**Higgins Hot In Hilltoppers First Win** — Freshman C **Josh Higgins** collected the first doubledouble of his career with 11 points and a Hilltopper season-best 14 rebounds in just 22 minutes, helping WKU to its first victory of the year in a 75-59 defeat of Austin Peay Saturday. In leading the Toppers on the glass for the first time, he recorded the most boards by a WKU player since **Chris Marcus** collected 15 in a 100-63 victory over Kentucky State on Feb. 19, 2002. The last time a Hilltopper grabbed that many rebounds against a Division I opponent came earlier that season on Jan. 2, when **Derek Robinson** collected 15 in a 65-54 win at Florida International. With Higgins' performance, the Hilltoppers have had four different players account for the team's five doubledoubles thus far this season. Higgins also shot 55.6 percent from the floor, collected a block and a steal, and did not commit a turnover.

Fine First Start — Ryan Lambert made the first start of his career Saturday in place of an injured Todor Pandov, grabbing nine rebounds while posting five points, a career-high two assists, a block and a steal. Lambert, who played 36 minutes (11 more than his previous high set against Louisville on Dec. 4), is averaging nine boards per game in the month of December.

**Charity Starts At The Stripe For Wells** — Senior **Mike Wells** accounted for half of his 14 points at the free-throw line in the APSU victory, the second consecutive contest that he has converted seven free throws. With Western up only four midway through the second half, he scored the Toppers' next nine points to help build their first double-digit lead of the evening. He added a career-best four steals and six rebounds.

**Haynes High Scorer Again** — Junior G **Antonio Haynes** paced all players with 17 points last weekend, marking the first time this season that the same player has led WKU in scoring in back-toback games. Haynes is averaging 17.7 points per game this month, shooting 54.5 percent (18-of-33) from the field including a 57.1 percent (8-of-14) mark from behind the three-point arc during that stretch. He also made a personal-best six free throws in the APSU contest, one less than his fivegame total entering play.

Winchester Warming Up? — Anthony Winchester's 12 points Saturday were the most he has scored since collecting a career-best 26 in the Hilltoppers' home opener against Mississippi State Nov. 29. The sophomore added six rebounds in the win, the fifth time in six outings in 2003 that he has recorded five or more.

**Rolling Rumph** — Sophomore **Danny Rumph** was one of the Hilltoppers' sparks off the bench in their first win of the season, recording a career-high-tying seven points to go along with two rebounds and two assists. Rumph has 13 points in the last two contests, the most he has scored in back-to-back games in his first season-plus on the Hill.

**Comeback Kids** — In earning their first win of the season against Austin Peay, the Hilltoppers overcame an eight-point halftime deficit as well as a 12-point margin with 16 minutes to go. It was WKU's first come-from-behind victory since Feb. 26 last season, when the Toppers trailed 35-28 at the break but recovered to defeat Louisiana-Lafayette, 69-66. WKU was 4-7 when behind at the half in 2002-03.

**Hitting The Boards** — For the second straight game, Western posted its best rebounding margin of the season after holding a 45-27 advantage on the glass against Austin Peay. The Hilltoppers are averaging 50.5 boards per game in the last two contests.

WKU Finds Way To The Free-Throw Line — The Toppers made 24 free throws against APSU, more than twice as many as the Governors attempted in the game — in fact, Wells (seven), Haynes (six) and Winchester (five) all made more free throws than the Governor with the most trips to the foul line (Josh Lewis, four). It marked the first time this season that WKU has gone to the charity stripe more than the opposition — Western accomplished the feat 19 times last year, winning each of those games.

**Benchmark Effort** — Thanks to the efforts of Higgins and Rumph, the Hilltoppers' bench outscored the opposition's reserves for the second time this season. Western's bench has accounted for 35 points in the last two games after posting just seven in the previous two contests.
