Game Notes

Marshall faces Illinois State today in the first ever ESPN Bracket Buster Saturday ... the game is one of nine "Bracket Buster" games scheduled for today ... Illinois State leads the all-time series with Marshall, 4-0 ... the teams played a four-game series that ended in 1977 with a 103-91 Redbird victory in Veteran's Memorial Field House ... Illinois State has won four of its last seven games and is coming off of a 65-61 win over Evansville ... The Redbirds are 0-10 on the road this season ... Today's game marks ISU's fourth game versus a MAC opponent this season, the Redbirds have lost at Central Michigan (74-69), at Kent State (76-61), and to Northern Illinois (72-65) ... Marshall is tentatively scheduled to travel to Normal, Illinois, next season on December 6th ... Marshall has never played in Redbird Arena and has not played in Normal since a 83-64 loss on January 26, 1976 ... The Redbirds lead the national in three-point shooting percentage (42.4%) a category that Marshall led last season ... ISU is led by soph. guard Vince Greene's 12.1 ppg, 6-9 senior Baboucar Bojanc leads the team with 5.2 rpg.

Bracket Buster Saturday: Today's game is part of the nine-game, first-ever ESPN Bracket Buster Saturday. Marshall is one of four MAC schools selected for today's event. Ball State plays at Western Kentucky (4:00 p.m. ESPN Regional); Bowling Green is at Illinois-Chicago (5:00 ESPN2); and Kent State hosts Hawaii (9:30 p.m. ESPN2).

Herd Heaven: Marshall's Cam Henderson Center has not been kind to non-conference foes. Marshall has won 31 of its last 32 non-conference games at home. The lone exception being a setback to Troy State last season.

Unfamiliar Foe from an Unfamiliar League: Marshall has met Illinois State only four times, with all of those meetings coming in the late 1970's. In fact, Marshall is only 12-12 all-time against current members of the Missouri Valley Conference and has not played a "Valley" member school since taking on Southern Illinois in the 1977-78 Marshall Memorial Invitational (The Salukis won 66-62).

Oh So Close: Marshall is just a few breaks away from having a few more wins. Six of Marshall's 10 losses have been by single digits, five of those by less than five points, and two of them have been in overtime.

Shear Excitement: Junior Ronald Blackshear was selected to the National Assoc. of Basketball Coaches All-District 4 second team this week. He was one of only three MAC players to MAC their respective district squads, Central Michigan's Kris Kaman and Kent State's Antonio Gates are the others. The district teams are made up of the top 150 players across the nation as voted on by members of the NABC. Blackshear currently ranks 25th nationally in scoring and his 3.6 three-pointers per game rank 11th in the NCAA.

The Distributor: Marshall sophomore A.W. Hamilton currently leads the MAC in assists per game with 5.72. The Wake Forest transfer, in his first season with the Herd, already has 103 assists, despite playing in only 18 games. He is third in the league in assist to turnover ratio (2.02).

Making the Most at the Line: Marshall's team free throw shooting percentage of .766 leads the MAC and currently ranks seventh in the nation in the latest NCAA statistical report. Ronald Blackshear leads all MAC individuals at the line at 88.1% (89-101) and ranks 24th nationally.

Camera Shy?: Marshall has played seven games on television this season and all of them have ended in losses. Five games were carried on the THN/ISP Network (ESPN +). The WVU game, was carried statewide in West Virginia, and the Eastern Michigan game was part of the MAC TV package on Fox Sports Net. Today's game is being televised by ESPN Regional/Full Court.

Down the Stretch They Come: Marshall has five regular season games remaining and three of those are at home (Illinois State, Kent State, and Miami). The two road games take the Herd to Ohio and Akron. Marshall is fighting for home court advantage in the MAC Tournament's first round and if the tournament were held today, the Herd would be the #7 seed and host #10 Eastern Michigan.

A Great Start: Marshall's win over Toledo moved the Herd to 4-0 in Mid-American Conference play for the first time ever. In fact, Marshall has only started 3-0 in MAC play twice in its 21-years in the MAC (Marshall was a member of the MAC from 1953 to 1969) and that was in 1959-60. Not even

Marshall's 1955-56 MAC Champion squad accomplished that feat.

The NBA Comes Calling: Marshall guard Tamar Slay was drafted by the New Jersey Nets in the second round of the NBA draft this past June. Slay was the only Mid-American Conference Player drafted and the first Marshall player to go in the NBA draft since 1985.

Shear Excitement: Junior Ronald Blackshear is among the best outside shooters in NCAA history. Blackshear tied the

national record for consecutive three-pointers made in a game when he hit his first 11 three-point attempts at Akron last season. The Camilla, Ga., native went on to score three more three-point goals to finish the game with the second most three-point goals ever made in an NCAA game (14), just one shy of the national record of 15 that was set, ironically, by Marshall University's Keith Veney in 1996.

Shear Force: Despite playing in only 21 games, and starting in only 12, Blackshear managed to connect on 88 of 193 three-point shots (45.6%) and score 157 points. His 88 three-pointers made led the team (Slay had 80 in 30 games played and ranked fourth in the MAC) and his 4.2 per game average would have led the nation had he qualified in the number of games played (He did not participate in the required 75% of games, due to being a mid-season transfer. Dan Dikau of Gonzaga, Jobey Thomas of UNC-Charlotte, and Cain Doliboa of Wright State are credited as last season's national leaders with 3.7 per game.).

A New Look Herd: For the first time in four years Marshall is without Tamar Slay and J.R. VanHoose. VanHoose finished his career as one of the top players in Marshall and Mid-American Conference history by recording 1,803 points and 1,088 rebounds. His 1,088 rebounds rank second all-time at Marshall only to the legendary Charlie Slack and 5th all-time in MAC history. Slay finished his career as Marshall's all-time leader in three point field goals (251) and three point field goal attempts (650). Slay's 1,792 career points rank sixth all-time at Marshall and his 142 career steals tie him for seventh on MU's all-time list.

White Surpasses 100-Win Mark; Reaches #225 With Win Over Western Carolina: With Marshall's win at Akron last season, Marshall head coach Greg White became only the fourth coach in Marshall history to reach the 100-win mark, joining Cam Henderson, Rick Huckabay and Jule Rivlin. The Herd's MAC tournament win over Northern Illinois last year made him the third winningest coach in Marshall history, surpassing Rivlin's 100 wins. The Herd's win over Western Carolina gave him 225 wins for his career.

Home Sweet Home: Marshall has enjoyed a great deal of success at home under Greg White. The Thundering Herd is 28-1 in non-conference home games, including wins over Wake Forest, Georgia, and UMass. Overall, White has guided the Herd to a 77-14 home mark for an .846 winning percentage.

Three-point Streak Continues: Marshall has connected on at least one three-point shot in all 192 games under head coach Greg White. In fact, Marshall University is currently riding a streak of 391 consecutive games with at least one three-pointer made. The last time Marshall did not make a three-pointer in a game was on February 27, 1989 against Appalachian State (Marshall won 97-96) and Rick Huckabay was the head coach.

Transfers Take Their Place in the Herd: Marshall has been heavily impacted by several transfers this season. Six-foot-eight power forward David Anderson sat out last season after transferring from Oklahoma State. A.W. Hamilton, a six-foot-three point guard, transferred from Wake Forest during mid-season. Marshall standout Ronald Blackshear transferred to MU from Temple during the 2000-01 season.

Marshall Picked 4th in Preseason Poll: The Thundering Herd was picked by league media members to finish fourth in the six team Mid-American Conference East Division. Ohio was picked to win the East, while Ball State was picked to win the seven-team west division.

Marshall Head Coach Greg White



First as a fan, then as a player, twice later as an assistant coach, and now as head coach, Greg White, 43, has poured his heart and soul into the Thundering Herd basketball program.

On April 8, 1996, while serving as an assistant coach under Jim HARRICK at UCLA, White's lifelong dream came true when he was named head coach at Marshall.

His alma-mater needed him. Marshall had struggled for most of the past decade and the program had become a revolving door job for head coaches (the school had four different coaches in an eight-year span). Thus, he was given the task of not only returning Marshall's storied basketball program back to respectability, but to give the program stability and help its transition into the Mid-American Conference.

Now in his sixth season, Greg White has accomplished just that. Under his direction, the Thundering Herd has become a respected player in MAC basketball - ranking among the conference's winningest programs over the last five seasons and MU is once again producing All-America caliber players and NBA draft picks.

White now stands third all-time in wins at Marshall, and is among the top three winningest active coaches in the MAC - along the way he has led Marshall to victories over the likes of Wake Forest, Georgia, UMass, Dayton and West Virginia and averaged better than 16.8 wins a year.

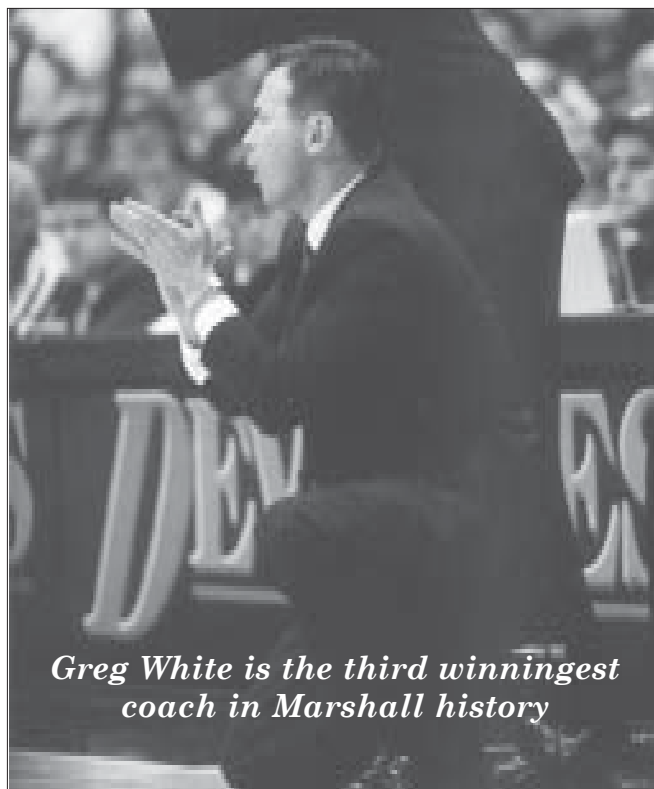

The Last Time Out ... Marshall Falls at Miami

OXFORD, Ohio - Juby Johnson scored 21 points to lead the Miami Redhawks to a 69-49 win over Marshall in Mid-American Conference men's basketball action Saturday.

Johnson, a junior guard, connected on six of 13 shots and was a perfect six of six at the free throw line. Danny Horace added 14 points for the Redhawks.

Miami (10-11 overall, and 8-4 MAC) used a tremendous defensive effort and solid outside shooting to get the win. Marshall (11-11 overall, 7-7 MAC) shot a season-low 14.3% from three-point range (2-14) en route to a season-low 49 points, while Miami connected on nine of 22 three-point attempts.

Marshall was led by Ronald Blackshear's 13 point effort. The Marshall standout also led the team with five rebounds and three assists.

"We just couldn't hit the ocean today," Blackshear said. "There are going to be games like this and you just have to shrug it off and move on. Miami did a good job today and deserved to win."
