

THE SECRET OF SOUZA'S SUCCESS

Senior quarterback **Mike Souza** garnered Gateway All-Newcomer honors last season and the senior from California also left his mark on the Redbird record books. He started 10 games in 2002 and passed for 1,404 yards while rushing for 224, the second-highest total on the team. He finished the year ranked No. 3 for rushing yards in a season by a quarterback.

CERONE THE INTERCEPTOR

The Illinois State defense only had four interceptions last season, and three of them were picked by junior **Cerone Colvin**. Colvin snagged Southern Illinois quarterback Joel Sambrusky's first two interceptions of the season and got his first pick of the season in a game-saving play against Murray State in the waning seconds of the fourth quarter. With his three picks last year, Colvin has six for his Illinois State career.

THE GREAT GRIGSBY

The list of honors Boomer Grigsby received after becoming the nation's leading tackler in 2002 was long. Needless to say, it is just going to get longer with two more years to claim the only award he didn't win last year-the Buck Buchanan Award for the top defensive player in I-AA football. Awards he did claim included the 2002 Gateway Defensive Player of the Year, Dopke.com Performer of the Year, First-Team All-Gateway, Second-Team All-American by The Sports Network, The College Sporting News/I-AA.org All-Star Team, First-Team All-American by Don Hansen Football Gazette.

EXPLORING THE NEW-MORE EXPERIENCED-FRONT YEAR

In 2002, the Illinois State offensive line started the season with four new starters and one starting in a new position. In 2003, the big guys up front have more experience and return a solid group that was tested last year and is ready to make an impact on the Gateway. Returning starters include **Jim**

Ferguson, Jeremy Melville, Stafford Davis and Mike Stegeman. Melville, Davis and Stegeman got the start 11 times last year while Ferguson started 10. Even with the return of all that experience, the 'Birds will only lose Ferguson at the end of this season.

Another One Bites the Dust

When Illinois State defeated No. 25 Southern Illinois on Oct. 19, and then topped No. 17 Northern Iowa a week later, it marked the sixth-straight year in which the Redbirds beat at least one ranked foe. The 'Birds have won 10 of their last 21 tilts against ranked I-AA foes.

RUNNING WITH THE BIG DOGS

Last year, running back Quincy Washington set Redbird records and had back-to-back 100+ yard performances, all after transferring to Illinois State from Big Ten foe Illinois. While Washington's career has concluded, the Redbirds had no problem filling the void left by the all-conference performer...with another Big Ten transfer named **Demetrus Johnson** from Minnesota. The junior from Milwaukee, Wis., was named Wisconsin Player of the Year in high school and tallied 55 yards in 10 games as a Golden Gopher in 2002.

THE RETURN OF THE KICKOFF TD

It has been over three seasons, since 1999, that a Redbird has returned a kickoff for a touchdown but Illinois State hopes all that will change this year with the addition of three key players in **Leon Kittrell, Antwan Oliver** and **Joe Walkins**. Kittrell is a redshirt freshman

while Oliver and Walkins both gained special teams experience while playing at Eastern Illinois and Auburn, respectively.

ALL-AMERICA U

Illinois State's football program has produced at least one all-American player in 17 of its last 20 seasons. Over the last four seasons, players from ten different positions have been honored. **Boomer Grigsby** and Jonathan Friend were both honored after the 2002 season.

McCray To Toledo

Randall McCray, Illinois State's former defensive coordinator and assistant head coach, took a coaching position with the University of Toledo, a I-A football institution, in March. McCray left his mark on Redbird football, however, leading the ISU defense, guided by Boomer Grigsby, to new heights which included a defense that ranked No. 11 nationally in pass defense and No. 23 in total defense his first year.

TRANSFERRABLE

Since 1993, when the NCAA rules changed to allow players immediate eligibility at the I-AA level, Illinois State has had 31 players transfer from I-A schools. Rule Changes for 2003

Rule 1-2-4-b: The team area shall be limited to squad members in full uniform and a maximum of 60 other individuals directly involved in the game. The individuals not in full uniform shall wear a credential marked 'team.' Credentials should be numbered 1 through 60. No other credential is valid for the team area.

Rule 3-2-5: Start the game clock on all kickoffs when the ball is legally touched in the field of play. Legally touched in the field of play also includes winding the clock when a runner crosses the goal line into the field of play after catching the ball in the end zone, and winding the clock when the ball rolls across the goal line from the end zone after being touched in the end zone.

Rule 6-4-1-a and 6-4-1-d: Delete the two-yard restricted area around a player positioned to catch a free or scrimmage kick.

Rule 6-5-1: When a valid fair catch signal is made, the unimpeded opportunity to catch a free or scrimmage kick is extended to a player who muffs a kick. This protection terminates when the kick touches the ground.

Rule 6-5-3: Delete all references to illegal fair catch signals.

Rule 8-3-6: Delete the option allowing a team that a touchdown is scored upon to kick.

Rule 8-4-2-a: Delete the option allowing a team that a field goal is scored upon to kick

Rule 9-1-2-e-1-(a): Offensive linemen at the snap positioned more than seven yards in any direction from the middle lineman of the offensive formation are prohibited from blocking below the waist toward the original position of the ball in or behind the neutral zone and within 10 yards beyond the neutral zone.

Rule 9-1-2-e-1-(b): Backs at the snap positioned outside the normal tackle position in either direction toward a sideline, or in motion at the snap, are prohibited from blocking below the waist toward the original position of the ball in or behind the neutral zone and within 19 yards beyond the neutral zone.

Rule 10-2-2-g-1: Enforce all penalties for unsportsmanlike acts (as defined in Rule 9-2-1-a) occurring during or after a down that ends in a touchdown and before a try, either on the try or on the succeeding kickoff (Exception: during extra period[s]).


Spring Cleaning

Comparing The Two • A Look at Ray Robinson and Jonathan Friend

And if Robinson and Friend are so comparable on the numbers end, then Robinson's career has a good chance of ending with numerous accolades as Friend's did-with all-conference first-team honors and all-american status. Spring Outlook

In addition to being a football coach, Denver Johnson is also a music enthusiast, so it is only fitting that the prospect of the 2003 season be compared to the Five Man Electrical Band's hit single *Signs*. As the 2002 campaign and recruiting season came to a completion, there have been "signs, signs everywhere there's been signs" that a run for the Gateway Football Conference Championship and the NCAA I-AA Playoffs is in the near future for the Redbirds.

The Redbirds rebounded with a 6-5 season after a 2-9 campaign in 2001 and return experience at nearly all the talent positions. The 'Birds also got a hearty taste of big games in 2002 and will have to convert those match-ups to wins in 2003 to keep title hopes alive. The Redbirds' five losses came to 2002 Sun Bowl Champion Purdue, I-AA Playoff participant Eastern Illinois, 2002 GFC Champion Western Illinois, 2002 National Champion Western Kentucky and five-time national champion Youngstown State.

On the winning side, the youthful Redbirds learned to win on the road in 2002 and can build on that this season with a 31-20 victory over preseason-favorite Northern Iowa at the UNI-Dome. Illinois State also capped the season with a 20-12 win at Indiana State to clinch the Redbirds' fourth winning season in the last five years. The 'Birds also learned to protect the home field, by posting a 4-1 record at Hancock Stadium.

The Redbirds cracked the top 25 prior to the game at Western Kentucky and wouldn't be a surprise in the 2003 preseason poll. With eight starters returning, the Redbird offense should continue to build on its 2002 success. Defensively, like last season, the 'Birds are deep at the talent positions, possess a lot of speed and continue to get better.

With all the experience returning, the addition of impact transfers, the development of redshirt freshmen and a favorable schedule without consecutive road games, there is no wonder why this program is beginning to show "signs."

DEFENSE

In the second half of the 2002 season, the Redbird defense began to take shape and started to show glimpses of what was in store for 2003. Shutting down the nation's

leading rusher, defeating the reigning conference champions Northern Iowa on their field and holding eventual National Champion Western Kentucky to just three field goals were all highlights that this defense can build on.

Junior linebacker **Boomer Grigsby** deservedly claimed many of the individual awards, but every great leader needs an even better supporting cast. That again will be the case in 2003. There are some voids to fill and some positions to be learned, but by the time the Gateway Football Conference season starts the Redbird defense should be cranking on all cylinders. The old adage is "defense wins championships." If that's the case, the conference title could be on its way back to Normal.

LINE: At least during spring practice, this area will prove to be thin for the 'Birds. With senior **Ray Robinson** as the only returning starter, a pool of unproven talent will be asked to fill the void left by graduates Eugene Boyd, Stuart Sands and all-American Jonathan Friend.

Robinson collected league honorable mention honors last season and ranked sixth on the team in tackles, second

among defensive linemen. He finished with 81 stops, including 10 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. Robinson also added five pass break-ups and a forced fumble. Adding depth behind Robinson, will be senior **Austin Dunlap** and walk-on **Montell Conner**.

At left end, sophomore **Mike Blough** and **Ryan Thorne** will occupy the position during the spring. Blough, who was pulled off his redshirt campaign four games into the season, finished with five tackles in seven games. He has some biggame experience playing at Western Illinois, Northern Iowa and Western Kentucky.

Thorne, from Vista, Calif., redshirted last season. In addition to competing at end, Thorne will also provide depth at defensive tackle.

Dunlap has the speed to back-up Robinson, but he also has the strength and size to occupy the left tackle position and will start there. In his first season with the Redbirds, Dunlap finished with 21 tackles and four tackles for loss. He was also fifth on the team with 10 hurries.

The other spot is up for grabs among three redshirt freshmen. Justin Martindale, of Wadsworth, Ill., will likely play for the defense in the spring, but by fall could be back on the offensive side of the ball. Michael Heffernan, a native of Hawthorn Woods, Ill., and walk-on Kentin Lathrope, from Bloomingdale, Ill., will also see plenty of

opportunities this spring.

Summary: This area was hit hard with attrition. But, Robinson is poised to have a breakout senior year like his former teammate Friend accomplished last season. He will have to carry the load, especially in the spring, as the others gain experience. Dunlap and Thorne will provide flexibility by playing both outside and inside. During the spring, the line might look like an area of concern at times, but depth is on its way with six talented signees joining the squad in the fall.

LINEBACKERS: Even with having to replace two starters, the Redbird linebacking corp will once again prove to be a strong asset to the Redbird defense. All-American Boomer Grigsby continues to improve, but has already been recognized multiple times for his talents.


Grigsby became the first sophomore in league history to win player of the year honors. He also finished third in the Buck Buchanan Award voting, an honor given to the nation's top defender. Grigsby finished the season with a nation's-best 179 tackles, including an NCAA record 108 solo stops. He also had 16 tackles for loss and four sacks.

In addition to Grigsby, the 'Birds return **Andrew Papoccia**. Papoccia will make the move from rover to the whip linebacker position. He finished third on the team in tackles last season with 89 and he ranks No. 7 all-time in career tackles for loss with 28.

Spotting Papoccia will be junior **Sesamir Yearby**. Yearby, who predominately played special teams last season, is still learning the system and recorded three tackles last season.

Filling the rover position left by Papoccia, will be sophomores **William Rolle** and **Glen Eaton**. Each played sparingly in 2002, but their time has come and the position is ready for the taking.

In addition to filling the rover, the Redbirds will have to

secure the middle with Grigsby. Lost to graduation is Greg Helle, the team's second-leading tackler with 110 stops. Senior **Gean Gilot** has the talent and experience, but a torn ACL in the season-opener at Purdue has left some question marks. If Gilot can't fully recover, redshirt freshman **Niall Campbell**, a Grigsby clone, or junior **Rick Splant** will be expected to step up.

Junior **Adam Redenius** and sophomore **Joe Bendoraitis** will also provided some added depth behind Grigsby.

Summary: Illinois State is starting to get a reputation for the quality linebackers it produces. This group should continue that tradition. Grigsby needs to continue to improve, especially in pass coverage, while Papoccia will have to adjust to a new position. But, like the defensive line, more depth and talent will be added in the fall as a strong signing class filters into camp.

SECONDARY: This area gained some much needed experience last season and continued to improve. Now with the addition of a pair of transfers and some redshirt freshmen, this group now has quality depth.

Cerone Colvin, Brandon Allen, Chris Govan, Cedric Jackson and Sam Yeargin all return. Colvin started all 11 games and led the team with three interceptions. He also tallied 53 tackles and five pass break-ups.

Allen, who was pulled from his redshirt season, started the last seven games at free safety. He led all defensive backs with 57 tackles and posted two tackles for loss, an interception and a sack.

Govan played in all 11 games, including two starts, and finished with 26 tackles. Jackson only played in three games, but was still recovering from a torn ACL that he suffered in 2001. He is 100 percent heading into the spring and is expected to be a heavy contributor. Yeargin saw action in 11 games and registered 17 tackles with two pass break-ups.

Transfers Antwan Oliver and Tyler Larrick will have immediate impacts. Oliver, a junior from Eastern Illinois, is a proven player that carries a physical presence in the secondary.

Larrick, from Hartnell Community College, had 120 tackles and two interceptions last season en route

to being named the 2002 Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year. In addition to the transfers, redshirt freshmen **Leon Kittrell** and **James Temple** will also via for a starting nod.

Summary: With a good combination of returnees, transfers and newcomers this will definitely be a fun group to watch. The area is talented, continues to improve and should be solid. With the quality of depth, coverage should not pose a problem, but forcing turnovers will continue to be a focus this spring. Last season, the Redbirds picked off only four passes. That number will need to increase in the Redbirds' run for the title.

OFFENSE

The Illinois State offense has a lot to hang its hat on, but probably the biggest is its offensive line. The Redbirds return eight starters from a young, talented and experienced group. A healthy Mike Souza also returns as the Redbird signal-caller and he has an arsenal of receivers to throw to.

In the spring, the coaching staff will look at a variety of combinations on the offensive line to get the top five players on the field. The offense will also look for more consistency in the passing game. Late in the year last season, defenses were able to key on the Redbird rushing attack.

LINE: Youth and battle-tested are adjectives that usually aren't used in combination, but this is the case for the Redbird offensive line. Returning starters include senior Jim Ferguson, junior Jeremy Melville and sophomores Stafford Davis and Mike Stegeman. Melville, Davis and Stegeman started all 11 games, while Ferguson drew the

starting nod 10 times.

Davis, who will likely stay at left guard, earned second team all-conference honors and was selected to the all-newcomer team, while Ferguson was also named lineman of the week during the season. Ferguson played mostly right guard in 2002, but can play all three interior positions. He will see some time at center, while Melville will also see time at right tackle. Melville has collected 19 starts in his two seasons of action, including 11 at center last season.

Stegeman, who posted all of his starting assignments at left tackle, will also be given an opportunity at the vacant right tackle spot. If the line wasn't young and talented enough, junior college transfer Noah Washington and redshirt freshmen Janiah Downing and Kory Anderson will also challenge for starting roles. Washington, a 6-foot-4, 344-pounder, will also see time at right tackle, along with Downing.

Joe Pantoja and Matt Pezdek will add depth at tackle and Geoff Pearson will provide the same at center.

Summary: The depth, talent and experience on the Redbird offensive line is unmatched by any other area

on the squad. This group should start to assert itself as one of the better units in the Gateway. Even with all the experience returning, the Redbirds will only be losing one (Ferguson) from this group after the season.

TIGHT END: Mike Larson and Steve Statz both return for the Redbirds, along with Jon Gusman, Kevin Kreger and Alex Filin. Statz started in nine games for the Redbirds last season. He caught six balls for 45 yards and is the best blocker in the group. Larson, who is the best receiver, posted 11 catches for 127 yards in his debut season. Gusman made the switch from defensive line to tight end mid-year last season and is still adjusting, while Kreger and Filin will also find time at the fullback position.

BACKS: The graduation of 1,000-yard rusher Quincy Washington will be a blow to the Redbird offense. But another Big Ten transfer **Demetrus Johnson**, from

Minnesota, along with a committee of backs should be able to fill the void. Johnson only rushed for 55 yards last season with the Golden Gophers after spending time at receiver, but will bring some speed and elusiveness to the Redbird backfield.

When defenses are tired of chasing Johnson, the Redbirds will be able to turn to **Sha-ron Edwards**, **Tristan Davis**, **T.J. Watts**, **LaShawn Bullock** and **Dan Dechert** for some reps. Edwards came on strong in the second half and rushed for 190 yards on 41 carries. He also added three touchdowns.

Davis, who played most of the season with an injured shoulder, gives the Redbirds some versatility. He can play both the halfback and fullback positions. Davis logged 28 carries last season for 141 yards and a touchdown.

Watts, like Johnson, is a speedster, but is coming off of a fractured left fibula. Prior to the injury, Watts rushed for 123 yards on 18 attempts for the best average on the team.

Bullock, a redshirt freshman, is another quick-footed back that is making his way back from an injury. He suffered a torn ACL last season during practice.

At fullback, in addition to Davis, J.P. Dundas, Harry Lattimore, Kevin Kreger and Alex Filin will all compete for the position. Dundas, Lattimore and Kreger saw the bulk of the snaps last season in a position that was primarily used for blocking. This season, the fullback, or H-back, position will be more involved in the offensive scheme.

Summary: With a solid offensive line and an arsenal of running backs with varying characteristics, the Redbird running game looks to be the foundation of the offensive attack once again. There will be more breakaway speed this season, but Johnson doesn't have the size to pass protect as often as Washington. There will be plenty of carries to go around, each member of the committee will just have to be ready to respond when their number is called.

QUARTERBACK: All-newcomer selection Mike Souza returns to lead the Redbird offense. Souza started in 10 games last season and passed for 1,404 yards and eight touchdowns. The scrambling signal-caller also rushed for 224 yards and five TDs. Souza has had a full year in the system and has a lot of stability around him. His numbers in every category should increase. He just needs to become more consistent throwing the ball.

Junior Yance Vaughan will also challenge for playing time. Vaughan saw action in two games last season, after a strong spring campaign. He threw for 34 yards on only four attempts.

Adding depth will be sophomore **Steve Kolodziej**. Kolodziej played against Quincy and threw for a touchdown and 35 yards.

Summary: Souza needs to bounce back this season after finishing the year battling injuries. He is a tough competitor, but his mobility puts him in adverse situations and he is going to get hit. With that in mind, both Vaughan and Kolodziej need to be prepared. Their time could come at a drop of a hat.

RECEIVERS: Losing a wideout like Vito Golson would normally send the offense reeling, but that is not the case this season. In addition to returnees **Dwayne Smith**,

Ramon Barber and LaMonte Jones, the Redbirds add Auburn transfer Joe Walkins to their receiving corp.

Smith will move to Golson's old spot and will look to build off of his debut season with the 'Birds after transferring from Illinois. Smith ranked second on the team in catches (39) and yards (470). He also collected three touchdowns.

Barber is coming off a tremendous season as a true freshman. He ended with 16 catches for 237 yards and two touchdowns. Both scores came at Northern Iowa in the Redbirds' victory. He will likely stay in the same position.


Another first-year player last season, Jones finished with eight balls for 117 yards and a touchdown after transferring from Fresno City Community College. Jones is able to play all three spots and will step in for the four receiver set.

Walkins is expected to play the motion receiver position. The staff likes him in motion and his elusiveness is multiplied when he is coming off of formations. He sat out last season with a leg injury at Auburn, but had 12 catches for

124 yards as a freshman.

Also competing for time will be redshirt freshman Clarence Glenn, who will make the move from tight end, Brian Busser and walk-on Pete Holak.

Summary: The receivers are deep and talented. With Smith, Jones and Barber having a full year in the system, along with Souza at quarterback, the passing game should begin to progress. Walkins brings a lot of versatility to the offense and combined with the other three, will cause a lot of problems for defenses.



SPECIAL TEAMS

KICKING: Junior Stephen Carroll becomes more and more consistent each season as the Redbird placekicker. Heralded with honorable mention honors last season, Carroll converted 68.4 percent of his field goal attempts last season, including 2-of-2 from 50-plus yards. He also finished the campaign

making his last five attempts. He ranked No. 7 nationally with 1.3 field goals per game and No. 41 in scoring.

Sophomore **Troy Maskel** earned the punting and kickoff duties last fall and is listed at No.1 this spring. Maskel helped the 'Birds rank No. 10 nationally in net punting at 36.89 yards. **Ryan Hoffman**, who battled a bad hamstring all season, looks to give Maskel competition as he tries to capture his job back.

RETURNS: The Redbirds could have some of the top return specialists in all of I-AA football. Transfers **Joe Walkins** and **Antwan Oliver** and redshirt freshman **Leon Kittrell** will make the Illinois State return game an exciting one. Each is elusive and has explosive breakaway speed.

MISCELLANEOUS: J.P. Dundas will return for his second season as the Redbirds' long and short snapper.

Summary: Two years ago, the special teams proved to be the Achilles' heel for the Redbirds. But in 2002, that all changed. With a solid foundation to build off, look for the special teams to improve even more in 2003, especially in the return area where the Redbirds have not returned a kick for a touchdown since 1999.

HEAD COACH



Denver Johnson is known for many things.

Devoted family man, community servant, humorist, professional football player and Academic All-American to name a few. Not only are Johnson's qualities and accomplishments plentiful, but his coaching and leadership abilities have worked their magic on Redbird student-athletes, staff and fans, making believers out of everybody-again.

The Redbirds under Johnson are definitely a team

on the rise and with nothing more than his wicked knowledge for the sport and a champion attitude,
Johnson has cast away the spells and is ready to put the magic touch on another season.

Last fall, his team posted a 6-5 regular-season record, a 4-3 Gateway Football Conference record and a fourth-place finish. Quite an improvement from a 2-9 outing in 2001 where Redbird fans were having feelings of doubt. But just one short year later, there is a resurgence in the dedication and commitment Johnson has to

Illinois State and Redbird football.

His commitment to football was one of the reasons he became the 19th head coach in Illinois State's history. Before he stepped onto campus, however, his coaching career was at its peak after 15 years in the business.

Johnson began his coaching career in 1985 as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma State and he was with the Cowboys for the '85 Gator Bowl.

His first full-time coaching job came at Tennessee-

Martin from 1986-89, where he was assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In 1988, UT-Martin, with an explosive offense, fashioned a record of 11-2 with a quarter-final appearance in the Division II playoffs. Johnson coached the offensive line at Oklahoma State from 1989-93 before embarking on a four-year stint as an assistant at Mississippi State. The 1993 Bulldogs earned a spot in the Peach Bowl, and in 1995 Johnson was recognized as one of the top assistant coaches in the Southeastern Conference.

Johnson was on the Oklahoma staff for the 1996 season before taking over the Murray State program prior to the 1997 campaign.

A late hiring process and the loss of several key players from the previous year's team appeared to have Johnson poised for a slow start at Murray, but that was not the case. The Racers responded with the aforementioned 7-4 mark.

Johnson graduated from Tulsa in 1981. He helped TU to the 1976 Independence Bowl as a player and was a two-time All-Missouri Valley Conference offensive lineman under former Ohio State and Arizona State head coach John Cooper. He also was an academic all-conference pick, too.

Following his college playing career at Tulsa, Johnson moved to the professional ranks. He was with the National Football League's Tampa Bay Buccaneers from April 1981 to February of 1983.

He then joined the Los Angeles Express of the nowdefunct United States Football League from February of 1983 through August of 1984, then wrapped up his playing career with the USFL's Houston Gamblers from February 1984 through August of 1985.

His USFL playing days included playing stints with quarterbacks Jim Kelly and Steve Young, both of whom went on to stardom in the National Football League.



Purdue Turns Up Heat in Redbird Season Opener

WEST LAFAYETTE Ind. - Redbird quarterback Mike Souza got the Illinois State football team on the board after a 15-vard pass to Dwayne Smith in the third quarter but one touchdown and one field goal was all the Redbirds could muster in front of 47. 701 in attendance at Ross-Ade Stadium Saturday, as Purdue downed Illinois State, 51-10.

"We had to make a first down to keep defense off the field," head coach Denver Johnson said. "I challenged them at the half to go out and finish the game and this team did that. If the spirit and character of team is what I think it is, we will make it through this and go back to work Monday and make it through the rest of

"Losing to Purdue is not easier than losing to anyone else," Johnson continued. "I hate it, I really hate it, but I am proud of our team. They went out and competed. But they were out-manned."

Purdue's Seth Morales fumbled an Illinois State punt before Smith recovered it and one play later Souza set up the lone 'Bird TD to Smith. Four minutes after ISU scored, Jerod Void crossed the goal line on a three-yard run as Purdue kept a commanding

After a holding penalty on the Boilermakers, another catch by Smith placed the Redbird offense on the Purdue eight-yard line and four plays later, Stephen Carroll made a 27-yard field goal to increase Illinois State's score to double digits.

Purdue went up 44-10 after a second, three-yard scurry by Void to start the final quarter and Purdue topped off its scoring with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Brandon Kirsch to Jameson Evans with four minutes remaining in the game

In the first quarter, the Redbirds trailed by 20 points after three touchdowns by the Boilermakers. A six-yard carry by Joey Harris at the 11:20 mark gave Purdue a 6-0 advantage, before a failed extra point attempt. John Standeford and quarterback Kyle Orton connected twice on 10- and 24-yard touchdown passes to end the first quarter.

Two minutes into the second quarter, Orton hooked up with Harris on a screen pass that went 57-yards for a score and lifted the Boilermakers to a 27-point lead. A 39-yard field goal by Berin Lacevic with 8:25 remaining in the first half put Purdue up by 30 at the break. The Redbirds netted 60 yards after 30 minutes of play, nine rushing and 51 passing, while the Boilermakers collected

Vito Golson also had a big game for the 'Birds with 63 yards receiving and two touchdowns on four receptions. Kevir Zouzounis completed seven of his 10 pass attempts for 95 yards and a touchdown.

Illinois State (1-1) wasted no time getting on the scoreboard. On their first play from scrimmage, Washington ran 41 yards for the touchdown to put the 'Birds up 7-0 with 11:03 left in the first

Quincy answered with a 38-yard field goal on the ensuing possession by Matt Peters to cut the ISU lead to four, 7-3. However, the Illinois State offense needed only 10 plays and 72 vards to add another score when Vito Golson grabbed his 13th career touchdown pass on an 11-yard pass from Mike Souza.

Washington's 2-yard run early in the second quarter increased the Redbird lead to 18 at 21-3 capping a drive which saw Washington pass his previous career-high of 92 rushing yards in a game and post his first 100-yard game rushing at Illinois State.

Tristan Davis added his first career touchdown as a Redbird with 6:42 left in the first half on a 3-yard rush, which gave Illinois State the 28-3 lead it took into halftime.

On their first drive of the second half, Kevin Zouzounis connected with Golson on a 37-yard pass for a touchdown to increase the ISU lead to 32. Later in the third quarter, freshman redshirt T.J. Watts scored on a 29-yard run that marked his first career touchdown and his longest career rush to make the score 42-3 heading into the fourth quarter.

Illinois State Wins Thriller over Murray State

NORMAL, III. - Boomer Grigsby made a huge tackle inside the five-yard line on Garner Byars during a two-point conversion attempt with 26 seconds remaining that would have given Murray State a one-point victory as the Redbirds prevail with an impressive 24-23 comeback win in a wild finish at Hancock

The Racers were able to recover an on-side kick attempt on the ensuing kickoff with 23 seconds remaining, but Cerone Colvin picked off a pass attempt by Stewart Childress to end the game and give the 'Birds (2-1) their second win of the season.

Quincy Washington rushed for 169 yards and two touchdowns and Vito Golson caught five passes for 110 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Mike Souza finished with 14 completions for 177 yards and a touchdown, while Grigsby paced the Redbird defense with 17 total tackles, including 10 solo stops.

Murray State (1-2) jumped out to an early 7-0 lead when running back Billy Blanchard rushed 77 yards for his longest run of the season and the score on the second play of the game. Illinois State cut into the Racers' lead with 7:26 left in the first quarter when Stephen Carroll booted a 41-yard field goal through the uprights to put the 'Birds up on the scoreboard.

The score remained 7-3 for most of the second quarter until the Racers tacked on three more points with a career-long 52-yard field goal by Shane Andrus with 3:33 left in the half to take a seven-point lead into halftime, 10-3.

With Blanchard sidelined in the second half with an ankle injury, freshman Ron Lane became the Racers' primary rusher and helped pace an early third quarter MSU scoring drive with a 45yard rush up the middle of the field that put the Racers in the red zone. The drive was capped by a three-vard run by Mario Riley that put Murray State ahead, 17-3.

With 1:05 remaining in the third quarter, Washington broke a couple of tackles and took the ball 35 yards down the middle of the field giving the 'Birds their first touchdown of the game and cutting the Racers' lead to 7 at 17-10.

The touchdown seemed to energize the Redbird defense as well as they pushed the Racers back three yards on their ensuing possession and forced MSU to punt from its own nine-yard line.

The Redbirds took full advantage of the resulting field position and needed only two plays to take the ball 42 yards on a drive capped by a 39-yard touchdown reception by Vito Golson from Mike Souza that knotted the game at 17-17.

A big, third-down sack by senior defensive tackle Stuart Sands with nine minutes remaining in the game forced the Racers to punt and the 'Birds marched 84 yards down the field to take the lead on a two-yard rush by Washington.

Murray State, however, would not guit and used 11 plays to score again on a nine-yard pass to Marcus Christon with 26 seconds remaining in the game and the Racers down by a point, 24-23.

Eastern Illinois Breaks Out Early in 45-10 Win

CHARLESTON, III.- Scoring on four of its first five possessions. Eastern Illinois took a quick 17-0 lead after the first quarter and continued to dominate offensively as the Redbirds managed just one field goal and one touchdown in the Panther's 45-10 win Saturday in front of 10,731 at O'Brien Field in Charleston.

Chip Taylor's grab at the EIU 15-yard line set up the only 'Bird TD of the game with 31 seconds remaining. Two plays later and with 18 seconds on the clock, Mike Souza connected on a 14-yard pass to Dwayne Smith for his second touchdown of the season. Stephen Carroll got the 'Birds the extra point.

Eastern Illinois improves to 2-2 on the year as the 'Birds take the same mark, 2-2. The 35-point margin of defeat tied the largest Panther win between the two schools in the series' history, dating back to 1978 when EIU beat ISU 42-7.

To start the second half, Zouzounis, who replaced starting QB Souza in the first quarter, was picked off by Chad Cleveland on the third play of the half, who returned it to the Illinois State three yard line. The play setup EIU's fourth TD, a 3-yard scramble by Taylor, his second of the game. Kicker Steve Kuehn secured the extra point for the Panthers, who took a commanding 31-3 lead.

A forced fumble at ISU's 38-yard line by George Lowe on Jon Laurenti's catch with 11:18 to play in the third led to another Panther TD, a nine-yard plunge by Nick Eller as the drive went four plays for 47 yards and the Panthers increased their lead to 38-3. Taylor scored his third touchdown of the game with 1:51 left on the clock in the third. The drive was six plays for 71 yards and EIU went up 45-3.

Stephen Carroll's 24-yard kick with 3.2 seconds left in the first half got the Redbirds on the scoreboard after a fumble by EIU's Andre Raymond was recovered by Boomer Grigsby. It was a small consolation as the 'Birds trailed 24-0.

Souza was 6-of-14 with one interception before being replaced by Zouzounis in the first quarter. The Panthers scored at the 10:52 mark on a 27-yard field goal before back-to-back touchdowns, first by Raymond on a 10-yard pass from Tony Romo at the 5:41 mark of the first and then Devon O'Neal grabbed a 57-yarder from Romo with three minutes left in the first, following a Souza interception.

Leading 17-0, Eastern Illinois increased its lead to 24 on a seven-yard run by JR Taylor. ISU was limited to -20 yards rushing in the first half while the Panthers ran for 77.

Illinois State Cruises Past SMS 30-20

A Homecoming crowd of 10,283 watched Quincy Washington rack up 167 vards rushing and two touchdowns on a career-high 33 carries, while Dwayne Smith turned in 64 yards and a touchdown on five receptions. Vito Golson also turned in 64 yards on the day on four grabs.

Illinois State (3-2, 1-0 GFC) jumped ahead 7-0 when Mike Souza connected with Dwayne Smith for a 7-yard touchdown pass to the right corner of the endzone. It was Smith's third touchdown reception of the season, but his first score as a Redbird at Hancock Stadium.

SMS (3-3, 0-2 GFC) answered on the ensuing possession with 6-play, 79-yard drive that was capped by a 13-yard touchdown pass from Michael White to Jay Steinbroner to tie the game at 7. The Bears were able to get the ball back on the ISU 27 on a fumble by Redbird quarterback Mike Souza, but were unable to capitalize on the turnover when Brian Long missed a 39-yard field goal attempt keeping the score 7-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Illinois State got a nice break early in the second quarter when SMS punt returner Anthony Sullivan fumbled the punt inside the Bears' 5-yard line and Randolph Waite was able to recover the turnover. The 'Birds needed only two plays to capitalize when Quincy Washington rushed in for the score on a 5-yard run to give ISU a 14-7 advantage with 11:56 left in the first half.

The Redbirds scored again later in the quarter when Stephen Carroll connected on a 30-yard field goal to give Illinois State a 10point lead. Another fumble by SMS in Bears' territory gave the Birds two more golden opportunities to increase their lead before the half and again ISU capitilized with two field goals, a 37-yard boot and a 26-yard kick that put the Redbirds up 23-7 at halftime.

Redbirds Miss a Road Win by Inches

MACOMB, III. - Illinois State senior running back Quincy Washington rushed for his fourth career 100-yard game, but a Western Illinois' goal line stand and a pair of 98-yard-plus drives resulted in a 22-17 Leatherneck win, Saturday night.

Washington finished with a game-high 127 yards, but with the 'Birds trailing 15-10 in a fourth-and-goal situation from the WIU one-half vardline, the Leatherneck defense denied Washington the one-yard gain and ended the Illinois State (3-3 overall, 1-1 Gateway Football Conference) drive.

On the ensuing possession, Western Illinois quarterback Russ Michna led a 99-yard scoring drive that ended with a 23-yard pass to Stacy Coleman. It was Coleman's second touchdown of the game and pushed the Western (5-1, 2-1) lead to 22-10.

That fourth-quarter drive topped Western Illinois' first drive of the game, which totaled 98 yards after Reggie Gray slipped in the damp grass at the 2-yard line on the opening kickoff. The Leathernecks quickly erased their misfortune with a 14-play, 98yard drive capped by a 6-yard touchdown run on a reverse by Coleman to take an early 7-0.

The Redbirds responded with a Stephen Carroll 37-yard field goal, following a 53-yard Dennis Butler kickoff return and pushed the score to 7-3. Early in the second quarter, Carroll had a chance to put the 'Birds within one point, but his 42-yard field goal attempt fell about three yards short.

On the fourth Redbird series, quarterback Kevin Zouzounis took control of the Redbird offense at ISU's 5-vard line. Three plays later, Zouzounis was hit by the WIU defense and the ball trickled out of the back of the endzone for a safety and a 9-3

WIU increased its lead to its haftime margin, 12-3, with a 37yard field goal by Justin Langan at the 2:36 mark in the second

Langan added a 35-yard field goal for only scoring in the third frame and a 15-3 Western Illinois lead.

With 11 minutes left in the game, the Redbirds pulled within five points on Michael Souza's 9-yard option run behind the right side of the line. Souza's touchdown run, his rushing score of the season, finished a 12-play, 66-yard drive for ISU.

Souza, who started for the Redbirds and returned in the third quarter, added a 6-yard scamper in the fourth quarter for ISU's final score. The Redbirds onside kick attempt was unsuccessful.

Souza finished with 71 yards on the ground and 112 in the air on 7-for-13 passing. LaMonte Jones led all Redbird receivers with 68 yards on three catches. The Redbirds totaled 382 yards offensively, including 210 rushing, while Western Illinois finished with 308 yards of total offense.

Redbirds Stun No. 25 Southern Illinois

NORMAL, III.-Mike Souza and Sha-ron Edwards eachran f or two touchdowns and Boomer Grigsby had a career-high 21 total tackles as Illinois State stunned No. 25 Southern Illinois 35-14 in front of 12,415 Family Day fans, the largest crowd this season at Hancock Stadium.

Quincy Washington led the rushing attack for the Redbirds with 126 yards on the ground and one touchdown. Vito Golson finished the game with six catches for 113 yards, while Souza hrew for 275 yards and no interceptions.

Southern Illinois (4-4, 2-1 Gateway) had both its touchdowns come from Mo Abdulgaadir the nation's leading rusher (203.5) yards per game). Abdulqaadir was limited to 103 yards on the ground, his lowest performance since being named the starting running back for the Salukis in their third game of the year

The Redbird defense set the tone throughout the game allowing the Salukis, who came into today's game ranked fifth in the nation for total offense in I-AA football, only 118 yards of total offense after the ISU offense scored its fourth touchdown of the game late in the third quarter. The 14-point performance for the Salukis ties their lowest point total for the season when they scored 14 against Southeast Missouri State on September 7.

Illinois State (4-3, 2-1 Gateway) held the Salukis' offense in check throughout the first quarter allowing SIU one first down and 30 yards of total offense, including only eight yards by the nation's leading I-AA rusher Mo Abdulqaadir. Two costly turnovers by the 'Birds offense, including a fumble on the SIU 11-yard line, kept the ISU from putting any points on the scoreboard.

However early in the second quarter, Illinois State quarterback Mike Souza gave the 'Birds a 7-0 lead with a nine-yard scramble to the endzone. It was his third rushing touchdown in the last two games. The Redbirds had three other opportunities in the second quarter to extend their lead, but two missed field goals by Stephen Carroll and a 57-vard punt return for a touchdown by Dennis Butler called back by a penalty kept ISU with its seven-point advantage heading into halftime

A fumble by Troy Hunter deep in Saluki territory on the first play from scrimmage of the second half proved costly for Illinois State as Southern Illinois marched 29 yards in seven plays to tie the game at 7-7. Abdulgaadir recorded the touchdown on a oneyard rush up the middle.

The 'Birds weren't ready to relinquish their lead just yet. On the ensuing possession, the ISU offense put together a six-play, 89-yard drive capped by a 15-yard run by Quincy Washington giving the Redbirds a 14-7 lead with 10 minutes left in the third. Souza showed off his ground attack again with 6:06 left in the

third when he rushed 13 yards for the score to extend Illinois State's lead to 21-7. But the 'Birds weren't done and following a blocked Saluki punt by Ray Robinson. ISU was able to mount a two-play, 43-yard drive capped by a one-yard run by Sha-ron Edwards for his first career touchdown in a Redbird uniform.

An interception by Cerone Colvin at the Redbird 19-yardline kept the Salukis from cutting into the 'Bird's 21-point lead and kept the score at 28-7 heading into the fourth quarter. Sha-ron Edwards put up another score with eight minutes left in the game when he rushed 10 yards to the right side of the endzone for the touchdown to put Illinois State up 35-7.

Redbirds Rally Against Indiana State. End Season with a 20-12

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. - Vito Golson and Quincy Washington each scored a touchdown in the final game of their careers to help the Illinois State football team come from behind to beat Indiana State, 20-12, Saturday in front of 2,652 people in frigid conditions at Memorial Stadium in Terre Haute, Ind.

The Redbirds spoiled the Sycamore's senior day with the victory and ended the season 6-5, 4-3 in the Gateway while Indiana State falls to 5-7 and 3-4 on the year. Golson ended the game with seven catches and 136 receiving yards while Washington rushed for 74 yards. It was Golson's fifth 100-yard receiving game under head coach Denver Johnson and his third of the year. Every member of the Redbird traveling team recorded playing time in the win.

A scoreless game through the first guarter, the Sycamores mped to an early six-point lead in the second when Soso Dede rushed for his second touchdown of the year, a three-yard scurry Indiana State kicker Mike Megyesi (22-26) couldn't connect on the extra point effort, missing his fourth PAT of the year.

Up by six, the Indiana State offense continued to take charge when QB Julian Reese connected with Chris Lewis on a five-yard pass at the 6:52 mark. Going for the two-point conversion, Reese's pass was intended for Tommy Signars in the endzone, but it sailed through his fingers, leaving the score at 12-0.

The Redbirds managed to get points on the board before the half after Stephen Carroll hit his 12th field goal of the year with 45 seconds on the clock. After two complete passes from Mike Souza to Golson for a gain of 29 yards, the 'Birds were in scoring position on the eight yard line but on the third down, Souza's pass in scoring territory was out of Golson's reach. Golson finished the season and his career with 29 consecutive games with a catch as Illinois State trailed 12-3 after 30 minutes of play.

Illinois State came back in the third to score its ninth TD of the year on the road. With five minutes left in the third quarter, a 25yard completion from Kevin Zouzounis, who replaced Souza, to Golson set up a 15-yard pass for the Redbirds, pulling Illinois State to within two of the Sycamores, 12-10, after Carroll scored the

The 'Birds got a break with 1:31 remaining in the third after a forced fumble on Reese by Stuart Sands was recovered by Illinois State's Mike Blough. As the time expired and the fourth quarter ensued, Washington pushed through the Sycamore line for a crucial first down and four plays later rushed for a seven-yard run at the 13-minute mark to give Illinois State its first lead of the game. It was Washington's 16th career TD and ninth of the

Up 17-12 after Carroll made good on his PAT, the score held until 4:26 was left on the clock and Carroll kicked a 32-vard field goal that helped secure the Redbird victory, cushioning the lead to 20-12. It was the third time this season the Redbirds have trailed at halftime and come back to win and the second road victory fo the 'Birds in 2002.

With the upset over the Sycamores, Illinois State guaranteed at least a .500 record for the fourth time in the last five years.
