Easing the Curse of Carbondale

Illinois State's 69-67 win Jan. 20 at Southern Illinois was just the second since 1990 at the home of the Salukis. Ironically, the other win was a close one, too--Jenny Schmidt's reverse layup with less than a second left in 1997 and Sunday's triumph are all the 'Birds have to show for 16 trips to Carbondale.

The Best Defense ...

The Redbirds are limiting opponents to just 39.6 percent field goal shooting, the second-lowest rate in the 25 years for which Illinois State has full statistics. Opponents' 29.7 percent from threepoint range is the lowest in Redbird history.

Donovan Twice As Good

At the start of 2002, freshman Katie Donovan's field goal percentage stood at just .267. In six games since the calendar turned, she has poured in 18 of 33 shots for a .545 percentage--more than double her efficiency for the first 10 games.

Birds Lag in Free Throw Tries

Through the first four weeks of league games, Illinois State ranked dead last in getting to the free throw line. Next-lowest Bradley averages more than 33 percent more league game attempts than the

'Birds. Ironically, Illinois State and Bradley are the only two Valley teams to only play two league home games thus far. Wichita State, averaging 25.0 attempts per game, has played five

home games, matching SIU for the league lead in home conference games so far. (see box above right).
