About The Game: Tonight's game is the return game from last season's match-up in Redbird Arena. The Redbirds are looking for their first road win of the season, while Illinois-Chicago is playing just its second home game of the season.

Series History: This is the 15th meeting in the series between the two schools. Illinois State leads the series 9-5, but UIC has won the last two meetings and three of the last five.

Last Time They Met: Illinois State had five players in double figures, but could not find consistent scoring throughout the game and fell to Illinois-Chicago, 78-65, to lose its third straight game to open the season. ISU was led by Vince Greene and Trey Guidry with 14 points apiece, while Gregg Alexander turned in 12 points for the 'Birds. Marcus Arnold added 11 points and six rebounds, while Andy Strandmark was the other Redbird in double figures with 10.

On the Tube: Tonight's game is televised live on Fox Sports Net-Chicago. The game is not available on satellite. Talent for the game includes Eric Collins (play-by-play) and Dave Kaplan (color analyst).

The Coaches

Porter Moser (Creighton '90) owns a 57-36 (.613) career mark in his first season at Illinois State, including a 3-2 (.600) record with the Redbirds. Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Moser served three seasons at Arkansas-Little Rock in his first head coaching position. Moser is assisted by Brian Barone, Steve Forbes and Daniyal Robinson.

Jimmy Collins (New Mexico State '70) leads Illinois-Chicago in his eighth season. With the Flames, Collins owns a 114-103 (.525) record in his first Division I head coaching position. Collins served 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Illinois under Lou Henson. He is assisted by Mark Coomes, Lynn Mitchem and Dave Donnelly.

About the Illinois-Chicago Flames

- Illinois-Chicago, located in Chicago, Ill., was founded in 1896 and has an enrollment of 24,541.
- The Flames currently rank No. 9 in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll.
- UIC returns all five starters from a year ago and has been tabbed to win the Horizon League according to the preseason poll of conference head coaches, sports information directors and media. The Flames collected 312 votes and 32 of the possible 35 first-place votes.
- Cedric Banks was selected as the preseason conference player of the year. Banks leads the team in scoring with 19.3 points per game, while hauling in 4.3 boards per contest.
- Martell Bailey was also named to the league's preseason first team. Bailey, a prep teammate of Banks, is averaging eight assists per game for the Flames.

A One-Man Bench

ISU's **Trey Guidry** has come off the bench in all five games for the Redbirds this season. Guidry has tallied 92 points this season, four more than the five Redbird opponent benches combined. Guidry matched a career best with 27 off the bench against Eastern Michigan. On the season, Guidry has posted three 20-point games off the bench.

What a Difference a Year Makes

Through five games, the Redbirds have collected their third victory of the season. Last season, ISU didn't win number three until February 1.

Several Redbirds will be returning to sweet home Chicago for tonight's game. **Marcus Arnold, Chris Burras, Najeeb**

Echols and **Vince Greene** all list the Windy City as their hometown, while **Ronnie Carlwell** (Maywood), **Kenneth Hill** (Naperville) and **Matt Miller** (Aurora) are all from just outside the city limits.

Dilly Delight

Freshman **Greg Dilligard** has made an early impact with the Redbirds. Against Eastern Michigan, Dilligard collected career highs with 10 points and nine rebounds. He has started all five games for Illinois State. In 102 minutes of action, Dilligard is second on the team with five blocked shots. He also averages 5.4 points and 3.6 rebounds per game.

Some Great Holiday Steals

It is always good to get some bargains around the holidays, but against Bellarmine the Redbirds got a steal ... 16 of them. ISU picked the pockets of the Knights all evening en route to a new Redbird Arena steals record. **Chris Burras** led the charge with five of them, while six others each collected at least one.

The Halves and Halves Not

So far this season the Redbirds have scored 40 or more points in seven of the 10 halves of action. Last year, for the entire season, the 'Birds only had nine 40-point halves. The 'Birds are averaging 39.3 points per half.

Home Security

The Redbird defense has been on red alert at Redbird Arena this season. In three home games, all wins, opponents are shooting 38.1 percent from the field and 25.9 percent from beyond the arc. The 'Birds also own an edge on the glass with 36.7 boards per game at home versus 35.3 by ISU's opponents. On the road, both losses, ISU opponents are shooting 56.6 percent and 55 percent on threes, while being outrebounded the Redbirds 31.5 to 25.5.

118 Games With a Trey on the Board

After draining 7 treys against E. Michigan, ISU enters tonight's game with at least one made three in 117 straight games. The last time ISU didn't sink a single trey was an 82-43 loss at Creighton on Dec. 12, 1999.

Alexander Continues the Climb

With a pair of three-pointers against Eastern Michigan, junior guard Gregg Alexander stands at No. 7 all-time in Illinois State history with 131 career treys. Alexander will need 18 more to tie for No. 6 with Shawn Jeppson. Tarise Bryson leads the list with 214 career three-pointers.

Double-Double Debut

It didn't take Neil Plank long to make an impact with the Redbirds – one game. In his debut, Plank posted his first career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds. He also added six assists and five steals. Plank became the first Redbird since Baboucarr Bojang to record a double-double in his first Illinois State game. Bojang did it on November 16, 2001 when he had 14 points and 10 rebounds against Weber State.

Marvelous Marcus

Sophomore Marcus Arnold started his second season where his first left off. Arnold tossed in a career-high 21 points, on 6-for-11 shooting, and added eight boards against Florida A&M. On the season, Arnold is averaging 17.0 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. Last season, Arnold became the fifth Redbird to be selected to the Valley All-Freshman Team by averaging 8.4 points and 3.4 boards per game, while shooting 50.3 percent from the floor.

Full-Service Burras

Sophomore Chris Burras has really picked up his production the last three games. Burras is averaging 11 points and four boards over the three game stretch. He added seven assists, eight steals and two blocks. Burras also ranks second on the team over the three game span in minutes played with 24.7 per game.

Gregg's Grand

By raising his scoring average by just a couple of points, junior Gregg Alexander could potentially add his name to the 1,000-point club this season. Alexander has 674 career points entering the campaign and needs 355 to reach the milestone. He scored 310 as a freshman and 323 last season. Alexander would be the 36th Redbird to join the 1,000-point club at Illinois State.

Literally the Home of Champions

Illinois State has long been known as the "Home of Champions" with its 114 Missouri Valley Conference titles, but the 2003-04 men's basketball schedule also looks like the home of champions – as far as preseason media polls are concerned. Florida A&M, Northern Illinois, Illinois-Chicago and Western Kentucky were all picked to win their respective leagues, while Illinois and Utah State were tabbed for second.

National Champs

Despite a 8-21 record, the 'Birds brought home a national championship last season in 3-point shooting. The 'Birds buried treys at a 44 percent clip, which was the highest success rate from behind the arc in the nation.

The Road to Aberration

Finishing with a sub-500 winning percentage is a rarity at Illinois State. In fact, last year was only the fourth losing season in the Redbirds' 33 years of basketball at the Division I level.

Six Straight?

The Redbirds have gone five straight seasons shooting 70 percent or better from the free throw line. Thus far this season, the Redbirds are shooting 77.0 percent from the line. The five-season streak ties Illinois State's longest string (1975-79) since joining the Division I level.

Letting the Tiger Loose

After the fall semester grades are recorded, Missouri transfer Najeeb Echols will take the court for the first time as a Redbird. Echols, who had to sit out a year to meet NCAA transfer rules, played in 10 games for the Tigers during the 2002-03 season, averaging 3.1 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. As a prep, Echols was ranked by most recruiting services among the nation's top 30 seniors.

Early Signs

During the fall early signing period head coach Porter Moser and the Redbirds added some instant athleticism for the 2004-05 season with the signing of Nedu Onyeuku and Justin Dentmon. Ranked as the eighth best shooting guard in junior college this season by The Sporting News, Onyeuku (6-3 • 180 • Guard • Omaha, Neb.) averaged 13 points and shot 41 percent on three-pointers as a freshman at Iowa Western. Dentmon (6-2 • 185 • Guard • Carbondale, Ill.) averaged 17.2 points, 7.8 assists and 4.0 rebounds as a junior at Carbondale High School, which posted a 24-6 mark last season and won the regional championship.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

ISU Loses Third Straight Game, 78-65

NORMAL, Ill. – Illinois State had five players in double figures, but could not find consistent scoring throughout the game and fell to Illinois-Chicago, 78-65, to lose its third straight game tonight at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State (0-3) was led by Vince Greene and Trey Guidry with 14 points apiece, while Gregg Alexander turned in 12 points for the 'Birds. Freshman Marcus Arnold had a career-high 11 points and six rebounds, while Andy Strandmark was the other Redbird in double figures with 10. Strandmark also led the 'Birds on the boards with a game-high eight rebounds.

UIC (2-1) was led by Martell Bailey with a game-high 20 points, while Armond Williams and Aaron Carr contributed 14 and 11 points respectively. The Flames overpowered Illinois State in the paint winning the scoring battle 38-12 and the rebounding battle 41-27.

Illinois State opened the game on fire shooting 6-for-8 from the field and jumping out to an early 16-7 lead at the 15:58 mark. Alexander led the way for the 'Birds early hitting two three-pointers during the run.

UIC went on an 11-0 run during the middle stretch of the first half and took its first lead of the game at 21-20 with 7:20 remaining before the break.

Arnold took Illinois State on his shoulders to open the second half scoring the Redbirds' first eight points to tie the game, 36-36, with 17:24 remaining in the game.

Illinois State, however, went into another scoring drought and managed only two points over nearly a six-minute stretch in the middle part of the second half as UIC took back the lead and extended it to nine at 58-49 at the 8:40 mark. The Flames seemed to be unable to miss their field goals in the latter part of the second half and shot 16-for-23 (.696) in the final period, including 10 of their final 11 shots.

DEKALB, Ill. - Junior Gregg Alexander sank four consecutive 3-pointers in the second half, but it wasn't enough to overcome the first half deficit as Illinois State fell 66-55 to Northern Illinois in non-conference action at the Convocation Center.

Todd Peterson led the Huskies with 19 points. Marcus Smallwood added 16 tallies and nine boards, while James Hughes tossed in 11.

Illinois State Outlasted by Aggies

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State used a 11-2 run after Illinois State's Marcus Arnold drew his fourth foul at the 16:08 mark of the second half to claim an 89-84 non-conference victory at the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum Saturday night.

The loss dropped the 'Birds record to 1-2 on the season, while the Aggies improved to 3-0. Utah State now owns a 71-7 record in the last six years on its home court.

The 'Birds got within six points three times, but that was as close as they would get until Guidry's three at the buzzer for the 89-84 final.

Plank led all scorers with 21 points, including 12 in the first half. Guidry tossed in 18 points off the bench, while Arnold finished with 14 points in just 23 minutes of play. Vince Greene and Burras each added 12 points off the bench.

Mark Brown led the Aggies with 20 points and 13 assists. Cardell Butler scored 14 and Nelson added 13. Williams and Nate Harris each tossed in 11 points.

Trey Guidry came off the bench to provide the spark again for Illinois State, as he lead all scorers with 11 in the first half. Freshman Greg Dilligard had a huge first half, as he reached career highs in points (8) and rebounds (8) in only one half of play.

In the second half, the Eagles received a heavy dose of Redbird sophomore Marcus Arnold, as Arnold had 16 of his career high 22 in the second frame. As a team, the Redbirds shot 50% for the game.

Eastern Michigan tied the game at 41 with just over 16 minutes to play and remained within striking distance throughout most of the second half. However an 8-0 Redbird run concluding with a Guidry bucket at the 5:19 mark gave Illinois State a 10-point lead and some breathing room. Illinois State led by as many as 14 in the second half.

James Jackson led the way for Eastern Michigan with 16, while Danny McElhinny added 14.
