About Southern Illinois

- Southern Illinois is located in Carbondale, Ill., and enrolls 22,552 students. The Salukis are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Head coach Bruce Weber is in his fourth season at Southern Illinois. He owns a 62-41 record with the Salukis after serving as an assistant at Purdue for 18 seasons and Western Kentucky for one.
- Southern Illinois is 4-0 at home this season, including a 72-60 win over #24 Indiana. SIU's only losses on the season came against #2 Illinois (75-72) at the Las Vegas Invitational and at Colorado State (80-62).
- Four players average double figures for the Salukis led by Kent Williams. Williams posts 17.2
 points per game and has led SIU in scoring in eight of Southern Illinois' 13 games. Williams is
 shooting 41 percent from the floor and 40.8 percent from behind the arc.
- SIU averages 5.5 made 3-point field goals per game and Williams averages at least two of them.
- Rolan Roberts, a senior transfer from Virginia Tech, averages 13.5 points per game and is also second in rebounds per 7.8 per contest. Roberts is shooting 60 percent from the floor and leads the team with 33 blocks and 19 steals.
- Jermaine Dearman leads the team with 8.0 boards per game and is averaging 11.2 points.
 Darren Brooks is the final Saluki averaging double figures with 10.3 points.
- Southern Illinois leads the league in rebounding at 40.5 boards per game and has really been aggressive on the offensive glass. SIU has 185 offensive boards on the year with Roberts, Dearman and Brooks hauling in the majority of them.
- The Salukis are 363-131 (.735) all-time at SIU Arena, including 35-10 (.778) in the Bruce Weber era. SIU owns a 16-10 edge over Illinois State at SIU Arena, but the 'Birds are 2-1 against the Salukis during the Weber era.

The Series

Today's game is the 117th meeting between the two schools. Southern Illinois leads the series 59-57, but Illinois State has won seven of the last nine meetings including both last season. The Salukis own a 36-16 advantage in Carbondale. The Redbirds topped SIU 88-74 in Carbondale last season, before beating the Salukis 69-60 in Redbird Arena a month later.

The Redbirds and Roberts

Southern Illinois' Rolan Roberts is no stranger to the Redbirds, well at least to some of them. Illinois State faced Virginia Tech, the school from which Roberts transferred from, in the first round of the 1999 San Juan Shootout. The Hokies topped the 'Birds 79-71 and Roberts tossed in 14 points, while grabbing five rebounds and blocking three shots. Current Redbirds Tarise Bryson dumped in 18 points and Shawn Jeppson added nine. Both Bryson and Jeppson logged 40 minutes, while Andy Strandmark came off the bench to score two points in 11 minutes.

Non-Conference Slate as Tough as Advertised

Heading into the season head coach **Tom Richardson** knew that Illinois State's 11-game non-conference schedule was going to be challenging. As if the Redbirds 4-7 record wasn't enough proof, Illinois State's non-conference opponents have posted a 86-47 (.647) mark this season. In addition to the overall winning percentage, Redbird non-conference foes have posted wins over Arkansas, Ball State, Gonzaga, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio State, St. Bonaventure, St. John's and Utah State, which College RPI all rank in its top 50.

League Games From Here on Out

Midwest winters in the months of January and February have been causes for bouts of depression, but this year during the first two months of 2002 Illinois State will be battling compression – of its Missouri Valley Conference schedule. The 'Birds will play their entire 18-game conference slate in 55 days from January 2 to February 25. In January, the Redbirds play 10 league games with six taking place in Redbird Arena. In February, Illinois State closes out the regular season with eight contests, including five on the road.

Streaking at the Charity Stripe

Illinois State's **Vince Greene** and **Dirk Williams** are riding of a couple of notable streaks – 18 straight made free throws. Greene has sank his last 18 attempts, while Williams has made all 18 tries this season. Gene Jontry holds the Redbird record for 35 made free throws in succession which was set in 1956-57.

January Drought

Central Illinois only averages 2.07 inches of participation in the month of January and that drought carried over to the Redbirds' second-half shooting Wednesday night against Creighton. **Shedrick Ford**'s layup at the 12:27 mark in the second half was the last field goal for the Redbirds until **Gregg Alexander**'s trey at the 4:04 mark. The 'Birds went 8:23 without a field goal and Alexander's 3-pointer was the only Illinois State basket in the final 12:27 of the game.

The Redbird Rollercoaster

Head coach **Tom Richardson** has said that the only consistency his Illinois State team has had this season has been its inconsistency. That erratic trend by the Redbirds is really evident in their winning and losing streaks this season. The ride has been a wild one, so please remain seated until it comes to a complete stop. Illinois State started the season by climbing the first hill to two straight wins, plunged through four straight losses, scaled for two more wins and is currently in the corkscrew of a four-game losing streak.

Breaking In Boo

Illinois State's **Baboucarr Bojang** is in his sixth year of organized basketball and is still developing as a player. That's bad news for Redbird opponents considering Bojang has already posted four double-doubles in 12 games and three 20-point efforts. At Chattanooga, Bojang posted a career-high 26 points and grabbed eight boards with seven of them coming off the offensive glass. He has scored double-digits in nine straight games and in every game this season except one.

Jeppson Pledging for the 1,000-Point Club

Of all the organizations on the Illinois State campus, the 1,000-Point Club must rank as one of the most exclusive with only 34 members in the last 104 years. The Redbirds' **Shawn Jeppson** is closing in on a membership, however. After scoring 11 points against Creighton, Jeppson currently owns 888 points for his career and only needs 112 more to become the 35th player in Illinois State history to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

Picked to Win the League? Chances Are You're Playing Illinois State

ISU will play 11 nonconference games this season. Of the Redbirds' 11 non-Missouri Valley Conference foes, seven of the teams were selected in the preseason polls to win their respective leagues. The seven preseason favorites are Weber State (Big Sky), UC-Irvine (Big West), UT-San Antonio (Southland), Illinois (Big Ten), Georgia Southern (Southern) and Central Michigan and Kent State, which are both favored to win the two divisions of the Mid-American Conference.

Ford's Getting Offensive on the Boards

Shedrick Ford is Illinois State's second leading rebounder, averaging 4.0 boards per game. Of Ford's 48 total rebounds, 42 percent or 20 boards are coming off the offensive glass.

Strandy Has Been Dandy

Junior **Andy Strandmark** got his first starting nod of the season against Creighton, based on his strong minutes off the bench in the two previous games. Against Illinois, Strandmark played 14 minutes and had a season-high seven points and seven boards. In the Kent State game, he hauled in another seven rebounds and chipped in six points in his season-long outing of 23 minutes. Over the first nine games, Strandmark averaged 1.7 points and 1.2 rebounds per game, before averaging 5.3 points and 6.0 boards in the Redbirds last three games.

Bryson Out For Season

Tarise Bryson, the nation's top returning scorer, the reigning Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year and Redbirds leading scorer for the last three seasons, fell to the floor on a drive to the basket at the 17:46 mark of the second half in Illinois State's 74-70 opening night victory over Weber State. The fall ended the season for the Redbirds sixth all-time leading scorer, as Bryson dislocated his right wrist and suffered severe ligament damage to his shooting hand. Bryson underwent surgery the day after the game and will face a year of rehabilitation.

Jeppson Hits Century Mark

With six minutes left in the game at Georgia Southern, Illinois State guard **Shawn Jeppson** became the ninth Redbird in school history to drain 100 treys in a career. Jeppson stands in ninth place overall and needs three 3-pointers to surpass former Redbird Kyle Cartmill.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Birds' Second-Half Start Tops SIU

CARBONDALE, III. – Tarise Bryson scored 16 of his game-high 26 points in the second half to lead Illinois State to a 69-60 victory Thursday in a Missouri Valley Conference basketball game at Redbird Arena.

The Redbirds, 18-5, 10-4 in the Valley, got 17 points from Shawn Jeppson to back Bryson's play.Randy Rice, who had 13 assists in ISU's victory Monday at Evansville, followed that with eight on Thursday. The Birds have won 10 of their last 13 games.

ISU trailed by two at halftime, but shot 56 percent from the field (14 of 25) in the second half and had just four turnovers in the final 20 minutes, out-scoring the Salukis 40-29 after intermission.

The Salukis, 13-12, 7-7, were led by Kent Williams with 14 points and Jermaine Dearman with 12 off the bench. SIU had a 37-28 rebounding advantage but ISU had a 51 percent to 39 percent field goal shooting edge.

ISU opened the second half with a 13-2 spurt as Bryson scored eight and Shedrick Ford got the other five and the Birds led 42-33. The Salukis never got closer than five after that and ISU led by as many as 12.

FT Four-Peat 222

The Redbirds have opened the season shooting 75.2% from the charity stripe and are on a good start to eclipse 70% for a fourth straight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line last season, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of that length since it bettered 70% for a four-season span from 1982 through 1985.

Double-Double Debut for Mr. Bojang-les

Baboucarr Bojang played his first game in a Redbird uniform against Weber State and it was worth an encore. Bojang tapped his way to posting his first double-double, as the SMS-West Plains Junior College transfer tossed in 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. It was the first time since November 23, 1990, that a Redbird had a double-double performance in an opening game. The late Reggie Wilson poured in 22 points and hauled in 13 rebounds in the season opener at Dayton. It was also Wilson's first game as a Redbird after transferring from Lincoln Community College.

Alexander the Great - Ballhandler

According to the roster and the register's office, **Gregg Alexander** is a true freshman, but on the court he plays like a savvy veteran. In his first season with the Redbirds, Alexander has logged 373 minutes, second most on the team by one minute, and coughed up only nine turnovers. Alexander is averaging .024 turnovers per minute, which is the lowest percentage in the Missouri Valley Conference. He has dished out 29 assists which ranks third on the team and is fourth on the club in scoring with 9.56 points per game. Alexander also leads the team in steals with 19.

Built Ford Tough

Shedrick Ford is second on the Redbirds in scoring with 11.1 points per game and has scored double-figures for Illinois State in six games. Ford has been the leading scorer in two games and had a season-high 21 points against Hofstra. In the season opener against Weber State, Ford put the team on his back after the injury to **Tarise Bryson** and finished with 18 points and eight boards.

Alexander Goes Where Few Freshmen Have Gone Before

Since 1990, three true freshman have started their first collegiate games at Illinois State. One of them is current Redbird **Gregg Alexander**. Alexander drew the starting nod in the opener against Weber State and responded with eight points, one rebound and two assists in 20 minutes of play. Alexander joins P.J. Smith (1999) and Dan Muller (1994).

Been There. Done That

At the Missouri Valley Conference media day, Illinois State was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the league title by the conference media and sports information directors. The Redbirds received 26 of the possible 30 first-place votes. The last time the 'Birds were chosen preseason favorites was in 1997-98. Illinois State went on to win the conference. In 1996-97, the Redbirds were also favored to win and won the league.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, has transferred to Illinois State from North Carolina State, but cannot play for the Redbirds until the 2002-03 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. Guidry was a spot starter for the Wolfpack last season as a freshman and recorded a scoring best of 15 points against Wake Forest.

It Never Gets Boring

Last season's trip to the NIT marked Illinois State's 14th post-season appearance in 31 seasons on the Division I level. The Redbirds have finished over .500 in all but three of their campaigns as a D-I school and own 13 20-win campaigns over the last 26 years.

A Trade-In???

It's not quite a trade, but next season when the Redbirds lose the services of **Shedrick Ford** to graduation they will add **Dana Ford**. Illini Downs Illinois State, 87-73

CHAMPAIGN, III. (AP) – It was a case of too much paint for Illinois State's basketball team Tuesday night at the Assembly Hall. No. 7-ranked Illinois scored 36 of its 50 second-half points in the paint to cover up ISU, 87-73, before a sellout crowd of 16,500 people.

The Illini (9-2) led by five at halftime but went on a 17-6 run in which Frank Williams scored eight straight points and 11 in total to help Illinois build a 20-point lead. He finished with 29 points - including 4-of-8 from 3-point range - one off his career high.

Leading 37-32 at halftime, the Illini extended their lead over Illinois State (4-5) to 50-38 in the opening minutes of the second half with Williams on the bench because of a stomach ailment. Reserve Damir Krupalija scored nine of Illinois' 13 points in the surge and finished with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.

Illinois made 13 of its first 17 field goal attempts after halftime and shot 60 percent in the half, with most of those points coming on shots near the basket. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game.

Baboucarr Bojang had 15 points for the Redbirds. The schools, located approximately 50 miles apart, played for just the seventh time, the first since 1982. The Illini won the last meeting 67-60, and has lost to the Redbirds once, in 1906.
