Series History - Wisconsin

Illinois and Wisconsin are meeting for the 165th time in series history with the Illini holding a 99-65 advantage, including a 62-17 advantage in game played at Champaign. Wisconsin won the first meeting this year on Jan. 5, 72-66, at Madison. Illinois has won the last three meetings in Champaign, and 16 of the last 18 dating back to 1981.

Illini Head Coach Bill Self

Bill Self is in his second season at the helm of the Illini program following three years at Tulsa where he earned National Coach of the Year honors from the John & Nellie Wooden Foundation and *The Sporting News* in 2000.

After leading Tulsa to a 32-5 record and into a Regional Final appearance in 2000, Self became the first coach to lead two different schools to a Final Eight appearance with the Illini in 2001. Prior to his stop at Tulsa, Self spent four years at Oral Roberts where he built a program from 6-21 his first season to 22-6 in his fourth year.

A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self has worked under Larry Brown at Kansas and Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State.

In his first season at Illinois, Self led the Illini to 27 victories, the second-most in school history and became just the fourth Big Ten coach since 1950 to defeat every conference school in his first season. He also became just the sixth coach in Big Ten history to win a Big Ten title in his first season.

Self was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, finishing fourth in voting, and a was a nominee for the Naismith College Coach of the Year.

For Openers...

Illinois' next three games are against teams currently ahead of the Illini in the Big Ten standings (Wisconsin, Indiana and Ohio State) ... Senior Lucas Johnson is expected to make his first appearance of the season Jan. 23 against Wisconsin ... Johnson had surgery Oct. 22 on his right knee to repair a completely torn ACL, a return to game action in three months and one day ... Damir Krupalija, who has not played since Dec. 22 could also make a return Wednesday ... Cory Bradford has started every game of his collegiate career and enters the Wisconsin game with 117 consecutive games and total games started to tie Bruce Douglas for second on the Illini list with career starts. Efrem Winters is the UI career leader with 120 ... Bradford moved into fifth place on the UI

career scoring list Jan. 15 against Iowa ... Illinois' shooting percentage of .680 (34-50) against Michigan on Jan. 12 was the best since setting the school record of .691 (38-55) against Wisconsin-Green Bay on Dec. 4, 1985 ... Illinois leads the Big Ten in scoring (82.1 ppg) while Wisconsin is ninth (67.8 ppg) ... Illinois ranks 13th in the nation in scoring ... Illinois is second in the Big Ten (28th nationally) in field-goal percentage (.479) while Wisconsin is ninth (.434) ... Illinois' Robert Archibald leads the Big Ten in field-goal percentage (.645) ... Frank Williams ranks second in the Big Ten in scoring with an 17.9 average, is second in steals with an average of 2.28 and fifth in assists with 4.44 per game.

Last Time Out : Iowa

Illinois took out the Hawkeyes 77-66 with good shooting (48.2 percent), strong rebounding (38-31 advantage) and the play of All-America guard Frank Williams. The junior guard scored 16 points, handed out a season-high nine assists, grabbed seven rebounds and made four steals in the Illini victory. The receiving end of several of Williams' assists was Brian Cook, who led all scorers with 21 points on 9-13 field-goal shooting. Cory Bradford added 16 for the Illini as Illinois won for the 27th straight time on its home court.

Illini Gridder Young Joins Hoops Squad

Illinois junior wide receiver Walter Young began practicing with the basketball team on Jan. 17 and is available for action beginning immediately. Young, who averaged 17 points and 11 rebounds as a senior for Rich East High School, has junior eligibility. The 6foot-5-inch forward will be the first Illinois student-athlete since 1973 to play both football and basketball in the same season. Jim Rucks and Garvin Roberson were the last two Illini to double up in the same academic year. Rucks played for the Illini basketball team in 1971, 1972 and 1973, while lettering as a tight end in football in 1970, 1971 and 1972. Roberson played basketball in 1972 and 1973, while lettering as a split end on the football team from 1971-73. Jeff Finke played basketball as a freshman at Illinois in 1987 before switching to football from 1987-90 because of a back injury.

Home Court Streakin'

Illinois enters its next home game against Wisconsin on Jan. 23 with a 27-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall, the longest home-winning streak by the Illini since winning 28 straight from Feb. 11, 1988 to Jan.

15, 1990. Last year, Illinois completed its first unbeaten home season since the 1988-89 season (17-0). The current 27-game winning streak ranks third nationally behind Detroit (38, next home vs. UIC, 1/31) and BYU (30, next home vs. Wyoming 2/2).

Illinois' current 17-game winning streak in conference games at the Assembly Hall is its longest streak since winning 21 straight Big Ten home games from March 10, 1983 to Jan. 2, 1986. As of Jan. 15, the home conference winning streak of 17 wins ranks fifth in the nation behind Utah (45, next vs. BYU 1/28), Winthrop (24, next vs. Charleston Southern 1/24), Southern Utah (22, next vs. Oakland 1/31) and Detroit (20, next vs. UIC 1/31). Fresno State has won 16 (next vs. SMU 1/24) straight conference home games.

Illini Prevailing Despite Injuries

With the number of players on the Illini roster battling injuries, trainer Rod Cardinal has been doing almost as many media interviews as Bill Self the last few weeks. Lucas Johnson returned to practice on Jan. 11 for the first time this season. He suffered a torn ACL in his right knee that was surgically repaired in October. Brett Melton has missed the last 10 games and is still unavailable after suffering a

severe ankle sprain against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 1. He is considering applying for a medical redshirt this season. Damir Krupalija has missed the last six games and has practiced just twice since mid-December due to an injury to his left foot. His status is day-to-day.

A Look at Illinois' RPIand Sagarin Ratings

Illinois currently ranks No. 12 in the nation in the ratings percentage index (RPI) with an RPI of .6430. The only other Big Ten teams besides the Illini in the RPI's Top 25 are Indiana (14th) and Ohio State (16th). Illinois' strength of schedule is currently ranked 10th in the country.

The Illini are ranked No. 11 in the nation in Jeff Sagarin's latest rankings with a rating of 88.01. The current Sagarin Top Five teams are, in order: Duke, Cincinnati, Kansas, Oklahoma and Florida.

Top 10 Streak Alive

Illinois has been ranked in the

ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 10 for a school-record 30 consecutive polls, every poll since Bill Self was named head coach. The previous longest stretch of Top 10 action was a string of 28 straight polls in the AP Top 10 from the preseason 1989 poll until Jan. 23, 1990.

Top 10 Matchups

When No. 9 Illinois defeated No. 8 Missouri on Dec. 22, it marked Illinois' third Top 10 showdown of the season. On Nov. 27, No. 2 Illinois fell at No. 5 Maryland 63-76 and on Dec. 4, the No. 5 Illini lost to No. 7 Arizona in Phoenix, 82-87. Illinois is now 1-2 in Top 10 matchups this year. Last season the Illini were involved in seven games between two Top 10 programs, posting a 4-3 record.

Comeback Kids

Illinois had a habit of making great comebacks last year, and this year's team is on the way to earning the title of "Comeback Kids" once again. The Illini have fought back from

Getting to the Line ... And Making it Count

Illinois has made nearly as many free throws (372) as its opponent has attempted (403) this season and has outscored opponents from the line in 15 of the 18 games. Illinois has outscored its opponent by a combined score of 372-262 at the line, an average of 6.1 points more per game. The Illini made 37 free throws against Arkansas on Dec. 8, just one shy of the school record, in 49

attempts, which is three short of the all-time UI record. Against Minnesota on Jan. 2, the Illini outscored the Gophers 20-to-6 from the free throw line. As a team, Illinois is shooting 73.7 percent from the line this season, which ranks third in the Big Ten. Illinois has made more free throws than any team in the Big Ten.

High-Scoring Illini

Through 18 games this season, Illinois leads the Big Ten with a scoring average of 82.1 points per game and is shooting 47.9 percent from the field, which ranks second in the conference. The Illini have shown unselfish play with an average of 18.0 assists per game, the most of any Big Ten team.

Did you Know ...

... Frank Williams is the first Illinois player to be named Big Ten Player of the Year since Bruce Douglas was the UPI Coaches Co-Player of the Year in 1984 and the first Chicago Tribune Silver Basketball Trophy winner from Illinois since 1967.

... Frank Williams and Brian Cook. They share a common bond, being named Mr. Basketball in the state of Illinois. Williams won the award in 1998 and Cook in 1999.

... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 11 McDonald's All-Americans and two are currently on the Illini roster. Frank Williams made the All-America team in 1998 and Cook in 1999. Illinois ranks 11th all-time in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.

... Illinois has the 18th best all-time winning percentage (.644) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.

... Illinois has an all-time record of 1420-784. The 1420 wins rank 18th on the Division I list, one spot ahead of Louisville.

... Illini Head Coach Bill Self helped Oklahoma State to a Big Eight Conference Tournament Championship.

... Eight Illini players have been firstround draft selections, including Nick Anderson and Kendall Gill from the 1989 Final Four team.

... Illinois ranks third in the Big Ten behind Indiana and Michigan in total NCAA appearances.

... Illinois is second in Big Ten wins behind Purdue and third in winning percentage in Big Ten games behind Indiana and Purdue.

... The Orange Krush student group is more than just a Fighting Illini cheering section. The students raised over \$93,000 last year which went to the University of Illinois general scholarship fund, the Fighting Illini Scholarship Fund and a variety of charities.

Tournament Tested

Illinois has earned six victories this season over teams that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament in Gonzaga, Eastern Illinois, Georgia Tech, Arkansas, Missouri and Iowa. Adding in losses to Maryland, who advanced to the Final Four last season,

Arizona, who was the national runner-up last year, and Wisconsin, Illinois has already played nine games against last season's NCAA Tournament field. Illinois will play its 10th NCAA Tournament team, Wisconsin, on Jan. 23.

• **Dee-Fence** ... **Dee-Fence**: Through 18 games, the Illini have held opponents to 41.2 percent field goal shooting, including 32.7 percent from three-point range. The Illini are forcing 15.4 turnovers per game and have averaged 7.1 steals.

• **Defending Home Court:** After nine home games this season, Illinois opponents are shooting just .385 (205-533) from the field, .313 (52-166) from three-point range and .601 (101-168) from the free throw line.

In Illinois' 12 homes games at the Assembly Hall during the 2000-01 season, opponents shot a combined 34.6 percent (240-693 FG) from the field and 29.4 percent (74-252 3FG) from three-point range.

• **Starting High:** Preseason pollsters placed the Fighting Illini as high as they've ever been entering a season. The USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll started Illinois at No. 2 in the preseason poll, and the Associated Press had the Illini at No. 3. The two previous high marks for preseason rankings came in 1962 and 1984 when the AP had Illinois No. 2 in the preseason. *The Sporting News* ranked Illinois No. 1 in the preseason while *Sports Illustrated* had the Illini No. 2.

• Williams Preseason Honors: Guard Frank Williams was named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First-Team Nov. 6. Williams was joined on the team by Duke's Jason Williams, Missouri's Kareem Rush, Stanford's Casey Jacobsen and Kentucky's Tayshaun Prince. The last Illinois

• **More Select Company:** When Illinois defeated Iowa on Feb. 24, 2001, Bill Self became just the fourth coach in the Big Ten since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference team in his first season. The other three coaches are Indiana's Bob Knight in 1972, Iowa's Tom Davis in 1987 and Penn State's Jerry Dunn in 1996.

• **Self Defense:** For the 2000-01 season, opponents shot just 38.6 percent from the field. That was the lowest opponent shooting percentage since the 1955-56 season

when Illini opponents shot 35.2 percent from the field. Illinois finished third in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, behind only Kansas and Holy Cross.

In league play, the Illini were second in the Big Ten in field-goal percentage defense (.387) while ranking second in blocked shots (5.19), second in steals (7.44) and fourth in scoring defense (63.6).

• **Board Work:** This season, the Illini are averaging 38.2 rebounds per game, an average of 5.9 more boards than their opponent. Illinois' average of 40.0 rebounds per game in 2001 was the team's highest average since 1979 when the Illini averaged 41.3 rebounds per game. Illinois' rebounding margin (6.7) ranked 13th in the nation last year.

Junior Frank Williams was named Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year by both the media and coaches for 2001-02, as well as preseason First-Team All-Big Ten. Last year, Williams was the first Illini player to earn conference player of the year honors since Bruce Douglas was named co-Big Ten Player of the Year (with Purdue's Jim Rowinski) in 1984. Illinois' last league MVP before Williams in 2001 was Jim Dawson in 1967.

Brian Cook had 18 points and nine rebounds, and Robert Archibald added 16 points to lead No. 3 Illinois to a 76-58 victory over Gonzaga on Friday night.

Cory Bradford had 17 points, and Frank Williams had 13 for the Illini (1-0), who were outrebounded 21-12 in the first half, but took advantage of their size in the second half by going to Cook and Archibald down low against a much shorter Gonzaga team.

Dan Dickau had 19 points for Gonzaga (0-1), which ended up outrebounding Illinois 40-30 but committed 20 turnovers.

Cook scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and made 7-of-7 free throws as Illinois built a 72-54 lead with 2:50 remaining.

Illinois led 36-29 at halftime, but jumped out to a 41-29 lead on a 3-pointer by Sean Harrington and two free throws from Cook.

Gonzaga never got closer than seven points the rest of the game.

Zach Gourde had 15 points and 12 rebounds, and Cory Violette added 12 rebounds for Gonzaga, which shot 42 percent but made only 4-of-16 3-pointers.

The victory improved Illinois' all-time record in season openers to 84-13, to 82-15 in home openers and 32-7 in home openers at the Assembly Hall. The victory also was Illinois' 19th straight win at home.

Second-ranked Illinois forced Eastern Illinois into 27 percent shooting in a 93-53 win in the first round of the Las Vegas Invitational. Frank Williams scored 20 points to lead the Illini, but it was Cory Bradford who may have had the more impressive game.

The senior guard scored just nine points on 2-of-4 shooting but hounded the nation's leading returning scorer, Henry Domercant, into having an awful night. Domercant, who was guarded by Bradford much of the game, scored 12 points on 3-of-14 shooting. With Domercant missing shot after shot, undersized Eastern Illinois was forced into taking contested jumpers throughout the game. The Panthers turned the ball over 22 times and had just seven assists.

The Illini went on a 15-0 run early in the game and led 48-23 at halftime. Eastern Illinois trailed by at least 20 points the rest of the way.

The Illini bench outscored the starters 54-39 in a game in which no player was on the court more than 25 minutes. The Illini shot 56 percent for the game and were 18-of-22 from the free throw line.

Williams scored 16 of his 20 points in the second half and had six rebounds. He was 5-of-8 from the field and made 7-of-9 free throws. Freshman Luther Head came off the bench for Illinois to score 14 points on 7of-9 shooting, most of those layups and dunks.

Juan Dixon scored 25 points and No. 5 Maryland built a 20-point lead and held off No. 2 Illinois 76-63 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

It was the 80th consecutive non-conference home victory for Maryland, the longest such run in the nation. It was also the Terrapins' fourth straight win overall after a season-opening defeat against Arizona.

After the Terrapins (4-1) went up by 12 at halftime, Dixon scored seven points in a 10-2 run at the outset of the second half to make it 51-31.

Despite playing its fifth game in nine days, Illinois (5-1) fought back - even after leading rebounder Brian Cook fouled out with 5:11 left.

The comeback was aided by poor free throw shooting by Maryland, which finished 12-for-24 at the line. The Fighting Illini closed to 66-58 with 2:56 left, but Chris Wilcox scored in the lane, then made one of two free throws on Maryland's next possession for an 11point cushion.

Wilcox scored 19 points and six rebounds off the bench for Maryland, which beat a Top 5 team for the first time since 1998.

Blandon Ferguson had 11 points for Illinois, which three days earlier won the Las Vegas Invitational and was off to its best start in six years. But on this night, the Illini looked rather ordinary.

The Illini shot 33 percent and committed seven turnovers in the decisive first half.

Illinois was the highest-ranked non-conference team the Terrapins faced at home since they upset No. 1 Notre Dame in 1979.

Frank Williams had a near-career night in leading the Fighting Illini to victory over in-state opponent Illinois State by the score of 87-73.

The Illini led by five at halftime but went on a 17-6 run in which Williams scored eight straight points and 11 in total to help Illinois build a 20-point lead. He finished with 29 points - including 4-of-8 from 3point range - one off his career high.

The Illini played most of the first half without Brian Cook and Robert Archibald. Cook played four minutes in the first half, and Archibald, whistled for three early fouls, played two just minutes.

Leading 37-32 at halftime, the Illini extended their lead to 50-38 in the opening minutes of the second half with Williams on the bench because of a stomach ailment. Reserve Damir Krupalija scored nine of Illinois' 13 points in the surge and finished with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.

Illinois made 13 of its first 17 field goal attempts after halftime and shot 60 percent in the half, with most of those points coming on shots near the basket. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game.

Williams, added eight rebounds and four steals and was 11-of-19 from the field. Illinois' height advantage also proved troublesome to Illinois State.

Forced to shoot jumpers for much of the game, the Redbirds were just 4-for-20 from 3-point range, and shot 42 percent from the field.

Illinois' preseason All-America selection got the best of Missouri's.

Frank Williams scored 16 of his 22 points in the second half, outplaying Missouri counterpart Kareem Rush, as No. 9 Illinois beat No. 8 Missouri 72-61. Williams, who scored on a variety of shots off drives and added three steals, helped Illinois beat Missouri for the second straight season in the neutral-court series.

Brian Cook added 12 points and eight rebounds for the Illini, who beat a Top 10 team for the first time in three tries this season after losing to Arizona and Maryland. Illinois, which shot 50 percent overall, led 33-31 at the break.

Rush, double-teamed and in foul trouble all night, had his second straight sub-par game with 16 points on 6-for-15 shooting. Rush had 10 points in the first half but didn't score in the first 11:15 of the second half. Missouri's other main threat, Clarence Gilbert, was 3-for-12 and had nine points, almost 10 below his average. Those two dragged down Missouri's shooting percentage to 36 percent for the game. Missouri was 8-for-31 from 3-point range.

Williams scored six of his points in a two-minute stretch of the second half, pulling up in the lane, shooting over 6-foot-9 Arthur Johnson and squirming for room on the baseline to give Illinois a 55-48 lead with 5:42 left. Williams, averaging 24 points the past five games on nearly 50 percent shooting, helped finish off Missouri with a driving, twisting shot with 1:49 to play that put Illinois up 62-53.

Injuries forced Illinois coach Bill Self to search his bench for a starting center. He settled on Nick Smith, and the freshman delivered. Smith, who hadn't played more than 15 minutes in a game this season, had a career-high 17 points and nine rebounds in an 87-72 victory over Loyola of Chicago.

Smith started in place of Robert Archibald, one of three big men for No. 7 Illinois sidelined with injuries against the Ramblers. The redshirt freshman, who played 30 minutes against Loyola, was thrust into a starting role with injuries to Archibald and Damir Krupalija, the team's leading rebounder.

Frank Williams made 4-of-9 3-pointers and had 25 points for Illinois.

The Illini led by just three with 8:56 left but outscored Loyola 29-17 down the stretch. With the Ramblers trailing 58-55, Williams took control for Illinois and scored six straight points, two on spinning drives in traffic, to push the lead back to eight.

Illinois held a 46-33 rebounding edge over Loyola, who were able to stay in it with 9-of-22 shooting from 3-point land.

Illinois held David Bailey, the nation's second-leading scorer, to one field goal for most of the first half. But Bailey hit three straight 3-pointers and scored the final 11 points of the half to pull the Ramblers within 10. Bailey had 24 points and five assists but was just 8-for-20 from the field and committed seven turnovers. He was guarded most of the game by Williams, who also had seven rebounds and three steals.

The Badgers built a 68-65 lead with 1:12 left when Frank Williams lost control of the ball for Illinois and Mike Wilkinson recovered it for Wisconsin. Archibald, who had 17 points, fouled out, and Wilkinson sank both shots for a 70-65 lead, the Badgers' biggest yet.

Luther Head hit one of two foul shots to make it 70-66 with a minute left. But Wills sank two free throws for the final margin after Cook and teammate Sean Harrington knocked each other over going for a rebound with 32 seconds left.

Rodney Smith had 17 points to lead six Purdue players in double figures and the Boilermakers avoided their first 0-3 start in the Big Ten in 38 years with an 84-75 victory over No. 9 Illinois. Purdue coach Gene Keady credited the defense that held Illinois to 32 percent shooting in the second half as the difference.

Illinois held a one-point halftime lead. But the Boilermakers scored the final four points of the first half and opened the second by scoring the first five to lead 45-44 and they never trailed again. Illinois missed seven of their first eight shots but still pulled to 51-50. A 3-pointer by Willie Deane keyed an 8-0 Purdue run and Darmetreis Kilgore hit a three to open an 11point lead with eight minutes remaining.

Purdue built a 72-59 lead, but from there the game turned into a free throw shooting exhibition until the final minute. The Boilermakers were 35-for-46 from the line, and Illinois made 16 of 23 free throws.

Frank Williams hit two 3-pointers and Cory Bradford put back a miss to slice the deficit to 81-75, but with only 32 seconds to go the comeback was too late. Williams finished with 23 points, while Bradford had 13 and Robert Archibald 12. Illinois finished the game without Archibald and Sean Harrington, who had 11 points, as they both fouled out.

Austin Parkinson scored 13 points, Deane had 12, Maynard Lewis 11, and Kilgore and Joe Marshall each had 10 for the Boilermakers, who had lost four of their last five games.

Frank Williams didn't start a game for the first time in two years. Illinois carried on fine without him. Williams found himself watching from the bench early on Saturday after showing up five minutes late for the ninth-ranked Illini's game with Michigan.

Even with their playmaker on the bench, the Illini had little trouble handling the Wolverines. They scored the game's first eight points and never trailed in a 94-70 victory that snapped a two-game losing streak.

Illinois had plenty of success against the Wolverines, particularly in the paint. Lobbing the ball down low to big men Brian Cook and Robert Archibald, Illinois scored a majority of its points on dunks and layups.

The Illini shot 68 percent for the game and had 28 assists and just 13 turnovers. Michigan struggled to get open looks down low and couldn't connect from outside. The Wolverines shot 38 percent for the game, including 7-of-23 from 3-point range.

Cook led Illinois with 20 points on 8-for-11 shooting. Williams had 14 points, four steals and seven assists, two on crowd-pleasing lobs that were dunked by freshman Luther Head. Sean Harrington matched Williams with seven assists.

Michigan cut the Illini's lead to 10-6 when Williams finally entered the game. He scored four of his team's next six points as the Illini went on a 16-4 run to open a 16-point lead and were up 45-26 at halftime.

LaVell Blanchard led the Wolverines with 17 points on 7-of-15 shooting.

Asked about one of his jaw-dropping passes, Frank Williams responded with a question of his own.

"Which pass are you talking about?" Williams said Tuesday. It was a fair question considering the guard's performance in No. 11 Illinois' 77-66 victory over No. 17 Iowa on Tuesday night.

Williams did a little of everything against the Hawkeyes, approaching a triple-double that he may have gotten had the game been closer. He had 16 points, nine assists, seven rebounds and four steals for Illinois, including several spectacular passes.

"He was awesome," coach Bill Self said of Williams. "I don't think there are very many people in America who can dominate the game without shooting the basketball. And that's what he does."

Leading by eight, the 6-foot-3 guard slipped free on a pick at the top of the key, drove the lane and dunked in traffic. Two plays later, Williams fired a behind-theback pass to Brian Cook for a layup, then stole the ball at midcourt and went in for an uncontested layup.

After a free throw by Cook, the lead was back to 15 points and the Hawkeyes weren't able to get the margin below double figures.

Illinois did a solid job defensively against Iowa's two marquee players, Luke Recker and Reggie Evans. Recker, the Big Ten's leading scorer, had 16 points on 5-for-13 shooting. Evans had 12 points and six rebounds, well off his average of 17.7 points and 11.7 rebounds.

Cory Bradford had 16 points on 4-of-10 shooting from 3-point range for Illinois, which shot 48 percent for the game and outrebounded the Hawkeyes 38-31.
