Illinois leads the all-time series 23-12, including a 16-8 advantage in Braggin' Rights games at St. Louis. Illinois carries a five-game winning streak over Missouri heading into Wednesday night's 25th anniversary showdown. The Illini posted an 86-81 overtime victory in 2000, a 72-61 win in 2001, an 85-70 win in 2002, a 71-70 win in 2003 and a 70-64 win last season.

Undefeated Illini

Illinois has the most victories of any team in the nation so far this season with 11 wins, and is one of just three teams to have reached double figures in victories along with Duke and Florida, who have 10 wins apiece. Illinois is one of only 15 teams in the country to boast a perfect record (through Dec. 18):

Another Strong Start for the Illini

The Illini have won their first 11 games for the second straight season with this year's 11-0 start, which also ties the sixth-best start in school history. Illinois set a school record by winning its first 29 games last season (see chart at bottom of page for Illinois' best all-time starts).

Braggin' Rights Notes

Illinois owns a 16-8 advantage over Missouri in Braggin' Rights games played in St. Louis ... Illinois won eight consecutive games from 1983-90 and won nine of the first 10 games played in St. Louis ... After Missouri won seven of nine games from 1991-99, Illinois has won the last five games in the series (2000-04) ... This is the eighth time that Illinois enters the Braggin' Rights game with an undefeated record. Illinois has won six of the previous seven games when entering in the Braggin' Rights game undefeated (wins in 1980, 1988, 1989, 1995, 2002 and 2004 and lone loss in 1981) ... This is the 16th time that Illinois has been ranked entering the Braggin' Rights game, and the eighth time the Illini have been ranked in the Top 10. Illinois is 12-3 when ranked in the Braggin' Rights game ... When the Braggin' Rights series began in St. Louis, Illinois'

Lou Henson and Missouri's Norm Stewart were in charge of their respective programs. Since then, every first-year coach has won his inaugural Braggin' Rights game. In 1996, Lon Kruger's first year at Illinois, the Illini won 85-69. In 1999, Quin Snyder's first year at Missouri, the Tigers won 78-72. In 2000, Bill Self's first year at Illinois, the Illini won 86-81 in overtime. And in 2003, in Bruce Weber's first year with the Illini, the UI won 71-70.

Illini Head Coach Bruce Weber

Bruce Weber has led the Fighting Illini to the top of the national charts in just his third season at the helm of the Illinois program. In addition to becoming the first coach in Big Ten history to lead his squad to outright Big Ten titles in each of his first two seasons, Weber had Illinois at No. 1 in the national polls the final 15 weeks of the 2004-05 season. He led the Illini to an NCAA record-tying 37 victories and the school's first appearance in the national championship game. The Illini success helped Weber be named National Coach of the Year by 10 different organizations. He came to Illinois following five years at Southern Illinois where he led the Salukis to Missouri Valley Conference titles each of his last two seasons.

Weber became just the third coach in Big Ten history to win an outright title in his first season in the league, leading the Illini to 10 straight victories to end the regular season and claim the title. He is also just the sixth coach in the conference since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference team in his first season.

In his five seasons at SIU, Weber took the Saluki program to the top of the MVC, winning league titles in 2002 and 2003. He posted records of 28-8 and 24-7 in his last two seasons, leading the Salukis to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances.

A 1978 graduate of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Weber spent 18 years as an assistant at Purdue under Gene Keady before moving to SIU.

He has helped teams make 19 NCAA Tournament appearances in 26 seasons as a collegiate coach, including one Final Four, one Elite Eight and four Sweet Sixteen appearances. Purdue won six Big Ten titles during his stop in West Lafayette.

Recapping Illini Wins in the Braggin' Rights Series

• 1980 - Illinois 84, #14 Missouri 62

Illinois posted its largest victory of the Braggin' Rights series – 22 points – in the first year of the now annual event in St. Louis. Eddie Johnson and Craig Tucker led the way with 20 points apiece as the Illini defeated the 14th-ranked Tigers. Illinois led by five at halftime, but outscored Mizzou 43-26 in the second half.

• 1983 - #20 Illinois 66, Missouri 60

No. 20 Illinois shot nearly 56 percent for the game to reclaim the trophy from Missouri with a 66-60 victory. Efrem Winters tallied 20 points and eight rebounds while George Montgomery added 15 points, nine boards and five assists. Illinois led 60-58 with 19 seconds left when Bruce Douglas made a pair of free throws for a four-point lead. Doug Altenberger then drew a charge with :12 remaining to give the Illini the ball back and seal the victory. This began a string of eight consecutive Braggin' Rights wins for the Illini.

• 1984 - #7 Illinois 65, Missouri 50

7th-ranked Illinois jumped out early and never looked back in securing a 15-point victory. The Illini led 38-19 at halftime. Four Illini scored in double figures with Anthony Welch and Bruce Douglas scoring 12 points each and George Montgomery and Doug Altenberger adding 10 apiece.

• 1985 – #15 Illinois 67, Missouri 55

Ken "Snake" Norman notched the first Illini double-double of the Braggin' Rights series with 22 points and 10 rebounds as No. 15 Illinois won its third in a row over Missouri. Norman made 8-of-10 field goals and added six free throws en route to his 22 points while Anthony Welch contributed 16 points and eight rebounds.

• 1986 - #9 Illinois 92, Missouri 74

The ninth-ranked Illini recorded its fourth win in row over Missouri, 92-74. The 18-point margin stands as the second largest margin of victory for the Illini in the Braggin' Rights series. Ken Norman had another double-double with 24 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Tony Wysinger also came up big with 18 points and seven assists. Illinois scored the final eight points of the first half to take a 41-30 lead into halftime and never looked back.

• 1987 - Illinois 75, #17 Missouri 63

The Illini shot 50 percent from the game, scoring 31 baskets – all 2-pointers – and outrebounded Missouri 46-33 to post its fifth straight win in the series over the 17th-ranked Tigers. Nick Anderson came off the bench to record a doubledouble with game-highs of 18 points and 11 rebounds while running-mate Kenny Battle chipped in 15 points and eight boards. Kendall Gill put an exclamation point on the win with a thunderous dunk in traffic with 2:49 left.

• 1988 - #5 Illinois 87, #10 Missouri 84

No. 5 Illinois extended the Braggin' Rights streak to six in a row with a furious come-frombehind win over No. 10 Missouri. The "Flyin' Illini" found themselves down by 18 points late in the first half. They then stormed back, and a 3-pointer by Marcus Liberty gave Illinois its first lead of the game at 54-52 with 11:15 remaining. The Illini took a four-point lead on a 3-point play by Kenny Battle with 2:25 remaining. But Mizzou then took an 84-83 lead on a dunk by Doug Smith with one minute to go. Kenny Battle made two crucial free throws with 26 seconds left to give Illinois an 85-84 lead. Mizzou turned it over on its next possession and Larry Smith's lay-up with four seconds left wrapped up the win. Battle scored 19 of his game-high 28 points in the second half, while Lowell Hamilton added 21 points for the Illini.

• 1989 – #5 Illinois 101, #4 Missouri 93

The 1989 game featured both teams ranked in the Top-5 nationally, with the fifth-ranked Illini defeating No. 4 Missouri 101-93, marking Illinois' seventh win in a row over the Tigers. The Illini shot 53 percent from the field and had five players net double figures, led by 26 points from Marcus Liberty on 8-of-12 shooting. Kendall Gill scored 25 points and Andy Kaufmann added 16. Guard Stephen Bardo recorded a double-double with 10 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. The Illini also got a big lift from center Ervin Small, who came off the bench to score 13 points and record six steals.

• 1990 - Illinois 84, Missouri 81

The 1990 Braggin' Rights game became a shootout between Illinois' Andy Kaufmann and Missouri's Doug Smith. And Kaufmann got the upper hand in leading Illinois' "Young Guns" to its eighth straight win in the series, 84-81. Kaufmann scored a series-record 33 points for the Illini, making 11-of-23 shots. Twenty-one of his 33 points came from behind the arc, as Kaufmann nailed 7of-14 three-pointers. While Kaufmann was the Illini star, Deon Thomas was just as important, scoring 23 points with eight rebounds and four blocks. The game was back-and-forth throughout the second half. Illinois went ahead 79-73 on a Larry Smith breakaway with 2:28 left. Missouri cut it to two with under 30 seconds to play on a 3pointer, but Tom Michael made one free throw with :15 left to make it a 3-point game. Missouri missed a pair of potential game-tying 3-pointers in the final 10 seconds.

• 1995 – #14 Illinois 96, #15 Missouri 85 (OT)

No. 14 Illinois improved to 8-0 on the season, defeating No. 15 Missouri in overtime in Lou Henson's final Braggin' Rights game. The UI win snapped a four-year Missouri winning streak. Six of the nine Illini players who entered the game scored in double figures, led by Kiwane Garris' 23 points. Garris shot just 4-of-17 from the field, but connected on 15-of-16 free throws. The Illini were up by as many as 10 in the second half before Missouri came back. The game was tied at 75-all when MU's Corey Tate missed a pair of free throws with :37 left. Garris then had his potential game-winning layup blocked by Julian Winfield, forcing OT. Jerry Hester became the Illini spark, hitting a pair of 3pointers and putting the finishing touches on the win with a dunk at the end as Illinois outscored Mizzou 21-10 in the overtime period.

• 1996 - Illinois 85, Missouri 69

Defense was the difference as Illinois rolled to an 85-69 win in Lon Kruger's first Braggin' Rights game. The Illini used an aggressive, fullcourt press to grab 12 steals and help force Missouri into 27 turnovers on the night. Kiwane Garris was one of four Illini in double figures, scoring 15 to go along with 14 points apiece from Chris Gandy and Bryant Notree.

• 2000 - #5 Illinois 86, Missouri 81 (OT)

5th-ranked Illinois ended its three-year losing streak to Missouri by defeating Tigers 86-81 in overtime in Bill Self's first Braggin' Rights game. Brian Cook scored a game-high 25 points, 23 of which came in the first half, and was one of four Illini to finish in double figures. Frank Williams scored 14 of his 18 points in the second half and overtime. Williams twice tied the game in the final 1:30 on consecutive baskets, forcing overtime. His 3-point play with two minutes left in overtime gave the Illini a seven-point advantage and secured the win.

• 2001 - #9 Illinois 72, #8 Missouri 61

Anticipation for the 2001 Braggin' Rights game was at an all-time high, with both teams ranked in the Top-10 nationally. Illinois shot 50 percent for the game and held Mizzou to just 36 percent shooting, including 26 percent from 3point range. Frank Williams scored 16 of his 22 points in the second half, which included a stretch of four straight field goals, to lead the Illini to victory. Illinois made 8-of-10 free throws in the final 1:08 to secure the win.

• 2002 - #12 Illinois 85, #11 Missouri 70

In the most recent Braggin' Rights meeting of undefeated teams, No. 12 Illini remained unbeaten on the year with an 85-70 win over No. 11 Missouri, making it three in a row over the Tigers. Dee Brown scored a game-high 21 points and had seven assists, while Brian Cook added 17 points, nine rebounds and five assists. The Illini shot 45 percent, held Missouri to 37.7 percent shooting, and outrebounded the Tigers 42-32.

• 2003 - #21 Illinois 71, #11 Missouri 70

Bruce Weber became the third straight Illini coach to win his inaugural Braggin' Rights game, leading the Illini to its fourth consecutive win in the series. Dee Brown scored 18 points and had six assists and six rebounds, while James Augustine added a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Illinois never trailed in the game after a red-hot start, leading by as many as 21 points in the first half. But Missouri chipped away at that lead in the second half, tying it at 67-all with 1:30 remaining on a 3-pointer by Travon Bryant. Nick Smith then fed Augustine for a go-ahead lay-up with :57 left. On the ensuing possession, Smith stole a pass to give the Illini the ball back. After missing two free throws, Dee Brown got his own offensive rebound and this time made a pair of free throws with :18 left to make it a four-point game. A 3-pointer by Missouri's Jimmy McKinney with four-tenths of a second left made the final margin one point.

• 2004 - #1 Illinois 70, Missouri 64

Top-ranked Illinois kept its perfect start in tact, improving to 11-0 with its fifth consecutive Braggin' Rights win over Missouri. The Illini led by 15 points at halftime before Mizzou made a comeback, cutting the UI lead to as few as four points. But Illinois made 11-of-12 from the free throw line down the stretch to win by six in its first game of the season decided by single digits. Luther Head scored 20 points and Deron Williams added 19 points and five assists to lead the Illini.

Top Illini Performers in the Braggin' Rights Series

Eddie Johnson – Scored game-high 20 points and had seven rebounds in his lone Braggin' Rights game in 1980, an Illini victory.

Craig Tucker – Totaled 43 points (21.5 avg.) in two Braggin' Rights games, with game-high 20 points in 1980 game and team-high 23 points in 1981 game.

Efrem Winters – Had game-high 20 points and eight rebounds in 1983 game, and nine points and gamehigh nine boards in 1984 game. Averaged 10.4 points and 6.3 rebounds in three Braggin' Rights games, all Illini victories.

George Montgomery – Had 15 points and game-high nine rebounds in 1983 game and 10 points and five rebounds in 1984 game. Averaged 12.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in his two Braggin' Rights appearances, both UI wins.

Anthony Welch – Tallied 12 points and game-high nine rebounds in 1984 game, and had 16 points and eight rebounds in 1985 game. Averaged 14 points and 8.5 rebounds in two Braggin' Rights wins.

Ken Norman – Had back-to-back double-doubles with game-highs of 22 points and 10 rebounds in 1985 game, and team-high 24 points with game-high 12 rebounds in 1986 game. His 8-of-10 shooting in the '85 game is the best field goal percentage (.800) by an Illini player in the series, and his 12 boards in the '86 game are tied for most rebounds by a UI player in the series. Averaged 16 points and 7.3 rebounds in three Braggin' Rights games, all UI wins.

Kenny Battle – Had 15 points, eight rebounds and two steals in 1987 game and game-high 28 points with six rebounds and game-high four steals in 1988 game. Averaged 21.5 points, seven rebounds and three steals in two Braggin' Rights wins.

Nick Anderson – Had double-double with gamehighs of 18 points and 11 rebounds in 1987 game, and had eight points and game-high 10 rebounds in 1988 game. Averaged 13 points and 10.5 rebounds in two Braggin' Rights wins.

Lowell Hamilton – Totaled 40 points (10.0 avg.) in four Braggin' Rights games from 1985-88, all Illini wins. Scored 21 points in 1988 game. Andy Kaufmann – Scored 68 points in three Braggin' Rights games. Average of 22.7 ppg is the best by an Illini player in the series. Scored 16 points in 1989 game. Had game-high 33 points in 1990 game, the highest point total in the series. Made 11-of-23 field goals, including 7-of-14 three-pointers in '90, all highest totals by UI player. Also had eight rebounds, gamehigh seven assists and two steals to go along with his 33 points in 1990 game, which is arguably the finest performance by an Illini player in the Braggin' Rights series. Had game-high 19 points in 1992 game.

Kendall Gill – Scored in double figures in three of four Braggin' Rights games, all UI wins, with 10 points in 1987 game, 11 points in 1988 game and 25 points in 1989 game. Totaled 54 points in four games, an average of 13.5 ppg.

Marcus Liberty – Totaled 35 points in two games (17.5 average), both Illini wins. Had nine points off the bench in 1988 and scored a game-high 26 points on 8-of-12 shooting with nine rebounds in 1989 game.

Deon Thomas – Illinois' all-time leading rebounder in the Braggin' Rights series with 37 rebounds. Averaged 17.8 points (71 total) and 9.3 rebounds per game for the series, scoring in double figures all four years. Had 23 points, eight rebounds and four blocks in 1990 game, double-double of 12 points and a game-high 10 rebounds in 1991 game, another double-double with 17 points and game-high 11 rebounds in 1992 game, and 19 points and eight rebounds in 1993 game.

Shelly Clark – Averaged 16 points and 8.5 rebounds in a pair of Braggin' Rights games. Had a double-double with 17 points and game-high 10 rebounds in 1993 and had 15 points and seven boards in 1994.

Kiwane Garris – Illinois' all-time leading scorer in the Braggin' Rights series with 79 points. Averaged 19.8 points, 5.3 rebounds and 6.8 assists in four games. Scored game-high 31 points with seven rebounds and six assists in 1993. Had 23 points with eight rebounds and eight assists in 1995, and had 15 points with nine assists in 1996. His nine assists in '96 are the most by a UI player in the series.

Richard Keene – Totaled 52 points in four Braggin' Rights games, an average of 13 ppg. Scored in double figures in three of four games. Best game came as a senior in 1995 when he had 14 points, seven rebounds, seven assists and two steals.

Kevin Turner – Totaled 36 points in three Braggin' Rights games, scoring in double figures in two of three games. Had 12 points in 1995 game, and had 17 points and six rebounds in 1997 game. Illini won two of the three games he played in.

Cory Bradford – Scored 51 points in four Braggin' Rights games, averaging 12.8 ppg. Had a game-high 17 points in 1998 game, and led the Illini with 19 points in 1999 game.

Marcus Griffin - Scored in double figures in both Braggin' Rights games he participated in, with 14 points in 1999 and a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds in 2000. Averaged 12 points and 7.0 rebounds in the series.

Frank Williams - Scored 51 points in three Braggin' Rights games, an average of 17.0 points. Reached double figures all three years, with 11 points in 1999, 18 points and game-high five assists in 2000, and gamehigh 22 points with four assists and three steals in 2001. Illini won two of the three games he played in.

Brian Cook – Averaged 14.8 points and 7.3 rebounds in the Braggin' Rights series. Had a double-double with a game-high 25 points and 11 rebounds in 2000, 12 points with eight rebounds in 2001, and 17 points with a game-high nine rebounds in 2002. Three of the four games he played in were Illini wins.

Luther Head – Totaled 47 points in four Braggin' Rights games (11.8 avg.), all UI victories. Had 10 points off the bench in 2002, and led Illini with teamhigh 20 points in 2004, along with seven rebounds and four steals.

Deron Williams – Averaged 13.5 points in pair of Illini wins in 2002 and 2004 (did not play due to broken jaw in 2003). Had 19 points and five assists in 2004 game.

Dee Brown – Has scored 50 points (16.7 average) in three Braggin' Rights games, all Illini victories. Scored a game-high 21 points with seven assists in 2002, had 18 points with six assists and six rebounds in 2003, and had 11 points, five assists and three steals last year. Averaging 6.0 assists in series.

Illini Headlines

• Illinois has the most victories of any team in the nation so far this season with 11 wins, and is one of 15 teams in the country to boast a perfect record (through Dec. 18).

• Illinois has tied its sixth-best start in school history at 11-0, and has won its first 11 games for the second straight year. The Illini won a school-record 29 games to start last season.

• Illinois has won 50 of its last 51 games during the regular season.

• Illinois owns the nation's third-longest homecourt winning streak at 27 games.

• Illinois has the nation's second-longest nonconference homecourt winning streak at 44 games.

• Illinois is 84-3 (.966) at the Assembly Hall over the last six-plus seasons, the best home mark in the nation over this time period.

• Illinois is the second-winningest team in the nation over the past five-plus seasons. Illinois has won 152 games since the beginning of the 2000-01 season, which trails only Duke (160).

• Bruce Weber is the winnningest coach in the nation over the past four-plus seasons. Since the beginning of the 2001-02 season, Weber has won 126 games, recording 52 wins in his final two years at Southern Illinois and 74 wins in his first two-plus years at Illinois. He leads Duke's Mike Krzyzewski by one win over this time period.

• Illinois and Duke are the only two schools in the nation to win at least 25 games each of the last five seasons.

• Dee Brown recorded his 1,500th career point vs. Coppin State on Sunday, becoming the eighth player in UI history to reach that milestone.

• Dee Brown and James Augustine have each played in 99 wins during their respective careers, tied for fourth on the UI career wins chart. The Illinois record for wins (played in) is 110 by Nick Smith (2002-05).

• Illinois' opponents are averaging just 56.2 points on 40 percent shooting on the season. The Illini rank second in the Big Ten in scoring defense, field goal percentage defense and scoring margin (+16.7).

Illinois is outrebounding its opponents by an

average of 8.8 boards per game. The Illini rank second in the Big Ten and 20th in the nation in rebounding margin and have outrebounded 10 of their 11 opponents on the year.

• Illinois has played 60 consecutive games while ranked in the Top 25.

• Illinois sold out of season tickets for the entire season for the second year in a row and third time in the last five years. The Illini have played in front of 18 consecutive sell-out crowds at the Assembly Hall.

Last Time Out: Coppin State

Illinois won its 27th consecutive game at the Assembly Hall and its 44th straight nonconference home game, improving to 11-0 on the year with a 61-42 victory over Coppin State on Sunday. CSU employed a zone defense and ran the shot clock down on offense throughout the game to slow the pace and limit Illinois' possessions. The Illini jumped out to a 24-7 lead but Coppin State chipped away, cutting it to seven points at 29-22 five minutes into the second half. Illinois then went on a 10-2 run to take a comfortable 39-24 advantage and led by double digits the rest of the way.

James Augustine led the Illini with 15 points and nine rebounds while Jamar Smith also finished in double figures, scoring 10 off the bench.

Illinois held Coppin State to just 34 percent shooting (17-50), and CSU's 42 points were the fewest by a UI opponent this season and the second fewest by an opponent during the Weber era at Illinois – the lowest since Penn State scored 37 in an 80-37 loss at the Assembly Hall on Jan. 21, 2004.

Home Cookin'

Illinois carries a 27-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall, which ranks third in the nation among active homecourt winning streaks ... The Illini have also won 44 in a row at the Assembly Hall against non-conference opponents, which ranks second nationally behind Oklahoma (45, plays next at home on Dec. 22) ... Illinois is 72-2 (.973) at the Assembly Hall over the last five-plus years, with the only losses coming to Michigan State on Feb. 3, 2002 and to Purdue on Jan. 10, 2004 ... The Boilermakers broke a 23-game Illini winning streak at the Hall that at the time ranked fourth in the nation ... Illinois is 84-3 (.966) at the Assembly Hall over the past six-plus seasons, the best home mark in the nation over that period ... Brown Eclipses 1,500 Career Points

Dee Brown scored his 1,500th point against Coppin State on Sunday, becoming the eighth player in Illinois history to reach that milestone. Brown currently stands eighth on the UI career scoring list with 1,503 points, which is also the most career points of any current Big Ten player.

Augustine and Brown Record 99th Career Win

Sunday's win over Coppin State marked the 99th career victory that seniors James Augustine and

Dee Brown have played in during their UI tenure. They are tied for fourth on the school career wins chart with Sean Harrington (2000-03) and Doug Altenberger (1983-87). The school record for career wins (played in) is 110 by Nick Smith (2002-05).

Doing it with Defense

At the beginning of the season, Bruce Weber challenged his team to build its identity and reputation on defense. Illinois has responded, using defense to spur its 11-0 start. Opponents are averaging just 56.2 points on 40 percent shooting for the season. The Illini have not given up more than 65 points in any game, with eight of the 11 opponents scoring under 60. Illinois has also not had an opponent shoot 50 percent in a game this season, and only three teams have shot better than 45 percent.

has reached double figures in 10 of 11 games, and tied his career high with 23 points in the win over Xavier on Dec. 3. Augustine had a nine-game streak of scoring in double figures – the longest stretch of games scoring in double figures of his career – come to an end vs. Oregon on Dec. 10 when he finished with eight points.

The leading career field goal percentage shooter in Illinois history, Augustine has made 62.8 percent of his shots this season (59-94), which ranks 26th in the NCAA (as of Dec. 12). He has shot 50 percent or better in 10 of 11 games, highlighted by a pair of 7-9 performances vs. Rutgers (Nov. 26) and Xavier (Dec. 3).

In addition to his increased scoring, Augustine has remained the Illini's top rebounder and has increased his production in that category as well. He is averaging 9.5 boards per game this season to lead the team and rank second in the Big Ten and 37th nationally (as of Dec. 12). Augustine averaged 7.6 rpg last year and entered his senior season with a career average of 7.0 rebounds.

Augustine has four double-doubles on the season with 18 pts.-14 reb. vs. South Dakota State (Nov. 18), 14 pts.-10 reb. vs. Wichita State (Nov. 25), 13 pts.-13 reb. vs. North Carolina (Nov. 29) and 10 pts.-13 reb. vs. Georgetown (Dec. 8).

Dee Does it All

Dee Brown, the "one-man fast break", is doing it all for the Illini this season now that his former running mates Deron Williams and Luther Head are in the NBA. Brown boasts a career-best scoring average of 14.6 ppg to lead the team, and he has been Illinois' leading scorer in six of 11 games. He has reached double figures eight times, with three games of 20 or more points.

Brown erupted for a season-high 26 points in

the win at Oregon on Dec. 10, falling just one point of his career high. It marked the most points by a UI player this season and the most by an Illini since Brown set his career high with 27 points vs. Purdue last season (March 3, 2005). Brown made 9-15 shots against the Ducks, including 5-8 from 3-point range. His nine field goals are the most baskets in a game by a UI player this year.

Brown's presence can be felt all over the court, as he leads the Illini in five total categories: points (14.6 ppg), minutes (33.7 mpg), assists (5.2 apg), steals (1.6 spg) and free throw percentage (29-39, .744). Brown had a season-high 10 assists vs. Arkansas-Little Rock on Dec. 5, which ties the most assists by a Big Ten player this year.

Jamar "The Microwave" Smith Gives Illini Instant Offense

True-freshman shooting guard Jamar Smith has given the Illini instant offense off the bench. Despite playing just under 20 minutes per game, Smith is third on the team in scoring, averaging double figures at 10.0 points per game in a reserve role. He is shooting over 54 percent from the field and leads the team and ranks sixth in the NCAA (as of Dec. 12) in 3-point field goal shooting at 54.9 percent (28-51) while knocking down a team-leading 28 treys, which is also the most 3pointers by a freshman in the NCAA.

Smith's coming out party occurred during Illinois' victory over Arkansas-Little Rock on Dec. 5. He scored a career-high 23 points, connecting on 8-10 from the field, including 6-8 from 3-point range. His 75 percent shooting from behind the arc vs. Ark.-Little Rock ranks as the best 3-point field goal shooting performance by a Big Ten player this season. On the season, Smith has scored at least nine points in nine of 11 games.

Randle Hitting Stride

After redshirting last season due to a broken hand, sophomore Brian Randle is back in the UI lineup and has had a pair of breakout performances recently. Randle scored a career-high 16 points against Rutgers on Nov. 26, shooting 6-8 from the field. He then had 12 points on 4-5 shooting against North Carolina on Nov. 29. He came up huge in the clutch, scoring in traffic with 1:06 remaining to give Illinois a 66-62 lead after the team had gone scoreless for five-and-a-half minutes. Randle had 11 points on 5-7 shooting and six rebounds vs. Arkansas-Little Rock (Dec. 5). and had nine points and seven boards in his most recent outing vs. Oregon on Dec. 10. Randle did not play vs. Coppin State on Sunday due to a sprained ankle.

Randle started the first 10 games of the season prior to his injury. He is fifth on the team in scoring, averaging 8.4 points while shooting 56.5 percent from the field (35-62). He is also third on

the team in rebounding at 5.2 rpg and leads the Illini with seven blocks.

McBride Showcases All-Around Game

Rich McBride was known as a three-point specialist in his first two seasons with the Illini. Now that he has moved from a reserve role to a starter, McBride has strengthened other parts of his game. He worked hard over the summer to improve his conditioning and is now playing more than 29 minutes per game and has earned a reputation as one of the team's top perimeter defenders. He is still a threat from behind the arc, ranking second on the team with 27 treys. Most impressive has been McBride's ability to take care of the basketball. He is second on the team in assists with 28 and has just 13 turnovers, good for an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.15.

Illini Nation's Second-Winningest Team over Past Five-Plus Seasons

Illinois ranks as the second-winningest team in the nation over the past five-plus seasons in terms of total wins, and ranks third nationally over that same time span in terms of winning percentage. Illinois has reeled off 152 victories since the beginning of the 2000-01 season, which trails only Duke. Illinois' .822 winning percentage over that same time period trails just Duke and Gonzaga. Augustine Named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week

James Augustine was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 5. He recorded a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds at North Carolina on Nov. 29 as Illinois recorded its first road victory of the season with a win at Chapel Hill. He added three assists and three steals against UNC. Augustine then equaled his career high in scoring in the win over Xavier on Dec. 3, erupting for 23 points. He was 7-of-9 from the field in the victory, while adding a game-high seven rebounds and two steals. For the week, Augustine averaged a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds on a combined 73.3 percent shooting (11-of-15).

It marked the third career Big Ten weekly accolade for Augustine, as he was also honored twice last season (Jan. 10 and Jan. 31). He shared the award with Indiana's Marco Killingsworth.

Chicagoans Brown and Augustine Finish Careers Undefeated at United Center

Illinois' victory over Xavier on Dec. 3 marked the final United Center appearance for a pair of Chicagoland products on the Illini roster in seniors Dee Brown and James Augustine. The duo never lost a game at the UC, finishing their fouryear careers with a perfect 12-0 record.

Illinois Does Its Part in Big Ten/ACC Challenge

The ACC won the 2005 Big Ten/ACC Challenge by a narrow 6-5 margin. But the Illini represented the Big Ten Conference well, posting a 68-64 victory over North Carolina at Chapel Hill on Nov. 29 to become the only Big Ten squad to win on the road in this year's Challenge.

Augustine Named MVP of South Padre Island Invitational

Senior James Augustine was named Most Valuable Player of the South Padre Island Invitational on Nov. 26. Augustine averaged 14.8 points and 7.5 rebounds over the course of the four-game tournament, while shooting 65 percent from the field. He had 18 points on 7-9 shooting in the championship game vs. Rutgers, and recorded a double-double vs. Wichita State with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Augustine also tied his career high in assists with four against the Shockers.

Brown and McBride Named to South Padre Island All-Tournament Team

In addition to James Augustine bringing home the MVP trophy from South Padre Island, guards Dee Brown and Rich McBride were named to the All-Tournament Team. Brown averaged 13 points, 4.3 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.0 steals during the tournament. His best game came against Texas-Pan American where he scored 20 points while tying his career high with seven rebounds, along with tallying four assists and four steals.

McBride was Illinois' best perimeter defender during the tournament while also averaging 9.8 ppg. In the four games, he dished out a combined 14 assists while turning the ball over just three

times.

Augustine Joins 1,000-Point Club

Senior James Augustine became the 40th player in Illinois history to record 1,000 career points when he scored his 1,000th point against Rutgers on Nov. 26. He joins Dee Brown as current UI players in the 1,000-point club. Brown scored his 1,000th point last season against Cincinnati (Dec. 31, 2004) and currently ranks eighth in school history with 1,503 career points, while Augustine ranks 37th with 1,092 career points.

Orange Krush Donates \$50,000 to Jimmy V Foundation

Illinois student section, "Orange Krush" is a charity foundation in addition to a cheering section, donating thousands of dollars each year to the community, University and students. During the past season, the Orange Krush Foundation raised and donated \$400,000 for charity to bring its seven-year total to \$1 million. Orange Krush donated \$350,000 to the University and 35 local charities at its annual check presentation ceremony this past October, and donated \$50,000 to the V Foundation for Cancer Research Dec. 8 during halftime of the game vs. Georgetown.

Orange Krush is almost entirely student run and is based on the 3-point program. Students must solicit pledges from the alumni and community in order to gain entry into Orange Krush. In addition to supporting countless charities over the past seven years, the Orange Krush Foundation has created two endowments. Two years ago the Orange Krush formed the Rod Cardinal Sports Medicine Fund honoring Rod Cardinal, who was Illinois men's basketball athletic trainer for 30 years. This endowment benefits all student-trainers at the University of Illinois. This was the second endowment formed by Orange Krush. The first was the Matthew Heldman Memorial Scholarship Fund, which endows a scholarship for an Illini basketball player. The scholarship honors the late Matt Heldman, point guard for the 1997-98 Big Ten Championship Team, who was tragically killed in a car accident in 1999.

Brown Preseason Player of the Year Candidate

Illinois senior guard Dee Brown is the first Illini player to ever be named preseason All-American by the *Associated Press*, and is a preseason Wooden Award, Naismith Award and Oscar Robertson Award candidate. He is also on the preseason Playboy Magazine All-America team for the second time. Brown earned Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year honors for the second time in his career (also prior to the 2004 season). Illinois has had the Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year for each of the last six seasons (2001-Cory Bradford; 2002-Frank Williams; 2003-Brian Cook; 2004-Dee Brown; 2005-Deron Williams; 2006-Dee Brown).

A Look Back at the Fighting Illini's Magical 2004-05 Season

Illinois recorded its best season in school history in 2004-05. The Illini tied the NCAA record for wins with 37 en route to a 37-2 overall record. The UI made its first Final Four appearance since 1989 and advanced to the NCAA Championship game for the first time in school history, finishing as the national runner-up. The Illini were ranked No. 1 in the nation for 15 straight weeks, including a first-ever No. 1 ranking in the final Associated Press poll. Illinois reeled off 29 straight wins to start the season and secured its second straight outright Big Ten championship with a 15-1 league record as Bruce Weber became the first coach in the 100-year history of Big Ten basketball to win consecutive outright titles in his first two seasons. The Illini also added the Big Ten Tournament title in addition to the regular season crown.

Weber Nation's Winningest Coach over the Last Four Seasons

Bruce Weber has coached consistent winners everywhere he's been throughout his college career. In fact, over the past four seasons no head coach in America has more wins on his resume than Weber. Beginning with the 2001-02 season and entering the 2005-06 season, Weber recorded 115 victories, which tied with Mike Krzyzewski and Roy Williams for the most wins by an NCAA Div. I over the past four years. In his final two years at Southern Illinois, Weber went 28-8 in 2001-02 and 24-7 in 2002-03. He then took over the Illinois program, leading the Illini to a 26-7 record in 2003-04 and a 37-2 mark in 2004-05.

Illini Unveil New Starting Lineup

With the departure of three starters from last year, Illinois had a new starting lineup for the season opening win over South Dakota State, marking the UI's first starting lineup change since the 2004 Big Ten Tournament Championship game. Dee Brown, Deron Williams, Luther Head, Roger Powell and James Augustine were all in the same starting lineup for a school-record streak of 42 consecutive games, which included all 39 games of the 2004-05 season.

Illini Reach 25-Win Marker for Fifth Straight Season in 2005

The 2005 season marked the fifth straight year that the Illini recorded at least 25 wins. Illinois and Duke are the only teams in the nation to accomplish this feat in each of the last five seasons (beginning in 2000-01). Duke has won at least 25 games each of the past eight seasons.

With a combined record of 152-33 (.822) over the last five-plus years, this marks Illinois' winningest stretch over that time period in school history.

Big Ten Road Success

It took a total of just 13 conference road games in just his second season for Bruce Weber's Illini to win at every Big Ten arena. Illinois won at Indiana, Iowa, Minnesota, Ohio State, Penn State and Purdue in 2004 and completed the conference run with wins at Northwestern, Wisconsin, Michigan State and Michigan in 2005.

Weber is just one of two current coaches in the Big Ten to win at every opposing arena – joining Michigan State's Tom Izzo. Weber has accomplished the feat the fastest. Below is a breakdown of how long it took the two to win at every arena.

Quick Shots

• Illinois spent 15-straight weeks at the top of the national polls during the 2004-05 season, easily the longest streak in school history, and the longest such streak in the nation since Kansas also spent 15-straight weeks at No. 1 in 1996-97. It was the third year in school history (1952 and 1989) that the Illini were ranked No. 1 in the nation.

• Illinois' 27-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall is the third-longest current homecourt streak in the nation (behind Washington and Gonzaga). The Illini wrapped up their third undefeated season at the Assembly Hall in the last five years with a 15-0 record last year. Illinois also went undefeated at home in 2000-01 (12-0) and 2002-03 (14-0). Illinois has the best homecourt record in the nation over the past six-plus years at 84-3 (.966).

• Illinois has led the Big Ten in scoring each of the last five seasons. The Illini led the Big Ten in scoring with an average of 75.9 points per conference game.

• More fans saw Illinois play in person during the 2004-05 season than any other school. Including the postseason, the Illini were seen by a total of 711,798 fans across the country. During the NCAA tournament alone, 196,065 fans watched the Illini advance to the national championship game. In home games, the Illini finished seventh in the nation with an average of 16,387 fans per game.

Brown Sixth-Straight Illini Chosen Preseason Player of the Year Pick

Senior guard Dee Brown became the sixth consecutive Fighting Illini player to earn Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year honors, the second time he has earned the distinction. The streak began in 2000 with Cory Bradford and followed with Frank Williams, Brian Cook, Brown, Deron Williams and Brown again this season. Cook went on to win the postseason award, while Frank Williams and Deron Williams earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors. Brown earned Big Ten Player of the Year honors following the 2005 season.

Illinois Begins Season in the Top 25

Illinois began the 2005-06 season ranked No. 17 in both the Preseason ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and Associated Press Poll, the sixth time in the last seven years they've been in the preseason Top 25. The Illini have played 60 straight games ranked in the Top 25. Illinois is currently ranked No. 8 in the Coaches Poll and 9 in the AP poll.

Randle Returns after Redshirt

Redshirt-sophomore forward Brian Randle used the 2004-05 season as a medical redshirt season after suffering a broken left hand in practice on Nov. 10, 2004. Randle started nine games as a true freshman in 2004, averaging 2.7 points and 2.3 rebounds on the season. As Illinois' most athletic player, Randle has shown great defensive ability and is a great finisher around the basket.

#25 Re-emerges on Brock's Back

Illinois redshirt freshman Calvin Brock is donning No. 25 on his uniform this season, continuing a tradition of Chicago Simeon players wearing the number when at Illinois. Nick Anderson (1988-89), Deon Thomas (1991-94), Bryant Notree (1995-97) and Brock have worn No. 25 in honor of former Simeon star Ben Wilson, who was tragically shot and killed prior to his senior year of high school.

Hot Ticket to Watch the Illini at the Hall For the second year in a row, and third time in the last five years, Illinois sold out of season tickets for the season, making it again one of the hottest tickets in program history. The Illini have played in front of a current streak of 18 consecutive sellout crowds at the Assembly Hall.

New Faces on the Roster

• Arnold Eligible After Transferring From Illinois State: Marcus Arnold, a 6-8 forward/center from Chicago, transferred to Illinois from Illinois State in the summer of 2004 and is eligible after sitting out the 2004-05 season per NCAA transfer rules. He begins the 2005-06 season with junior eligibility.

• Meacham Transfers From Dayton: Trent Meacham, a 6-2 point guard from Champaign, transferred to Illinois from Dayton in the summer of 2005 and will sit out the 2005-06 season per NCAA transfer rules. He will begin the 2006-07 season with sophomore eligibility.

• Freshman trio: The 2005 recruiting class of 6-foot-2-inch guard Chester Frazier of Baltimore,

Md., 6-8 forward C.J. Jackson of Buena Vista, Ga. and 6-3 guard Jamar Smith of Peoria are now in their freshman season for the Illini.

• Hicks joins squad as walk-on: Sophomore Chris Hicks has joined the Illini squad as a walkon after surviving a tryout this fall. The 6-2, 190pound guard is a native of Chicago and graduated from Whitney Young High School. Hicks is majoring in athletic training.

Illini Sign Two

Illinois signed two prep standouts to national letters of intent during the fall signing period in Brian Carlwell, a 6-11 center from Maywood, Ill. (Proviso East High School) and 6-9 forward Richard Semrau of Rocky River, Ohio (Lutheran West High School).

Cook, Williams and Head in the NBA Illinois currently has three alumni in the NBA in Brian Cook, Deron Williams and Luther Head.

Cook, chosen as the 24th pick in the first round of the 2003 draft, is in his third season with the Los Angeles Lakers.

Deron Williams was chosen No. 3 overall in 2005 by the Utah Jazz, the highest draft pick in UI history. Head was the 24th pick by the Houston Rockets in 2005.

Orange Krush Honors Cardinal

The Orange Krush student support group and cheering section announced in 2004 that it will fund an endowment in the name of former men's basketball trainer Rod Cardinal in the amount of \$300,000 to fund future student athletic trainers for the UI sports medicine program. The Krush has already endowed the \$250,000 Matthew Heldman Memorial Scholarship, named after former Illini point guard Matt Heldman who was tragically killed in a car accident in 1999.

The 17th-ranked Illini beat South Dakota State 90-65, but they had to overcome some sloppy play to do it.

Illinois committed 20 turnovers, a number reached only twice during its 39-game run to the national title game last April. But with three starters gone from a lineup that started 42 consecutive games together, the new Illini are still getting to know each other on the court.

Brown scored 19 points and James Augustine had 18 points and 14 rebounds as Illinois (1-0) won its 22nd consecutive home game.

James Augustine added 13 points and 13 rebounds for Illinois, which improved to 3-4 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Illini also snapped the Tar Heels' 21-game home winning streak despite scoring only four points in the final 6 1/2 minutes.

No one expected a true rematch of the final because only seven remaining players on the two teams even played in that game, won 75-70 by the Tar Heels.

Those points came during a 12-0 run to make it 64-62, and after the teams traded baskets, Illinois freshman Jamar Smith missed the front end of a 1- and-1 with 17 seconds left. But Randle beat everyone to the rebound and quickly got the ball to Brown, who made two free throws to finally seal the victory.

Illinois also seemed to rally around injured coach Bruce Weber, who broke his ankle a day earlier working in his yard. He hobbled a bit on the sidelines with a protective boot, and used a crutch to travel from the locker room to the sideline.

He watched his team take the lead for good on Randle's 3-pointer to open the second half, and Illinois stayed in control until suddenly losing its shooting touch. Illinois missed five straight shots and had three turnovers in one 5-minute stretch, losing nearly all of a 14-point lead.

Dee Brown and James Augustine carried the scoring load and Marcus Arnold's inspired play off the bench late in the second half helped the No. 12 Illini rally from an early 15-point deficit to defeat Xavier 65-62.

Augustine scored 23 points to tie his career high and Brown had 20, but Arnold scored seven points and grabbed a pair of key rebounds. He tied the game 53-53 and then converted a 3-point play to give the Illini a 56-53 lead with 5:10 to go.

Xavier built a 19-4 lead and led 36-26 at halftime. But Illinois, which has now won 15 in a row at the United Center, came out of the locker room with a 15-4 run.

The Musketeers were led by Justin Cage's 15 points. Justin Doellman scored 12 and Stanley Burrell had 11. Xavier shot 60 percent in the first half, but dropped off in the second half to finish with 48 percent.

Illinois had major trouble getting started. The Illini turned the ball over on their first two possessions and missed their first nine shots. Meanwhile, the Musketeers hit five of their first eight to build a 12-0 lead.

Dee Brown scored 16 points and Illinois' defense made up for a poor shooting night as the 11th-ranked Illini won their ninth straight to open the season, 58-48 over Georgetown.

Brown made two layups midway through the second half that boosted Illinois' lead to 14 points and stalled Georgetown's comeback attempt. The Hoyas (3-2), who were down 15 points at halftime, rallied behind Jeff Green, who scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half.

But Georgetown ran out of time. After closing to 52-44 on Ashanti Cook's 3-pointer with 1:10 to go, the Hoyas missed three straight shots, were forced to foul and the Illini converted all six free throws before Green scored four points in the final seconds.

James Augustine got his fourth double-double of the season for Illinois with 10 points and 13 rebounds. Cook scored 10 points for the Hoyas.

Illinois was only 9-of-25 from the field in the second half and finished the game shooting a paltry 32 percent. They were helped by nine 3-pointers.

Illinois scored the first 10 points of the game and then held the Hoyas to five first-half baskets.

Illini coach Bruce Weber, still hobbled by a broken left ankle, was waving his arms early exhorting his players and applauding their defensive play as Georgetown missed its first six shots and eight of its first 10 on their way shooting 38 percent.

The Hoyas closed within 12-7 with 10:59 to go in the half but the Illini tightened up their defense again and forced Georgetown to miss nine straight shots and turn the ball over four times over the next 9:02. Illinois took a 25-11 lead and was up 28-13 at halftime.

Rose Garden, Portland, Ore. Playing its 10th game in 23 days, Illinois coach Bruce Weber didn't know exactly what to expect from his team.

However, the 11th-ranked Fighting Illini showed no signs of fatigue as Dee Brown had 26 points and seven assists in an 89-59 win over Oregon. Brown hit 9 of 15 shots, including five 3s in his best performance of the season.
