About The Game: Tonight's game is the second straight home game for the Redbirds. The 'Birds own a 2-0 mark this season at home, while Eastern Michigan is 1-1 on the road. This is the second Mid-American opponent the 'Birds will have faced this season with the Northern Illinois game being the other. EMU hasn't played a game against the Missouri Valley Conference since a season-opening win against Drake in 1997. **Series History:** This is the 29th meeting in the series between the two schools. Illinois State leads the series 21-7, but the two teams have not met since 1974. The series began in 1950. The Redbirds have won 14 of the last 15 meetings.

Last Time They Met: Bubbles Hawkins led the Illinois State charge as he totaled 22 points in the 96-80 Redbird victory over Eastern Michigan on Jan. 28, 1974. In addition to scoring 22 points, Hawkins dished out 10 assists, while Ron deVries collected 12 rebounds. Roger Powell and Calvin Harper each added 14 points. EMU took an early 14-6 lead, but a 26-10 Redbird run gave Illinois State a lead that it would never relinquish

Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Moser served three seasons at Arkansas-Little Rock in his first head coaching position. Moser is assisted by Brian Barone, Steve Forbes and Daniyal Robinson.

Jim Boone (West Virginia '81) leads Eastern Michigan in his fifth season. With the Eagles, Boone owns a 25-66 (.275) record and a 298-203 (.592) in his 18-year career. Boone served four seasons as the head coach at Robert Morris and ten at California (Pa.). He is assisted by Glenn Gutierrez, Dave Pilipovich and Adrian Townsend.

- · This season is the 107th intercollegiate basketball season at Eastern Michigan. The Eagles have been a member for the Mid-American Conference for 30 seasons and have claimed three league titles (1987-88, 1990-91 and 1995-96).
- James "Boo" Jackson has posted double-doubles in three of the five games. He also led the Eagles in scoring Tuesday night against Kent State with 19 tallies.
- · Guard Ricky Cottrill needs 70 points to join the 1,000point club at Eastern Michigan. Markus Austin needs 298 to also join.
- · Junior guard JaQuan Hart missed the first three games of the season due to a violation of team rules. He played against Nebraska and got the start versus Kent State.
- Some famous EMU basketball alums include George Gervin, Grant Long and Earl Boykins.

Big MAC Attack

Playing a league member of the Mid-American Conference is nothing new for Illinois State, especially with the Redbirds playing at least two MAC opponents this season. Tonight's game will mark the 251st contest against a current affiliate of the MAC. The 'Birds have had their share of success against the MAC with a 152-98 record (.608). Some Great Holiday Steals

It is always good to get some bargains around the holidays, but Tuesday against Bellarmine the Redbirds got a steal ... 16 of them. ISU picked the pockets of the Knights all evening en route to a new Redbird Arena steals record. Chris Burras led the charge with five of them, while six others each collected at least one.

The Halves and Halves Not

So far this season the Redbirds have scored 40 or more points in six of the eight halves of action. Last year, for the entire season, the 'Birds only had nine 40-point halves. The 'Birds are averaging 39.1 points per half.

Home Security

The Redbird defense has been on red alert at Redbird Arena this season. In two home games, both wins, opponents are shooting 35.7 percent from the field and 20.9 percent from beyond the arc. On the road, both losses, ISU opponents are shooting 56.6 percent and 55 percent on threes.

Alexander Continues the Climb

With a pair of three-pointers against Bellarmine, junior guard Gregg Alexander passed Rickey Jackson for No. 7 all-time in Illinois State history with 129 career treys. Alexander will need 20 more to tie for No. 6 with Shawn Jeppson. Tarise Bryson leads the list with 214 career three-pointers.

Double-Double Debut

It didn't take Neil Plank long to make an impact with the Redbirds - one game. In his debut, Plank posted his first career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds. He also added six assists and five steals. Plank became the first Redbird since Baboucarr Bojang to record a double-double in his first Illinois State game. Bojang did it on November 16, 2001 when he had 14 points and 10 rebounds against Weber State.

Louisiana Lightning

Sophomore Trey Guidry opened the season as the league's player of the week after pouring in 24 points, powered by four threes, in the season opener against Florida A&M. Guidry was 4-for-6 on treys and had the sixth 20-point game of his career, all with ISU. He also tied an ISU Redbird Arena record by sinking 12 of his 14 free throw attempts against Florida A&M. Guidry's 12 charity makes tied Rico Hill's effort in 1997.



Dilly Delight

Freshman **Greg Dilligard** has made an early impact with the Redbirds. Dilligard started in both exhibition games and has started the first four games for Illinois State. In 72 minutes of action, Dilligard leads the team with five blocked shots. He also averages 4.3 points and 2.3 rebounds per game.

Marvelous Marcus

Sophomore **Marcus Arnold** started his second season where his first left off. Arnold tossed in a career-high 21 points, on 6-for-11 shooting, and added eight boards against Florida A&M. On the season, Arnold is averaging 15.8 points and 6.0 rebounds per game, both team leaders. He has also made all 13 of his free throw attempts. Last season, Arnold became the fifth Redbird to be selected to the Valley All-Freshman Team by averaging 8.4 points and 3.4 boards per game, while shooting 50.3 percent from the floor.

Full-Service Burras

Sophomore **Chris Burras** has really picked up his production the last two games. At Utah State, Burras finished with a then career-best 12 points, three boards and two steals. Versus Bellarmine, Burras ended with a career-high 17 points, five rebounds and five steals. The 6-foot-5 forward also dished five assists.

117 Games With a Trey on the Board

After draining nine treys against Bellarmine, ISU enters tonight's game with at least one made three in 117 straight games. The last time ISU didn't sink a single trey was an 82-43 loss at Creighton on Dec. 12, 1999.

It's Miller Time

Sophomore **Matt Miller** drew his first career starting nod for the Redbirds at Utah State and started again against Bellarmine. Miller is averaging 14 minutes per game and has five assists and two turnovers.

Gregg's Grand

By raising his scoring average by just a couple of points, junior **Gregg Alexander** could potentially add his name to the 1,000-point club this season. Alexander has 668 career points entering the campaign and needs 361 to reach the milestone. He scored 310 as a freshman and 323 last season. Alexander would be the 36th Redbird to join the 1,000-point club at Illinois State.

Literally the Home of Champions

Illinois State has long been known as the "Home of Champions" with its 114 Missouri Valley Conference titles, but the 2003-04 men's basketball schedule also looks like the home of champions – as far as preseason media polls are concerned. Florida A&M, Northern Illinois, Illinois-Chicago and Western Kentucky were all picked to win their respective leagues, while Illinois and Utah State were tabbed for second.

National Champs

Despite a 8-21 record, the 'Birds brought home a national championship last season in 3-point shooting. The 'Birds buried treys at a 44 percent clip, which was the highest success rate from behind the arc in the nation.

The Road to Aberration

Finishing with a sub-500 winning percentage is a rarity at Illinois State. In fact, last year was only the fourth losing season in the Redbirds' 33 years of basketball at the Division I level.

Six Straight?

The Redbirds have gone five straight seasons shooting 70 percent or better from the free throw line. Thus far this season, the Redbirds are shooting 80.9 percent from the line. The five-seasons streak ties Illinois State's longest string (1975-79) since joining the Division I level.

Letting the Tiger Loose

After the fall semester grades are recorded, Missouri transfer **Najeeb Echols** will take the court for the first time as a Redbird. Echols, who had to sit out a year to meet NCAA transfer rules, played in 10 games for the Tigers during the 2002-03 season, averaging 3.1 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. As a prep, Echols was ranked by most recruiting services among the nation's top 30 seniors.

Early Signs

During the fall early signing period head coach **Porter Moser** and the Redbirds added some instant athleticism for the 2004-05 season with the signing of Nedu Onyeuku and Justin Dentmon. Ranked as the eighth best shooting guard in junior college this season by *The Sporting News*, Onyeuku (6-3 • 180 • Guard • Omaha, Neb.) averaged 13 points and shot 41 percent on three-pointers as a freshman at Iowa Western. Dentmon (6-2 • 185 • Guard • Carbondale, III.) averaged 17.2 points, 7.8 assists and 4.0 rebounds as a junior at Carbondale High School, which posted a 24-6 mark last season and won the regional championship.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Redbirds Win – deVries Sets Record

NORMAL, III. - Had Gertrude Stein been a basketball coach, she would have written, "Win is a win is a win is a win."

And that's just about the way Illinois State University coach Will Robinson felt after his Redbirds' overcame a sluggish start to turn back Eastern Michigan, 96-80, before 3,000 fans at Horton Field House Monday night.

Eastern Michigan, which slumped to a 4-13 record, jumped off to a 6-0 lead and stayed in front until Calvin Harper scored on a fast break to give Illinois State a 22-22 tie with 9:35 left in the first half.

Calvin Williams meshed a pair of free throws to put Eastern Michigan back on top but Roger Powell's corner shot and three straight baskets by Bubbles Hawkins steered ISU to a 30-24 lead.

Harper and Larry Walls traded field goals before Ron deVries and Bubbles struck again. It was 36-26 with 5:29 to go in the half and all but over for the Hurons.

There were heroes aplenty as Illinois State moved its record to 9-7. Ron deVries set a career rebounding record; Harper turned in his best performance in nearly a month; and Hawkins, who was treated

rudely by home court fans in his last outing, went from jeers to cheers with 22 points and 10 assists.

deVries handled 12 rebounds, running his career total to 892 in 67 games.

Harper has been playing with a bad right hand since the first week in January. Calvin came off the bench to score 14 points and handle 6 rebounds.

Illinois State put up 100 shots and hit 46 percent of them. Eastern Michigan hit at a 46 percent clip. The Hurons outscored Illinois State at the free throw line, sinking 12 of 18 attempts while the Redbirds made 4 of 6.

The home team had a 57-35 rebounding edge and committed seven less turnovers than Eastern Michigan's 24.

The Redbirds overcame a one-point halftime deficit in the first minute of the second frame to take a four-point lead, 33-29, their largest of the game. Gregg Alexander tossed in a three-pointer at the 18:51 mark to put the 'Birds up by two. After an Alexander steal, Marcus Arnold dropped in a layup for the lead.

The Redbirds held their four-point edge on another trey by Alexander at the 16:44 mark, but a 14-4 run by the EA Sports All-Stars gave the visitors a 51-42 advantage and a lead they would never relinquish. The Redbirds closed the gap to 61-57 after a Plank layup at the 5:48 mark, but again the All-Stars responded with a 9-0 run to put the game away.

With 10:07 left in the first half, an Arnold basket gave the Redbirds their only lead of the frame at 15-13. The 'Birds managed to stay close in the first 20 minutes, despite only shooting 2-for-10 on treys, overcoming their largest deficit of six points to close within one, 29-28, at the half. The Redbird defense was largely responsible by forcing EA Sports into 18 first-half turnovers.

Arnold finished with 16 points and six boards, but was 6-for-21 from the field. Alexander chipped in 11. EA Sports was led by Robert O'Kelley's 16 tallies off the bench, while Clay Tucker and Cory Largent tossed in 11 and 10 points respectively.

In the second half, Illinois State used a 7-0 run midway through to get a little breathing room, as they extended their lead to seven at 68-61. Much like the first half, Global Sports kept it close, as they would tie the Redbirds at 58 and 61, but the 'Birds never trailed in the second half.

Other Redbirds in double figures included Alexander (15), Guidry (15), and Burras (14). Burras was relentless all night on the glass, leading the way with seven rebounds, including six on the offensive end.

Illinois State Outlasted by Aggies

LOGAN. Utah - Utah State used a 11-2 run after Illinois State's Marcus Arnold drew his fourth foul at the 16:08 mark of the second half to claim an 89-84 non-conference victory at the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum Saturday night.

The loss dropped the 'Birds record to 1-2 on the season, while the Aggies improved to 3-0. Utah State now owns a 71-7 record in the last six years on its home court.

The Redbirds shocked the home crowd by jumping out to a 17-6 lead as Neil Plank scored seven of the Redbird tallies. Utah State closed the gap to two at 22-20, but Plank added two more baskets to push the lead back up to six, 26-20, with 6:27 left in the first half.

The Aggies tied the game at 28-28 on a Spencer Nelson basket, but a Trey Guidry 3-pointer gave the 'Birds the halftime lead, 31-30 after Utah State's Jason Williams sank a pair of free throws.

Nelson's basket 15 seconds into the second half stole the ISU lead, one the 'Birds would never get back. Chris Burras scored a pair of foul shots with 19:18 on the clock to force a 33-33 tie, but that was the closest ISU would get.

A couple minutes later, Arnold was whistled for his fourth foul forcing head coach Porter Moser to his bench. Mike Ahmad scored four of Utah State's points during its 11-2 run. The 'Birds got within six points three times, but that was as close as they would get until Guidry's three at the buzzer for the 89-84 final.

Plank led all scorers with 21 points, including 12 in the first half. Guidry tossed in 18 points off the bench, while Arnold finished with 14 points in just 23 minutes of play. Vince Greene and Burras each added 12 points off the bench.

Mark Brown led the Aggies with 20 points and 13 assists. Cardell Butler scored 14 and Nelson added 13. Williams and Nate Harris each tossed in 11 points

Along with Guidry and Burras, Illinois State placed five players in double figures, as Vince Greene had 14, Marcus Arnold had 12, and Neil Plank dropped in 10. Illinois State shot 49% from the field for the game. Victor Pierson was the lone Knight in double digits, as he had 18.
