Series History - North Carolina

The all-time series between Illinois and North Carolina is tied 2-2. Illinois won last year's Big Ten-ACC Challenge matchup over the Tarheels with a 92-65 victory at the Assembly Hall. The Illini also won the first meeting over UNC in Champaign in 1951. North Carolina defeated Illinois in consecutive seasons, winning in Chapel Hill in 1986 and in Champaign in 1987.

Illinois in the Big Ten-ACC Challenge

The Big Ten-ACC Challenge is now in its fifth year of existence. Illinois is 1-3 all-time in the Challenge, earning its first win of the annual event last season over North Carolina at the Assembly Hall. This marks the second time that the Illini will play a Big Ten-ACC Challenge game at the Greensboro Coliseum, having also played Duke in Greensboro in 2000. Illinois' opponent in the Challenge has twice gone on to win the NCAA Championship (Duke in 2000-01 and Maryland in 2001-02). Illinois has been ranked in the Top 25 every year of the Challenge and has also drawn a Top 25-ranked opponent every year. Here is a look back at Illinois' games in the Challenge:

11/30/99 Duke 72, Illinois 69

No. 16 Illinois shot just 34 percent from the field in dropping a three-point decision to No. 17 Duke at the United Center in Chicago. Duke's Chris Carrawell led all scorers with 21 points while Frank Williams and Cory Bradford led the Illini with 14 each.

11/28/00 Duke 78, Illinois 77

Turnovers cost the No. 9 Fighting Illini a chance at knocking off No. 1 Duke as Illinois committed 26 turnovers in a one-point loss to the Blue Devils at Greensboro, N.C. Illinois controlled the glass, outrebounding Duke 42-27. Frank Williams led the Illini with 19 points while Jason Williams led Duke with a game-high 23 points and Mike Dunleavy added 21.

11/27/01 . . Maryland 76, Illinois 63

No. 5 Maryland won its 80th consecutive home game against non-conference opponents in the final season at Cole Field House, handing No. 2 Illinois its first loss. Juan Dixon led all scorers with 25 points while Chris Wilcox scored 19. Blandon Ferguson scored 11 points off the bench to lead the Illini.

12/3/02 . . Illinois 92, North Carolina 65

No. 25 Illinois won its first Big Ten-ACC Challenge game with a 27-point rout of No. 12 North Carolina in Champaign. Brian Cook and Sean Harrington dominated the game for the Illini. Cook scored a game-high 22 points with eight rebounds and five assists. Harrington came off the bench to nail six 3-pointers and finish with 20 points and five steals. Sean May led UNC with 21 points.

Illinois-North Carolina: Past Matchups

This marks the fifth meeting between Illinois and North Carolina, with the all-time series tied 2-2.

The first matchup in the series came on

Dec. 20, 1951, an 86-66 Illinois victory in Champaign's Huff Gym. Johnny "Red" Kerr led the way with 17 points and 12 rebounds while Bob Peterson added 16 points for the Illini, who went on to advance to the Final Four that season.

The two teams met for the second time in a showdown of Top 10 programs in Chapel Hill on Dec. 20, 1986, as No. 4 North Carolina defeated No. 5 Illinois 90-77. Kenny Smith scored 22 points for the Tar Heels, while Ken Norman led the Illini with 22 points and a game-high 15 rebounds.

The rematch one year later in Champaign

Illini Head Coach Bruce Weber

Bruce Weber is in his first season at the helm of the Illini program following five years at Southern Illinois where he led the Salukis to Missouri Valley Conference titles each of the last two seasons.

In his five seasons at SIU, Weber took the Saluki program to the top of the MVC, winning league titles in 2002 and 2003. He posted records of 28-8 and 24-7 in his last two seasons, leading the Salukis to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2002 with wins over Texas Tech and Georgia at the United Center in Chicago. Weber earned Missouri Valley Conference Coach-of-the-Year honors following the 2003 season.

A 1978 graduate of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Weber spent 18 years as an assistant at Purdue under Gene Keady before moving to SIU.

He has helped teams make 17 NCAA Tournament appearances in 24 seasons as a collegiate coach, including one Elite Eight and three Sweet Sixteen appearances. Purdue won six Big Ten titles during his stop in West Lafayette.

again went to the Tar Heels as No. 4 North Carolina defeated the Illini 85-74 on Dec. 19, 1987. J.R. Reid scored 30 points on 12-of-14 shooting to lead the Tar Heels to victory. Kendall Gill had 25 points and eight assists for the Illini while Nick Anderson added 16 points.

The most recent meeting in the series was Dec. 3, 2002 in the fourth annual Big Ten-ACC Challenge. No. 25 Illinois handed No. 12 UNC its first loss of the season, outscoring the Tar Heels 28-8 over the final eight minutes to turn a seven-point game into a lopsided 92-65 victory. Brian Cook scored a game-high 22 points, but it was Sean Harrington's shooting off the bench that sparked the Illini. Harrington nailed 6-of-8 three-pointers en route to 20 points.

faces North Carolina for the first time, first-year UNC coach Roy Williams is no stranger to the Fighting Illini. While Williams was at Kansas, his Jayhawks played the Illini in four consecutive seasons, which included two NCAA Regional Semifinal showdowns. Williams is 2-2 all-time against the Illini. Illinois defeated Kansas 84-70 at Chicago's United Center in 1999 and 80-64 in the 2001 Sweet Sixteen at the Alamodome in San Antonio. Kansas defeated Illinois 65-55 at Kansas City's Kemper Areana in 1998 and 73-69 in the 2002 Sweet Sixteen at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis.

Last Time Out

Illinois stormed out to a 27-7 lead in the game's first 10 minutes and never looked back, cruising to a 75-60 victory over Temple at the Palestra in Philadelphia. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game and displayed superb passing in shredding Temple's zone defense. Illinois

was credited with 22 assists on its 27 baskets. Roger Powell led the Illini with his second straight double-double, registering 19 points and 10 rebounds. Deron Williams scored a career-high 18 points and Dee Brown added 16 as Illinois improved to 3-0.

Williams Showcases All-Around Game

He scores, he defends, he distributes the ball...guard Deron Williams has been turning heads with his sensational play to start his sophomore season. Williams has scored in double figures in all three games and ranks third on the team in scoring at 14.3 points per game, more than doubling his freshman scoring average of 6.3 points. He scored a career-high 18 points vs. Temple and is shooting 50 percent from the field (15-30) and 3-point land (7-14). While his scoring has improved dramatically, Williams remains an unselfish player with the ball in his hands. He leads the Illini in

... Dee Brown is the eighth Illinois Mr. Basketball to attend the University of Illinois.

... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 12 McDonald's All-Americans and one is currently on the Illini roster. Dee Brown made the All-America team in 2002. Illinois ranks 11th all-time in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.

... Illinois has the 17th best all-time winning percentage (.647) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.

... Illinois has an all-time record of 1459-796. The 1459 wins rank 16th on the Division I list.

... Ten Illini players have been first-round draft selections, including Nick Anderson and Kendall Gill from the 1989 Final Four team and recent UI alumni Frank Williams to the New York Knicks in 2002 and Brian Cook to the Los Angeles Lakers in 2003.

... Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten behind Indiana in total NCAA appearances.

assists with 18 (6.0 apg), setting a career high with eight assists in the season opener vs. Western Illinois.

Back-to-Back Double-Doubles for Powell

Junior Roger Powell recorded the first double-double of his Illinois career against Mercer on Nov. 26, scoring 16 points and grabbing a career-high 10 rebounds. What better way to follow up that performance than with another double-double in his next outing vs. Temple. Powell scored a season-high 19 points and matched his career high with 10 boards. Powell ranks second on the team in scoring and rebounding, averaging 16.3 points and 8.3 rebounds. He is shooting over 61 percent from the field (19-31) and leads the Illini with 13 offensive rebounds in three games.

Head, Spears Return to Action vs. Temple

Junior guard Luther Head and redshirt-freshman Aaron Spears saw their first action of the season Saturday at Temple after sitting out two exhibition games and the first two games of the regular season due to team rules violations. Head scored nine points in 19 minutes of action while Spears had a rebound and block in 12 minutes.

Freshman guard Richard McBride is scheduled to miss one more game (through Dec. 2) for violating team rules.

First-Time Action

Freshman Brian Randle was in the starting lineup in his first two games as an Illini. He responded with eight points and a team-high three steals in the opener and six points and five boards in the second.

Junior transfer Jack Ingram, who sat out last season after transferring from Tulsa, scored four points and grabbed five rebounds in his first action as an Illini and had eight points and eight boards vs. Mercer. Freshman forward Warren Carter came off the bench and scored nine points, grabbed three rebounds and two assists in his first collegiate game against Western Illinois.

Quick Shots

Illinois' 2003 Big Ten Tournament title was the school's first in the six-year history of the tournament ... In 2002-03, Illini opponents shot .377 from the field, which ranked second in the nation and was the lowest opponent field-goal percentage by UI opponents since 1955-56 (.352) ... Since 1956, the only other Illini squad to hold opponents to less than 40 per-

Brown and Williams Invade Greece

Sophomores Dee Brown and Deron Williams were part of the USA Junior World Championship Team that competed at the 2003 FIBA Men's Junior World Championship in Greece from July 10-20. Williams and Brown both started all four game in the Global Games and all eight games of the world championships. Brown led the team in scoring with an average of 17.3 points and in steals with 19, and was second in assists with 33. Williams was fourth in scoring at 8.4 points and led the

team in assists with 38.

Brown and Augustine Return After Earning League Honors

Illini sophomores Dee Brown and

James Augustine return after earning league honors in 2003. Both were named to the first-ever Big Ten All-Freshman Team as voted on by the league coaches, while Brown was named Second-Team All-Big Ten by the media and Third-Team All-Big Ten by the coaches.

Big Ten Leaders

After the Big Ten regular season (16 games), the Illini had four players lead statistical categories. Brian Cook led the Big Ten in scoring (20.0 avg.), while Roger Powell ranked first in field-goal shooting at .641 (50-78). Deron Williams led the league in assists (4.81 avg.) while Dee Brown was one assist back in second (4.75 avg.). Brown led in steals (1.88 avg.) and assist/turnover ratio (3.04).

In all-games statistics, Illini players led five Big Ten categories. Brian Cook led the Big Ten in scoring (20.0 ppg), Dee Brown led in assists (4.97 apg) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.56), Sean Harrington led the conference in 3-point field goal percentage (.444) and Cook led in defensive rebounds (6.10 avg.). Deron Williams was third in assists (4.53 apg) and second in assist-turnover margin (2.46).

Youth Was No Excuse

The Illini were 25-7 last season, finished in second place in the Big Ten and won the Big Ten Tournament Championship with a majority of playing time coming from underclassmen. Of a possible 160 starts last season, 90 came from freshmen and 32 from sophomores, with 37 coming from seniors and one from a junior.

Illini Defense is Tops

During the 2002-03 season, Illinois opponents shot just 37.7 percent from the field, including just 30.9 percent from 3-point range. The Illini ranked second in the nation in field goal percentage defense (behind St. Joseph's 37.2). Only four opponents shot better than 45 percent from the field during the season.

The 37.7 percent shooting by Illini opponents was the lowest allowed since 1956, and just the second time since then that teams shot under 40 percent. The other was in 2001.

The 30.9 percent 3-point field goal percentage defense was the second-lowest in school history behind 30.8 percent in 2000.

Against Coppin State on Dec. 30, Illinois held the Eagles to just 12 field goals, the fewest made shots in the 40-year history of the Assembly Hall, and to just 29 percent shooting from the field. In a 70-40 defeat of Michigan State on Feb. 18, the 40 points scored by the Spartans tied the fewest points allowed by Illinois in Big Ten play in Assembly Hall history.

Illinois held 20 opponents to under 40 percent shooting from the field. Coppin State's 37 points were the fewest allowed by the Illini since defeating Northwestern 63-30 on Feb. 19, 2000.

Illinois led the Big Ten in field-goal percentage defense, was second in 3-point percentage defense and third in scoring defense, allowing opponents an average of just 61.6 points.

In the final national statistics compiled by the NCAA, Illinois ranked second in field-goal percentage defense and sixth in scoring margin (+13.1), while ranking 20th in scoring defense (61.6).

Illini Top League in Assists

The 2002-03 Fighting Illini season was trademarked with unselfish play. Illinois led the Big Ten and ranked second in the nation in assists per game (18.0 avg.), highlighted by a season-high 26 assists vs. Minnesota (3/9), 25 assists vs. Oakland, 24 vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff and 23 against Western Illinois, North Carolina and Penn State. In the win over Coppin State, the Illini were credited with 21 assists on 22 made baskets, an amazing 96 percent of shots made, and in the regular-season finale vs. Minnesota, Illinois was credited with 26 assists on 30 baskets (86.7 percent). Illinois tallied 20 or more assists in 12 games and recorded assists on 67 percent of its baskets (575 assists on 859 FG) on the season. Guards Dee Brown and Deron Williams ranked first and third in the Big Ten (all games) in assists with respective averages of 4.97 and 4.53 per game.

points per game last season, outscoring its opponents by a league-leading average of 13.1 points per game. Illinois shot 47.9 percent from the field, ranking first in the Big Ten, and shot 50 percent or better in 15 of 32 games.

Illinois led the Big Ten in scoring (74.6), field goal percentage (.479), scoring margin (+13.1) and was second in 3-point shooting (.366). Five of Illinois' top eight scorers shot 48 percent or better from the field.

Illinois has led the Big Ten in scoring each of the last three seasons.

Top 25 Streak Continues

Illinois is ranked 12th in the current ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, extending its streak to 61 consecutive polls in which the Illini have been ranked. Illinois is also ranked No. 12 in the AP Top 25 poll.

straight polls in the Top 10 snapped in January, 2002, but has never dropped out of the Coaches' Top 25 the last three-plus seasons.

Brown Streaks Past Foes

It was evident early on how Dee Brown earned the nickname of "one-man fast break." In his first year at the collegiate level, Brown started every game but one and led the Illini in minutes played (34.1 avg.). He earned second-team All-Big Ten honors from the media and third-team honors from the coaches, and earned a spot on the first-ever Big Ten All-Freshman team. He scored in double figures in 19 games and was second on the team in scoring, averaging 12.0 points.

Brown led the Big Ten in assists with 4.97 per game and also led the league with an assist/turnover ratio of 2.56. He ranked 18th in the Big Ten in scoring at 12.0 points per game. One of the quickest guards in America, Brown's 1.78 steals per game led the team and ranked third in the Big Ten.

In Big Ten Conference games only, Brown totaled 76 assists with only 25 turnovers, leading the conference with an assist/turnover ratio of 3.04 in league play. In conference games only, Brown finished second in assists (one behind teammate Deron Williams) and led the league in steals and assist/turnover ratio.

Among the top freshmen in the League, he ranked among the top four in assists (first), points (fourth) and steals (first) per game.

Brown exploded for a career-high 25 points against Eastern Illinois on Dec. 10, hitting 10-of-14 shots, including a career-high five 3-pointers.

In two December performances in front of national television audiences, Brown first had a game-high 21 points with seven assists and five rebounds in Illinois' victory over No. 11 Missouri to earn Big Ten Player of the Week honors on Dec. 21. He then followed with 19 points, including five 3-pointers, and three assists and three boards with no turnovers in 37 minutes against Memphis.

Brown had his best game in conference play against Michigan State on Feb. 18, scoring a game-high 24 points on 8-of-13 shooting with five rebounds, five assists and a career-high five steals.

Twice as Nice - Williams and Brown Excel as All-Freshman Backcourt in '03

Dee Brown and Deron Williams made up one of the best, if not the best, freshmen backcourts in the nation in 2003. The two ranked first and second, respectively, in the Big Ten in assist-to-

turnover-ratio and helped the Illini lead the Big Ten in team assists and assist-to-turnover ratio. Brown led the team in minutes at 34.1 per game, while Williams was third at 27.1 minutes. Brown was second on the team in scoring at 12.0 ppg while leading with 159 assists, seventh all-time on the Illinois single-season list. Williams averaged 6.3 points and dished out 145 assists, while ranking second on the team in steals with 46. He ranked second in the Big Ten in assist-turnover ratio at 2.46 and was third in assists with an average of 4.53.

In Big Ten play only, Williams led the Big Ten in assists (4.81 avg.) and ranked third in assist/turnover ratio (2.33).

Air Rog Takes Off

Roger Powell returned to the starting lineup with a bang over the last month of the 2003 season with several strong performances, scoring at least 18 points in wins over Northwestern, Indiana and Michigan, 15 points in a win over Minnesota, then 14 points in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals vs. Northwestern and 16 points in the title game vs. over Ohio State en route to capturing Big Ten All-Tourney Team honors.

After starting the first nine games of the season, Powell suffered a toe injury against Memphis and sat out the next two games. A slow return from the injury pushed back his progress before a strong stretch of play beginning at Michigan State on Feb. 2.

Powell had 10 points and seven rebounds in the 70-40 win over Michigan State and a then-career-high 20 points and four rebounds in the victory over Northwestern.

Against Indiana (2/25), Powell set a new career high with 22 points and grabbed seven boards, making nine of 13 shots. In the win at Michigan, Powell had 18 points and seven rebounds. In the last 11 games of the 2003 season, he combined to make 49 of 79 (.620) field goals in nine wins and finished second in the Big Ten in field-goal shooting at 59.1 percent (104-176). Powell ranked third on the team with an average of 8.7 points.

In Big Ten play, Powell led the league in field-goal shooting at 64.1 percent.

Augustine Steps Up in First Season

Another member of the heralded Illini freshman class of 2003 to shine was James Augustine. Augustine, named to the first-ever Big Ten All-Freshman Team, helped bolster the UI frontcourt, averaging 7.0 points and shooting 58.0 percent from the field. He scored in double figures nine times, recorded his first

career double-double with season highs of 19 points and 12 rebounds vs. Penn State and followed with another against Michigan with 11 points and 10 rebounds. He also notched a double-double of 12 points-10 rebounds in the Big Ten Tournament title game. Augustine was second on the team behind Brian Cook in rebounding, averaging 5.8 boards. He was Illinois' top-rebounder in eight games, highlighted by his 12-rebound performance against Penn State. Augustine ranked 13th in the Big Ten in rebounding at 5.8 per game and 13th in blocked shots.

In Big Ten play only, Augustine ranked third in field-goal shooting at 58.6 percent.

Big Nick a Solid Sub

Nick Smith, a 7-foot-2-inch junior, put up some impressive numbers off the bench in Big Ten play in 2003. In 16 conference games, Smith shot 67.3 percent (33-49) from the field, made 4-of-6 treys, and shot 90.5 percent (19-21) from the free-throw line. Smith averaged 5.9 points and 2.9 rebounds in the league while averaging 18.8 minutes per game. He led the Illini and ranked seventh in the Big Ten with 38 blocked shots. Smith was Illinois' top free throw shooter, making 38-of-44 from the line for 86.4 percent on the season.

Freshmen Make History in '02-03 Season Opener

On Nov. 24, 2002, for the first time in school history, Illinois opened the season with three freshmen in the starting lineup when James Augustine, Dee Brown and Deron Williams were on the floor for the opening tip vs. Lehigh. Two sophomores, Roger Powell and Nick Smith, rounded out the starting lineup as the youngest in school history. Prior to the opener, the five starters had combined for a total of four starts (all by Nick Smith).

The previous time Illinois started three freshmen in any game was Feb. 20, 1991 when Rennie Clemons, Scott Pierce, and Tom Michael started vs. Ohio State.

In the opening two wins of the season, the five Illinois freshmen scored 104 of Illinois' 186 points (56 percent), while grabbing 42 of the Illini's 90 rebounds (47 percent).

Cardinal Remains on Staff in Basketball Operations Role

Long-time Illini men's basketball trainer Rod Cardinal, who spent his 30th and final season as trainer on the bench last year, will remain with the program and serve in the basketball operations role. Cardinal began his UI career

as a trainer in 1973-74 in Harv Schmidt's final season, worked with Gene Bartow in his one season (1974-75), under Lou Henson from 1976 to 1996, Lon Kruger from 1997-2000 and Bill Self from 2001-03. Cardinal was on the bench as a trainer for more than 900 games (927, 595-332), and several thousand practices.

Al Martindale, UI Director of Sports Medicine, takes over the position of men's basketball trainer after working for many years with the Illini football program.

Orange Krush Honors Cardinal

The Orange Krush student support group and cheering section has announced that it will fund an endowment in the name of former men's basketball trainer Rod Cardinal in the amount of \$300,000 to fund future graduate assistants for the UI sports medicine program.

2003 Seniors Post Impressive Record

The Illinois senior class of 2003 finished their careers with a four-year record of 100-34 (.746). The 100 wins are the most victories during a four-year period, one more than the group who played from 1986-89. They have been a part of a 51-2 record at the Assembly Hall, the best home record of any team in the nation over the last four seasons.

The five players who finished their collegiate careers last season include Nick Huge, Clayton Thomas, Blandon Ferguson, Sean Harrington and Brian Cook.

Over the last four years, the group was a part of a total of 100 wins, two Big Ten regular season championships, one Big Ten Tournament title and four NCAA Tournament appearances.

Cook and Harrington had the biggest impact on the Illini record book. Cook finished his career as third leading scorer and fifth leading rebounder in school history. He also stands fourth on the career blocked shots list. Harrington ranks third on the UI career three-point list.

Harrington and Cook stand tied for first and third, respectively, in number of wins played in for the Illini. Doug Altenberger and Harrington are the all-time UI leaders having played in 99 wins during their careers followed by Steve Bardo and Cook (98).

Tip-Ins...

- Illinois' 26 wins in 2002 tied as the third-winningest season in school history, following a 27-win season in 2001, the second-winningest season in school history.

- The 2001-02 season was the second time in school history that the Illini posted back-to-back seasons with at least 26 wins. The last time was in 1984 and 1985.
- In 2003, Illinois won at least 10 games in conference play for the fourth straight season, and fifth of the last six years.
- Brian Cook was named 2003 Big Ten Player of the Year by both the media and league coaches. He and Frank Williams won Big Ten Player of the Year and Chicago Tribune Silver Basketball Awards two of the last three seasons.
- Brian Cook (20.0 avg. in 2003) was the first Illini player to win the Big Ten scoring title in league games since Kendall Gill in 1990 ... Cook also swept Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors.

Cook, Williams, Archibald and Gill in the League

Frank Williams became Illinois' first, first-round NBA draft pick since 1990 when the New York Knicks chose him as the 26th pick of the 2002 NBA Draft. Teammate Robert Archibald soon followed as the 32nd pick by the Memphis Grizzlies. Archibald was the first native of Scotland to be drafted by an NBA team. Archibald was traded to Phoenix prior to the 2003-04 season.

In 2003, Brian Cook was chosen as the 24th pick in the first round by the Los Angeles Lakers, becoming the third Illini chosen by the NBA in the last two drafts. Former Illini Kendall Gill (1987-90) is with the Chicago Bulls this season.

Bruce Weber was nervous when he walked into the Assembly Hall for his first game as Illinois coach.

"You're kind of getting a little antsy because you don't know what's going to happen, you're a little bit short-handed and crazy things happen," Weber said, referring to his depleted team.

But the 12th-ranked Illini had little trouble beating Western Illinois 94-66 despite having only nine players available. Luther Head, Aaron Spears and Richard McBride spent the game on the bench, serving suspensions for violating team rules.

Dee Brown scored 23 points to lead five Illini players in double figures as they built a 37-9 lead in the first 14 minutes and were never threatened.

Western (0-3) put together a 12-2 run in the closing minutes of the first half, but that was the most pressure it could put on the Illini all night.

But the Illini started the second half with a 16-6 run to push a 49-28 halftime lead to 65-34. They were able to keep the spread at about 30 points throughout the second half.

Roger Powell added 14 points, Nick Smith 13 and James Augustine 12 for the Illini, who hit 52 percent of their shots and were 7-for-22 from behind the 3-point line. Deron Williams added 11 points, nine rebounds and eight assists, nearly a triple-double.

Augustine added 13 rebounds, a career high, and the Illini extended their Assembly Hall winning streak to 18 in a row.
