About The Game: Tonight's match-up is the first of two meetings between these two teams in the next 10 days. Illinois State is coming off of a two-game road swing with losses at Southern Illinois and Northern Iowa, while Creighton is completing a central Illinois stop after beating Bradley on Wednesday.

Series History: This is the 47th meeting between the two schools with Illinois State leading the series 31-15. However, as of late, Creighton has owned the series winning seven of the last eight meetings, including the last four. The 'Birds are 19-3 against the Jays in Normal and 12-2 in Redbird Arena.

Last Meeting: Randy Rice led three Redbirds in double figures scoring with 14 points, but Illinois State's hopes for a fifth State Farm-Missouri Valley Conference Tournament title were dashed by Creighton's hot shooting in a 90-63 Bluejay win in a tournament semi-final game. Kyle Korver scored 18 of his 20 points in the first half and led a barrage of three-point field goals for Creighton as the Bluejays—9 in the first half when the Jays took command of the game. Shawn Jeppson and Baboucarr Bojang each had 11 points for Illinois State, while Terrell Taylor backed Korver's play with 19 points.

THE COACHES

Tom Richardson (St. Xavier '77) is 49-53 in his fourth season at Illinois State. He is assisted by Chad Altadonna, Lance Irvin and Kirk Sarff. Richardson is 31-31 against Valley opponents, 18-22 vs. non-conference foes, 32-15 at home, 12-32 on the road and 5-6 on neutral floors.

Dana Altman (Eastern New Mexico '80) is in his ninth season at Creighton. He owns a 158-96 record with the Bluejays and is 240-163 during his 14-year coaching career.

About the Creighton Bluejays

- Creighton is located in Omaha, Neb., and enrolls 6,297 students. The Bluejays are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Valley Player of the Year Kyle Korver leads the team with 19.3 points and 6 rebounds per game. He has been named the league's player of the week three times this season.
- Korver needs one three pointer to eclipse the 300 total for his career. He will join Southern Illinois' Shane Hawkins (314) as the only players in the conference to reach the plateau.
- In the 13 wins, Creighton never trailed during the second half.
- · The Jays have 44 more assists than turnovers this season, while they have forced their opponent into 92 more turnovers than assists.
- Michael Lindeman tied a career-high with 15 points at Bradley on Wednesday. The Jays have won nine straight when Lindeman scores in double figures.
- · In typical Creighton fashion, the Jays have 10 players that are averaging 13 or more minutes per game.
- The trey is Creighton's offensive weapon of choice as 39 percent of the Jay' total field goal attempts have come from behind the arc. They have been successful too. converting 40.6 percent of them.
- This is the fifth time in the history of the program that Creighton has started off 12-1.

Rare Ranked Redbird Romp

With Creighton's visit to Normal on Saturday, it will be the first time a ranked opponent has played in Redbird Arena since ISU hosted No. 23 Purdue on December 7, 1999. The Redbirds fell to the Boilermakers 86-75.

A Second Lightning Strike?

On January 19, 1991, Creighton entered Redbird Arena as the first place team in the Missouri Valley Conference and Illinois State was amidst a 2-12 campaign and sitting in the league's basement. Moving ahead 22 years, the cast of characters have changed, but the situation is similar. The 1990-91 Redbirds went on to upset the Bluejays 71-68 at Redbird Arena, while Creighton went on to capture the league title.

Hey Arnold!

Freshman Marcus Arnold can't be seen on cable's Nicklelodeon, but he has been putting on a show against Missouri Valley Conference opponents. In the first three league games of his career, Arnold scored 14 points against SMS at Redbird Arena, added 15 points at Southern Illinois and topped his career-high for the third straight game with 19 at Northern Iowa. In addition to averaging a team-best 16.0 points in conference games, Arnold is shooting 20-for-35 (.571) against league foes.

A Post Pattern

Head coach Tom Richardson isn't looking to become an offensive coordinator for the football team, but he has called for a Redbird post pattern heading into conference play. In the first eight games, posts Baboucarr Bojang and Marcus Arnold averaged 6.5 and 6.4 points per game, respectively. However, in the last three, Arnold is averaging 16 points per game and Bojang is hovering around the double digit mark with 9.7 points per contest.

Built Ford Tough

When freshman Dana Ford pulled down a team-high and a career-best eight rebounds at Southern Illinois, he became the first Redbird guard to grab eight caroms since Tarise Bryson equalled the feat against Evansville on March 3, 2001 in the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament. Ford leads all guards and ranks fourth on the team in rebounding with 3.0 boards per game. The Tamms, Ill., native is also the team leading rebounder in league games with 5.3 rebounds per game.



Where There's a Will. There's G.A.

Sophomore Gregg Alexander appears to be laying claim to the Illinois State leadership role. The sophomore has picked up his game facing adversity. In the last two outings, Alexander is averaging 15 points and for rebounds per game with a 1.0 assist-to-turnover ratio. Prior to that, Alexander posted 9.8 points and 1.7 boards per outing with more than double turnovers (17) to assists (8). The one thing that has remained constant has been his free throw shooting, where Alexander has converted all 14 of his attempts.

It's Easy Being Greene

Kermit the Frog might not agree, but for point guard Vince Greene it is easy when he gets his teammates involved. Greene ranks fourth in The Valley in assists with 4.4 dishes per game. In his last eight games, Greene has handed out 37 assists. In addition to distributing the ball, Greene has posted double-digit scoring efforts in three of his last five games and ranks third on the team in scoring with 9.3 points per game.

Consistently Inconsistent

The Redbirds have seven players that have started seven or more games, but head coach Tom Richardson is still looking for a consistent scoring trend. Of the seven players, each one has scored at least nine points in a game, while also tossing in as few as three tallies in a game. The seven have also combined for 22 games where they have scored three points or less.

It's a Small World

With 6-foot-9 Baboucarr Bojang being tabbed a preseason first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, head coach **Tom Richardson** is probably surprised that his top three scorers are 6-4 or smaller. Trey Guidry, a 6-2 quard, leads the team with 11.2 points per game, while Gregg Alexander, a 6-4 sophomore, ranks second on the squad with 10.7 tallies per game. Vince Greene, a 5-9 sophomore, is third with 9.3 points per contest.

Greenbirds

Prior to this season, the 13 players currently on the Illinois State roster had combined for a total of 240 game played, or just 18.5 games per player, or roughly half of one season. Moreover, of the 13 now playing, seven had never played in an ISU game prior to this season and six had never played in a college game.

On Guard

The Redbirds, offensively, have definitely been driven by guard play so far this season. Sophomores Trey Guidry, Grega Alexander and Vince Greene have accounted for 50.8 percent of Illinois State's scoring this season. The threesome has also combined for 61 treys and is shooting 42.3 percent from behind the arc.

Feeling Charitable

The Redbirds have been in a giving mood at times this season. Both sophomores Trey Guidry and Vince Greene have dished out career-high 11 assists this season. Guidry passed out the gifts at Kent State, while Greene delivered his presents against Jacksonville. Both Greene and Guidry's 11 assists were the most by a Redbird since Randy Rice's 13 dishes against Evansville on Feb. 12, 2001.

Time and the Minutes Are On Their Side

Just slightly less than 75 percent of the minutes (73.4%) logged so far this season (1,615 of a possible 2,200) are by players that have at least two years of eligibility AFTER this season. The top three minutegetters are Gregg Alexander (331), Trey Guidry (301) and Vince Greene (307) – all sophomores.

If History Repeats Itself – Buy Season Tickets Now

In the 74-50 win over Jacksonville, the Redbird underclassmen accounted for 56 points of Illinois State's scoring total. The 56 tallies was the highest total by a group of Redbird sophomores and freshmen since Dec. 9, 1995, when underclassmen totaled 57 points in the Redbirds' 79-59 win over Fairleigh-Dickenson. That group included names like Rico Hill, Dan Muller, Jamar Smiley, LeRoy Watkins, Rob Gibbons, Kyle Cartmill and Kenneth Pierson. During the 1995-96 season this band of underclassmen didn't have a junior class, either, and eventually went on to participate in two NCAA Tournaments as upperclassmen.

95 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

Illinois State heads into tonight's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 95 straight games. In fact, in the Tom Richardson era the Redbirds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on December 12, 1999. Since Richardson took the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 74 of 102 games.

Birds Fall in Valley Semifinal to Creighton

ST. LOUIS - Randy Rice led three Redbirds in double figures scoring with 14 points, but Illinois State's hopes for a fifth State Farm-Missouri Valley Conference Tournament title were dashed by Creighton's hot shooting in a 90-63 Bluejay win in a tournament semi-final game.

Kyle Korver scored 18 of his 20 points in the first half and led a barrage of three-point field goals for Creighton as the Bluejays-9 in the first half when the Jays took command of the game. Shawn Jeppson and Baboucarr Bojang each had 11 points for Illinois State, while Terrell Taylor backed Korver's play with 19 points. Six different Creighton players had at least one three-pointer.

The third-seeded Redbirds, 17-14, had two good runs at Creighton in the first half fueled by Rice's 11 points. CU led 8-2 when the Redbirds went on a 9-0 run to take an 11-8 lead on Baboucarr Bojang's three-point play with 14:35 left in the half.

The Jays, 21-7, the No. 2 seed, edged ahead 26-21 before Tyler McKinney fired in back-to-back threes to start a 15-0 spurt which put Creighton ahead 41-21. Rice and Jeppson hit three-pointers in an 8-0 ISU run to slice that lead to 41-29, but Korver hit another three and Creighton led 47-31 at intermission.

Block Party

Opponents have experienced more rejection from the 'Birds this season than in recent years. Through 11 games, the 'Birds are averaging 3.1 blocked shots per game, which ranks No. 5 all-time in the Illinois State record book. Freshman **Marcus Arnold** leads the way with nine blocks, while **Andy Strandmark** and **Baboucarr Bojang** each have seven. The Redbirds' swat per game average is the highest by the Redbirds since the 1998-99 season, when Illinois State ended with 3.7 blocks per contest.

Second Half Resistance Has Been Futile

Illinois State's 2-3 zone limited Jacksonville to 31.6 percent shooting, but at Northern Iowa, the ISU defense was torched for a shooting percentage of 50% or better in the second half for the 10th time in 11 games. In the 10 losses, ISU foes have shot 137-for-235 in the second half – for an insuperable 58.3%.

Who Ya Gonna Call?

Bracket Busters! In an effort to help "mid-major" programs bust into the NCAA Tournament field, conferences from around the country have joined forces with ESPN to form – Bracket Buster Saturday on Feb. 22, 2003. The event consists of 18 teams with one predetermined match-up with Gonzaga hosting Tulsa. The rest of the games will be announced on Feb. 1, 2003, with the intention of pitting the best-possible match-ups. By the end of the season, the 'Birds will have faced six opponents that are a part of Bracket Buster Saturday.

Bojang One of Valley's Elite

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

Slightly Above Average Valley Year

With 12 league victories last season, it was an "average" year for Illinois State. Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourth-straight season. This year the Redbirds are in line to accomplish the feat with a 70.1 percentage through the first 11 games. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

We Have a Winner

With a 17-14 record last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

On November 13, 2002, the Illinois State basketball team added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, III • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, III. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period. The Redbirds have one scholarship left to fill.

Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 7-3 record when playing on January 11, one of Illinois State's seven wins happened in 2002 and it is today's Redbird Flashback: **Jan. 11, 1989 • Normal, III.** – Illinois State opened up Redbird Arena with a 71-70 win over Chicago State in front of 9,724 fans. Randy Blair scored the first points in the facility with a five-foot jumper 35 seconds into the game, but Jarrod Coleman led the 'Birds with 17 points and 13 rebounds. Scott Fowler chipped in 16 points and Rickey Jackson tossed in 14. Blair finished with eight. The Redbirds never trailed and led by as many as 17 points, but an 11-2 run by Chicago State in the game's final minute almost spoiled opening night.

Greene Leads 'Birds in Exhibition Win

NORMAL, III. – Sophomore point guard Vince Greene scored a game-high 26 points, including six three-pointers, as Illinois State won its first exhibition of the season, 89-70, over SIU-Edwardsville at Redbird Arena.

Baboucarr Bojang finished with 14 points and six rebounds for the 'Birds, while true freshman Chris Burras came off the bench to score 12.

SIU-Edwardsville was led by Ron Jones with 19 points, 17 of which came in the second half. Rob Baumgardner and Ben Garwitz each contributed 13 points, and Baumgardner also led the Cougars in rebounding with six boards. The Cougars never led in the entire game and after the initial 12-point deficit never got closer than seven points.

Illinois State opened up the game with a 12-0 run, highlighted by two three-pointers and a cross-over lay-up by Greene. The 'Birds defense forced eight Cougar turnovers in the first 12 minutes of the game, including the team's first two possessions.

Greene led all scorers in the first half with 10 points, while Gregg Alexander chipped in eight first half points on 3-for-4 shooting. ISU shot 61 percent from the field in the first half, including 5-for-8 from beyond the arc.

Down 45-24 at halftime, the Cougars came out firing in the second half and outscored the 'Birds 26-15 over the first 8:30 minutes led by nine points apiece by junior Ron Jones and freshman Logan Glosser narrowing the Redbird lead to 10. Following a timeout with 11:05 remaining in the game, the 'Birds went on a 13-0 run to extend their lead back to 23, which tied their largest lead of the night.

NORMAL, III. – Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (.125) free-throw attempts.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah State run with nine points, including three lay-ups.

NORMAL, III. – Vince Greene and Marcus Arnold each scored 14 points, but Illinois State suffered its worst defeat ever in Redbird Arena falling 76-48 to Southwest Missouri State in the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both teams.

Northern Iowa Edges the Redbirds, 66-64

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa — Marcus Arnold scored a career-high 19 points and Gregg Alexander chipped in 12 to pace Illinois State but it was not enough as the men's basketball team fell to 1-10 overall, 0-3 in the Missouri Valley Conference on Tuesday after a two-point loss to Northern Iowa, 66-64, in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

Leading by one point with 1:10 to play, the Redbirds let the game slip from their grasp as Ryan Paulsen of UNI hit a three pointer with :42 seconds remaining. A missed trey by Alexander and a foul by Dana Ford put Ben Jacobson at the line in the final seconds. He connected on both free throws as the Panthers (4-7, 1-2) handed ISU their fourth consecutive loss. Vince Greene hit a shot to pull within two with :16 seconds left, but that was as close as the 'Birds got.

Illinois State led 31-29 at the half off of hot shooting from Alexander, who scored eight points in the first twenty minutes, and Kevin Troc who added seven. It was the second game in a row that the 'Birds led at halftime and faultered in the second period, resulting in a loss.

Northern lowa shot 58 percent from the field in the second half, sparked by 17 points from Jacobsen. Paulsen added 14 for the Panthers while Chris Foster tossed in 11.
