Illini Headlines

- Illinois has won 56 of its last 59 games during the regular season.
- Illinois owns the nation's third-longest homecourt winning streak at 31 games, trailing both Southern Illinois and Gonzaga by one.
- Illinois' 31-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall has tied its longest in school history, equaling the school-record streak of 31 straight wins first set at The Hall from Jan. 15, 1984 through Jan. 4, 1986.
- Illinois is 88-3 (.967) at the Assembly Hall over the last six-and-a-half seasons, the best home mark in the nation over this time period.
- Illinois is the second-winningest team in the nation over the past five-and-a-half seasons. Illinois has won 158 games since the beginning of the 2000-01 season, which trails only Duke (167 wins).
- Bruce Weber is the winningest coach in the nation over the past four-and-a-half seasons. Since the beginning of the 2001-02 season, Weber has won 132 games, recording 52 wins in his final two years at Southern Illinois and 80 wins in his first two-and-a-half years at Illinois. He is tied with Duke's Mike Krzyzewski over this time period.
- Illinois and Duke are the only two schools in the nation to win at least 25 games each of the last five seasons.
- Illinois, Duke and Oklahoma State are the only three teams to advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 each of the last two seasons.
- Illinois has won 13 of 17 games by double figures, leading the Big Ten and ranking 10th in the nation in scoring margin at +15.2 ppg.
- Illinois' opponents are averaging just 56.5 points on 38.8 percent shooting on the season, including just 27.4 percent from 3-point range. The Illini lead the Big Ten and rank seventh in the nation in scoring defense, are second in the Big Ten and 17th nationally in field goal percentage defense, and lead the Big Ten in 3-point field goal percentage defense.
- Illinois is outrebounding its opponents by an average of 7.2 boards per game. The Illini lead the Big Ten and rank 12th in the nation in rebound-

- ing margin and have outrebounded 16 of 19 opponents on the year.
- Dee Brown ranks second in the Big Ten and 25th in the nation in assists, averaging 5.7 apg.
- Seniors Dee Brown and James Augustine have accounted for 49.5 percent of Illinois' points during Big Ten play.
- Dee Brown scored a career-high 34 points in the win over Michigan State on Jan. 5. It marked the most points by an Illini player in eight years, since Kevin Turner scored 35 vs. Indiana on Jan. 3, 1998.
- Sharp-shooting freshman guard Jamar Smith ranks second in the Big Ten in 3-point field goal percentage at 51.8 percent (43-83). He has come off the bench to make his first 3-point attempt in 52.6 percent of the games on the year (10-19).
- Dee Brown has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.77 over the past 13 games (86 assists, 31 turnovers), after opening the season with an assist/turnover ratio of 0.96 in the first six games (23 assists, 24 turnovers).
- James Augustine broke the school record for career rebounds vs. Tennessee-Martin on Dec. 30 when he collected his 854th rebound, breaking the previous Illini career record of 853 rebounds set by Efrem Winters from 1983-86. Augustine currently has 891 career rebounds and is on pace to become the first 1,000-point scorer and 1000-rebounder in UI history and just the 11th in Big Ten history.
- Dee Brown and James Augustine have each played in 105 wins during their respective careers, ranking third on the UI career wins chart. The Illinois record for wins (played in) is 110 by Nick Smith (2002-05).
- Dee Brown recorded his 1,500th career point vs. Coppin State on Dec. 18, becoming just the eighth player in UI history to reach that milestone. Brown currently has 1,630 points to rank seventh on the all-time UI list, and he is the top active career scorer in the Big Ten.
- James Augustine has won the opening tip in 16 of 19 games this season, and has won the tip over 80 percent of the time during his career (96-23).
- Illinois has played 68 consecutive games

Illini Head Coach Bruce Weber

Bruce Weber has led the Fighting Illini to the top of the national charts in just his third season at the helm of the Illinois program. In addition to becoming the first coach in Big Ten history to lead his squad to outright Big Ten titles in each of his first two seasons, Weber had Illinois at No. 1 in the national polls the final 15 weeks of the 2004-05 season. He led the Illini to an NCAA record-tying 37 victories and the school's first appearance in the national championship game. The Illini success helped Weber be named National Coach of the Year by 10 different organizations. He came to Illinois following five years at Southern Illinois where he led the Salukis to Missouri Valley Conference titles each of his last two seasons.

Weber became just the third coach in Big Ten history to win an outright title in his first season in the league, leading the Illini to 10 straight victories to end the regular season and claim the title. He is also just the sixth coach in the conference since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference team in his first season.

In his five seasons at SIU, Weber took the Saluki program to the top of the MVC, winning league titles in 2002 and 2003. He posted records of 28-8 and 24-7 in his last two seasons, leading the Salukis to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances.

A 1978 graduate of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Weber spent 18 years as an assistant at Purdue under Gene Keady before moving to SIU.

He has helped teams make 19 NCAA Tournament appearances in 26 seasons as a collegiate coach, including one Final Four, one Elite Eight and four Sweet Sixteen appearances. Purdue won six Big Ten titles during his stop in West Lafayette.

- Illinois has the nation's longest nonconference homecourt winning streak at 46 games (tied with Oklahoma).
- Illinois tied its fourth-best start in school history this season with a 15-0 start, marking the second straight season that the UI won its first 15 games. The Illini won a school-record 29 games to start last season.
- Illinois sold out of season tickets for the entire season for the second year in a row and third time in the last five years. The Illini have played in front of a school-record 22 consecutive sell-out crowds at the Assembly Hall.

Illini By the Numbers Under Weber

Illinois has been a consistent winner during Bruce Weber, a tenure that spans the most successful period in school history. The following is a breakdown of Illinois' success under Weber:

- **80-11:** Illinois' overall record under Weber, a winning percentage of .879.
- 37-1: Illinois' record at the Assembly Hall under Weber, a winning percentage of .974.
- 56-3: Illinois' record in its last 59 regular season games under Weber (beginning Jan. 31, 2004), a winning percentage of .949.
- 37-2: Illinois' record last season, which tied the record for the winningest season in NCAA history.
- 26-7: Illinois' record in Weber's first season (2003-04), which tied the fourth-winningest season in school history.
- 17-2: Illinois' record so far this season, the second straight year under Weber that Illinois has gone undefeated in non-conference play and won its first 15 games.
- 31-6: Illinois' record in Big Ten play under Weber which incudes back-to-back outright championships in 2004 and 2005 a winning percentage of .838.
- 68-8: Illinois' record in regular season games under Weber, a winning percentage of .895.
- 17-5: Illinois' record in road games under Weber, a winning percentage of .773.

- 26-5: Illinois' record in neutral-site games under Weber, a winning percentage of .839.
- 7-2: Illinois' NCAA Tournament record under Weber which includes a trip to the Sweet 16 in 2004 and the program's first-ever appearance in the national championship game in 2005 a winning percentage of .778.
- 5-1: Illinois' Big Ten Tournament record under Weber – which includes the 2005 tournament title – a winning percentage of .833.
- 12-3: Illinois' combined postseason record under Weber, a winning percentage of .800.

Seniors Carry Scoring Load in Big Ten Play Illinois has leaned on experience to start off conference play with seniors Dee Brown and James Augustine combining for 49.5 percent of the UI's scoring in Big Ten games, totaling 151 of the Illini's 305 points. This is up from non-conference play, where the duo accounted for just 37.8 percent of the team's points. Illinois carries a 31-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall, which ranks third in the nation among active homecourt winning streaks (one behind both Southern Illinois and Gonzaga) ... Illinois' 31-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall has tied a school record, equaling the streak of 31 straight wins at The Hall first set from Jan. 15, 1984 through Jan. 4, 1986 ... The Illini have also won 46 in a row at the Assembly Hall against non-conference opponents, which is tied with Oklahoma for the longest non-conference homecourt winning streak in the country ... Illinois is

76-2 (.974) at the Assembly Hall over the last five-and-a-half years, with the only losses coming to Michigan State on Feb. 3, 2002 and to Purdue on Jan. 10, 2004 ... The Boilermakers broke a 23-game Illini winning streak at the Hall that at the time ranked fourth in the nation ... Last Time Out: Northwestern

Illinois recorded its first Big Ten road win, defeating Northwestern 58-47 on Saturday. The Illini defense again led the way to victory, as Northwestern shot 35.4 percent for the game, making only 17-48 from the field, including just 3-20 from 3-point range.

Illinois surged ahead to a 32-17 halftime lead after holding the Wildcats to just four baskets in the first half. The lead then grew to as large as 26 points, but Illinois managed just three field goals in the final 16 minutes to settle for an 11-point victory.

Dee Brown scored a game-high 18 points and Rich McBride added 12 behind four 3-pointers. The Illini dominated Northwestern on the boards by a 44-31 advantage, as Warren Carter (12) and Shaun Pruitt (10) each recorded career highs in rebounds.

Augustine and Brown Approaching School Record for Career Wins

Saturday's win over Northwestern marked the 105th career victory that seniors James Augustine and Dee Brown have played in during their UI tenure, which ranks third on the school career wins chart. Roger Powell (2002-05) played in 107 career wins, and the school record for career wins (played in) is 110 by Nick Smith (2002-05).

Augustine Top Rebounder in Illini History Senior James Augustine broke the Illinois school record for career rebounds with his final rebound with 10:51 left in the game vs. Tennessee-Martin on Dec. 30 to give him 854 rebounds in his career, breaking the previous Illini career record of 853 rebounds set by Efrem Winters from 1983-86.

Augustine now has 891 career boards, which is also the most rebounds of any current Big Ten player. He is on pace to become the first 1,000-point scorer and 1,000-rebounder in Illinois history and just the 11th in Big Ten history.

Doing it with Defense

At the beginning of the season, Bruce Weber challenged his team to build its identity and reputation on defense. Illinois has responded, using defense to spur its 17-2 record. Opponents are averaging just 56.6 points (first in Big Ten, seventh in NCAA) on 38.8 percent shooting (sec-

ond in Big Ten, 17th in NCAA) and 27.4 percent 3-point shooting (first in Big Ten) for the season.

The Illini have only given up more than 65 points once this season (Michigan, 74), with 12 of the 19 opponents scoring under 60. Illinois has not had an opponent shoot 50 percent in a game this year, and only four teams have shot better than 45 percent.

Illinois held back-to-back opponents to less than 50 points in wins over Arkansas-Little Rock (75-49) and Georgetown (58-48) for the first time since Nov. 30 and Dec. 5, 1998 under Lon Kruger when the Illini defeated Valparaiso (53-49) and Bradley (53-48).

On Dec. 18, the Illini held Coppin State to just 42 points, the second-fewest points by an opponent in the Weber era at Illinois and the fewest by a UI opponent since Penn State scored 37 in an 80-37 loss at the Assembly Hall on Jan. 21, 2004.

came in the win over Michigan State on Jan. 5. The Spartans entered the game ranked 14th in the nation in scoring, averaging 82.8 ppg. But the Illini held MSU to a season-low 50 points, nearly 33 points below its average. MSU was 10th in the NCAA in field goal percentage at 50.4 percent but shot just 36.2 percent against the Illini defense.

The Illini "D" did its best work on Michigan State's top two scorers, Maurice Ager and Paul Davis. Ager entered the game ranked 12th in the nation in scoring at 22 points per game, but he was held 13 below his average, scoring a season-low nine points on 3-8 shooting, his only game of the season not reaching double figures. Davis, meanwhile, came into the game third in the Big Ten in scoring, averaging 20 points, but scored just 12.

In the win over Northwestern on Saturday, Illinois held the Wildcats to 35.4 percent shooting and 17 field goals on its home floor, which included just four first-half baskets.

Crashina the Boards

One major area where Illinois has improved its performance compared to last season is in rebounding. The Illini are averaging 38.1 rpg and have totaled 40+ boards nine times. Illinois is

outrebounding its opponents by an average of 7.2 boards to lead the Big Ten and rank 12th in the NCAA in rebounding margin. Illinois has outrebounded its opponent in 16 of 19 games on the season. The Illini also rank second in the Big Ten in offensive rebounding, averaging 13.3 offensive boards per game.

Last season, Illinois averaged 34.3 rpg and outrebounded its opponent by an average of only 3.0 boards.

Brown Eclipses 1,500 Career Points

Dee Brown scored his 1,500th point against Coppin State on Dec. 18, becoming the eighth player in Illinois history to reach that milestone. Brown currently stands seventh on the UI career scoring list with 1,630 points, which is also the most career points of any current Big Ten player. At his current pace, Brown should finish his career ranked third on the all-time Illini scoring chart.

Illini Also Enjoy Success in Close Games Illinois leads the Big Ten and ranks 10th in the nation in scoring margin at +15.2 ppg and has won 13 of its 17 games by double figures. But the other five games have gone down to the wire and the Illini have been successful in close games as

This is quite a contrast to last year, when Illinois had a total of just four games decided by five points or less out of 39 games on the year. Last season, Illinois did not play in a game decided by five or less until its 19th game, when it defeated Iowa in overtime on Jan. 20 by the score of 73-68. Illinois went 2-2 in games decided by five points or less last season and is 10-4 in such games under Bruce Weber.

Dee Does it All

Dee Brown, the "one-man fast break", is doing it all for the Illini this season now that his former running mates Deron Williams and Luther Head are in the NBA. Brown boasts a career-best scoring average of 15.2 points to lead the team, and he ranks fifth in the Big Ten in scoring in conference play with a 17.8 average. He has been Illinois' leading scorer in 11 games and has reached double figures 13 times, with five games of 20 or more points.

Brown put on one of the best scoring performances by an Illinois player in nearly a decade in the Big Ten opener vs. Michigan State on Jan. 5. He scored a career-high 34 points, making a career-high 12 field goals. Seven of his 12 buckets came from 3-point range, tying the most treys by a Big Ten player on the year. Brown was on fire in the first half, scoring 23 points on 8-12 shooting, which matched the number of first-half baskets that MSU had as a team. His 34 points are the most by a UI player in eight years, since Kevin

Turner scored 35 vs. Indiana in the 1998 Big Ten opener vs. Indiana (Jan. 3, 1998).

Brown was at it again in the win over Michigan on Jan. 14, scoring a game-high 26 points, which equaled his second-highest total of the season. He scored 16 of 26 in the final 11 minutes, nailing four 3-pointers and a key basket with less than two minutes left to put the Illini up by three. Brown, who played the entire 40 minutes against the Wolverines, also tied his best-ever performance from the free throw line by making 9-10.

He had his first standout performance in a Big Ten road game on Saturday at Northwestern, scoring a game-high 18 points on 6-10 shooting, to go along with eight assists.

Brown's first scoring explosion of the season came in the win at Oregon on Dec. 10 when he led the Illini with 26 points. Brown made 9-15 shots against the Ducks, including 5-8 from 3-point range.

Against Missouri on Dec. 21, Brown played a brilliant all-around game, scoring a game-high 17 points while also recording a game-high seven assists. He played the entire game (36 min.) without committing a turnover.

Brown's presence can be felt all over the court, as he leads the Illini in five total categories: scoring (15.2 ppg), minutes (34.5 mpg), assists (5.7 apg), steals (1.7 spg) and free throw percentage (52-68, .765). He ranks second in the Big Ten in assists (25th in NCAA) and sixth in steals, and leads the conference with 50 three-pointers.

Brown has recorded double-digit assists three times this year, led by a season-high 11 assists at Indiana (Jan. 17) and 10 vs. both Arkansas-Little Rock (Dec. 5) and Tennessee-Martin (Dec. 30). He also owns an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.77 over the last 13 games (86 assists, 31 turnovers).

Augie Taking Over

Illinois is counting on a big year from senior James Augustine, and he is delivering. A four-year starter, Augustine was the Illini's fifth-leading scorer last year (10.1 ppg), but ranks second on the team in scoring this season at 13.8 points per game. He has reached double figures in 16 of 19 games and tied his career high with 23 points in the win over Xavier on Dec. 3 and again with 23 in the win over Michigan on Jan. 14. Augustine had a nine-game streak of scoring in double figures — the longest stretch of games scoring in double figures of his career — come to an end vs. Oregon on Dec. 10 when he finished with eight points.

The leading career field goal percentage shooter in Illinois history, Augustine has made 62.2 percent of his shots this season (102-164), which ranks third in the Big Ten and 13th in the

NCAA. He's shot 50 percent or better in all but three games, highlighted by a pair of 7-9 performances vs. Rutgers (Nov. 26) and Xavier (Dec. 3), 8-9 shooting vs. Tennessee-Martin (Dec. 30) and 9-11 shooting vs. Michigan (Jan. 14).

In addition to his increased scoring, Augustine has remained the Illini's top rebounder and has increased his production in that category as well. He is averaging 8.8 boards per game this season to lead the team and rank third in the Big Ten. Augustine averaged 7.6 rpg last year and entered his senior season with a career average of 7.0 rebounds.

Augustine broke the school career rebounding record vs. Tennessee-Martin on Dec. 30 and with 891 career rebounds, at his current average he is on pace to become Illinois' first-ever player to collect 1,000 rebounds.

Augustine has five double-doubles on the season with 18 pts.-14 reb. vs. South Dakota State (Nov. 18), 14 pts.-10 reb. vs. Wichita State (Nov. 25), 13 pts.-13 reb. vs. North Carolina (Nov. 29), 10 pts.-13 reb. vs. Georgetown (Dec. 8) and 19 pts.-11 reb. vs. Tennessee-Martin (Dec. 30).

Smith Gives Illini Instant Offense

True-freshman shooting guard Jamar Smith has given the Illini instant offense off the bench. Despite playing under 19 minutes per game, Smith is fourth on the team in scoring, averaging 8.7 points in a reserve role. He ranks second in the Big Ten in 3-point field goal shooting at 51.8 percent (43-83) while ranking third on the team with 43 treys.

Smith has come off the bench to make his first 3-point attempt in 10 games on the year, and has made at least one 3-pointer in all but two games (Michigan State, Indiana) on the season.

Smith's coming out party occurred during Illinois' victory over Arkansas-Little Rock on Dec. 5. He scored a career-high 23 points, connecting on 8-10 from the field, including 6-8 from 3-point range.

Against Southeast Missouri State on Dec. 28, Smith scored 14 points on 5-5 shooting, including 4-4 from 3-point range.

On the season, Smith has scored at least eight points in 15 of 19 games.

Randle Hitting Stride

After redshirting last season due to a broken hand, sophomore Brian Randle is back in the UI lineup and has had a number of breakout performances. He has also become Illinois' defensive stopper, drawing the assignment of containing the opponents' top perimeter player each game.

Randle scored a career-high 16 points against Rutgers on Nov. 26, shooting 6-8 from the field. He then had 12 points on 4-5 shooting against North Carolina on Nov. 29. He came up huge in the clutch, scoring in traffic with 1:06 remaining to give Illinois a 66-62 lead after the team had

gone scoreless for five-and-a-half minutes.

Randle had 11 points on 5-7 shooting and six rebounds vs. Arkansas-Little Rock (Dec. 5). and had nine points and seven boards vs. Oregon on Dec. 10.

Randle did not play vs. Coppin State on Dec. 18 due to a sprained ankle but returned to the starting lineup to score 13 points and collect six rebounds vs. Missouri on Dec. 21. His defense locked down MU's Thomas Gardner, who entered the game leading the Big XII in scoring at 22.3 ppg but managed just six points on 2-12 shooting and had five turnovers against the Illini.

Randle had another superb defensive performance on Michigan State's Maurice Ager on Jan. 5. Ager entered the game ranked 12th in the nation in scoring at 22 points per game, but Randle held him 13 below his average, as Ager scored a season-low nine points on 3-8 shooting, his first game of the season not reaching double figures.

Randle came within one point of his career high at Indiana on Jan. 17, scoring 15 points to go along with six rebounds.

Randle has started 18 games on the year. He is fifth on the team in scoring, averaging 8.0 points while shooting over 50 percent from the field (59-117). He is third on the team in rebounding at 5.2 rpg and ranks second with 12 blocks

McBride Showcases All-Around Game Rich McBride was known as a three-point specialist in his first two seasons with the Illini. Now that he has moved from a reserve role to a starter, McBride has strengthened other parts of his game. He worked hard over the summer to improve his conditioning and is now playing nearly 29 minutes per game and has earned a reputation as one of the team's top perimeter defenders along with Brian Randle.

McBride is still a threat from behind the arc, ranking second on the team with 46 treys on the year. He had a season-high 21 points vs. Tennessee-Martin on Dec. 30 behind a career-high seven 3-pointers, tying the most by a Big Ten player this season and also tying the third-most 3-pointers in a game ever by an Illinois player.

McBride ranks third on the team in scoring at 8.7 points per game. He is second on the team in assists behind Brown, averaging 2.3.

Pruitt Asserting Himself in the Paint

The Illini coaching staff tabbed sophomore Shaun Pruitt as the team's most improved player compared to a year ago. He quickly earned a starting role in the UI lineup based on preseason practice, and has started every game this season after averaging just 4.6 minutes in 21 games as a truefreshman last year. Pruitt is averaging 6.2 points on the season and is second on the team in rebounding, averaging 5.9 rebounds. He has increased his scoring in Big Ten play, ranking third on the team with 7.4 ppg in conference games. Pruitt had the best game of his career on at Indiana on Jan. 21, leading the Illini with 17

points on 7-9 shooting, while adding a team-high seven rebounds and three blocks. He then had a career-high 10 rebounds at Northwestern on Saturday.

Frazier Strengthens Illini Backcourt

Back-up freshman point guard Chester Frazier missed five games during December with a slight tear and strained quadriceps muscle in his left leg. He has played well since he returning to the UI lineup. In his first game back vs. Southeast Missouri State on Dec. 28, he played 13 minutes with five rebounds, five assists and no turnovers. Against Tennessee-Martin on Dec. 30, Frazier dished out a career-best eight assists and had just one turnover in a career-high tying 22 minutes. In his most recent game vs. Northwestern on Saturday, Frazier scored a career-high six points.

Over the past six games since his return, Frazier has totaled 16 assists with just six turnovers (2.7 a/to ratio).

Illini Nation's Second-Winningest Team over Past Five-and-a-Half Seasons

Illinois ranks as the second-winningest team in the nation over the past five-and-a-half seasons in terms of total wins, and ranks third over that same time span in terms of winning percentage. Illinois has reeled off 158 victories since the beginning of the 2000-01 season, which trails only Duke, while the Illini's .819 winning percentage over that time span trails just Duke and Gonzaga. Weber Nation's Winningest Coach over Past Four-and-a-Half Seasons

Bruce Weber has coached consistent winners everywhere he's been throughout his college career. In fact, over the past four-and-a-half seasons no head coach in America has more wins on his resume than Weber. Beginning with the 2001-02 season, Weber has recorded 132 victories, which is tied with Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (132 wins, next game 1/26) and leads Roy Williams (125 wins, next game 1/22) for the most wins by an NCAA Div. I coach over this time span. In his final two years at Southern Illinois, Weber went 28-8 in 2001-02 and 24-7 in 2002-03. He then took over the Illinois program, leading the Illini to a 26-7 record in 2003-04, a 37-2 mark in 2004-05 and a 17-2 mark so far this season.

Illini Win Another Top-10 Showdown at Assembly Hall

With 6th-ranked Illinois' 60-50 win over 7th-ranked Michigan State on Jan. 5, it marked Illinois' fourth straight win at the Assembly Hall in a game where both teams were ranked in the Top 10. Illinois is now 13-4 all-time at home in Top-10 match-ups, including 9-2 at the Assembly Hall. The game marked the first time at Assembly Hall with both teams ranked in the Top 10 since last season when No. 5 Illinois defeated No. 1 Wake Forest 91-73 on Dec. 1, 2004. And it marked the first time in five years that Illinois hosted a Big Ten game with both teams in the Top 10, since the No. 7 Illini defeated No. 4 Michigan State 77-66 on Feb. 6, 2001.

Road Warriors

Illinois has received much attention from its homecourt dominance, but the Illini have also enjoyed great success on the road. Illinois is 16-5 (.762) in away games under coach Bruce Weber. The Illini had to win six straight road games to clinch the 2004 Big Ten championship, finishing the 2003-04 season 7-2 in away games. Illinois then compiled an 8-1 record on the road last season. Illinois' 14-game road winning streak was snapped in the 2005 regular season finale at Ohio State, and the Illini are 2-2 on the road so far this

Augustine Named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week

James Augustine was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 5. He recorded a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds at North Carolina on Nov. 29 as Illinois recorded its first

road victory of the season with a win at Chapel Hill. He added three assists and three steals against UNC. Augustine then equaled his career high in scoring in the win over Xavier on Dec. 3, erupting for 23 points. He was 7-of-9 from the field in the victory, while adding a game-high seven rebounds and two steals. For the week, Augustine averaged a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds on a combined 73.3 percent shooting (11-of-15).

It marked the third career Big Ten weekly accolade for Augustine, as he was also honored twice last season (Jan. 10 and Jan. 31). He shared the award with Indiana's Marco Killingsworth.

Chicagoans Brown and Augustine Finish Careers Undefeated at United Center

Illinois' victory over Xavier on Dec. 3 marked the final United Center appearance for a pair of Chicagoland products on the Illini roster in seniors Dee Brown and James Augustine. The duo never lost a game at the UC, finishing their four-year careers with a perfect 12-0 record.

Illinois tops North Carolina in Big Ten/ACC Challenge

The ACC won the 2005 Big Ten/ACC Challenge by a narrow 6-5 margin. But the Illini represented the Big Ten Conference well, posting a 68-64 victory over North Carolina at Chapel Hill on Nov. 29 to become the only Big Ten squad to win on the road in this year's Challenge. Illinois also broke UNC's 21-game winning streak at the Smith Center, which was the second-longest UNC winning streak in the 20-year history of Dean Dome.

Augustine Named MVP of South Padre Island Invitational

Senior James Augustine was named Most Valuable Player of the South Padre Island Invitational on Nov. 26. Augustine averaged 14.8 points and 7.5 rebounds over the course of the four-game tournament, while shooting 65 percent from the field. He had 18 points on 7-9 shooting in the championship game vs. Rutgers, and recorded a double-double vs. Wichita State with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Augustine also tied his career high in assists with four against the Shockers.

Brown and McBride Named to South Padre Island All-Tournament Team

In addition to James Augustine bringing home the MVP trophy from South Padre Island, guards Dee Brown and Rich McBride were named to the All-Tournament Team. Brown averaged 13 points, 4.3 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.0 steals during the tournament. His best game came against Texas-Pan American where he scored 20 points while tying his career high with seven

rebounds, along with tallying four assists and four steals.

McBride was Illinois' best perimeter defender during the tournament while also averaging 9.8 ppg. In the four games, he dished out a combined 14 assists while turning the ball over just three times.

Augustine Joins 1,000-Point Club

Senior James Augustine became the 40th player in Illinois history to record 1,000 career points when he scored his 1,000th point against Rutgers on Nov. 26. He joins Dee Brown as current UI players in the 1,000-point club. Brown scored his 1,000th point last season against Cincinnati (Dec. 31, 2004) and currently ranks seventh in school history with 1,630 career points, while Augustine ranks 26th with 1,197 career points.

Orange Krush Donates \$50,000 to Jimmy V Foundation

Illinois student section, "Orange Krush" is a charity foundation in addition to a cheering section, donating thousands of dollars each year to the community, University and students. During the past season, the Orange Krush Foundation raised and donated \$400,000 for charity to bring its seven-year total to \$1 million. Orange Krush donated \$350,000 to the University and 35 local charities at its annual check presentation ceremony this past October, and donated \$50,000 to the V Foundation for Cancer Research on Dec. 8 during halftime of the game vs. Georgetown.

Orange Krush is almost entirely student run and is based on the 3-point program. Students must solicit pledges from the alumni and community in order to gain entry into Orange Krush. In addition to supporting countless charities over the past seven years, the Orange Krush Foundation has created two endowments. Two years ago the Orange Krush formed the Rod Cardinal Sports Medicine Fund honoring Rod Cardinal, who was Illinois men's basketball athletic trainer for 30 years. This endowment benefits all student-trainers at the University of Illinois. This was the second endowment formed by Orange Krush. The first was the Matthew Heldman Memorial Scholarship Fund, which endows a scholarship for an Illini basketball player. The scholarship honors the late Matt Heldman, point guard for the 1997-98 Big Ten Championship Team, who was tragically killed in a car accident in 1999.

Illini Unveil New Starting Lineup

With the departure of three starters from last year, Illinois had a new starting lineup for the season opening win over South Dakota State, marking the UI's first starting lineup change since the 2004 Big Ten Tournament Championship game. Dee Brown, Deron Williams, Luther Head, Roger Powell and James Augustine were all in the

same starting lineup for a school-record streak of 42 consecutive games, which included all 39 games of the 2004-05 season.

Brown Preseason Player of the Year Candidate

Illinois senior guard Dee Brown is the first Illini player to ever be named preseason All-American by the *Associated Press*, and is a preseason Wooden Award, Naismith Award and Oscar Robertson Award candidate. He is also on the preseason Playboy Magazine All-America team for the second time. Brown earned Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year honors for the second time in his career (also prior to the 2004 season). Illinois has had the Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year for each of the last six seasons (2001-Cory Bradford; 2002-Frank Williams; 2003-Brian Cook; 2004-Dee Brown; 2005-Deron Williams; 2006-Dee Brown).

A Look Back at the Fighting Illini's Magical 2004-05 Season

Illinois recorded its best season in school history in 2004-05. The Illini tied the NCAA record for wins with 37 en route to a 37-2 overall record. The UI made its first Final Four appearance since 1989 and advanced to the NCAA Championship game for the first time in school history, finishing as the national runner-up. The Illini were ranked No. 1 in the nation for 15 straight weeks, including a first-ever No. 1 ranking in the final Associated Press poll. Illinois reeled off 29 straight wins to start the season and secured its second straight outright Big Ten championship with a 15-1 league record as Bruce Weber became the first coach in the 100-year history of Big Ten basketball to win consecutive outright titles in his first two seasons. The Illini also added the Big Ten Tournament title in addition to the regular season

Illini Reach 25-Win Marker for Fifth Straight Season in 2005

The 2005 season marked the fifth straight year that the Illini recorded at least 25 wins. Illinois and Duke are the only teams in the nation to accomplish this feat in each of the last five seasons (beginning in 2000-01). Duke has won at least 25 games each of the past eight seasons.

With a combined record of 158-35 (.819) over the last five-and-a-half years, this marks Illinois' winningest stretch over that time period in school history.

Big Ten Road Success

It took a total of just 13 conference road games in just his second season for Bruce Weber's Illini to win at every Big Ten arena. Illinois won at Indiana, Iowa, Minnesota, Ohio State, Penn State and Purdue in 2004 and completed the conference run with wins at Northwestern, Wisconsin,

Michigan State and Michigan in 2005.

Weber is just one of two current coaches in the Big Ten to win at every opposing arena – joining Michigan State's Tom Izzo. Weber has accomplished the feat the fastest. Below is a breakdown of how long it took the two to win at every arena.

Quick Shots

- Illinois spent 15-straight weeks at the top of the national polls during the 2004-05 season, easily the longest streak in school history, and the longest such streak in the nation since Kansas also spent 15-straight weeks at No. 1 in 1996-97. It was the third year in school history (1952 and 1989) that the Illini were ranked No. 1 in the nation.
- Illinois' 31-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall is the third-longest current home-court streak in the nation (trailing both Southern Illinois and Gonzaga by one). The Illini wrapped up their third undefeated season at the Assembly Hall in the last five years with a 15-0 record last year. Illinois also went undefeated at home in 2000-01 (12-0) and 2002-03 (14-0). Illinois has the best homecourt record in the nation over the past six-and-a-half years at 88-3 (.967).
- Illinois has led the Big Ten in scoring each of the last five seasons. The Illini led the Big Ten in scoring with an average of 75.9 points per conference game last year.
- More fans saw Illinois play in person during the 2004-05 season than any other school. Including the postseason, the Illini were seen by a total of 711,798 fans across the country. During the NCAA tournament alone, 196,065 fans watched the Illini advance to the national championship game. In home games, the Illini finished seventh in the nation with an average of 16,387 fans per game.

Brown Sixth-Straight Illini Chosen Preseason Player of the Year Pick

Senior guard Dee Brown became the sixth consecutive Fighting Illini player to earn Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year honors, the second time he has earned the distinction. The streak began in 2000 with Cory Bradford and followed with Frank Williams, Brian Cook, Brown, Deron Williams and Brown again this season. Cook went on to win the postseason award, while Frank Williams and Deron Williams earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors. Brown earned Big Ten Player of the Year honors following the 2005 season.

Illinois Begins Season in the Top 25 Illinois began the 2005-06 season ranked No. 17 in both the Preseason ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and Associated Press Poll, the sixth time in the last seven years they've been in the preseason Top 25. The Illini have played 68 straight games ranked in the Top 25. Illinois is currently ranked No. 7 in the Coaches Poll and No. 8 in the AP Poll

Randle Returns after Redshirt

Redshirt-sophomore forward Brian Randle used the 2004-05 season as a medical redshirt season after suffering a broken left hand in practice on Nov. 10, 2004. Randle started nine games as a true freshman in 2004, averaging 2.7 points and 2.3 rebounds on the season. As Illinois' most athletic player, Randle has shown great defensive ability and is a great finisher around the basket.

#25 Re-emerges on Brock's Back

Illinois redshirt freshman Calvin Brock is donning No. 25 on his uniform this season, continuing a tradition of Chicago Simeon players wearing the number when at Illinois. Nick Anderson (1988-89), Deon Thomas (1991-94), Bryant Notree (1995-97) and Brock have worn No. 25 in honor of former Simeon star Ben Wilson, who was tragically shot and killed prior to his senior year of high school.

Hot Ticket to Watch the Illini at the Hall For the second year in a row, and third time in the last five years, Illinois sold out of season tickets for the season, making it again one of the hottest tickets in program history. The Illini have played in front of a current school-record streak of 22 consecutive sell-out crowds at the Assembly Hall.

New Faces on the Roster

- Arnold Eligible After Transferring From Illinois State: Marcus Arnold, a 6-8 forward/center from Chicago, transferred to Illinois from Illinois State in the summer of 2004 and is eligible after sitting out the 2004-05 season per NCAA transfer rules. He begins the 2005-06 season with junior eligibility.
- Meacham Transfers From Dayton: Trent Meacham, a 6-2 point guard from Champaign, transferred to Illinois from Dayton in the summer of 2005 and will sit out the 2005-06 season per NCAA transfer rules. He will begin the 2006-07 season with sophomore eligibility.
- Freshman trio: The 2005 recruiting class of 6-foot-2-inch guard Chester Frazier of Baltimore, Md., 6-8 forward C.J. Jackson of Buena Vista, Ga. and 6-3 guard Jamar Smith of Peoria are now in their freshman season for the Illini.
- Hicks joins squad as walk-on: Sophomore Chris Hicks has joined the Illini squad as a walk-on after surviving a tryout this fall. The 6-2, 190-pound guard is a native of Chicago and graduated from Whitney Young High School. Hicks is majoring in athletic training.

Illini Sign Two

Illinois signed two prep standouts to national letters of intent during the fall signing period in Brian Carlwell, a 6-11 center from Maywood, Ill. (Proviso East High School) and 6-9 forward Richard Semrau of Rocky River, Ohio (Lutheran West High School).

Cook, Williams and Head in the NBA Illinois currently has three alumni in the NBA in Brian Cook, Deron Williams and Luther Head.

Cook, chosen as the 24th pick in the first round of the 2003 draft, is in his third season with the Los Angeles Lakers.

Deron Williams was chosen No. 3 overall in 2005 by the Utah Jazz, the highest draft pick in UI history. Head was the 24th pick by the Houston Rockets in 2005.

Orange Krush Honors Cardinal

The Orange Krush student support group and cheering section announced in 2004 that it will fund an endowment in the name of former men's basketball trainer Rod Cardinal in the amount of \$300,000 to fund future student athletic trainers for the UI sports medicine program. The Krush has already endowed the \$250,000 Matthew Heldman Memorial Scholarship, named after former Illini point guard Matt Heldman who was tragically killed in a car accident in 1999.

This was not the smooth, methodical effort that Illinois became known for in 2004-05.

The 17th-ranked Illini beat South Dakota State 90-65, but they had to overcome some sloppy play to do it.

Illinois committed 20 turnovers, a number reached only twice during its 39-game run to the national title game last April. But with three starters gone from a line-up that started 42 consecutive games together, the new Illini are still getting to know each other on the court.

Brown scored 19 points and James Augustine had 18 points and 14 rebounds as Illinois (1-0) won its 22nd consecutive home game.

South Dakota State committed 21 turnovers and its two best big men were in foul trouble all night. Ben Beran, who added 11 points, and Mohammed Berte both fouled out with more than 5 minutes to go.

Augustine and Shaun Pruitt, who scored 15 points, were able to have their way inside with Beran and Berte limited to a combined 38 minutes on the court.

South Dakota State led twice early, but Illinois used an 8-0 run to take a 15-10 lead with 14:41 to go in the first half. Even though the Jackrabbits scored the next five points to tie the score, Illinois never trailed again.

The Illini put the game away with a 13-4 run to close out the first half after South Dakota State closed a 10-point Illinois lead to 33-28 with 6:29 to go on Holdren's 3-pointer and a layup by Andre Gilbert.

Augustine and Brown hit free throws, then Pruitt got a basket and Calvin Brock had a pair of free throws to give the Illini a 38-29 lead with 3:15 to go.

The dazzling guard scored 14 points and Brian Randle grabbed a key rebound in the waning seconds, helping the 12th-ranked Illini hold off North Carolina 68-64 in a rematch of the 2005 NCAA championship game.

James Augustine added 13 points and 13 rebounds for Illinois, which improved to 3-4 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Illini also snapped the Tar Heels' 21-game home winning streak despite scoring only four points in the final 6 1/2 minutes.

No one expected a true rematch of the final because only seven remaining players on the two teams even played in that game, won 75-70 by the Tar Heels.

Those points came during a 12-0 run to make it 64-62, and after the teams traded baskets, Illinois freshman Jamar Smith missed the front end of a 1-and-1 with 17 seconds left. But Randle beat everyone to the rebound and quickly got the ball to Brown, who made two free throws to finally seal the victory.

Illinois also seemed to rally around injured coach Bruce Weber, who broke his ankle a day earlier working in his yard. He hobbled a bit on the sidelines with a protective boot, and used a crutch to travel from the locker room to the sideline.

He watched his team take the lead for good on Randle's 3-pointer to open the second half, and Illinois stayed in control until suddenly losing its shooting touch. Illinois missed five straight shots and had three turnovers in one 5-minute stretch, losing nearly all of a 14-point lead.

The Musketeers were led by Justin Cage's 15 points. Justin Doellman scored 12 and Stanley Burrell had 11. Xavier shot 60 percent in the first half, but dropped off in the second half to finish with 48 percent.

Illinois had major trouble getting started. The Illini turned the ball over on their first two possessions and missed their first nine shots. Meanwhile, the Musketeers hit five of their first eight to build a 12-0 lead

In its first trip to town since last year's Final Four, Illinois got big games from its tournament holdovers.

Dee Brown had 17 points, seven assists and two steals and James Augustine added 12 points, eight rebounds and three steals in the sixth-ranked Illini's 82-50 rout of Missouri in St. Louis.

Illinois (12-0) won by the most lopsided margin in the 25-year history of the neutral-court "Braggin' Rights" series.

The sold-out game was played in an arena across downtown from the domed stadium where the Illini lost to North Carolina in the 2005 national champi-

The Fighting Illini's superior quickness had Missouri (4-4) on the run from the start and the game was over by halftime when the lead was 18 points. It grew to as many as 34 near the end as Illinois won its sixth straight in the series and raised its overall record to 17-8. The previous highest winning margin was 22 points by Illinois in 1980.

Jimmy McKinney had 11 points for Missouri, which got an off-night from Thomas Gardner. Gardner, who leads the Big 12 with a 22-point average, was held to a season-worst six points on 2-for-12 shooting. Gardner wasn't the only one struggling: Missouri shot 35 percent and committed a seasonworst 21 turnovers.

Brian Randle returned to the Illinois lineup after missing a game with a sprained right ankle and added 13 points and six rebounds, while Marcus Arnold had 13 points. Randle also led the defensive effort against Gardner.

Only 2 seconds remained before halftime and Illinois had already seen a 15-point lead shrink to three. Dee Brown grabbed the inbounds pass and raced to midcourt where he let fly from about 40 feet

"I just threw it up and prayed for it to go in, and it went in," Brown said after the sixth-ranked Illini beat Southeast Missouri State 89-64. "It was big momentum for us going into halftime."

The basket extended Illinois lead to 38-29, the Illini came out of the locker room energized and went on to their 13th straight victory to start the season.

Brown scored 16 points and made two diving saves that led directly to baskets. Early in the game, he dove into the defensive corner and scooped the ball back to Warren Carter who got it back to Brown. Brown then sent a pass to Jamar Smith, who hit a 3-pointer.

In the second half, Brown dove over the midcourt line and into the courtside seats to save a ball. He got it to Smith who found Rich McBride for another 3 that gave the Illini a 16-point lead.

Southeast Missouri fought off an 0-for-6 start and trimmed a 20-5 Illini lead to 27-24 when Ketschner Guerrier hit a jumper with 11:42 to go in the first

But Smith's 3-pointer stopped the outburst and the Illini stretched their lead when Brown scored the final five points of the half, the last three on the buzzerbeater. He hit another 3-pointer with 17:27 left in the game that started a 13-2 Illinois run.

Smith and Carter scored 14 points each off the bench, and James Augustine added 12 and eight rebounds for Illinois. Smith was 4-for-4 from 3-point range and Carter grabbed seven rebounds to help the Illini to a 48-24 edge on the boards.

Dee Brown scored a career-high 34 points and the sixth-ranked Illini remained unbeaten with a 60-50 victory over the seventh-ranked Spartans to run their home winning streak to 30 games in the Big Ten opener for both teams.

Brown was 12-of-22 from the field, including 7-of-13 from 3-point range, for the Illini and had 23 points in the first half. He hit a 30-foot bailout as the shot clock wound down and a buzzer beater at halftime.

"I think it was one of the most incredible performances I've seen," Izzo said.

Michigan State had its 11-game winning streak snapped as the Illini held the Spartans nearly 33 points below their average. Maurice Ager, the Big Ten's leading scorer, finished with nine points, 13 below his

Shannon Brown had 17 points for Michigan State, which was held to its lowest point total since falling 72-50 to Duke on Dec. 3, 2003. The Spartans have lost four straight to Illinois.

Brown's hot hand helped the Illini overcome a poor night by their big men. James Augustine, Shaun Pruitt and Marcus Arnold combined for a woeful 4for-12 from the field, missing several easy layups and tips, and Augustine committed seven turnovers.

The Spartans never could get their fast break going. Brian Randle corralled Ager and Dee Brown and Rich McBride consistently beat Shannon Brown down the floor on defense.

Once the game began it was a typical Big Ten battle with both coaches screaming at the officials. Weber drew a technical foul with 2:29 left in the first half after his complaint to J.D. Collins was heard by most in the building during a free throw attempt by Augustine.

Carver-Hawkeye Arena, lowa City Jeff Horner scored 16 points to help Iowa beat

Illinois 63-48, snapping the Illini's 15-game winning streak.

In a physical battle between two of the Big Ten's best defensive teams, Iowa held Illinois to 34.6 percent shooting and became the first team to keep the Illini under 50 points since Michigan State did it Feb. 11, 1999.

The Hawkeyes also shut down Illinois' flashy point guard Dee Brown, who scored six points on 2-of-13 shooting - one game after he scored a career-high 34 in a victory over No. 7 Michigan State.

The win also helped Iowa snap a four-game losing streak against Illinois, and fans savored the moment by rushing the court to celebrate with the team after time expired.

James Augustine led Illinois with 14 points and nine rebounds, but was in foul trouble for much of the game.

The Illini, which had won 54 of its last 55 regularseason games, committed 16 turnovers, trailed the entire second half and shot 19 percent from 3-point range.

Iowa shot 35 percent and made 3-of-11 3-pointers. The difference was at the free-throw line, where the Hawkeyes went 24-of-32, compared to 7-of-15 for Illinois

The Hawkeyes led 23-19 at the half and grabbed its first double-digit lead when Haluska swished a 3-pointer to put Iowa up 38-28.

The Illini cut it to six 3 minutes later when Chester Frazier scored on a one-hander in the paint and Jamar Smith's 3-pointer on the next possession brought Illinois to 41-38. But the Illini would get no closer.

Dee Brown scored 26 points and James Augustine added 23 and No. 7 Illinois withstood a second-half charge from Michigan to beat the Wolverines for the 11th straight time, 79-74.

The win was Illinois' 31st in a row at the Assembly Hall, tying the school record set between Jan. 15, 1984 and Jan. 4, 1986.

After Michigan's 10-0 run gave it a 70-69 lead on Dion Harris' two free throws with 4:01 left, Augustine put the Illini back into the lead with two free throws.

His layup 56 seconds later gave the Illini a 73-70 lead and they outscored the Wolverines 6-4 down the stretch

Brown hit four straight 3-pointers that built a 53-51 Illinois lead to 69-60 before Daniel Horton scored eight straight points to bring the Wolverines within one before Harris' free throws gave them their short-lived lead.

Michigan started chipping away and cut its deficit to 50-45 on Lester Abram's long 3-pointer with 12:59 left. Then Brent Petway, playing in place of Graham Brown who was on the bench in foul trouble, scored six straight points that cut the Illinois lead to 53-51.

Brown answered with the first of four straight 3-pointers and the Illini scored 16 of the next 24 points to take the 69-60 lead.

The Illini, playing their first game since their loss at Iowa a week ago, came out sluggish on offense again and watched the Wolverines take their four-point lead after Sims backed Pruitt into the lane and got a three-point play with 10:40 to go in the first half.

But Augustine's dunk and a 3-pointer by Rich McBride with 8:55 to go ignited the 22-6 run. Then Brian Randle slammed in a rebound of a miss by Brown to give Illinois the 11-point halftime lead.

Marco Killingsworth scored 20 of his 23 points in the second half to help No. 13 Indiana beat No. 7 Illinois 62-60 at Bloomington.

Indiana won for the seventh time in eight games and became only the fourth team to beat the Fighting Illini in the regular-season since Jan. 24, 2004. The victory set off a wild celebration as Indiana extended its home winning streak to 11 against Big Ten teams.

Illinois was led by Shaun Pruitt's career-high 17 points, but lost for the second time in three games. Brian Randle added 15 points, but leading scorer Dee Brown, who averaged 15.6 points, had just five.

Roderick Wilmont tied his season high with 17 points for the Hoosiers. Illinois jumped to a 14-3 lead. Wilmont sparked an 18-0 run as Indiana held Illinois scoreless for nearly 6 1/2 minutes late in the first half. The spurt ended when he scored the final four points to make it 27-19.

The Illini closed to 28-24 at the half when Brown connected on a 3-pointer before the buzzer -- his only basket of the night.

Indiana used a 15-6 run in the second half to make it 55-40 with 8:23 to go.

The Illini rallied with 12 straight points to close to 55-52 when Randle completed a three-point play with 4:52 left. Brown missed a 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left that would have tied the game. Jamar Smith tipped in the miss to make it 61-60.

Robert Vaden then made one of two free throws with 3.6 seconds left, and Rich McBride's half-court heave at the buzzer was off the mark as fans raced onto the court.

Dee Brown scored a game-high 18 points and had eight assists to lead No. 7 Illinois to a 58-47 victory over Northwestern.

After shooting a combined 9 of 39 in the previous three games, Brown was 6-for-10 from the field and 2-for-5 from 3-point range.

Rich McBride added 12 points, and Shaun Pruitt grabbed 10 rebounds for the Illini (17-2, 3-2 Big Ten).

Northwestern (9-8, 2-4) shot 35 percent (17-for-48) on its way to its fourth straight loss.

Mohamed Hachad scored all of his 14 points in the second half for Northwestern. Vedran Vukusic, the Big Ten's leading scorer, missed his first 13 shots and scored a season-low five points, his first game in single digits. His first basket was a 3-pointer that pulled Northwestern to within 53-43 with 1:34 left in the game.

With Illinois up 46-21, Northwestern went on a 14-2 run to pull to within 48-35 with 4:28 left in the game. The Wildcats cut it to 12. Then, Vukusic hit that 3 to make it a 10-point game. Otherwise, it was a quiet game for him.

Northwestern's Vince Scott scored 30 seconds into the game, but the Wildcats missed their next six field goals as Illinois opened a 13-4 lead. Brian Randle, McBride and Brown hit 3-pointers during that stretch, and Illinois never looked back.

With more than half the crowd of 8,117 decked out in orange, the Illini made themselves at home.

They picked apart Northwestern's 2-1-2 trap and took the Wildcats out of their offense. The Wildcats seemed flustered and did not get the ball to Vukusic in the post.

Northwestern went more than seven minutes between its first and second field goals, before Sterling Williams hit a 3 to make it 13-7, but Illinois took a 32-17 lead into halftime.
