About The Game: Tonight's game is the second and final regular season meeting between the two programs. Illinois State is riding a nine-game losing skid. The Redbirds return home for a two-game homestand after playing five of their last seven on the road. Northern lowa has lost three straight and owns a 1-7 record on the road this season, including a 0-3 mark in Valley road games.

Series History: This is the 40th meeting between the two schools with Illinois State leading the series 29-10. The Redbirds have won five of the last six meetings and six of the last 10. In regular season Valley play, the 'Birds own a 14-8 edge and are 9-2 in Redbird Arena.

Last Meeting: Marcus Arnold scored a career-high 19 points and Gregg Alexander chipped in 12 to pace Illinois State but it was not enough as the men's basketball team dropped a two-point loss to Northern Iowa, 66-64, in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Leading by one point with 1:10 to play, the Redbirds let the game slip from their grasp as UNI's Ryan Paulsen hit a three pointer with :42 seconds remaining. A missed trey by Alexander and a foul by Dana Ford put Ben Jacobson at the line in the final seconds. He connected on both free throws to seal the win.

THE COACHES

Tom Richardson (St. Xavier '77) is 49-58 in his fourth season at Illinois State. He is assisted by Chad Altadonna, Lance Irvin and Kirk Sarff. Richardson is 31-36 against Valley opponents, 18-22 vs. non-conference foes, 32-17 at home, 12-35 on the road and 5-6 on neutral floors.

Greg McDermott (Northern Iowa '88) is in his second season at Northern Iowa. He owns a 19-26 record with the Panthers and is 150-90 during his nine-year coaching career.

About the Northern Iowa Panthers

- Northern Iowa is located in Cedar Falls, Iowa, and enrolls 13,800 students. The Panthers are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- The Panthers are currently riding a three-game losing skid, which is the second-longest of the season behind a five-game streak earlier in the year.
- UNI ranks last in Valley games with only 8.19 offensive rebounds per game.
- David Gruber leads the conference in field goal percentage (.625) and ranks third in rebounding with 7.8 caroms per game.
- Chris Foster tops the league in assists with 5.07 per game, but has been slowed with a wrist injury.
- Matt Schneiderman is 10th in the Valley in field goal percentage (.523) and sixth in 3-point field goal percentage (.449).
- Gruber and Schneiderman rank third (5.31) and fourth (5.00), respectively, in defensive rebounding.
- Minus Gruber and Schneiderman, the Panthers as a team are shooting 37.4 percent from the floor.
- Gruber and Schneiderman account for 45.8 percent of UNI's rebounds.
- Nine players have logged 100 minutes or more, but Gruber, Schneiderman, Jacobson, Foster and Little account for 71.4 percent of the team's minutes.

Greene With Envy

Sophomore **Vince Greene** can get a little jealous when the opponents have the ball, but the Chicago native is doing something about it – he's stealing it. At Evansville, Greene tallied a career-best seven steals against the Purple Aces, which tied the Illinois State record held by Victor Williams, Ron Jones and Bubbles Hawkins. Greene also has 34 takeaways on the season and needs only 14 more to crack the Redbird top 10 for a single season. He is also currently leading The Valley in steals per game with 2.11.

100 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

ISU enters tonight's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 100 straight games. In fact, in the **Tom Richardson** era the 'Birds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on Dec. 12, 1999. With Richardson at the helm, the 'Birds have made four or more treys in 79 of 107 games.

Offensive Resurgence

The Redbirds still aren't cracking the win column, but they're getting closer. A lot of that has to do with the latest increase in offensive firepower. With 82 points at #9 Creighton and 74 at Evansville, the 'Birds scored the most points in back-to-back games since last season's 73-55 win at Evansville and 84-70 victory over Southern Illinois in Feb. 2002.

Mr. Bojang-les

More shot attempts appears to be the cure for senior center Baboucarr Bojang's slow start. In the five games where Bojang has had 10 or more attempts, Bojang has finished with double-digit point totals in four of them. His field goal percentage is also on the rise. In the first eight games, Bojang shot 32.7 percent from the floor. In the last eight, he is scorching the nets at 51.7 percent.

Eight is Enough

For only the fifth time since joining The Valley in 1981-82, the Redbirds have dropped eight league games in a season. In the same time frame, only SMS (3), which joined in 1990-91, has less eight or more conference losses in a season. Evansville, which become a member in 1995-96, also has five.

Home Sweet Home?

After five of the last seven on the road, Illinois State returns to Redbird Arena to host Northern Iowa and Bradley. In years past this would be a good thing, but this season the 'Birds are only 1-7 on their home court. Illinois State will have to sweep its six remaining home games to avoid only the second losing season at Redbird Arena, with the first coming during the 1990-91 season where the 'Birds finished 3-10 at home.



Louisiana Lightning

There was another lightning strike in Evansville, as Baton Rouge, La., native **Trey Guidry** posted a career-high 27 points against the Purple Aces on Saturday. Guidry poured in 21 in the first half, the included a 5-for-9 effort on 3-pointers. It marked the fourth straight double-digit scoring game for the Redbirds leading scorer and his second-straight 20-point performance.

For Starters ...

Illinois State has used a number of starting lineup combinations this season. Through 16 games, the Redbirds have sent 11 different quintet combos on the floor for the opening tip.

Three on Treys

The Redbirds rank No. 3 nationally among NCAA Division I teams in three-point field goal percentage, according to the latest NCAA statistics. Illinois State is shooting 42.7 percent from behind the arc. The 'Birds are averaging six made treys per game.

Sending Out an S.O.S.

After being picked to finish fourth in the conference and sitting with a 1-15 overall record, the Redbirds are left feeling like they're stranded on a deserted island. However, for these castaways the cause, rather than the solution, can be found in an S.O.S. – Strength of Schedule. Illinois State's schedule ranks as the No. 22 toughest slate in the nation by Saragin Rankings and No. 40 by College RPI.

Not Shying Away From the Competition

The Redbirds' No. 22 ranked schedule is well documented, but let's take a closer look at how that developed by breaking down the non-conference slate. ISU posted a 1-7 against non-league foes, with the sole win coming against the only team (Jacksonville) with a losing record. Combined, Illinois State's non-Valley opponents currently own a 93-45 (.674) record. Four schools are leading their respective conference races, while two are in second place.

Caging a Tiger

On Jan. 15, the Redbirds added Missouri transfer **Najeeb Echols** to their roster. Echols, who will have to sit out a year to meet NCAA transfer rules, will eligible for competition on Dec. 13, 2003. Echols played in 10 games for the Tigers this season, averaging 3.1 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. As a freshman, he registered 2.5 points and 2.6 boards per contest. As a prep, Echols was ranked by most recruiting services among the nation's top 30 seniors. He was also a regular feature on the Fox Sports television show *Preps*, which focused on the lives of several Chicago basketball standouts.

Thus Far, Not An Average Valley Year

Since the Redbirds joined the Valley for the 1981-82 season, Illinois State has averaged 10.3 conference wins per year. Five of those 21 campaigns were just 16-game Valley schedules, while four others included only 14 games. On average, Illinois State has finished four games over .500 in league play.

Hey Arnold!

Freshman **Marcus Arnold** can't be seen on cable's Nicklelodeon, but he has been putting on a show against Valley opponents. In seven of his first eight league games of his career, Arnold scored double figures including a career-high with 19 at Northern lowa. He is averaging a team-best 12.3 points in conference games.

A Post Pattern

Head coach **Tom Richardson** isn't looking to become an offensive coordinator for the Redbird football team, but he has called for a post pattern heading into league play. In the first eight games, posts **Baboucarr Bojang** and **Marcus Arnold** averaged 6.5 and 6.4 points per game, respectively. In the last eight, Arnold is averaging 12.3 points per game and Bojang has 10.1 points per contest.

It's a Small World

With 6-foot-9 **Baboucarr Bojang** being tabbed a preseason first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, head coach **Tom Richardson** is probably surprised that his top three scorers are 6-4 or smaller. **Trey Guidry** (12.6 ppg.), **Vince Greene** (10.8 ppg) and **Gregg Alexander** (10.3 ppg.) are the top three tallymarkers on the team.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Northern Iowa Edges the Redbirds, 66-64

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa — Marcus Arnold scored a career-high 19 points and Gregg Alexander chipped in 12 to pace Illinois State but it was not enough as the men's basketball team fell to 1-10 overall, 0-3 in the Missouri Valley Conference on Tuesday after a two-point loss to Northern Iowa. 66-64. in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

Leading by one point with 1:10 to play, the Redbirds let the game slip from their grasp as Ryan Paulsen of UNI hit a three pointer with :42 seconds remaining. A missed trey by Alexander and a foul by Dana Ford put Ben Jacobson at the line in the final seconds. He connected on both free throws as the Panthers (4-7, 1-2) handed ISU their fourth consecutive loss. Vince Greene hit a shot to pull within two with :16 seconds left, but that was as close as the 'Birds got.

Illinois State led 31-29 at the half off of hot shooting from Alexander, who scored eight points in the first twenty minutes, and Kevin Troc who added seven. It was the second game in a row that the 'Birds led at halftime and faultered in the second period, resulting in a loss

Northern lowa shot 58 percent from the field in the second half, sparked by 17 points from Jacobsen. Paulsen added 14 for the Panthers while Chris Foster tossed in 11.

Looking for the Winning 50-50 Ticket

With a win against Northern Iowa, head coach **Tom Richardson** would register the 50th win of his coaching career. Richardson currently ranks 10th in victories at Illinois State with 49.

Greenbirds

Prior to this season, the 13 players currently on the Illinois State roster had combined for a total of 240 game played, or just 18.5 games per player, or roughly half of one season. Moreover, of the 13 now playing, seven had never played in an ISU game prior to this season and six had never played in a college game.

Time and the Minutes Are On Their Side

Just slightly less than 75 percent of the minutes (74.4%) logged so far this season (2,381 of a possible 3,200) are by players that have at least two years of eligibility AFTER this season. Three of the top four minute-getters are **Gregg Alexander** (501), **Vince Greene** (492) and **Trey Guidry** (436) – all sophomores.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Neil Plank transferred to ISU from Wisconsin, but cannot play for the 'Birds until the 2003-04 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. In 27 games, Plank scored 25 points in 173 minutes for UW.

We Have a Winner

After finishing 17-14 last season, the Redbirds finished above .500 for the 29th time in 32 seasons at the Division I level. It was also the 'Birds' tenth winning season in the last 11 years.

Second Half Resistance Has Been Futile

Only three times this season, Illinois State held its opponent below 50 percent shooting in the second half. In the Redbirds' 15 losses, ISU foes have shot 203-for-358 in the second half – for an insuperable 56.7%.

Who Ya Gonna Call?

Bracket Busters! In an effort to help "mid-major" programs bust into the NCAA Tournament field, conferences from around the country have joined forces with ESPN to form — Bracket Buster Saturday on Feb. 22, 2003. The event consists of 18 teams with one predetermined match-up with Gonzaga hosting Tulsa. The rest of the games will be announced on Feb. 1, 2003, with the intention of pitting the best-possible match-ups. By the end of the season, the 'Birds will have faced six opponents that are a part of Bracket Buster Saturday.

Bojang One of Valley's Elite

Senior **Baboucarr Bojang** was named to the preseason all-league team at the Missouri Valley Conference's media day. Bojang claimed second-team honors in 2001-02 and joined Creighton's Kyle Korver, Drake's Luke McDonald and Southern Illinois' Kent Williams and Jermaine Dearman on the All-Valley team.

FT Five-Peat ?

With the 77.5% effort from the line last season, the Redbirds eclipsed the 70% shooting mark for a fourth-straight season. This year the Redbirds are in line to accomplish the feat with a 72.4 percentage through the first 13 games. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line in 2000-01, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

Illinois State added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, Ill • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, Ill. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period.

Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 3-3 record when playing on January 29, one of Illinois State's three wins happened in 1987 and it is today's Redbird Flashback: **Jan. 29, 1987 • Normal, III.** – Derrick Sanders' jumper with six seconds left ices a 52-50 homecourt win over Drake at Horton Field House. The game featured nine lead changes and seven ties. Sanders finished with 10 points, but Tony Holifield lead the Redbird charge with 15 points before fouling out. The late Cliff Peterson also chipped in 10 tallies, while all three posted six rebounds a piece.

Down 45-24 at halftime, the Cougars came out firing in the second half and outscored the 'Birds 26-15 over the first 8:30 minutes led by nine points apiece by junior Ron Jones and freshman Logan Glosser narrowing the Redbird lead to 10. Following a timeout with 11:05 remaining in the game, the 'Birds went on a 13-0 run to extend their lead back to 23, which tied their largest lead of the night.

Illinois State Falls to 0-4

NORMAL, III. - Trey Guidry had a career-high 26 points and Baboucarr Bojang posted his first double-double of the season, but Illinois State could not get its first win falling to Chattanooga 75-68 in non-conference college hoops action tonight at Redbird Arena.
