This is also the first public appearance for the 'Birds after the annual Red-White Scrimmage was cancelled. This is also the exhibition opener for Missouri-St. Louis, which will also face St. Louis and SMS in exhibition games.

Series History: This is the second meeting between the two schools and the first as an exhibition. Illinois State leads the series 1-0, after a 105-60 win at Horton Field House on Jan. 15, 1979.

THE COACHES

Porter Moser (Creighton '90) owns a 64-53 (.547) career mark in his second season at Illinois State, including a 10-19 (.345) record with the Redbirds. Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Moser served three seasons at Arkansas-Little Rock in his first head coaching position. Moser is assisted by Chris Jans, Danyal Robinson and Brian Barone.

Chris Pilz (UMSL '91) is in his second season leading his alma mater. With the Rivermen, Pilz owns a 9-18 (.333) record, his first collegiate head coaching job. He is assisted by Deryn Carter and Chico Jones. Pilz was inducted into the UMSL Sports Hall of Fame in 2002 and ranks second all-time in points scored with 1,673 tallies.

ABOUT THE MISSOURI-ST. LOUIS RIVERMEN

- Missouri-St. Louis, located in St. Louis, Mo., was founded in 1963 and has an enrollment of 15,650. The Rivermen are members of the Great Lakes Valley Conference.
- The Rivermen return three players from a team that posted a 9-18 record a year ago, including leading scorer Jonathan Griffin, who averaged 18.4 points per game last season while starting in all 27 games.
- Other returnees include Ike Attah, a senior center who started in 21 games last season, and Sherome Cole, a junior who ranked fourth on the team in scoring with 6.5 points per game.
- UMSL lost nine letterwinners from the 2003-04 roster.
- The Rivermen ended the season on a six-game losing skid with an average margin of defeat of 19 points in those final six contests.
- On Dec. 1, 2003, UMSL downed Bellarmine 85-78 in overtime at Louisville, Ky. The very next night, Illinois State handed the Knights a 87-53 loss. Later in the season, UMSL swept Bellarmine with a 85-74 win in St. Louis.
- The Rivermen were 3-9 on the road last season with away victories at Bellarmine, Harris Stowe and UW-Parkside.
- UMSL has 10 newcomers on the squad this season, including six transfers.
- Two of the transfers are Chris Mroz and Joey Paul, who each played two seasons at Bradley.
- The Rivermen allowed their opponents to shoot 47.8 percent from the field last season, while being outrebounded by 3.2 boards per game.
- UMSL applied some defensive pressure a year ago and recorded 274 steals on the year, or 10.1 per game, while claiming a 2.7 advantage in the turnover margin.

LET'S GET THIS PARTY STARTED

The Illinois State basketball program has the dubious honor of opening up exhibition play for the Missouri Valley Conference. The Redbirds are the first of 10 league teams to take the court for the 2004-05 season with Northern Iowa and Bradley starting competition on Thursday night. The 'Birds will also be the first to start regular season play in the league, as Illinois State travels to the BCA Classic on Nov. 14.

... AND THE NEW HOME OF THE BRAVES

Even though Missouri-St. Louis has never played in Redbird Arena, a couple of Rivermen are very familiar with Illinois State's crown jewel. UMSL's Joey Paul and Chris Mroz are both in their first season with the Rivermen after playing two seasons for I-74 rival Bradley. Last season, in three games against the 'Birds, the former Brave duo combined for 29 minutes with no points and a 0-for-3 effort from the field. Paul started in the game at Redbird Arena, but was held scoreless in 21 minutes of action.

THE EARLY BIRD, GETS THE NITTANY LIONS?

If the basketball season seems to be starting a little earlier this season – that's because it is. Nov. 14 is the earliest the Redbirds have ever begun a basketball campaign, topping ISU's Nov. 15 start in 1998-99. Twice the 'Birds started the season on Nov. 16, including most recently the 2001-02 season.

THE THREE FACTOR

Illinois State's three seniors spend some time around the 3-point arc and it shows – especially in the Redbird record books. **Gregg Alexander** ranks No. 3 in career treys with 166, 48 behind the school mark owned by Tarise Bryson. **Trey Guidry** stands in a tie for the No. 6 spot with 149 triples, while **Vince Greene** is only 28 three-balls away from cracking the top 10. All three should also end their careers in the top 10 for career three-point field goal percentage.

THREE FOR A GRAND

Seniors **Gregg Alexander**, **Vince Greene** and **Trey Guidry** all have a legitimate shot of joining ISU's 1,000-point club. Guidry is the closest with 841 points in his collegiate career and he needs 237 tallies to score 1,000 in a Redbird uniform. Alexander has 821 career tallies, while Greene sits at 752 career points.



THE BAR HAS BEEN RAISED

This season, the Illinois State athletics department has been defending its home turf like a champion. Through nearly three months of competition, the football team boasts a 4-0 mark at Hancock Stadium, volleyball is riding a 17-game home winning streak and is 10-0 in Redbird Arena this year and the women's soccer team is 6-0-3 at Adelaide Street Field. The women's basketball team also got off to a 1-0 start at home claiming a win in its first exhibition game.

AIR NEDU TEMPORARILY GROUNDED

As a precautionary measure, head coach Porter Moser cancelled the annual Red-White Scrimmage last week when junior college transfer Nedu Onyeuku was shelved with a mild Achilles' tendon strain. Onyeuku has since returned to practice and he and his 40-inch-plus vertical jump should be ready for tonight's exhibition game.

HIGH FIVES ALL AROUND

Trey Guidry finished the 2003-04 season by dumping five three-pointers in two of the last four games. The Baton Rouge, La., native now has 10 games with five or more made treys in his career to his credit.

TOEING THE LINE

In the last two seasons the Redbirds have not done much toeing at the free throw line - only 940 times, to be exact. The two-year total is the lowest for the Redbirds since the 1973-74 and 1974-75 seasons when the 'Birds totaled 918 attempts over two years.

THE ROAD TO ABERRATION

The Redbirds are coming off their first ever back-to-back losing seasons since becoming a Division I program. Finishing with a sub-.500 winning percentage is a rarity at Illinois State. In fact, there have been only five losing campaigns in the Redbirds' 34 seasons of basketball at the Division I level.

142 GAMES WITH A TREY ON THE BOARD

ISU enters the 2004-05 season with at least one made three in 142 straight games. The last time ISU didn't sink a single trey was an 82-43 loss at Creighton on Dec. 12, 1999.

ANOTHER TREY FOR TREY

Holding true to his name, Trey Guidry is a long-range assassin. He finished last season with 86 three-pointers, which is the third highest single-season total in ISU history. Guidry averaged three treys a game, which tied for No. 26 nationally.

DILLY DELIGHT

Greg Dilligard had an instant impact with the Redbirds and led the team a year ago in field goal percentage. In the last 10 games of the season, Dilligard shot 28-for-35 (.800) from the field. He finished the season sinking shots at a 67.9 percent clip. He also was the team's leading offensive rebounder with 58 caroms and ranked second in blocked shots with 24. Dilligard also added 20 pounds to his frame in the off-season and looks to be a force inside for the Redbirds.

AT THE LINE, IT'S EASY BEING GREENE

Vince Greene finished last season without a missed free throw in the final 15 games and finds himself riding a free throw streak of historic proportions. Greene has made 44 straight free throws dating back to Jan. 18 against SMS where he secured the victory with three straight charity tosses. Along the way, Greene claimed the 48-year-old school record previously held by Gene Jontry, who had 35 straight free throws during the 1956-57 season. Greene's streak is the third longest in conference history, trailing only Blake Ahearn's (SMS) 60 consecutive and Marcus Wilson's (Evansville) 48 straight and tying James Gillingham's (Bradley) 44 consecutive makes.

MORE ON TREY'S TREYS

Trey Guidry finished the 2003-04 season ranked No. 5 nationally in 3-point accuracy. He converted the long-range bomb at a 46 percent clip, which ranks No. 5 for single season percentage in school history. He owns a 44.1 percentage during his Redbird career, which places him No. 3 all-time at ISU.

PRIZED PUPIL PLANK

Junior Neil Plank was named to the 2003-04 CoSIDA Academic All-District V University Men's Basketball Team and the 2004 Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete Second Team. Plank, a native of Mt. Zion, Ill., carries a 4.0 grade point average and is a double major in finance and insurance at Illinois State. At the 2004 State Farm Academic Excellence Banquet, Plank was recognized as Illinois State's Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Things Balance Out for Winning Redbirds

NORMAL, Ill. - Illinois State University's basketball team has spent more time on the bus than the Greyhound recently but the Redbirds came out smoking Monday night and whipped Missouri-St. Louis 105-60 before 3,000 people at Horton Field House.

The Redbirds shot 69 percent the first half and put all their starters in double scoring figures as they boosted their record to 11-4 and won their 29th straight at Horton.

"We've played three Division I teams and that's the best of the three," said Missouri-St. Louis coach Chuck Smith.

"We've played St. Louis, Drake, and Illinois State - all on the road." Illinois State spent the best part of Sunday riding a bus from Detroit. The Redbirds climb aboard again today and head for Evansville, Ind., and a Wednesday night game.

The Rivermen have had their travel problems too. They played in Chicago Saturday night and couldn't get out of the city until Monday. They arrived in Normal about 2:30 p.m. Monday and didn't have an opportunity to work out at Horton.

"We play hard and we mean well," continued Smith. "But Hubert Hoosman is our only returning starter and the rest of the kids are new.

"Illinois State has a fine club. They're well balanced, rebound well, and play reasonably good defense on the ball."

Illinois State coach Bob Donewald pointed that Missouri-St. Louis was just six points down at Drake at the half.

"We played well," said Donewald. "The defense coughed it up and we ran it.

"I think the key to our scoring 56 points in the first half was our defensive effort, not our offense. We did hit with regularity but our defense turned it over to us and took them out of their offense."

Missouri-St. Louis had 20 turnovers the first half and 32 total.

"Offensively, we executed very well," said Donewald. "They started with a diamond and two and all of our kids were very assertive in exploiting it. Then they went to a 1-3-1 zone."

Donewald was also pleased with the Redbirds' second-half start that had ISU going from a 56-29 lead to a 69-37 advantage in five minutes.
