Scouting Creighton

Creighton returns 10-of-12 letterwinners and all five starters from last season's 23-9 team that reached the second round of the NCAA

Tournament. The Bluejays have been picked to win their third consecutive Missouri Valley Conference title and will be led by the senior trio of DeAnthony Bowden, Larry House and reigning MVC Player of the Year Kyle Korver. Korver, Joe Dabbert, Brody Deren, Mike Grimes and Michael Lindeman give CU plenty of returning depth in the frontcourt, while Nate Funk, Tyler McKinney, Kellen Miliner and Brandon Sims will share time on the perimeter with House and Bowden.

Creighton opened the season with 10 straight wins, including impressive victories over Notre Dame (80-75), BYU (74-64), Tennessee Tech (101-72) and Nebraska (81-73) before falling at #19 Xavier, 75-73 on Dec. 31. The Bluejays are ranked 16th nationally in both polls.

Korver leads the team in scoring (19.8), rebounding (5.8) and assists (3.3) while Dabbert and Deren share the team (and MVC) lead with 18 blocked shots. Ten different players average at least 12.8 minutes and 4.7 points per game or more.

Scouting Bradley

New coach Jim Les has brought an up-tempo style to his alma mater in his first season replacing the departed Jim Molinari. The Braves

boast three players averaging more than 15 points per game in **Phillip Gilbert** (18.5), **Danny Granger** (18.0) and **James Gillingham** (15.2) while scoring an average of 79.2 points per game as a squad. The Braves opened the season with a home overtime win over Pepperdine but have struggled with inconsistency. The Braves are coming off 67-45 drubbing at SMS in which they committed 28 turnovers and shot just 29.5 percent.

Scouting Illinois State

After opening to a 1-8 start, Illinois State coach **Tom Richardson** taped the door to the Redbirds locker room shut and stripped the team's three captains of their titles in an effort to inspire a turnaround last week. The Redbirds played tougher last Saturday, leading much of the game before falling at Southern Illinois, 74-65, to fall to 1-9 overall and 0-2 in the MVC.

Three sophomores and a freshman lead the team in scoring. North Carolina State transfer **Trey Guidry** scores 12.3 points per game with sophomore classmates **Gregg Alexander** (10.6) and **Vince Greene** (10.0) close behind. **Baboucarr Bojang** has struggled since off-season wrist surgery and averages 7.3 points and 4.9 rebounds per contest.

The Coaches

The dean of Missouri Valley Conference coaches, Creighton's **Dana Altman** (Eastern New Mexico, 1980) is in his ninth year as head coach of the Bluejays. He owns a 157-96 (.621) mark at CU and a career record of 240-163 (.596) in his 14th year as an NCAA Division I head coach. Altman has been named conference coach of the year eight times in his 17 years as a head coach, including recognition in 2001 and 2002 from the Missouri Valley Conference. Altman has led Creighton to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments and his teams have played in the postseason in eight of the past 11 years. He's assisted by **Greg Gensing**, **Len Gordy** and **Darian DeVries**.

Jim Les (Bradley, 1986) is in his first season as head coach at his alma mater, owning a 4-8 record. Les is a seven-year veteran of the NBA and was the point guard for the last MVC team to win the regular-season title with a perfect record, the 1985-86 Braves. A member of the Bradley University, Greater Peoria Sports and Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Halls of Fame, Les earned the 1986 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Hall of Fame Award as the nation's best senior less than 6-feet tall. He is assisted by **Al Biancalana**, **Howard Moore** and **Lennox Forrester**.

Tom Richardson (St. Xavier, 1977) is in his fourth season as head coach at Illinois State, owning a 49-52 record since replacing **Kevin Stallings** on the sidelines in Normal. Richardson led the 2000-01 Redbirds to the NIT and last year his squad finished third in the Valley despite losing preseason Player of the Year **Tarise Bryson** to a season-ending injury in

the opener. Richardson is assisted by **Chad Altadonna**, **Lance Irvin** and **Kirk Sarff**.

Series Histories

Bradley owns a 36-26 lead in the all-time series vs. Creighton, including a decided 22-9 advantage in Peoria. In fact, last season's 80-64 triumph over the Braves was **Dana Altman's** first in Peoria. Altman is 7-10 all-time vs. the Braves.

Illinois State leads the all-time series with Creighton by a 31-15 margin, including a 19-3 record at home vs. the Jays. Creighton is **Dana Altman** is 8-9 vs. the Redbirds despite losing his first seven games vs. ISU. He is 7-2 head-to-head vs. **Tom Richardson**, including a 3-0 mark last season.

Last season was the first time in Creighton history that the Bluejays won at Bradley and at Illinois State in the same season.

Last Game Recap

Creighton started the game with a 15-2 run and later answered a Drake rally with a 17-0 second-half run to cruise to an 84-63 win in its MVC home opener. Six different Bluejays scored early as Creighton took a 15-2 lead in the opening seven minutes en route to a 48-30 halftime lead. In the second half, Drake put together a 10-0 run to draw within eight points, only to have the Bluejays storm back with a 17-0 run to put the game away. The Bulldogs went 10:44 without a field goal in the second half and had just four field goals in the final 14 minutes of play.

Kyle Korver had 23 points and seven rebounds on 7-of-9 shooting, while **DeAnthony Bowden** and **Mike Grimes** each added 11 points off the bench. **Greg Danielson** led Drake with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while **Luke McDonald** added 13 second-half points after a scoreless opening half.

Korver Earns Third MVC POW Honor of Year

Already honored on Nov. 19 and Dec. 2 this season, Creighton senior **Kyle Korver** has been named the Missouri Valley Conference Player a third time, this time for the week ending Jan. 5.

Korver picked up his first honor by averaging 19.0 points per game while earning MVP honors of the Omaha Regional of the Guardians Classic. Korver made 13-of-19 shots overall (68.4 percent) and was 11-for-15 from three-point range (73.3 percent), while making his first eight tries of the season.

Korver's earned his second honor by averaging 22 points and 5.5 rebounds per game against IUPUI and Notre Dame while earning MVP honors at the Guardians Classic finals in Kansas City, Mo. Korver shot 15-for-27 from the field (55.6 percent) and 12-for-19 (63.2 percent) from three-point range on the weekend, including a career-best seven treys vs. Notre Dame.

Korver's third weekly honor came after he averaged 27.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists while shooting 64.3% from the field (18-28), 64.7% from three-point range (11-17) and 100% at the free throw line (8-8) in games vs.

#19 Xavier and Drake. Korver scored a career-high 32 points in Creighton's 75-73 loss at #19 Xavier, including 26 second-half points. Korver tied the CU single-game record with eight three-pointers, including four in the final three minutes as CU rallied from a nine-point deficit to tie the game in the final minute. Korver also led the Jays with six rebounds and four assists in the setback. Against Drake, Korver scored 23 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 27 minutes of play in CU's 84-63 victory. Korver made 7-of-9 shots from the floor, including 3-of-4 from downtown, while also making all six free throw attempts.

Series Stuff

Creighton will get a couple road tests this week as they look to improve on their best start in 40 years, as the Jays play at Bradley and at Illinois State. Creighton is 1-6 under Dana Altman in Peoria and owns a 3-15 record in its last 18 trips to Normal. Last season was the first time in Creighton history that the Bluejays won at Bradley and at Illinois State in the same season.

History Lesson

While Creighton's 11-1 start and #16 national ranking may seem like a cause for celebration, they still have a long way to go before making their NCAA Tournament plans.

Last season, two teams ranked in the top-10 (#4 Virginia and #9 Iowa) on January 1st failed

Big Game Player

Creighton senior **Kyle Korver** continues to star in some of Creighton's biggest games.

Korver made 7-of-11 three-pointers and finished with 24 points and 10 rebounds to earn Guardians Classic MVP honors in Creighton's win over Notre Dame.

Against BYU in a battle of 6-0 teams, Korver had 19 points, 11 rebounds and four assists.

Against in-state rival Nebraska, Korver made six three-pointers and finished with 25 points and seven rebounds to secure CU's fourth straight triumph over the Huskers.

At #19 Xavier, Korver tied the CU record with eight three-pointers and had a career-high 32 points. Twenty-six of his points came after half.

Big Man Can Shoot

Senior **Kyle Korver** has been shooting his way into the Creighton record books, owning the school's single-game, single-season and career marks. Now, he's shooting towards some NCAA history.

In fact, Korver's career 45.6 percent accuracy from three-point range (298-653) ranks him 12th in NCAA history among those with 200 or more three-pointers, and second all-time among players 6-7 or taller. In fact, Korver and UCLA's much-hyped **Jason Kapono** are the only active players 6-7 or taller with 200 or more three-pointers (Kapono makes 45.7%). Ranking Information

Creighton is ranked 16th in the Jan. 6th Associated Press poll, one spot shy of its season-best rank of 15th on Dec. 30. The program's best ever spot was the 13th slot in the March 4, 1975 poll. Creighton's surrounded by some pretty lofty company with its 16th ranking in this week's coaches poll. The two teams ahead of Creighton are Kansas and Indiana, while the team after the Jays is Maryland. The Jayhawks lost in the Final Four last season, while Maryland defeated Indiana in the national championship game last season.

Ready For Prime Time?

Sunday's game vs. Drake marked the start of a six game stretch that has the Bluejays on TV five times. In addition to Sunday's Fox Sports Net coverage, the Jays will be shown on KM3 against Bradley (Jan. 8), Evansville (Jan. 15) and Illinois State (Jan. 20) and nationally on ESPN2 against Southern Illinois on Jan. 18.

The Jays are 4-0 on TV this season, beating Drake, Nebraska, Notre Dame and IUPUI on the tube.

Plenty of Twenty For Korver

Kyle Korver has scored 22 points or more in each of the last four games. The last Creighton player with four straight games of 20 or more points was **Rodney Buford**, who had eight straight from Jan. 27-Feb. 17, 1997. Korver owns 25 career games of 20 or more points, including eight contests this season.

kets. **Tyler McKinney** made one of those treys, and assisted on all of Creighton's nine other trifectas. All told, McKinney's 10 points and 12 assists led to 43 Bluejay points on the evening.

McKinney Earns Scholar-Athlete Award

Bluejays point guard **Tyler McKinney** has been named the Prairie Farms/MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Week for Dec. 21. McKinney averaged 7.5 points, 6.0 assists and 2.5 rebounds while shooting 67 percent from the field to help the Bluejays defeat Delaware State (68-48) on Dec. 16 and Nebraska (81-73) on Dec. 21. He had 12 assists without a turnover vs. the Huskers.

Interchangeable Parts

Mike Grimes continues to see his playing time produce while backing up both **Kyle Korver** and

Brody Deren. Against Southeast Missouri State on Dec. 29, Grimes made 7-of-8 shots from the floor and finished with a career-high 17 points in just 18 minutes of action.

Grimes is now shooting a stellar 71.4 percent from the field and he has made 50 percent or better of his attempts in all but one of the last 18 games.

Rebounding A Concern

Despite being outrebounded 45-28 at Nebraska, Creighton still managed to beat the Huskers. Creighton hadn't been outrebounded by 17 or more since the Huskers owned a 51-33 advantage on the glass on Dec. 6, 1995. More Attendance Notes

First, Creighton attracted 8,529 fans against BYU on Dec. 7, and then on Dec. 14 another 8,813 fans came to see the Bluejays beat Tennessee Tech. That marked the largest home crowds to see consecutive non-conference games since the start of the 1986-87 season when 8,995 fans turned out for a victory over Iowa State and 9,618 came to see Creighton beat Nebraska four days later. Creighton is currently averaging 7,123 fans per home game, which would rank as the sixth-highest average in school history.

Hanging Fifty...Twice

Creighton put up 50 or more points in both halves of its 101-72 victory over Tennessee Tech. The Jays led 50-27 at the break and outscored the Golden Eagles 51-45 in the second stanza.

The last time Creighton had 50 or more points in both halves of the same game was on Dec. 29, 1979 against Canisius. In that game, Creighton led 54-47 at the half en route to a 104-95 victory over the Golden Griffins. None of Creighton's current players had been born yet when that game took place.

Passing Fancy

An unselfish Creighton squad racked up an impressive 26 assists on its 36 field goals vs. Tennessee Tech. Creighton averages over 18 assists per game as six different players average 1.6 or more per game. Those 26 assists were the most since a 27-assist showing vs. Evansville on Feb. 28, 2000.

McKinney A McWinner

Sophomore point guard **Tyler McKinney** may not have the gaudiest stats in the league, but few have been as successful at controlling a game and coming out a winner. McKinney has gone 28-5 as Creighton's starting point guard, while the Jays are just 6-5 in his career when he doesn't start.

Coming Through In The Clutch

Speaking of **Tyler McKinney**, few Bluejays have made as many clutch plays in close games since the start of last season.

Last year, McKinney nailed two free throws in the final six seconds to give CU a 64-63 road win at Indiana State on Feb. 6. Eleven days later, McKinney's coast-to-coast lay-up at the buzzer beat Wichita State, 69-67.

In Creighton's two close games this season, McKinney has stepped up huge both occasions. Against Notre Dame, McKinney had a lay-up, two free throws and a key charge in the final two minutes while scoring a career-high 14 points.

Against Northern Iowa, McKinney had 10 points, including two clutch free throws in the final three minutes and a lay-up with two minutes left that sealed the Creighton win.

Shooting Stars

Creighton's been shooting the lights out this season, making a collective 52.0 percent of its shots from the field and 42.0 percent from three-point range. The Bluejays have shot 50 percent or better in 14 of 24 halves of play this season 9-of-12 games this season. The Jays have won 33 straight games when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.

Of Creighton's 13 active players, eight are shooting better than 50 percent overall, including two from long-distance. In the first half against IUPUI on Nov. 25, Creighton had eight different players make a three-pointer.

Creighton's 67.9 percent shooting effort (19-28) in the second half vs. Tennessee Tech on Dec. 14 was its best since making 76.9 percent in the second half (20-26) at Evansville on Feb. 28, 2000.

Double Your Fun

Kyle Korver notched his sixth career double-double with a 19-point, 11-rebound effort vs. BYU on Dec. 7. It was Korver's second double-double in his last three games, as he also had 24 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Notre Dame on Nov. 26.

Give Me Five

Creighton's Jan. 5 game vs. Drake marked the 32nd consecutive game with the same starting five. **Tyler McKinney, Larry House, Michael Lindeman, Kyle Korver** and **Brody Deren** have gone 27-5 when being paired together to start the game dating to Jan. 9, 2002.

Non-Conference Power

Creighton's 11-1 start includes a 9-1 record in non-conference games. Here's a look at Creighton's regular-season record vs. non-MVC teams under **Dana Altman**. Since December 1, 1997, the Jays are an impressive 44-10 (.815) in such games. Creighton is also 29-2 (.935) in home non-conference games since the start of the 1997-98 campaign.

First Time For Everything

According to available records, Creighton had never won three games in the same regular-season tournament before a season-opening 4-0 run to the Guardians Classic title. That's not to say they haven't been successful in postseason action, as they've won three of the last four MVC Tournaments.

3-0 The Way To Go

Creighton has started 3-0 (or better) for the fifth season in a row. Each of the four previous 3-0 starts under **Dana Altman** have culminated in an NCAA Tournament appearance at the end of the year.

Creighton currently owns a 6-0 home record on the season. It marks the seventh straight season they have opened 4-0 or better at home.

Getting Better With Experience

The 80-75 win over Notre Dame was **Dana Altman's** 150th on the Creighton sideline. Altman won his 50th game at CU in his 105th game in Blue & White. It took him just 73 games to win his next 50 to get to 100. Impressively, it took Altman just 67 games to reach his next 50 wins.

It's Up....And It's Good

Kyle Korver started the season with a bang, making his first eight three-point attempts, including a CU-record 6-for-6 effort from long-range in the opener vs. Texas-Arlington.

Korver, who also made his last trifecta attempt last year, had a streak of nine snapped with a miss vs. Furman. The NCAA record for consecutive three-pointers made is 15, set by **Todd Leslie** of Northwestern over four games in 1990.

More Perfection

Before **Kyle Korver's** 6-for-6 display from long-range vs. UT-Arlington, the last Creighton player to shoot 5-for-5 from three-point range was **Ben Walker**, who did it on Feb. 28, 2000 vs. vs.

Evansville. Creighton has had a player make six or more three-pointers 25 times (seven times by Korver) in school history, but Korver is the first to ever make all his 3-pt. attempts on such a night.

Don't Blink

Creighton has posted impressive starts to start both the first and seconds halves of its games. The Bluejays have outscored their opponents 120-55 in the first five minutes of the first half, and 123-102 in the opening five minutes after half.

All About The Bench

Creighton's depth has allowed it to gradually wear down the opposition this season. The Bluejays have 10 players see double-digit minutes with no sign of letting up.

In the season opener, the CU bench contributed 61 points, 24 rebounds and 11 assists vs. Texas-Arlington. Creighton's 61 points off the pine was their most since the bench had 62 points in a win over Grambling on Dec. 6, 1999.

Against Southeast Missouri State, the Jays outscored the Indians bench 42-4 while winning by 23 points.

As a whole, Creighton's bench is averaging 34.9 points, 13.8 rebounds and 7.4 assists per game this season while playing 88.7 minutes per contest. An individual has scored 10 or more points off the bench 13 different times this season.

All-Tournament Honors

Kyle Korver and **Brody Deren** were both named to the all-Tournament team for the Guardians Classic championship rounds in Kansas City. Korver averaged 22 points and 5.5 rebounds to earn tournament MVP accolades, while Deren averaged 11 points and seven rebounds to earn his spot. Rounding out the all-Tournament team were **Chris Thomas** and **Matt Carroll** from Notre Dame and **Karim Souchu** from Furman.

Bombs Away

Creighton's 15 three-pointers against UT-Arlington were one shy of the school and Civic Auditorium record set vs. Evansville on Jan. 4, 1999 in a 84-79 loss. In that game CU was 16-for-30. That Evansville game was the only previous time Creighton made as many as 15 three-pointers in a game. Creighton also made 15-of-25 three-pointers vs. IUPUI.

Kyle Korver broke a Civic Auditorium record against BYU when he launched 14 three-point attempts. The 14 attempts were a career-high and one attempt shy of the Bluejay record.

Nothing But Nets

Did you know that Creighton is one of four schools nationwide to qualify a team for the NCAA Tournament in men's soccer, women's soccer, men's basketball and women's basketball in 2002? They are joined by Notre Dame, Connecticut and Stanford in this elite group.

Of those four, Creighton was the only school to win its league tournament in all four sports.

Good Luck Charm

Dan Bresnahan played just five minutes against Texas-Arlington but the sophomore walk-on made the most of his minutes. In addition to his tip-in at the buzzer, Bresnahan had four rebounds, a steal and an assist, all career highs. Bresnahan played a career-high seven minutes against IUPUI. Creighton is 16-0 all-time when Bresnahan plays.

Altman Top MVC Coach Back-to-Back Years

Not only did **Dana Altman** clinch a second-straight regular-season title for Creighton last season, but he also repeated Rawlings/MVC Coach of the Year honors. The only previous coach in the last 30 years to earn MVC Coach of the Year honors in back-to-back campaigns was when current Kentucky coach **Tubby Smith** did it at Tulsa in 1993-94 and 1994-95.

The only other MVC coaches to go back-to-back were **George Smith** when he had **Oscar Robertson** at Cincinnati (1958-59) and **Maurice "Maury" John** at Drake from 1968-70.

Korver Passes Sears On CU 3-Pt. List

With his fourth three-pointer of the season-opener, **Kyle Korver** became Creighton's all-time leader in three-pointers made, passing his former teammate, **Ryan Sears** who had 245.

With two more three-pointers, Korver can become second player in MVC history to make 300 or more treys, joining former Southern Illinois standout **Shane Hawkins** who owns the Valley mark with 314 in his career. Fantasy League Dream

With the numbers he produces in so many different categories, senior forward **Kyle Korver** would be a fantasy league owners' dream. The Missouri Valley Conference tracks 12 different statistical categories, and Korver ranked among the top-13 in all but one category (offensive rebounding) last season. Korver led the Valley in steals and free throw percentage and also ranked among the top-five in three-point field goals made, three-point field goal percentage, scoring and assists.

He led Creighton in points, three-pointers, rebounding, assists and steals. Korver became the first player in school history to lead the team in points, steals and assists in the same year since they began recording steals in 1980-81. Korver has two or more assists in all but two of his last 41 games.

Korver By The Numbers

Kyle Korver has made three or more three-pointers in 60 of his 106 career games at Creighton. Creighton is 47-13 in such contests, including a 9-1 record this year.

Korver has made five three-pointers or more in a game on 21 occasions in his career, with the Jays winning 17 of those games. He has made at least one three-pointer in each of the last 49 games he's attempted one dating to an 0-for-4

effort beyond the arc at Indiana State his sophomore season.

Korver is already the only player in CU history to make 60 or more three-pointers in three different seasons and is seven shy of doing it again.

Money Ball

Kyle Korver ranks fourth among the nation's active players in career free-throw percentage, so it's no surprise that he'll go long stretches at the line without a miss. In fact, Korver owns four career streaks of 20 or more consecutive free throws. He had a stretch of 21 straight from the stripe snapped on Nov. 25, 2002 with a miss vs. IUPUI.

Only once in his career has Korver missed two free throws during the same trip to the line, and that came Dec. 16, 2000 vs. Wichita State.

Preseason Hype

In addition to the preseason MVC poll (page 4), Creighton has been picked to win the Missouri Valley Conference by *Athlon Sports*, *Basketball News*, *Lindy's*, *The Sporting News* and *Street & Smith's* magazines. In addition, *The Sporting News* ranks Creighton 24th nationally.

The preseason favorite's role is Creighton's second in three years (also 2000-01) and fifth time since 1989-90. In addition, **Kyle Korver** has been tabbed preseason MVC Player of the Year. Combined with the CU women's selection as the top squad, this season marks the first time since 1992-93 that both The Valley's men and women's preseason favorite are from the same school.

Jays Break 60 In A Half

Creighton's 63-point second half vs. Texas-Arlington was the first time they scored that many in a half since outscoring Indiana State 68-46 in the second half of a 115-80 win on Jan. 19, 1985.

Creighton's 24 second-half field goals were their most in a half since a 25-for-41 first half against Nebraska-Kearney on Nov. 24, 1984.

A March Tradition

Did you know that Creighton is one of 20 teams nationally to have played in the NCAA Tournament each of the last four years? The select company, listed alphabetically, also includes Arizona, Cincinnati, Creighton, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan St., Missouri, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Stanford, Texas, UCLA, Winthrop and Wisconsin.

According to Stats Inc., Creighton is also one of just 22 teams nationally that have won 20 or more games in each of the last four seasons. Joining them in that category are Arizona, Butler, Charleston, Cincinnati, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Indiana, Kansas, Kent

State, Kentucky, Maryland, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Stanford, Syracuse, Tulsa, UCLA and Xavier.

Put together, Creighton is one of just 15 schools to win 20 or more games and reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last four years.

Four Straight Trips Rare

Creighton's current run of four straight NCAA Tournaments has been matched just one time previously by a MVC school. Cincinnati played in six straight NCAA Tournaments between 1958-63, including national titles in 1961 and 1962. **Oscar Robertson** played at Cincinnati from 1958-60.

Leading The Charge

Creighton has taken 26 charges this season, led by nine from **Mike Grimes** and four from **Tyler McKinney** and **Joe Dabbert**. The Bluejays took a season-high six on Nov. 18 vs. Furman and added five more vs. BYU.

Dana's Arc

Creighton has made two or more three-pointers in 275 consecutive games, including every game under the direction of **Dana Altman**. The last time they had just one trey was a 74-70 win over Florida A&M on Dec. 22, 1993.

Overall, Creighton has made at least one trifecta in 285 straight games since a 59-53 loss at Illinois St. on Feb. 20, 1993 when **Rick Johnson** was coach.

Creighton is one of 14 schools to make 200 or more three-pointers in each of the last five seasons, placing them with this elite list: Arkansas, Creighton, Duke, Florida, Fresno State, Georgia Tech, Gonzaga, Lafayette, Montana State, Princeton, Siena, TCU, Temple and Tulsa.

Civic Swan Song

The 2002-03 campaign will mark Creighton's final season in the Omaha Civic Auditorium. Creighton first played at the Civic in 1955 and

moved there full-time for the 1961-62 season. The Jays own an all-time record of 423-155 at the Civic, including an 90-28 mark under **Dana Altman**.

The Civic has been home to five regular-season MVC champs and seven MVC Tournament champions in the last 25 years alone.

Creighton's future home is under construction less than a mile from the current floor. The Omaha Convention Center & Arena is a \$291 million project that will seat 15,800 fans for basketball and be ready for the 2003-04 season. The new arena is located between downtown Omaha and Eppley Airport on the former Union Pacific Railroad yards.

Civic Leader

With his season-opening win over Texas-Arlington, **Dana Altman** now owns the distinction of winning more games at the Civic Auditorium than any previous Creighton coach. Altman's 90 wins passes **Tom Apke**, who was 83-16 at the Civic from 1974-81.

Streaks Of Note

Creighton has won 12 straight games when scoring 100 or more points, including a perfect 5-0 record under **Dana Altman** under such circumstances. Creighton last lost when surpassing 100 points on Feb. 26, 1977.

Altman is now 20-0 when his Creighton team scores 90 or more points. The Bluejays have won 36 straight since Jan. 11, 1988 when scoring 90 or more.

Altman is also 55-5 when his teams score 80 or more points, including 28 straight wins, dating to a Feb. 19, 2000 setback.

Recapping Last Season

Creighton finished last season with a 23-9 record, a fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament and a share of a second straight MVC title.

Some of last season's highlights included a win over #17 Western Kentucky in double-overtime, an eight-game winning streak in MVC play in January, and the team's third MVC Tournament crown in the last four seasons. Creighton then knocked off #14 Florida in double-overtime in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to #16 Illinois in the second round.

Dana Altman was named MVC Coach of the Year, **Kyle Korver** was named MVC Player of the Year and **Terrell Taylor** was named the

MVC's Sixth Man of the Year.

20 Wins x 4 Years = Unprecedented Success

With 23 wins in 2001-02, Creighton won 20 games for an unprecedented fourth straight season. The Jays were 24-8, 23-10 and 22-9 in the previous three campaigns. Creighton owns 15 seasons of 20 or more wins in school history, including a school-record total of 24 wins in 1990-91 and 2000-01.

Creighton's 23 wins last year gives them 47 over the last two seasons, 70 in the last three years and 92 in the last four seasons. All four of those marks tie or set a school-best for most wins in consecutive seasons.

Making the Move To The New Arena

Renewal information regarding Jaybackers and Creighton men's basketball season tickets for 2003-04 at the Omaha Convention Center & Arena was mailed out Jan. 2 to current ticketholders and Jaybackers.
