Series History - Minnesota

Illinois leads the all-time series by a 99-60 margin, but the Gophers own a 43-35 edge in games played at Minnesota. The Illini have won six straight games over the Gophers, including the final regular season game last year when the Illini clinched a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 67-59 victory at Minnesota. In the first game of conference play earlier this season, the Illini defeated the Gophers 76-53 in Champaign.

Illini Head Coach Bill Self

Bill Self is in his second season at the helm of the Illini program following three years at Tulsa where he earned National Coach of the Year honors from the John & Nellie Wooden Foundation and *The Sporting News* in 2000.

After leading Tulsa to a 32-5 record and into a Regional Final appearance in 2000, Self became the first coach to lead two different schools to a Final Eight appearance with the Illini in 2001. Prior to his stop at Tulsa, Self spent four years at Oral Roberts where he built a program from 6-21 his first season to 22-6 in his fourth year.

A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self has worked under Larry Brown at Kansas and Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State.

In his first season at Illinois, Self led the Illini to 27 victories, the second-most in school history and became just the fourth Big Ten coach since 1950 to defeat every conference school in his first season. He also became just the sixth coach in Big Ten history to win a Big Ten title in his first season.

Self was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, finishing fourth in voting, and a was a nominee for the Naismith College Coach of the Year in 2001.

For Openers...

Illinois can clinch a share of its second consecutive Big Ten title with a win at Minnesota on Sunday, the first back-to-back league championships in basketball for the Illini in 50 years since 1951-52 ... The other back-to-back title runs came in 1942 and 1943 ... Illinois enters the regular-season finale in nearly the exact same position as last season, needing a win over the Gophers to clinch a share of the league title ... The last time the Big Ten champion had five losses was the 1982-83 season when Indiana won the league with a 13-5 record ... Illinois would become the first Big Ten school to win league championships in both football and men's basketball during the same academic year since the Illini captured both titles in 1983-84 ... During its seven-game winning streak, Illinois' opponents have combined to shoot

just 39 percent from the field (140-of-360) and 30 percent from 3-point range (42-of-140) ... Also, during the current streak, Illinois opponents are scoring just 58.9 points per game, while during the three-game losing streak prior to the current streak, opponents averaged 77.7 points ... With its victory over Penn State Feb. 20, Illinois reached 20 wins for the 21st time in school history, the third straight year, and fifth time in the last six seasons ... Illinois has won at least 10 games in conference play for the third straight season, and fifth of the last six years ... Robert Archibald, who leads the Big Ten in field-goal percentage at .642, had the secondbest shooting day in Illinois basketball history Feb. 20 against Penn State when he made 11of-12 attempts on his way to a career-high 25 points. Only Derek Harper's perfect 11-for-11 shooting in 1983 tops Archibald's recent performance in the Illinois record books ... A pair of victories at Michigan and at Michigan State gives Illinois its first road sweep in the state of Michigan since 1989 ... Brian Cook became the 35th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points during his 23-point, 15rebound performance Feb. 16 at Seton Hall ... Illinois is the only team in the Big Ten to have three current players eclipse 1,000 career points (Bradford, Williams and Cook) ... Brian Cook has made 35 of his last 37 free throws over the span of the last 12 games, while Frank Williams has made 57 of his last 63 free throws over the span of the last 13 games ... In Big Ten play, Cook ranks first and Williams second in free throw percentage with Cook at 90.9 percent (40-of-44) and Williams at 88.4 percent (61-of-69) ... Illinois is shooting 74.5 percent from the free throw line this season, which is on pace to break the school record of 74.4 percent set during 1996-97 ... Illinois shot a season-high 93.3 percent (14-of-15) from the free throw line in the victory at Michigan Feb. 7 for the Illini's first road win of the season ... Cory Bradford has started every game of his collegiate career (128 games) and set the Illinois school record with his 121st start against Michigan State on Feb. 3, surpassing the previous record set by Efrem Winters ... Illinois leads the Big Ten in scoring (76.8 ppg). but is third in scoring in league play at 70.8 points per game ... Frank Williams ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring with a 16.3 average, is second in steals with an average of 2.10 and is sixth in assists with 4.0 per game ... Williams is 15th on the UI career scoring list with 1,346 points, and needs 14 points to catch Dave Downey for 14th place ... Cory Bradford moved into fifth place on the UI career scoring list Jan. 15 against Iowa and with 1,645 career points, he needs eight points to reach Mark Smith for fourth place ... Illinois' shooting per-

Illinois also shot 68 percent (17-25) in the first half against Wisconsin on Jan. 23 ... The Illinois bench is averaging 22.3 (646 total) points per game after 29 games, while opponent reserves are averaging 19.2 (556 total) points per game.

Self Nears Historic Mark

Last season, Bill Self became the first coach in 22 years, just the sixth all-time in the Big Ten, and second Illini coach to win a Big Ten championship in his first season as coach at a conference school.

A win at Minnesota on Sunday, and Self becomes the first coach in Big Ten history to win Big Ten basketball titles in his first two seasons.

Minnesota's Bill Musselman is the only coach to win an outright title in his first season in 1972. Other league rookies earning hardware are Iowa's Sam Barry in 1923, Michigan's George Veekner in 1929, Illinois' Doug Mills in 1937, Purdue's Lee Rose in 1979, Self in 2001 and Wisconsin's Bo Ryan this year.

Getting Hot at the Right Time

Illinois carries a seven-game winning streak into Sunday's game against Minnesota. The Illini own the fifth-longest active winning streak among nationally ranked teams. Here is

Last Time Out: Indiana

Illinois won its seventh straight game and climbed into a first-place tie with a 70-62 victory over Indiana Tuesday at Champaign. Frank Williams led all scorers with 24 points and grabbed six rebounds, while Brian Cook added 15 points and six rebounds in the Illini win. The Illini jumped out to a 14-point lead then held on with some clutch free-throw shooting down the stretch. The win, coupled with an Ohio State loss to Michigan State,

moved Illinois into a first-place tie with Wisconsin, Ohio State and Indiana. Indiana scoring leader Jared Jeffries was held to three points and four rebounds, with six turnovers, in 29 minutes

Archibald Big Ten Co-Player of the Week

Senior Robert Archibald was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week for the week of Feb. 25-Mar. 3 following Illini wins over Penn State and Northwestern. Archibald shared the award with Michigan State's Adam Ballinger.

Archibald earned Co-Player-of-the-Week honors after averaging a double-double in the two victories with 16.0 points and 11.5 rebounds per game while shooting an astounding 82.4 percent from the field, hitting 14 of 17 shot attempts. The senior forward recorded a pair of career-high performances on the week, beginning with a 25-point effort to equal a career-best vs. Penn State. Archibald added 10 rebounds against the Nittany Lions for his first double-double of the year and third of his career. He hit 11-of-12 shots against

- ... Frank Williams is the first Illinois player to be named Big Ten Player of the Year since Bruce Douglas was the UPI Coaches Co-Player of the Year in 1984 and the first Chicago Tribune Silver Basketball Trophy winner from Illinois since 1967.
- ... Frank Williams and Brian Cook. They share a common bond, being named Mr. Basketball in the state of Illinois. Williams won the award in 1998 and Cook in 1999.
- ... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 11 McDonald's All-Americans and two are currently on the Illini roster. Frank Williams made the All-America team in 1998 and Cook in 1999. Illinois ranks 11th all-time in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.
- ... Illinois has the 18th best all-time winning percentage (.644) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.

He posted a double-double with a seasonhigh 23 points and a career-high 15 boards at Seton Hall on Feb. 16 and had another near double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds at Northwestern Feb. 23.

Comeback Kids

Illinois had a habit of making great comebacks last year, and this year's team is on the way to earning the title of "Comeback Kids" once again. The Illini have fought back from five double-digit deficits to post victories. The Illini fell behind by 13 points against Penn on Nov. 22, 32-45 with :47 left in the first half, before rallying for a 78-71 win. Illinois trailed

by as many as 12 points against Arkansas Dec. 8, 36-48 with 17:49 remaining in the game, before mounting another comeback and finishing with a 94-91 win. On Feb. 7 at Michigan, Illinois trailed by 13 points, 14-27, with 6:10 left in the first half before fighting back for a 68-60 victory. Just two days later, Illinois found itself down 18 points to Purdue, 17-35 with 6:46 left in the first half, before rallyling for a 69-67 victory. On Feb. 16 at Seton Hall, the Pirates jumped out to an 11-point lead at 13-2 with 16:36 remaining in the first half before the Illini posted a 75-65 win.

Krupalija Out Until At Least Big Ten Tourney

Illinois senior forward Damir Krupalija reinjured his left foot against Michigan State on Feb. 3 and had surgery Feb. 6 to place a small plate on the area affected by the stress fracture. It is hoped that Krupalija will return to the court for the Big Ten Tournament. Krupalija has missed 13 games this season because of his injured foot.

Illini Roster Yet To Reach Full Strength

After having key players missing practice time and games for a number of different injuries this season, Illinois' roster was nearly back to full strength before Damir Krupalija re-injured his foot Feb. 3.

Lucas Johnson returned to practice on Jan. 11 after suffering a torn ACL in his right knee that was surgically repaired in October. Johnson played in his first game Jan. 23 against Wisconsin, scoring five points and grabbing three rebounds in 12 minutes. Johnson made his first start of the season Feb. 3 against Michigan State. He played a season-high 27 minutes against Michigan on Feb. 7, scoring 10 points and tying his career high with eight rebounds.

Krupalija missed seven games and had not played since Dec. 22 before also returning to the court against Wisconsin. Krupalija played 11 minutes against the Badgers. He re-injured his left foot Feb. 3 against Michigan and is out until at least the Big Ten Tournament.

Brett Melton has missed every game since suffering a severe ankle sprain against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 1. Following the season, he will apply for a medical redshirt.

A Look at Illinois' RPland Sagarin Ratings

Illinois currently (as of Feb. 27) ranks No. 13 in the nation in the ratings percentage index (RPI) with an RPI of .6175. The only Big Ten teams other than the Illini in the RPI's Top 50 are Indiana (19th), Ohio State (22nd) and Michigan State (33rd). Illinois' strength of schedule is ranked 24th in the country.

The Illini are ranked No. 11 in the nation in Jeff Sagarin's latest rankings (thru Feb. 27) with a rating of 88.16. Illinois' strength of schedule is ranked 21st by Sagarin.

the Big Ten with a scoring average of 76.8 points per game and is shooting 46.0 percent from the field, which ranks fourth in the conference. The Illini have shown unselfish play with a Big Ten-leading average of 16.3 assists per game.

During Illinois' current seven-game winning streak, the Illini are averaging 69.1 points while allowing 58.9.

Tournament Tested

Illinois has earned 10 victories this season over teams that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament in Gonzaga, Eastern Illinois, Georgia Tech, Arkansas, Missouri, Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan State, Penn State and Indiana. The Illini have lost to Arizona, who was the national runner-up last year, Maryland and Michigan State, Final Four participants from a year ago, and Wisconsin, Indiana and Ohio State. Illinois has played 16 games against last season's NCAA Tournament field.

Williams Among 30 Midseason Candidates for Wooden Award

Frank Williams is one of 30 candidates placed on the midseason list (released Dec. 27) for the John R. Wooden Award Player of the Year and All-America Team. Joining Williams on the midseason list from the Big Ten are Luke Recker and Reggie Evans of Iowa and Jared Jeffries of Indiana.

Getting to the Line ... And Making it Count

Illinois has outscored opponents from the line in 22 of 29 games this season. The Fighting Illini have outscored its opponent by a combined score of 546-414 at the line, an average of 4.6 points more per game. The Illini made 37 free throws against Arkansas on Dec. 8, just one shy of the school record, in 49 attempts, which is three short of the all-time UI record. Against Minnesota on Jan. 2, the Illini outscored the Gophers 20-to-6 from the free throw line. The Illini shot a season-high 93.3 percent against Michigan on Feb. 7, connecting on 14-of-15 from the line. Illinois has made more free throws than any team in the Big Ten and is shooting 74.5 percent from the line this season, which ranks second in the Big Ten. The Illini are also on pace to break the school record for free throw percentage in a season. The current Illinois record is 74.4 percent set during the 1996-97 season.

Top 10 Streak Snapped

Illinois moved to No. 12 in the Jan. 28 ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll, snapping a school-record streak of 30 consecutive appearances in the Top 10, the first 30 polls after Bill Self was named head coach Jan. 21, 2002. The previous longest stretch of Top 10 action was a string of 28 straight polls in the AP Top 10 from the preseason 1989 poll until Jan. 23, 1990.

Illinois has been ranked in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls for 37 consecutive polls.

Illini Gridder Young Has Short Stint With Hoops Squad

Illinois junior wide receiver Walter Young, who began practicing with the basketball team on Jan. 17 and saw his first action against Wisconsin on Jan. 23, has returned back across Kirby Avenue to prepare for sring football. A knee injury suffered in the Nokia Sugar Bowl kept Young on the sidelines during practice last week and the decision was made to allow his knee to heal before spring practice opens in March. He saw action in two games, scoring two points and grabbing one rebound. Young was second on the Big Ten Champion Illini football team with 50 receptions for 890 yards and eight touchdowns. The 6-foot-5-inch forward wasz the first Illinois student-athlete since 1973 to play both football and basketball in the same season. Jim Rucks and Garvin Roberson were the last two Illini to double up in the same academic year. Rucks played for the Illini basketball team in 1971, 1972 and 1973, while lettering as a tight end in football in 1970, 1971 and 1972. Roberson played basketball in 1972 and 1973, while lettering as a split end on the football team from 1971-73. Jeff Finke played basketball as a freshman at Illinois in 1987 before switching to football from 1987-90 because of a back injury.

Top 10 Matchups

When No. 9 Illinois defeated No. 8 Missouri on Dec. 22, it marked Illinois' third Top 10 showdown of the season. On Nov. 27, No. 2 Illinois fell at No. 5 Maryland 63-76 and on Dec. 4, the No. 5 Illini lost to No. 7 Arizona in Phoenix, 82-87. Illinois is 1-2 in Top 10 matchups this year. Last season the Illini were involved in seven games between two Top 10 programs, posting a 4-3 record.

- **Dee-Fence** ... **Dee-Fence**: Through 29 games, the Illini have held opponents to 41.3 percent field goal shooting, including 33.0 percent from three-point range. The Illini are forcing 15.6 turnovers per game and have averaged 7.3 steals.
- **Defending Home Court:** In 14 home games this season, Illinois opponents shot just .390 (305-783) from the field, .320 (85-265) from three-point range and .625 (168-269) from the free throw line.

In Illinois' 12 homes games at the Assembly Hall during the 2000-01 season, opponents shot a combined 34.6 percent (240-693 FG) from the field and 29.4 percent (74-252 3FG) from three-point range.

- **Starting High:** Preseason pollsters placed the Fighting Illini as high as they've ever been entering a season. The USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll started Illinois at No. 2 in the preseason poll, and the Associated Press had the Illini at No. 3. The two previous high marks for preseason rankings came in 1962 and 1984 when the AP had Illinois No. 2 in the preseason. *The Sporting News* ranked Illinois No. 1 in the preseason while *Sports Illustrated* had the Illini No. 2.
- Williams Preseason Honors: Guard Frank Williams was named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First-Team Nov. 6. Williams was joined on the team by Duke's Jason Williams, Missouri's Kareem Rush, Stanford's Casey Jacobsen and Kentucky's Tayshaun Prince. The last Illinois player to earn First-Team All-America honors from AP in the postseason was Andy Phillip in 1943.
- Self in Select Company: When Illinois defeated Iowa on Feb. 24, 2001, Bill Self became just the fourth coach in the Big Ten since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference team in his first season. The other three coaches are Indiana's Bob Knight in 1972, Iowa's Tom Davis in 1987 and Penn State's Jerry Dunn in 1996.
- **Self Defense:** For the 2000-01 season, opponents shot just 38.6 percent from the field. That was the lowest opponent shooting percentage since the 1955-56 season when Illini opponents shot 35.2 percent from the

field. Illinois finished third in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, behind only Kansas and Holy Cross.

In league play, the Illini were second in the Big Ten in field-goal percentage defense (.387) while ranking second in blocked shots (5.19), second in steals (7.44) and fourth in scoring defense (63.6).

• **Board Work**: This season, the Illini are averaging 36.8 rebounds per game, an average of 5.0 more boards than their opponent. Illinois' average of 40.0 rebounds per game in 2001 was the team's highest average since 1979 when the Illini averaged 41.3 rebounds per game. Illinois' rebounding margin (6.7) ranked 13th in the nation last year.

Williams Big Ten Preseason P-0-Y

Junior Frank Williams was named Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year by both the media and coaches for 2001-02, as well as preseason First-Team All-Big Ten. Last year, Williams was the first Illini player to earn conference player of the year honors since Bruce Douglas was named co-Big Ten Player of the Year (with Purdue's Jim Rowinski) in 1984. Illinois' last league MVP before Williams in 2001 was Jim Dawson in 1967.

National Exposure

For the 2001-02 season, Illinois is scheduled to play 13 regular-season games on national television. The Illini are scheduled to appear eight times on ESPN, four times on CBS and once on FOX Sports Net.

Bradford Holds NCAA 3-Point Record

Illinois junior guard Cory Bradford holds the NCAA record for consecutive games with a three-pointer with a trey in 88 straight games. He broke the previous record of 73 games set by Wally Lancaster of Virginia Tech from 1986-89 with his first trey against Arizona on Dec. 16, 2000.

Illini Basketball is a Hot Ticket

For the first time in Assembly Hall history, the Fighting Illini sold out in season tickets with 16,500 sold and set a school record with 12 sellouts in 2002. The eight sellouts last season were the most at the Assembly Hall since 1989.

Four Sign With Illini in November

Four future Fighting Illini players signed national letters of intent to attend Illinois during the fall signing period in November. **Dee Brown**, a 6-foot guard from Proviso East High School in Maywood, Ill., **Deron Williams**, a 6-3 guard from The Colony, Texas, **Kyle Wilson**, a 6-8 forward from Plano, Texas and **James Augustine**, a 6-10 forward from Lincoln-Way Central High School in New Lenox, Ill., all signed with the Illini. *Bob Gibbons' All-Star Report* ranks the Illini class No. 4 in the nation. The Illini have one scholarship remaining to issue in the spring.

Brian Cook had 18 points and nine rebounds, and Robert Archibald added 16 points to lead No. 3 Illinois to a 76-58 victory over Gonzaga on Friday night.

Cory Bradford had 17 points, and Frank Williams had 13 for the Illini (1-0), who were outrebounded 21-12 in the first half, but took advantage of their size in the second half by going to Cook and Archibald down low against a much shorter Gonzaga team.

Dan Dickau had 19 points for Gonzaga (0-1), which ended up outrebounding Illinois 40-30 but committed 20 turnovers.

Cook scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and made 7-of-7 free throws as Illinois built a 72-54 lead with 2:50 remaining.

Illinois led 36-29 at halftime, but jumped out to a 41-29 lead on a 3-pointer by Sean Harrington and two free throws from Cook.

Gonzaga never got closer than seven points the rest of the game.

Zach Gourde had 15 points and 12 rebounds, and Cory Violette added 12 rebounds for Gonzaga, which shot 42 percent but made only 4-of-16 3-pointers.

The victory improved Illinois' all-time record in season openers to 84-13, to 82-15 in home openers and 32-7 in home openers at the Assembly Hall. The victory also was Illinois' 19th straight win at home.

Juan Dixon scored 25 points and No. 5 Maryland built a 20-point lead and held off No. 2 Illinois 76-63 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

It was the 80th consecutive non-conference home victory for Maryland, the longest such run in the nation. It was also the Terrapins' fourth straight win overall after a season-opening defeat against Arizona.

After the Terrapins (4-1) went up by 12 at halftime, Dixon scored seven points in a 10-2 run at the outset of the second half to make it 51-31.

Despite playing its fifth game in nine days, Illinois (5-1) fought back - even after leading rebounder Brian Cook fouled out with 5:11 left.

The comeback was aided by poor free throw shooting by Maryland, which finished 12-for-24 at the line. The Fighting Illini closed to 66-58 with 2:56 left, but Chris Wilcox scored in the lane, then made one of two free throws on Maryland's next possession for an 11-point cushion.

Wilcox scored 19 points and six rebounds off the bench for Maryland, which beat a Top 5 team for the first time since 1998.

Blandon Ferguson had 11 points for Illinois, which three days earlier won the Las Vegas Invitational and was off to its best start in six years. But on this night, the Illini looked rather ordinary.

The Illini shot 33 percent and committed seven turnovers in the decisive first half.

Illinois was the highest-ranked non-conference team the Terrapins faced at home since they upset No. 1 Notre Dame in 1979.

In a rematch of last season's Midwest Regional final, Jason Gardner scored 18 of his 23 points in the second half, including six consecutive free throws over the final 54 seconds, as Arizona beat Illinois 87-82 in Phoenix.

Frank Williams scored 16 of his 30 points over the last 4:19 as the Illini, who trailed by as many as 19 points early in the second half, narrowed the gap to four.

Rick Anderson scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 21 minutes for the Wildcats. Freshman Isaiah Fox added 12 points, nine in the first half as Arizona built a 16-point lead.

Illinois went inside in a 20-6 run that cut the lead to 64-59 on Damir Krupalija's two free throws with 7:31 to play. Arizona freshman Will Bynum's three-point play boosted the lead to 67-59 with 7:19 remaining. Illinois cut it to five again, but Anderson grabbed teammate Luke Walton's missed free throw and was fouled. Anderson made both free throws to make it 70-62, then Dennis Latimore scored inside to put Arizona up 72-62 with 4:38 to play.

Williams' third 3-pointer in his late rush cut the lead to 84-80 with 36 seconds to go. Gardner lifted Arizona out of danger with his final two free throws that made it 86-80 with 32 seconds remaining, then Fox made one of two from the line to put the Wildcats ahead 87-80 with 16 seconds to go. Sean Harrington, fouled by Fox on a 3-point attempt, made two of three free throws with 7.8 seconds to play for the final margin.

The Illini made four of 20 3-pointers for the game. Cory Bradford was 0-for-8 from 3-point range and 3-for-15 overall.

Arkansas played its trademark in-your-face defense Saturday, swarming the court, pressuring the ball and making every possession a difficult one for No. 5 Illinois. In the process, the Razorbacks repeatedly sent Illinois to the free throw line, particularly in the second half. And that's where the Illini were able to pull out a victory, rallying to beat the Razorbacks 94-91 and deny Arkansas coach Nolan Richardson his 500th career victory.

Frank Williams scored 25 points, with 21 coming in the second half. He hit 18-of-24 from the line, and also had a last-second steal as the Illini came back from a 12 point deficit to earn the victory.

Brandon Dean led Arkansas with a career-high 29 points, but he was called for an offensive foul with 5.5 seconds to go - his driving shot banked into the basket but didn't count. Arkansas' Jannero Pargo scored 28, with seven 3-pointers.

Cory Bradford's jumper with 6:30 left gave the Illini their first lead at 71-70. Illinois pushed the lead to nine with two minutes left, but Dean hit a 3-pointer and then drove for a basket to make it 87-83. J.J. Sullinger's three-point play with 58 seconds to go got Arkansas to 90-88. After a steal, the Razorbacks moved the ball around the court several times before Pargo hit a 3-pointer, making it 91-90 Arkansas with 31 seconds remaining.

Damir Krupalija's dunk on a pass from Bradford with 11 seconds left gave the Illini a 92-91 lead. Dean then drove the middle, ran into Illinois center Robert Archibald and was called for the critical foul.

The Illini played most of the first half without Brian Cook and Robert Archibald. Cook played four minutes in the first half, and Archibald, whistled for three early fouls, played two just minutes.

Leading 37-32 at halftime, the Illini extended their lead to 50-38 in the opening minutes of the second half with Williams on the bench because of a stomach ailment. Reserve Damir Krupalija scored nine of Illinois' 13 points in the surge and finished with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.

Illinois made 13 of its first 17 field goal attempts after halftime and shot 60 percent in the half, with most of those points coming on shots near the basket. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game.

Williams, added eight rebounds and four steals and was 11-of-19 from the field. Illinois' height advantage also proved troublesome to Illinois State.

Forced to shoot jumpers for much of the game, the Redbirds were just 4-for-20 from 3-point range, and shot 42 percent from the field.

Illinois' preseason All-America selection got the best of Missouri's.

Frank Williams scored 16 of his 22 points in the second half, outplaying Missouri counterpart Kareem Rush, as No. 9 Illinois beat No. 8 Missouri 72-61. Williams, who scored on a variety of shots off drives and added three steals, helped Illinois beat Missouri for the second straight season in the neutral-court series.

Brian Cook added 12 points and eight rebounds for the Illini, who beat a Top 10 team for the first time in three tries this season after losing to Arizona and Maryland. Illinois, which shot 50 percent overall, led 33-31 at the break.

Rush, double-teamed and in foul trouble all night, had his second straight sub-par game with 16 points on 6-for-15 shooting. Rush had 10 points in the first half but didn't score in the first 11:15 of the second half. Missouri's other main threat, Clarence Gilbert, was 3-for-12 and had nine points, almost 10 below his average. Those two dragged down Missouri's shooting percentage to 36 percent for the game. Missouri was 8-for-31 from 3-point range.

Williams scored six of his points in a two-minute stretch of the second half, pulling up in the lane, shooting over 6-foot-9 Arthur Johnson and squirming for room on the baseline to give Illinois a 55-48 lead with 5:42 left. Williams, averaging 24 points the past five games on nearly 50 percent shooting, helped finish off Missouri with a driving, twisting shot with 1:49 to play that put Illinois up 62-53.

Injuries forced Illinois coach Bill Self to search his bench for a starting center. He settled on Nick Smith, and the freshman delivered. Smith, who hadn't played more than 15 minutes in a game this season, had a career-high 17 points and nine rebounds in an 87-72 victory over Loyola of Chicago.

Smith started in place of Robert Archibald, one of three big men for No. 7 Illinois sidelined with injuries against the Ramblers. The redshirt freshman, who played 30 minutes against Loyola, was thrust into a starting role with injuries to Archibald and Damir Krupalija, the team's leading rebounder.

Frank Williams made 4-of-9 3-pointers and had 25 points for Illinois.

The Illini led by just three with 8:56 left but outscored Loyola 29-17 down the stretch. With the Ramblers trailing 58-55, Williams took control for Illinois and scored six straight points, two on spinning drives in traffic, to push the lead back to eight.

Illinois held a 46-33 rebounding edge over Loyola, who were able to stay in it with 9-of-22 shooting from 3-point land.

Illinois held David Bailey, the nation's second-leading scorer, to one field goal for most of the first half. But Bailey hit three straight 3-pointers and scored the final 11 points of the half to pull the Ramblers within 10. Bailey had 24 points and five assists but was just 8-for-20 from the field and committed seven turnovers. He was guarded most of the game by Williams, who also had seven rebounds and three

Cook's dunk gave the Illini a 37-29 lead, but official Rick Hartzell slapped him with a technical, his fourth personal foul, and Illinois coach Bill Self got one of his own moments later for arguing the call. Cook said he didn't shove Wills on purpose nor did he do any trash talking. It proved costly nonetheless.

Kirk Penney hit one of two shots, and Devin Harris sank two more after Self was whistled on the inbounds play. Dave Mader's jumper on the ensuing penalty possession pulled the Badgers to 37-34 with 16:41 remaining.

The Illini regained control at 42-34 on baskets by Nick Smith and Robert Archibald. But behind Mader's seven points, the Badgers used a 13-2 run to take a 47-44 lead with 10:33 remaining. Mader finished with a career-high nine points before fouling out with 4:44 remaining.

The Badgers built a 68-65 lead with 1:12 left when Frank Williams lost control of the ball for Illinois and Mike Wilkinson recovered it for Wisconsin. Archibald, who had 17 points, fouled out, and Wilkinson sank both shots for a 70-65 lead, the Badgers' biggest yet.

Luther Head hit one of two foul shots to make it 70-66 with a minute left. But Wills sank two free throws for the final margin after Cook and teammate Sean Harrington knocked each other over going for a rebound with 32 seconds left.

Asked about one of his jaw-dropping passes, Frank Williams responded with a question of his own.

Williams did a little of everything against the Hawkeyes, approaching a triple-double that he may have gotten had the game been closer. He had 16 points, nine assists, seven rebounds and four steals for Illinois, including several spectacular passes.

"He was awesome," coach Bill Self said of Williams. "I don't think there are very many people in America who can dominate the game without shooting the basketball. And that's what he does."

Leading by eight, the 6-foot-3 guard slipped free on a pick at the top of the key, drove the lane and dunked in traffic. Two plays later, Williams fired a behind-the-back pass to Brian Cook for a layup, then stole the ball at midcourt and went in for an uncontested layup.

After a free throw by Cook, the lead was back to 15 points and the Hawkeyes weren't able to get the margin below double figures.

Iowa's Luke Recker, the Big Ten's leading scorer, had 16 points on 5-for-13 shooting. Reggie Evans added 12 points and a season-low six rebounds.

Cory Bradford had 16 points on 4-of-10 shooting from 3-point range for Illinois, which shot 48 percent for the game and outrebounded the Hawkeyes 38-31.

Dane Fife scored 20 points, and Indiana set a Big Ten record with 17 three-pointers in an 88-57 victory over Illinois, the Illini's worst loss in more than a decade. The Hoosiers made baskets almost at will, hitting 51.6 percent of their shots and 63 percent of their 3-pointers. Illinois managed only two 3s - both coming in the game's final 85 seconds.

Indiana decimated an Illini defense that had allowed opponents a league-low 30.6 percent on 3s in conference play. Fife made six 3s, Kyle Hornsby five and Tom Coverdale four. Coverdale finished with 16 points, while Hornsby had 15.

Frank Williams led the Illini in scoring with 11 points, all in the first half.

Indiana took control with two gigantic runs - 20-6 near the end of the first half and 21-4 at the start of the second half and led by as many as 35 points.

The Hoosiers broke to an 18-9 lead when Coverdale, Fife and Hornsby combined for four 3s. Illinois closed to 24-23 with 9:56 left in the half, but the Indiana's shooters wouldn't allow Illinois to get any closer.

The 20-6 run gave IU a 46-35 halftime lead, and the Hoosiers continued their shooting spree in the second half. Fife's 3-pointer with 17:58 to go ignited a 21-4 run that gave Indiana a 72-41 lead with 9:07 left.

The Buckeyes made just one field goal in the final five minutes, a big one by Darby. After the teams traded possessions, Darby hit a 15foot jumper off the dribble from the left wing. The lead never dropped below seven again, with Darby hitting four free throws in the final 39 seconds.

In the first half, Ohio State did more than just outplay the Illini on the perimeter. The Buckeyes had 11 assists to one for Illinois, and inside they outrebounded the taller Illini 16-8. Ohio State led 17-15 when it pulled away for good on Sean Connolly's 3pointer and a jumper by Brown.

Ohio State led by as many as 19 points before settling for a 42-27 lead at the break. That gave the Buckeyes room to hang on at the finish.

Cook, who entered the game averaging 12.4 points and 6.2 rebounds, bested his previous highs this season of 22 points against Michigan State and 10 rebounds against Southern Illinois.

Williams, the reigning Big Ten player of the year, said the road wins are all part of getting it together at the right time of the season.

Williams had 10 points as Illinois overcame a 13-2 deficit to tie the game 20-20 on his 3-pointer with 12:11 left.

Cook took over later in the half, scoring 10 points in the Illini's closing 21-6 run that gave them a 45-30 halftime lead.

Freshman John Allen led Seton Hall with 18 points, seven of which came in a 10-0 run that brought the Pirates within 50-43 with 15:12 to play. That would be as close as they would get the rest of the way.

Pirates center Charles Manga had two points and two rebounds Saturday, coming off a 23-point, 15-rebound effort against Georgetown. He was overmatched against Cook and fouled out in just 16 minutes.

It was easy to figure out what Illinois was doing on offense. It was anything but easy for Penn State to stop it.

Robert Archibald tied his career-high with 25 points and had 10 rebounds in the 16th-ranked Illini's 83-56 victory over Penn State. The 6-foot-11 Archibald overpowered the Nittany Lions down low, backing his defender toward the basket and scoring all of his points from the field on an assortment of dunks and layups.

Illinois has now won five straight, a winning streak that started after it lost three in a row and five of eight.

Archibald did all his damage down low, where he was a career-best 11-of-12 from the field. Penn State coach Jerry Dunn rotated defenders to try and stop the senior center, but none were effective as Archibald recorded his first double-double of the season. He also had three blocks. Archibald, playing with a heavily taped wrist on his shooting hand, could have eclipsed his career best set last year had the game been closer. He had 21 points with 12:44 left in the game, but was pulled when things got out of hand.

While the Illini worked the ball down low for easy baskets, they rarely allowed Penn State an open look. PSU shot a season-low 28 percent. It was the lowest percentage Illinois has held an opponent to this season.

Frank Williams finished with six points, five rebounds, four assists and six steals. Cook added 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting as 10 players scored for Illinois. Sharif Chambliss led Penn State with 18 points on 5-of-15 shooting, and Brandon Watkins had 11 points on 5of-19 shooting.

Illinois turned in one of its best defensive efforts of the season in a 56-41 victory over Northwestern on Saturday as the Wildcats set season-lows for points, field goals and shooting percentage.

From the opening minutes, nothing was falling for the Wildcats - even when they had open looks - as they missed shots from all over the court. Northwestern shot 29 percent from the field, including 0-for-17 from 3-point range, and was 13-of-30 from the free throw line. The Wildcats scored 13 points in the first half on 18 percent shooting, making just four field goals.

Illinois was led by Brian Cook's 12 points and nine rebounds and Cory Bradford's 12 points and seasonhigh six assists. Robert Archibald scored seven points and pulled down a career high 13 rebouns, while Frank Williams added seven points and grabbed eight

Jitim Young led Northwestern with 11 points on 4-of-13 shooting, while Tavaras Hardy had nine points and 11 rebounds, but was 3-of-13 from the free throw line

Illinois shot 43 percent for the game and outrebounded the Wildcats 48-29.

Leading by two, the Illini went on a 17-2 run behind six straight points from reserve forward Lucas Johnson to take a 25-8 lead.

Illinois then scored the final eight points of the half, the last of which came at the buzzer when Williams flipped the ball behind his back to an open Bradford who hit a long 3-pointer for a 35-13 lead.

In his final home game, Frank Williams scored 24 points as No. 15 Illinois beat No. 25 Indiana 70-62 for its seventh straight victory, one that helped create a four-way tie for first place in the Big Ten.

The junior was guarded most of the game by Dane Fife, who had trouble keeping up with the quicker Williams and was repeatedly beaten off the dribble. Williams was 8-of-19 from the field and 7-of-9 from the line, and also scored seven straight points late in the game to maintain the Illini's lead.

Brian Cook added 15 points, going 7-of-8 from the free throw line, and senior Cory Bradford had 13 points and was 3-of-4 from 3-point range for Illinois.

Illinois, Indiana, Ohio State and Wisconsin all have 10-5 records in the league and are tied for first, each with one game to play.

Kyle Hornsby had 14 points and Tom Coverdale added 13 for the Hoosiers, who have lost two straight and three of five.

Illinois led by as many as 14 points midway in the second half, but Indiana slowly cut the lead to two with 3:11 left on a basket by Jarrad Odle. After a basket by Williams, an Indiana assistant coach was charged with a technical foul for arguing a call. It was the second technical of the game for Indiana, and it couldn't have come at a worse time.

Cook made both free throws after the technical to give Illinois a six-point lead, then put back a missed shot to put the Illini up eight with 1:39 left. Illinois was 6-of-6 from the free throw line over the final 31 seconds, and the Hoosiers never got closer than five points the rest of the way.
