Posted three double-doubles on the season, 22 points-10 assists vs. Arizona in the Regional Final; 15 points-10 assists vs. Nevada in the NCAA Tournament Second Round; and 11 points-12 assists vs. Penn State (Jan. 12) ... Totaled at least seven assists in 19 games ... Led the team and ranked fourth in the Big Ten in assist/turnover ratio (2.42) ... Third on the Illini with 68 three-pointers, averaging 1.7 treys per game ... Las Vegas Holiday Classic All-Tournament Team ... Scored a season-high 23 points vs. Longwood (Dec. 27) ... Made a seasonhigh five 3-pointers vs. Gonzaga (Nov. 27) and vs. Arizona (March 26) ... Tied career high in steals with four vs. Penn State (Jan. 12) ... 2003-2004 Sophomore: First-Team All-Big Ten selection by coaches and media ... Big Ten All-Tournament Team ... USBWA All-District 5 selection ... NABC Second-Team All-District 11 ... Led the Illini and ranked eighth in the Big Ten in scoring, averaging 14.0 points ... Just the third player in Big Ten history to lead the league in assists each of his first two seasons in the conference, joining Magic Johnson and Bruce

Douglas ... Season average of 6.17 assists ranks third in Illini history ... Broke the Illinois NCAA Tournament scoring record with career-high tying 31 points in second round win over Cincinnati ... Made 10-of-13 shots, including a careerhigh six 3-pointers against the Bearcats ... Set a career high with 31 points, making nine-of-18 shots, including five 3pointers, and career-best eight-of-eight shooting from the freethrow line, in win over Wisconsin on Feb. 18 ... Ranked second in the league with an assist/turnover ratio of 2.47 and sixth in 3-point shooting at 39.4 percent ... Also sixth in the Big Ten in 3-pointers per game with 2.23 avg. ... Recorded third career double-double with 16 points and 10 assists to help Illini clinch share of Big Ten title at Purdue on March 3 ... Scored 20 points and had seven assists in Big Ten Tournament quar-terfinal win over Indiana ... Recorded second career double-double with 19 points and career-high 11 assists in win at Minnesota on Feb. 8 ... Finished the regular season by scoring in double figures for 10 straight games, all Illini victories ... Missed three games in December after suffering a double jaw fracture against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 11 when he ran into a screen ... Came off the bench and led the Illini to come-from-behind win over Illinois State on Jan. 3 with 20 points, four rebounds and three assists in 34 minutes with his jaw still wired shut from the fracture ... Had a streak of 26 consecutive free throws broken at Penn State on Feb. 21 ...
