois defeated No. 8 Missouri on Dec. 22, it marked Illinois' third Top 10 showdown of the young season. On Nov. 27, No. 2 Illinois fell at No. 5 Maryland 63-76 and on Dec. 4, the No. 5 Illini lost to No. 7 Arizona in Phoenix, 82-87. Illinois is now 1-2 in Top 10 matchups this year. Last season the Illini were involved in seven games between two Top 10 programs, posting a 4-3 record.

Comeback Kids

Illinois had a habit of making great comebacks last year, and this year's team is on the way to earning the title of "Comeback Kids" once again. The Illini have fought back from two double-digit deficits to post victories. The Illini fell behind by 13 points against Penn, 32-45 with :47 left in the first half, before rallying for a 78-71 win. Illinois trailed by as many as 12 points against Arkansas Dec. 8, 36-48 with 17:49 remaining in the game, before mounting another comeback and finishing with a 94-91 victory.

Williams Among 30 Midseason Candidates for Wooden Award

Frank Williams is one of 30 candidates placed on the midseason list (released Dec. 27) for the John R. Wooden Award Player of the Year and All-America Team. Joining Williams on the midseason list are fellow

season and has outscored opponents from the line in 13 of the 14 games. Illinois has outscored its opponent by a combined score of 309-176 at the line, an average of 9.5 points more per game. The Illini made 37 free throws against Arkansas on Dec. 8, just one shy of the school record, in 49 attempts, which is three short of the all-time UI record. Against Minnesota on Wednesday, the Illini outscored the Gophers 20-to-6 from the free throw line. As a team, Illinois is shooting 73.4 percent from the line this season, which ranks third in the Big Ten.

High-Scoring Illini

Through 14 games this season, Illinois leads the Big Ten with a scoring average of 83.3 points per game and is shooting 47 percent from the field, which ranks second in the conference. The Illini have shown unselfish

play with an average of 17.6 assists per game, the most of any Big Ten team.

Tournament Tested

Illinois has earned five victories this season over teams that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament in Gonzaga, Eastern Illinois, Georgia Tech, Arkansas and Missouri. Adding in losses to Maryland, who advanced to the Final Four last season, and Arizona, who was the national runnerup last year, Illinois has already played seven games against last season's NCAA Tournament field. Up next is Wisconsin, the eighth NCAA tournament opponent for the Illini.

Did you Know ...

... Frank Williams is the first Illinois player to be named Big Ten Player of the Year since Bruce Douglas was the UPI Coaches Co-Player of the Year in 1984 and the first Chicago Tribune Silver Basketball Trophy winner from Illinois since 1967.

... Frank Williams and Brian Cook. They share a common bond, being named Mr. Basketball in the state of Illinois. Williams won the award in 1998 and Cook in 1999.

... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 11 McDonald's All-Americans and two are currently on the Illini roster. Frank Williams made the All-America team in 1998 and Cook in 1999. Illinois ranks 11th all-time in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.

... Illinois has the 18th best all-time winning percentage (.645) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.

... Illinois has an all-time record of 1418-782. The 1418 wins rank 18th on the Division I list, one spot ahead of Louisville.

... Illini Head Coach Bill Self helped Oklahoma State to a Big Eight Conference Tournament Championship.

... Eight Illini players have been firstround draft selections, including Nick Anderson and Kendall Gill from the 1989 Final Four team.

... Illinois ranks third in the Big Ten behind Indiana and Michigan in total NCAA appearances.

... Illinois is second in Big Ten wins behind Purdue and third in winning percentage in Big Ten games behind Indiana and Purdue.

... The Orange Krush student group is more than just a Fighting Illini cheering section. The students raised over \$50,000 last year which went to the University of Illinois general scholarship fund, the Fighting Illini Scholarship Fund and a variety of charities.

Krupalija Impressive off the Bench

One of Illinois' most consistent players to date this season has come from the bench. Despite missing three games and multiple practices because a foot injury and starting just one game, senior Damir Krupalija has

been putting up the kind of numbers that would stack up well against many of the Big Ten's starting forwards. Averaging just over 20 minutes per game, Krupalija is tied for the team lead in rebounding at 6.9 boards per game and is almost in double figures in scoring, averaging 9.4 points. Krupalija was named MVP of the Las Vegas Invitational Tournament after averaging 10.5 points and 8.0 rebounds in the four games. He pulled down 11 boards against Penn, the highest rebound total by an Illini player this season. Krupalija has scored in double figures in six of 11 games and recorded a double-double of 11 points and 10 rebounds vs. Arizona. He has also led the Illini in rebounding four times. Krupalija scored 14 points and had a team-high eight rebounds against Illinois State, then scored scored seven points on 3of-3 shooting and pulled down six rebounds in just 11 minutes of play against Missouri.

Home Court Streakin'

Illinois enters its next home game against Michigan on Jan. 12 with a 25-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall, the longest home-winning streak by the Illini since winning 28 straight from Feb. 11, 1988 to Jan. 15, 1990. Last year, Illinois completed its first unbeaten home season since the 1988-89 season (17-0). The current 25-game winning streak ranks ninth nationally.

Illinois' current 15-game winning streak in conference games at the Assembly Hall is its longest streak since also winning 15 straight Big Ten home games-beginning on Feb. 11, 1988 and lasting until Jan. 15,

In addition to his scoring, he also led the Illini in rebounds with eight and steals with four against ISU. Williams was the catalyst in Illinois' 72-61 win over No. 8 Missouri, scoring a gamehigh 22 points. He turned it on in the clutch, with 13 of his points coming in the game's final 10 minutes of play. Williams also had four assists, four rebounds, and three steals against Mizzou. For the week,

Williams averaged 25.5 points, six rebounds, three assists and 3.5 steals per game in the two victories.

• **Sharing the Spotlight:** Illinois is one of just three schools to have both its men's basketball and football teams ranked among the Top 10 in the nation. The Illini football team is ranked No. 7 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' polls this week, while the basketball squad is also currently ranked No. 7 in both polls. Florida (No. 5 football, No. 3/2 basketball) and Maryland (No. 6 football, No. 8/6 basketball) join Illinois among the elite in both sports.

• **Dee-Fence** ... **Dee-Fence**: Through 14 games, the Illini have held opponents to 40.5 percent field goal shooting, including 32.4 percent from three-point range. The Illini are forcing 16.3 turnovers per game and have averaged 7.1 steals.

• **Defending Home Court:** After seven home games this season, Illinois opponents are shooting just .379 (158-417) from the field, .304 (38-125) from three-point range and .592 (73-123) from the free throw line.

In Illinois' 12 homes games at the Assembly Hall during the 2000-01 season, opponents shot a combined 34.6 percent (240-693 FG) from the field and 29.4 percent (74-252 3FG) from three-point range.

• **Starting High:** Preseason pollsters placed the Fighting Illini as high as they've ever been entering a season. The USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll started Illinois at No. 2 in the preseason poll, and the Associated Press had the Illini at No. 3. The two previous high marks for preseason rankings came in 1962 and 1984 when the AP had Illinois No. 2 in the preseason. *The Sporting News* ranked Illinois No. 1 in the preseason while *Sports Illustrated* had the Illini No. 2.

• Williams Preseason Honors: Guard Frank Williams was named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First-Team Nov. 6. Williams was joined on the team by Duke's Jason Williams, Missouri's Kareem Rush, Stanford's Casey Jacobsen and Kentucky's Tayshaun Prince. The last Illinois player to earn First-Team All-America honors from AP in the postseason was Andy Phillip in 1943.

• Select Company: Bill Self became the first coach in 22 years, just the sixth all-time in the Big Ten, and second Illini coach to win a Big Ten championship in his first season as coach at a conference school. Minnesota's Bill Musselman is the only coach to win an outright title in his first season in 1972. Other league rookies earning hardware are Iowa's Sam Barry in 1923, Michigan's George Veekner in 1929, Illinois' Doug Mills in 1937 and Purdue's Lee Rose in 1979.

• **More Select Company:** When Illinois defeated Iowa on Feb. 24, 2001, Bill Self became just the fourth coach in the Big Ten since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference

team in his first season. The other three coaches are Indiana's Bob Knight in 1972, Iowa's Tom Davis in 1987 and Penn State's Jerry Dunn in 1996.

• **Illini Milestone:** Illinois became the 18th Div. I program to reach 1,400 all-time victories with the Feb. 17, 2001 win at Indiana.

• **20th 20-win Season:** Last season, Illinois posted its 20th 20-win season in Illini basketball history. It also marked the second-earliest 20th win in school history (by calendar date). The earliest was Feb. 11, 1989 when the Illini defeated Northwestern. That team went on to win a school-record 31 games.

• Wins, Wins and More Wins: Illinois' 27 victories during the 2000-01 season are the second-most wins in a season in school history. The school record for victories in a season is 31 in 1989.

• **Self Defense**: For the 2000-01 season, opponents shot just 38.6 percent from the field. That was the lowest opponent shooting percentage since the 1955-56 season when Illini opponents shot 35.2 percent from the field. Illinois finished third in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, behind only Kansas and Holy Cross.

In league play, the Illini were second in the Big Ten in field-goal percentage defense (.387) while ranking second in blocked shots (5.19), second in steals (7.44) and fourth in scoring defense (63.6).

• **Board Work:** This season, the Illini are averaging 39.9 rebounds per game, an average of 6.5 more boards than their opponent. Illinois' average of 40.0 rebounds per game in 2001 was the team's highest average since 1979 when the Illini averaged 41.3 rebounds per game. Illinois' rebounding margin (6.7) ranked 13th in the nation last year.

Wayne McClain Joins Ilini Staff

Legendary Illinois high school coach Wayne McClain joins the Illini as an assistant coach for the 2001-02 season. McClain, the father of former Illini player Sergio, replaces Rob Judson who was named head coach at Northern Illinois University on March 6.

Williams Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year

Junior Frank Williams was named Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year by both the media and coaches for 2001-02, as well as preseason First-Team All-Big Ten. Last year, Williams was the first Illini player to earn conference player of the year honors since Bruce Douglas was named co-Big Ten Player of the Year (with Purdue's Jim Rowinski) in 1984. Illinois' last league MVP before Williams in 2001 was Jim Dawson in 1967.

National Exposure

For the 2001-02 season, Illinois is scheduled to play at least 11, with the possibility of 13 regular-season games on national television. The Illini are scheduled to appear at least seven times on ESPN, at least three times on CBS and once on FOX Sports Net.

Bradford Holds NCAA 3-Point Record

Illinois junior guard **Cory Bradford** holds the NCAA record for consecutive games with a three-pointer with a trey in 88 straight games. He broke the previous record of 73 games set by Wally Lancaster of Virginia Tech from 1986-89 with his first trey against Arizona on Dec. 16, 2000.

Bradford also has started every game of his Illini career and enters the Wisconsin game with a school-record streak of 113 starts for the Illini.

Bradford's streak of consecutive starts set a school record against Northwestern on Feb. 3, 2001, passing Richard Keene's previous record streak of 85 consecutive games started in an Illini career.

Top 10 Streak Alive

Illinois has been ranked in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 10 for 27 consecutive polls, the longest stretch of Top 10 action since a string of 28 straight polls in the Top 10 in the 1989 and 1990 seasons.

Illini Basketball is a Hot Ticket

For the first time in Assembly Hall history, the Fighting Illini sold out in season tickets with 16,500 sold. Of the six games not on the student season package (over the semester break), four are sold out. Every Big Ten game is sold out for 2002. The eight sellouts last season were the most at the Assembly Hall since 1989.

Williams, Cook on Preseason Wooden List

Illinois' Brian Cook and Frank Williams were among 50 players on the list of preseason candidates for the 2002 Wooden Award All-American team. Williams, the 2001 Big Ten Player of the Year and a member of the 2001 Wooden All-America team, made the list for the second consecutive season while Cook earned his first appearance on the list.

Four Sign With Illini in November

Four future Fighting Illini players signed national letters of intent to attend Illinois during the fall signing period in November. **Dee Brown**, a 6-foot guard from Proviso East High School in Maywood, Ill., **Deron Williams**, a 6-3 guard from The Colony, Texas, **Kyle Wilson**, a 6-8 forward from Plano, Texas and **James Augustine**, a 6-10 forward from Lincoln-Way Central High School in New Lenox, Ill., all signed with the Illini. *Bob Gibbons' All-Star Report* ranks the Illini class No. 4 in the nation. The Illini have one scholarship remaining to issue in the spring.

Brian Cook had 18 points and nine rebounds, and Robert Archibald added 16 points to lead No. 3 Illinois to a 76-58 victory over Gonzaga on Friday night.

Cory Bradford had 17 points, and Frank Williams had 13 for the Illini (1-0), who were outrebounded 21-12 in the first half, but took advantage of their size in the second half by going to Cook and Archibald down low against a much shorter Gonzaga team.

Dan Dickau had 19 points for Gonzaga (0-1), which ended up outrebounding Illinois 40-30 but committed 20 turnovers.

Cook scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and made 7-of-7 free throws as Illinois built a 72-54 lead with 2:50 remaining.

Illinois led 36-29 at halftime, but jumped out to a 41-29 lead on a 3-pointer by Sean Harrington and two free throws from Cook.

Gonzaga never got closer than seven points the rest of the game.

Zach Gourde had 15 points and 12 rebounds, and Cory Violette added 12 rebounds for Gonzaga, which shot 42 percent but made only 4-of-16 3-pointers.

The victory improved Illinois' all-time record in season openers to 84-13, to 82-15 in home openers and 32-7 in home openers at the Assembly Hall. The victory also was Illinois' 19th straight win at home.

Second-ranked Illinois forced Eastern Illinois into 27 percent shooting in a 93-53 win in the first round of the Las Vegas Invitational. Frank Williams scored 20 points to lead the Illini, but it was Cory Bradford who may have had the more impressive game.

The senior guard scored just nine points on 2-of-4 shooting but hounded the nation's leading returning scorer, Henry Domercant, into having an awful night. Domercant, who was guarded by Bradford much of the game, scored 12 points on 3-of-14 shooting. With Domercant missing shot after shot, undersized Eastern Illinois was forced into taking contested jumpers throughout the game. The Panthers turned the ball over 22 times and had just seven assists.

The Illini went on a 15-0 run early in the game and led 48-23 at halftime. Eastern Illinois trailed by at least 20 points the rest of the way.

The Illini bench outscored the starters 54-39 in a game in which no player was on the court more than 25 minutes. The Illini shot 56 percent for the game and were 18-of-22 from the free throw line.

Williams scored 16 of his 20 points in the second half and had six rebounds. He was 5-of-8 from the field and made 7-of-9 free throws. Freshman Luther Head came off the bench for Illinois to score 14 points on 7of-9 shooting, most of those layups and dunks.

Illinois saved its best for the second half, and that was good enough to get past Pennsylvania. Frank Williams scored 22 points to lead No. 2 Illinois to a 78-71 victory over Penn in the second round of the Las Vegas Invitational.

The Illini trailed 45-34 at the half and didn't take the lead until midway through the second half. Damir Krupalija scored to give the Illini a 61-60 lead with 10:23 remaining. The teams traded baskets until Illinois took the lead for good with 7:06 left.

Nick Smith and Robert Archibald each added 11 points, and Brian Cook had 10 for Illinois, which shot 71 percent from the floor in the second half. Krupalija had 11 rebounds as the Illini outrebounded the Quakers 34-26.

Illinois shot 32 percent (8-for-25) in the first half and trailed by as many as 12 points. The Illini limited the Quakers to 33 percent (9-for-27) shooting in the second half after allowing 57.1 percent in the first half.

Juan Dixon scored 25 points and No. 5 Maryland built a 20-point lead and held off No. 2 Illinois 76-63 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

It was the 80th consecutive non-conference home victory for Maryland, the longest such run in the nation. It was also the Terrapins' fourth straight win overall after a season-opening defeat against Arizona.

After the Terrapins (4-1) went up by 12 at halftime, Dixon scored seven points in a 10-2 run at the outset of the second half to make it 51-31.

Despite playing its fifth game in nine days, Illinois (5-1) fought back - even after leading rebounder Brian Cook fouled out with 5:11 left.

The comeback was aided by poor free throw shooting by Maryland, which finished 12-for-24 at the line. The Fighting Illini closed to 66-58 with 2:56 left, but Chris Wilcox scored in the lane, then made one of two free throws on Maryland's next possession for an 11point cushion.

Wilcox scored 19 points and six rebounds off the bench for Maryland, which beat a Top 5 team for the first time since 1998.

Blandon Ferguson had 11 points for Illinois, which three days earlier won the Las Vegas Invitational and was off to its best start in six years. But on this night, the Illini looked rather ordinary.

The Illini shot 33 percent and committed seven turnovers in the decisive first half.

Illinois was the highest-ranked non-conference team the Terrapins faced at home since they upset No. 1 Notre Dame in 1979

Cory Bradford's jumper with 6:30 left gave the Illini their first lead at 71-70. Illinois pushed the lead to nine with two minutes left, but Dean hit a 3-pointer and then drove for a basket to make it 87-83. J.J. Sullinger's three-point play with 58 seconds to go got Arkansas to 90-88. After a steal, the Razorbacks moved the ball around the court several times before Pargo hit a 3-pointer, making it 91-90 Arkansas with 31 seconds remaining.

Damir Krupalija's dunk on a pass from Bradford with 11 seconds left gave the Illini a 92-91 lead. Dean then drove the middle, ran into Illinois center Robert Archibald and was called for the critical foul.

Frank Williams had a near-career night in leading the Fighting Illini to victory over in-state opponent Illinois State by the score of 87-73.

The Illini led by five at halftime but went on a 17-6 run in which Williams scored eight straight points and 11 in total to help Illinois build a 20-point lead. He finished with 29 points - including 4-of-8 from 3point range - one off his career high.

The Illini played most of the first half without Brian Cook and Robert Archibald. Cook played four minutes in the first half, and Archibald, whistled for three early fouls, played two just minutes.

Leading 37-32 at halftime, the Illini extended their lead to 50-38 in the opening minutes of the second half with Williams on the bench because of a stomach ailment. Reserve Damir Krupalija scored nine of Illinois' 13 points in the surge and finished with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.

Illinois made 13 of its first 17 field goal attempts after halftime and shot 60 percent in the half, with most of those points coming on shots near the basket. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game.
