SYCAMORES, REDBIRDS GET NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT – Indiana State returns to the national spotlight when it visits Illinois State, Saturday, January 12. The contest, to be televised, nationally, by ESPN2 is set to tip-off at Illinois State's Redbird Arena (cap. 10,200). at 5:07 p.m. EST.

THE RECORDS – Indiana State enters Saturday afternoon's contest with records of 3-10/1-3 MVC. After earning their first MVC victory in defeating Evansville (45-40) last Saturday, snapping a five-game losing skid, the Sycamores most recently dropped a 70-71 decision to Northern Iowa. The Sycamores have also dropped MVC contests at Creighton (46-70) and at Drake (71-85). Indiana State, playing a schedule rated among the top-twenty toughest in the country, went 2-7 in non-conference action.

Illinois State, 5-10/1-3 MVC, has posted its lone MVC victory over Wichita State (81-71), while conference losses have come against Creighton (62-76), at Southern Illinois (58-79) and at Drake (73-83). In going 4-7 in non-league action, the Redbirds recorded victories over Weber State (74-70), UC-Irvine (58-52), Samford (65-54) and Central Michigan (72-63). Losses have come to Pitt (46-65), Hofstra (80-82 ot), at Georgia Southern (76-87), at UT-San Antonio (82-88), at Chattanooga (59-70), at Illinois (73-87) and Kent State (48-61).

THE COACH – Sycamore head coach Royce Waltman (Slippery Rock '64) is entering his fifth season at the helm of the Indiana State basketball program. Waltman's record as head coach at Indiana State is **78-54 (.591)** through four-plus seasons, while his 15-year career mark stands at **267-140 (.656)**, including previous head coaching stints at Indianapolis (1993-97) and DePauw (1988-92).

THE SERIES – Saturday night will be the 84th meeting between the two schools. The series, which dates back to the 1913-14 season, finds Indiana State trailing, 38-45, in the overall series and 11-26 in games played in Normal, IL. However, the Sycamores have won the last six consecutive contests, including a 78-71 win at Redbird Arena last January 6.

ON THE AIR – Every Sycamore regular and postseason game may be heard live on WSDM-FM 97.7 and the Sycamore Radio Network with Brian Fritz (play-by-play) and former Sycamore guard Michael Menser (color) calling the action. The pregame show begins 25 minutes prior to tip time.

TV, TOO! – The Indiana State-Illinois State game will be nationally televised by ESPN2, with Mark Jones (play-by-play) and Tim McCormick (color) courtside.

NEXT UP – The Sycamores return home to host Wichita State, Wednesday, January 16. Tip-off is set for 7:05 p.m. EST.

BLOCK TO MISS THREE WEEKS – Senior guard Kelyn Block is expected to miss approximately three weeks of action after undergoing surgery on his right knee on January 4. The 6-2, 200-pound senior from Kansas City, KS, is the Sycamores' scoring, assists and minutes-played leader, averaging 12.9 ppg., 4.9 rpg., and 3.0 apg. over 34.2 minutes per contest. Prior to the January 5 game against Evansville, Block had never missed playing in a game since arriving at Indiana State, a string of 104 consecutive contests.

SYCAMORES HOME AND AWAY – Thus far in 2001-02, Indiana State stands 3-4 at home and 0-6 on the road. In four-plus seasons under head coach Royce Waltman, Indiana State has recorded a 48-12 (.800) mark at Hulman Center, at one point compiling a 22-game home winning streak. Over the past four seasons, the Sycamores have posted home records of 12-2 (2000-01), 12-1 (1999-2000), 10-3 (1998-99) and 11-2 (1997-98). Indiana State is 17-4 (.810) in non-conference home games and 30-8 (.789) in Valley home games under Waltman. On the road, ISU has recorded a 21-36 (.368) ledger and stand 14-23 (.378) in Valley road games under Waltman. The Sycamores recorded a 5-8 road mark in 2000-01, were 6-6 in 1999-2000 and were 5-8 in both 1998-99 and 1997-98.

NONCONFERENCE SLATE WAS PERILOUS– Playing a nonconference schedule ranked among the fifteen-toughest in the country (Sagarin ranking), Indiana State posted its worst non-league record since the 1993-94 campaign. No fewer than five of Indiana State's seven non-league opponents were tabbed to win either their respective league or division titles in 2001-02. Ball State (MAC-West), Butler (Horizon League), Murray State (Ohio Valley), Valparaiso (Mid-Continent) and Wyoming (Mountain West) are predicted top their standings.

SYCAMORE DEFENSE STINGY – Indiana State ranks second in the Missouri Valley Conference in points allowed, allowing just 65.8 ppg. The Sycamores also stand third in FG percentage allowed, holding opponents to 42.2 FG%.

MORE DEFENSE – The Sycamores' defense tallied a pair of season bests against Evansville, as they forced a season-high 19 turnovers and blocked a season-high seven shots.

SYCAMORES' GET DEFENSIVE AGAINST ACES – In posting its first MVC win of the season, Indiana State held visiting Evansville to a season-low 28.1 percent shooting from the field. That 28.1 field goal percentage represents the first time the Sycamores have held an opponent to below 30 percent from the field since limiting Loyola-Chicago to just 29.3% on December 12, 1998 in Chicago.

NO EASY BUCKETS – The 40 points scored by Evansville were the fewest tallied by a Sycamore opponent since December 2, 1950, when St. Joseph's College managed just 38 points in a 64-38 Sycamore victory.

GRIMES GETS NOD – In part due to the injury to senior guard Kelyn Block, true freshman Lamar Grimes has seen his playing time increase. The Chicago, IL-Gage Park freshman, who has made six starting appearances this season, has made the most his playing time. He logged a career-high 39 minutes of action against Evansville, scoring a career-best 11 points, grabbing four rebounds and dishing four assists. His next outing saw him match those 11 points while dishing a career-best nine assists and block two shots over 38 minutes of action.

HOWARD IS SYCAMORES' ASSIST LEADER – Sophomore guard Marcus Howard has developed into Indiana State's 'stingiest' guard. For the year, he leads the Sycamores with 36 assists, while committing just 27 turnovers. Over the past three contests, the Elgin, IL-High product has dished eight assists while committing just two turnovers.

KANTE 'ACES' TEST – Senior center Djibril Kante tied a career-high with 13 rebounds against Evansville. The Bloomington, IN, native also recorded four blocked shots on the evening, moving past Nate Green and into sole possession of second place on the Indiana State career blocked shots chart. Kante now has 112 career blocks. He also matched a career assist best with his three dishes.

OFFENSE LIVELY AGAINST PANTHERS – After not topping 60 points over the previous five outings, Indiana State's offense came to life against Northern Iowa. As a team, the Sycamores shot a season-best 49.1 pct. from the floor, hitting a season-high 28 field goals in the process.

HOWARD TURNS UP OFFENSIVE INTENSITY – Sophomore guard Marcus Howard has made noticeable contributions, offensively, over the past three contests. During that time, he has averaged 12.3 points and dished eight assists (to just two turnovers). Most recently, he scored a career-high 18 points and dished five assists against Northern Iowa.

KANTE BIG INSIDE – Senior Djibril Kante is on a rebounding roll, having logged four consecutive games with double-digit rebound totals. Over those last four contests, Kante (who is averaging a team-high 8.2 rpg.) has grabbed 44 rebounds, including 10 rebounds vs. Ball State, 11 boards vs. Bowling Green, a career-high tying 13 rebounds against Evansville and 10 boards against Northern Iowa. Earlier this season, the Bloomington, IN, native also grabbed a career-best 13 rebounds against Valparaiso.

BROERMANN LOGS CAREER ACTIVITY – Junior guard Matt Broermann certainly can't complain about a lack of activity. After not playing more than 28 minutes in a single game over the first two seasons of his career, the 6-5 Hamilton, OH, native, who is averaging 21.6 minutes per contest, is on a string of three consecutive games of 30+ minutes. He logged a career-high 38 minutes of action against Bowling Green, followed with 32 minutes of action against Evansville and sweated away 31 minutes of activity against Northern Iowa.

BOARDS BY COMMITTEE – No single Indiana State player is posting glittering rebound numbers. Rather, four players, Terence Avery, Djibril Kante, Kelyn Block and Matt Berry are each contributing the lion's share on the boards. Kante is averaging a team-high 8.2 rpg., Avery is contributing 6.5 rpg., Block is averaging 4.9 rpg. while Berry is averaging 4.2 rebounds.

AVERY REMAINS STRONG ON OFFENSIVE GLASS – Senior center Terence Avery's continues to show remarkable production on the offensive boards, nearly matching his defensive rebound total. For the season, Avery, who is averaging 6.5 rpg., has 41 offensive rebounds to go with 43 defensive rebounds.

... AND IS SOLID ON BOTH ENDS OF FLOOR – Center Terence Avery has displayed a dramatic increase in offensive production through the early portion of the 2001-02 season. In averaging 10.5 points to go with 6.5 rebounds, Avery has posted seven double-figure scoring performances, including a career-high 29 points at Eastern Illinois and 14 points at Wyoming. Meanwhile, the West Frankfurt, IL, native grabbed a career-best 12 rebounds at Eastern Illinois, recorded 11 rebounds vs. Bowling Green and nine rebounds at Butler.

MORE REBOUNDING – After being outmuscled on the boards for five consecutive contests, Indiana State out-rebounded two of its past three opponents, including a much-taller Bowling Green team, 38-32, as well as Northern Iowa by a 32-29 margin. For the season, the Sycamores have outrebounded their opponent just five times over 13 outings.

BLOCK BREAKS INTO TOP-20 – Senior guard Kelyn Block continues his climb up the Indiana State career scoring chart. With 130 points thus far in 2001-02, the Kansas City, KS native has accumulated 1,148 career points. That ranks 20th on the ISU all-time scoring chart, 25 points shy of 19th place-Bob Royer (1947-49, 1,173 pts.) and 27 behind Lenny Rzeszewski (1947-50, 1,175 pts.).

KANTE SWATS AWAY – Senior center Djibril Kante rejected a pair of Northern Iowa field goal attempts, giving him six blocks over the past two games and bringing his career total to 114 blocked shots. The Bloomington, IN-North product enjoyed a season-best four blocked shots against Evansville, and now resides in second place on the Indiana State career block chart, trailing only DeCarsta Webster (1975-78), who tops the chart with 168 career blocks. Earlier this season, Kante recorded three blocked shots to go with nine rebounds against IUPUI, then followed with a two block, 19-point, nine rebound night against Murray State.

YOUNG GUNS – Three Sycamore true freshmen have seen activity thus far in 2001-02. Freshmen point guard Lamar Grimes, who has drawn six starting assignments this season, is averaging 5.7 points, 1.9 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 19.8 minutes. Forward Jake Sams is averaging 3.1 points (including a season-best 13 at Butler) and 1.2 boards while seeing 13.8 minutes per contest, including four starting appearances. Center Jerod Adler is averaging 0.5 points and 0.3 rebounds over 4.9 minutes per game in eight appearances. Forward Darron Evans is being redshirted this season.

STRONG SOPHOMORES – The Sycamores' sophomore guard tandem of Matt Berry (Tulsa, OK-Washington) and Marcus Howard (Elgin, IL-High) is proving to be productive. Howard, who's career spans 47 contests, is averaging 8.2 points and 2.0 rebounds per contest. He has reached double-digit scoring totals six times, with a career-best 18 points coming against Northern Iowa. Berry, who has seen duty in 46 games during his career, is averaging 5.7 points and 4.2 boards this season, including a career-best 15 points at Butler, 14 points against Murray St. and a career-topping 13 rebounds against IUPUI.

Russell Trudeau, a 6-4, 190, guard, Lafayette (IN) Central Catholic - averaged 19.5 points, 8.3 rebounds and 4.0 blocks per game as a junior for 21-4 Central Catholic.

After an early experiment at forward, Kante has returned to the post position and is averaging 9.0 points and a team-leading 8.2 rebounds over 26.4 minutes. He lies second on the Indiana State career blocks list with 114. Kante notched his second double-double of the year (and fifth of his career) by tallying 17 points to go with 10 rebounds vs. Northern Iowa. The Bloomington, IN, native matched career-high rebound total with 13 boards against Evansville, and has run his string a double-figure rebound totals to four, as in consecutive games he also crashed the boards for 11 rebounds vs. Bowling Green and 10 rebounds vs. Ball State. He posted an earlier double-double with his 13-point, career-high 13-rebound outing against Valparaiso. He tallied a career-high 19 points, grabbed nine rebounds and blocked a pair of shots against Murray State. At Wyoming, he tallied a team-high 16 points to go with six boards, two blocks and one steal. Against IUPUI, he grabbed nine rebounds and blocked a trio of shots. He scored 11 points to go with six boards, two steals and one block at Creighton.

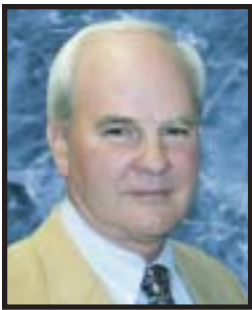

Looked upon for increased production during his senior campaign, Terence Avery has responded by averaging 10.5 points and 6.5 rebounds over 28.9 minutes per game. The muscular Illinois native enjoyed a career-best outing at Eastern Illinois when he scored 29 points and grabbed 12 rebounds. Of those 12 caroms, 11 came on the offensive end. Avery also corralled 11 rebounds vs. Bowling Green. For the year, 41 of his 84 rebounds (49%) have come on the offensive boards. He has also proven to be the Sycamores' most consistent inside scoring threat this season, having reached double-figure scoring on seven occasions. In addition to his 29 points at E. Illinois, Avery notched 14 points at Wyoming, 13 vs. Ball State, 12 vs. Northern Iowa, 11 at Butler and has twice scored 10 points. He was a Missouri Valley Conference all-Bench honoree a year ago, averaging 8.2 points and 4.4 rebounds.





ROYCE WALTMAN HEAD COACH

It took just three seasons as head coach at Indiana State University for Royce Waltman to return Sycamore basketball to the spotlight, attracting national attention unlike that since the fabled 1978-79 team danced to the NCAA Championship game.

His efforts were rewarded by his being named as the 1999-2000 Missouri Valley Conference Coach Of The Year.

As if an encore was needed, Waltman, now entering his fifth season at Indiana State, directed the 2000-01 Sycamores to their first MVC Tournament Championship since the 1978-79 campaign - leading Indiana State to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

While Waltman will quickly deflect praise for what his 1999-2000 ballclub has accomplished as being due to the diligent efforts of his entire staff, the achievements which he and his program have attained this season certainly merit mention of the bold face, large type variety.

Be it a mid-December, 63-60, victory at Indiana to claim the Indiana Classic Championship, defeating the Hoosiers again - this time in Terre Haute, recording the University's first 20-win season in 21 years, claiming outright possession of Indiana State's first Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title over that same 21-year span or directing the Sycamores to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in the school's history, Waltman's dedication, or to use one of his favorite terms - passion - for his program and the game of basketball are nothing short of amazing.

But Waltman is no stranger to the national spotlight, having spent his first five years in collegiate coaching as an assistant to Bob Knight at Indiana University. In those five seasons, the Hoosiers compiled a 116-41 mark, captured the 1987 National Championship, made four trips to the NCAA Tournament and one appearance in the NIT Finals.

As the leader of the Sycamore program, Waltman has methodically built his program towards the level of success he experienced as an assistant. Implementing an extremely effective recruiting program upon his arrival, Waltman and his staff have built the foundation for what has become a highly successful operation. Recruiting what Waltman refers to as 'good kids', exceptional youngsters both on the court as well as away from the arena, he and his staff have molded the Sycamore basketball program into one of headline proportion.

He does so with a style and candor which is certainly refreshing in this sometimes ultra-intense sport. Whether it be stopping by the University Commons each morning for a cup of coffee or visiting with fans and supporters on the team bench during pre-game warm-ups, Waltman's approach to the game is much the same as it was when he was coaching at the lower levels.

In fact, Waltman is quick to acknowledge another coach or player who, somewhere along the line of his career, 'knows what it's like to get off the bus and play ball,' as Waltman is fond of saying.

Waltman's determination to produce a winning program became apparent in his initial two seasons as the Sycamores cap-

tured their first back-to-back winning seasons in 20 years. Entering year number-three, his Sycamores were picked to make a run for a Missouri Valley Conference Championship.

And run they did, taking the outright MVC regular-season title.

Winning games and quickly reversing the fortunes of struggling basketball programs is the hallmark of this veteran coach. Prior to his arrival at Indiana State, Waltman spent a decade resurrecting basketball programs at the University of Indianapolis and DePauw University.

Waltman came to Indiana State from the University of Indianapolis. Prior to the 1992-93 campaign, Waltman inherited an Indianapolis team that had a .327 winning percentage over the previous 14 seasons. By the time he was finished, Waltman had completely turned around the Greyhound program, compiling an overall winning record of 89-49 a winning percentage of .645.

From 1987-92, Waltman was the head coach at DePauw University in Greencastle, IN. During his five seasons at that Division III institution, Waltman compiled an overall record of 100-36. His teams were ranked number-one in the nation during both the 1988-89 and 1990-91 seasons.

Prior to becoming a collegiate coach, Waltman spent 15 years as head coach at Bedford High School in Bedford, PA, amassing an overall record of 276-110.

A native of Ellerslie, MD, Waltman graduated from Slippery Rock in 1964 with a degree in health and physical education. While at Slippery Rock, Waltman was a two-sport letterwinner, earning monograms in both baseball and basketball.

Waltman and his wife, Carole, reside in Terre Haute. They have a daughter, Suzanne, a son, Kevin, and two grandchildren, Samuel and Lilly.
