About Bradley

- Bradley is located in Peoria, III., and enrolls 5,951 students. The Braves are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Head coach Jim Molinari is in his 11th season at Bradley. He owns a 170-143 record with the Braves after serving as the head coach at Northern Illinois for two seasons. Prior to guiding the Huskies, Molinari was an assistant at DePaul for 11 seasons.
- Bradley entered the 2001-02 season riding a 19-game home winning streak against league teams, but enters tonight's game with a 1-2 mark at Carver Arena against conference foes. In fact on the season, the Braves are 3-4 at home with losses to Southern California (60-50), UT-Arlington (61-60), Northern Iowa (67-61) and Southern Illinois (55-49).
- The Braves have two players averaging double digits on a team that averages 60.8 points per game. Phillip Gilbert leads the team with 13.9 points per contest. He is also the team leader in made 3-pointers and has attempted 40 percent of the entire team's trey attempts.
- James Gillingham ranks second on the club with 10.4 points per game. He also leads the team in steals with 21 and free throw percentage at 91.9%.
- Danny Granger averages a team-high 6.8 rebounds and ranks third with 9.8 points per game. He also leads the club in blocked shots with 32.
- Gilbert, Gillingham and Marcello Robinson account for 88% of the Braves 3-point attempts.
- The Braves are only shooting 29.2% on 3-pointers and are averaging 4.8 treys per outing.
- Bradley is shooting 41% on the season on 2-point attempts.

The Series

Today's game is the 91st meeting between the two schools in one of nation's most heralded rivalries. The Braves lead the series 50-40 and have three of the last five meetings, including the last two. In Peoria, Bradley leads the series 28-16 and have won eight of the last 10 in Carver Arena.

Just Reid – A New Slant

Illinois State had a new variation of the "Just Reid" program Saturday night against Southwest Missouri State. With no time left on the clock, it was just **Casey Reid** on the free throw line with a 60-60 tie. Reid sank his attempt after being fouled by Scott Brakebill in the final seconds to give the 'Birds the win. The last time the Redbirds claimed victory from the free throw line at the end of regulation was on March 2, 1992. Mike VandeGarde sank two charity shots to down Drake in Des Moines, 76-75.

A Larger Portion of Rice

In the last five games, if the Redbirds have looked a little different it might be because of a change in their diet. Lately, the offensive appetite of the 'Birds has been fueled by Rice – **Randy Rice** that is. The senior point guard is averaging 9.2 points per game during that span on 17-for-34 shooting. Not only has Rice been scoring, he also has 22 assists over the five games with only eight turnovers and 13 steals.

Sending Out an S.O.S.

After being picked to win the conference and sitting with a 7-11 overall record, the Redbirds might be feeling like they're stranded on a deserted island. However, for these cast aways the cause, rather than a solution, could be found in an S.O.S. – Strength of Schedule. Illinois State's schedule ranks as the No. 31 toughest slate in the nation by Saragin Rankings and No. 55 by College RPI.

Jeppson Pledging for the 1,000-Point Club

Of all the organizations on the Illinois State campus, the 1,000-Point Club must rank as one of the most exclusive with only 34 members in the last 104 years. The Redbirds' **Shawn Jeppson** is closing in on a membership, however. After scoring 14 points against Southwest Missouri State, Jeppson currently owns 965 points for his career and only needs 35 more to become the 35th player in Illinois State history to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

Redbird Rebounding is on the Rebound

After being out-rebounded in 11 of the first 14 games, including six straight, the Redbirds started to hit the boards against Drake, Indiana State and Creighton. In the last four games, the 'Birds own a +6.5 rebounding edge, despite holding a -1.9 margin for the season. The Redbirds have had 137 boards over the last four games with 51 coming off of the offensive glass.

Rudimentary Redbird Rally

Saturday's victory over SMS was the first win for Illinois State this season when trailing with five minutes remaining in the game. The 'Birds were down 51-44 and outscored the Bears 17-9 in the final five minutes to claim the victory. Now the 'Birds are 2-11 in games in which they trail, or are tied, at halftime and 1-11 in games trailing with five ticks left on the clock.

FT Four-Peat ???

The Redbirds have opened the season shooting 74.8% from the charity stripe and are on a good start to eclipse 70% for a fourth straight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line last season, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of that length since it bettered 70% for a four-season span from 1982 through 1985.

Sensational From the Stripe

Not only will the Redbirds 74.8% shooting from the free throw be four straight seasons at 70% or better, it currently ranks as the second-best percentage by an Illinois State team in school history. Only the 1983-84 team has shot better from the line at 77.4%.

Freshman Trey-ning

True freshman **Gregg Alexander** is adjusting the next level nicely. In fact through 18 games, Alexander has 34 made 3-pointers, for an average of 1.9 per game. At this pace, Alexander will finish the regular season with 55 treys. The Redbird freshman record for made 3-pointers is 50, set by Dan Muller during the 1994-95 season.

Non-Conference Slate as Tough as Advertised

Heading into the season head coach **Tom Richardson** knew that Illinois State's 11-game nonconference schedule was going to be challenging. As if the Redbirds 4-7 record wasn't enough proof, Illinois State's non-conference opponents have posted a 117-72 (.619) mark this season (as of 1/8). In addition to the overall winning percentage, Redbird non-conference foes have posted wins over Arkansas, Ball St., Boston College, Gonzaga, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio St., Pepperdine, St. Bonaventure, St. John's and Utah St. (twice), which College RPI all rank in its top 50.

League Games From Here on Out

Midwest winters in the months of January and February have been causes for bouts of depression, but this year during the first two months of 2002 Illinois State will be battling compression – of its Missouri Valley Conference schedule. The 'Birds will play their entire 18-game conference slate in 55 days from January 2 to February 25.

Streaking at the Charity Stripe

Illinois State's **Vince Greene** and **Dirk Williams** are riding of a couple of notable streaks at the free throw line. Williams has made all 22 tries this season, while Greene has sank his last 18 attempts. Gene Jontry holds the ISU record for 35 made free throws in succession which was set in 1956-57.

Breaking In Boo

Illinois State's **Baboucarr Bojang** is in his sixth year of organized basketball and is still developing as a player. That's bad news for Redbird opponents considering Bojang has already posted five double-doubles this season and three 20-point efforts. At Chattanooga, Bojang posted a career-high 26 points and grabbed eight boards with seven of them coming off the offensive glass. He has scored double-digits in 15 straight games and in every game this season except two.

Picked to Win the League? Chances Are You Played Illinois State

ISU played 11 non-conference games this season. Of the Redbirds' 11 non-Missouri Valley Conference foes, seven of the teams were selected in the preseason polls to win their respective leagues. The seven preseason favorites are Weber State (Big Sky), UC-Irvine (Big West), UT-San Antonio (Southland), Illinois (Big Ten), Georgia Southern (Southern) and Central Michigan and Kent State, which are both favored to win the two divisions of the Mid-American Conference.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Bradley Drops 'Birds in Valley Semis

ST. LOUIS, Mo. – Phillip Gilbert had 18 points and five assists as Bradley advanced to the championship game of the Missouri Valley Conference tournament with a 73-66 victory over Illinois State Sunday.

Bradley (19-10), the No. 2 seed, is in the finals for the first time since 1996 and will play fifth-seeded Indiana State in Monday's championship game.

Tarise Bryson of Illinois State (21-8), the conference's player of the year, matched his Valley-leading season average with 22 points. But Bryson often forced shots and was 7-for-18, including 3-for-12 from 3-point range.

Jerome Robinson had seven points in a 16-3 run to open the second half to give Bradley a 45-40 lead with 12:07 to go.

Illinois State cut the gap to a point at 48-47 on a 3pointer by Bryson with eight minutes left. Bradley answered with an 11-0 run over the next 3:14, with Gilbert, who was 7-for-11, scoring six points.

All five Bradley starters reached double figures. Jerome Robinson added 14 points and eight rebounds, Marcello Robinson had 13 points, Jeffrey Rabey 12 and Eddie Cage 10. Shawn Jeppson and Shedrick Ford added 19 points apiece for Illinois State.

Bryson Out For Season

Tarise Bryson, the nation's top returning scorer, the reigning Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year and Redbirds leading scorer for the last three seasons, fell to the floor on a drive to the basket at the 17:46 mark of the second half in Illinois State's 74-70 opening night victory over Weber State. The fall ended the season for the Redbirds sixth all-time leading scorer, as Bryson dislocated his right wrist and suffered severe ligament damage to his shooting hand. Bryson underwent surgery the day after the game and will face a year of rehabilitation.

Jeppson Hits Century Mark

With six minutes left in the game at Georgia Southern, Illinois State guard **Shawn Jeppson** became the ninth Redbird in school history to drain 100 treys in a career. Jeppson stands in eighth place overall and needs one 3-pointer to surpass former Redbird Maurice Trotter and seven to move ahead of Rickey Jackson.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, has transferred to Illinois State from North Carolina State, but cannot play for the Redbirds until the 2002-03 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. Guidry was a spot starter for the Wolfpack last season as a freshman and recorded a scoring best of 15 points against Wake Forest.

Double-Double Debut for Mr. Bojang-les

Baboucarr Bojang played his first game in a Redbird uniform against Weber State and it was worth an encore. Bojang tapped his way to posting his first double-double, as the SMS-West Plains Junior College transfer tossed in 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. It was the first time since November 23, 1990, that a Redbird had a double-double performance in an opening game. The late Reggie Wilson poured in 22 points and hauled in 13 rebounds in the season opener at Dayton. It was also Wilson's first game as a Redbird after transferring from Lincoln Community College.

Alexander the Great – Ballhandler

According to the roster and the register's office, **Gregg Alexander** is a true freshman, but on the court he plays like a savvy veteran. In his first season with the Redbirds, Alexander has logged 562 minutes, tied for most on the team, and coughed up only 24 turnovers. Alexander is averaging .043 turnovers per minute and 1.3 per game. He is tied for second on the team in assists with 43 and is fourth on the club in scoring with 9.9 points per game. He ranks second in steals with 26.

Built Ford Tough

Shedrick Ford is third on the Redbirds in scoring with 10.2 points per game and has scored doublefigures for Illinois State in eight games. Ford has been the leading scorer in three games and had a season-high 21 points against Hofstra. In the season opener against Weber St., Ford put the team on his back after the injury to **Tarise Bryson** and finished with 18 points and eight boards.

Alexander Goes Where Few Freshmen Have Gone Before

Since 1990, three true freshman have started their first collegiate games at Illinois State. One of them is current Redbird **Gregg Alexander**. Alexander drew the starting nod in the opener against Weber State and responded with eight points, one rebound and two assists in 20 minutes of play. Alexander joins P.J. Smith (1999) and Dan Muller (1994).

Been There, Done That

At the Missouri Valley Conference media day, Illinois State was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the league title by the conference media and sports information directors. The Redbirds received 26 of the possible 30 first-place votes. The last time the 'Birds were chosen preseason favorites was in 1997-98. Illinois State went on to win the conference. In 1996-97, the Redbirds were also favored to win and won the league.

A Trade-In???

It's not quite a trade, but next season when the Redbirds lose the services of **Shedrick Ford** to graduation they will add **Dana Ford**. Dana Ford, a 6-foot-4, 185 guard from Egyptian High School in Tamms, Ill., signed a national letter of intent during the early signing period with Illinois State. Last year, Dana Ford averaged 22.5 points and is the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,620 points.

CHAMPAIGN, III. (AP) – It was a case of too much paint for Illinois State's basketball team Tuesday night at the Assembly Hall. No. 7-ranked Illinois scored 36 of its 50 second-half points in the paint to cover up ISU, 87-73, before a sellout crowd of 16,500 people.

The Illini (9-2) led by five at halftime but went on a 17-6 run in which Frank Williams scored eight straight points and 11 in total to help Illinois build a 20-point lead. He finished with 29 points - including 4-of-8 from 3-point range - one off his career high.

Leading 37-32 at halftime, the Illini extended their lead over Illinois State (4-5) to 50-38 in the opening minutes of the second half with Williams on the bench because of a stomach ailment. Reserve Damir Krupalija scored nine of Illinois' 13 points in the surge and finished with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.

Illinois made 13 of its first 17 field goal attempts after halftime and shot 60 percent in the half, with most of those points coming on shots near the basket. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game.

Baboucarr Bojang had 15 points for the Redbirds. The schools, located approximately 50 miles apart, played for just the seventh time, the first since 1982. The Illini won the last meeting 67-60, and has lost to the Redbirds once, in 1906.
