**GoREDBIRDS.COM****THE GAME FACTS**

- Tonight's game is the 13th meeting all-time between Illinois State and Western Kentucky. The Hilltoppers have dominated the series, winning 10 of the previous 12 meetings, including the last five.
- The Redbirds have lost the last three games against the Hilltoppers by a total of nine points, with three-point losses in each of the last three games.
- ISU is winless in Bowling Green, Ky., entering tonight's game with an 0-5 record all-time.
- Head coach Denver Johnson and the Redbirds have never won their first road game in Gateway Football Conference play in the previous six seasons.
- With a catch in tonight's game, ISU wide receiver Laurent Robinson will tie the school record for most consecutive games with a catch at 29. He also needs only 12 receiving yards to move into second place for most career yards in ISU history.
- Senior linebacker Cameron Siskowic needs 10 tackles in tonight's game to become the 11th player in Redbird history to post 300 career tackles.
- With one more rushing touchdown, running back Pierre Rembert will have 17 career TDs which would put him tied for fifth all-time in the ISU record books.

**THE COACHES****► ILLINOIS STATE**

Denver Johnson is in his seventh season at Illinois State and owns a 35-36 (.493) overall record with the Redbirds. Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Johnson was the head coach at Murray State where he compiled a 21-12 mark. Johnson, 47, is a 1981 graduate of Tulsa and his nine-year head coaching record stands at 56-48 (.538). He is 1-7 against Western Kentucky.

**► WESTERN KENTUCKY**

David Elson (Butler '94) is in his fourth season at the helm of the Hilltopper football program. Elson owns a 26-14 (.650) mark at Western Kentucky, his only stop as a collegiate head coach. He is 3-0 against Illinois State in his career.

The luncheon begins at noon, with comments from two selected players representing both the offense and defense. Following the student-athletes, head coach Denver Johnson will address the media. **CREDENTIALS**

Credentials (game and parking) can be obtained by contacting the Athletics Media Relations Office, Campus Box 7130, Normal, Ill., 61790-7130. Requests must be received on official letterhead at least two days prior to the game. Passes that are not mailed will be available at the Will Call window (Gate 4) 90 minutes before kickoff.

**PRACTICE**

Most practices are open to the media (approximately 3:30-6 p.m.), but only the first 15 minutes of Tuesday through Thursday practices are available to photographers. For all other media, it is recommended that an advance call be made to the media relations office to check on the status of practice for a particular day.

**INTERVIEWS**

- Head Coach Denver Johnson will do general interviews following practice on Tuesday-Thursday. All other requests for interviews must be submitted to the media relations office at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled interview.
- Assistant Coaches: Arrangements should be made through the media relations office. Most interviews will be conducted after practice Tuesday-Thursday.
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Players who attend the Tuesday luncheon will not be available following practice that day.
- Post-game: The Illinois State locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Denver Johnson and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. At home, the post-game media conference will take place in the team room of the Kaufman Football Building, located in the northeast corner of Hancock Stadium. The media should enter through the west doors and travel up the two flights of stairs to the conference area.



**SCOUTING WESTERN KENTUCKY**

- Western Kentucky is located in Bowling Green, Ky., and has an enrollment of 18,645. The Hilltoppers are members of the Gateway Football Conference
- WKU receiver Curtis Hamilton made eight catches for 166 yards and a touchdown in the Western Illinois victory, marking the highest receiving total by a Topper player in more than nine years. He has four TDs this fall after collecting four in 11 contests a year ago, while his 419 yards are already a career high.
- Quarterback Justin Haddix fell nine yards shy of matching his career high after completing 16-of-20 passes for 267 yards and two scores in the Western Illinois win Saturday. Haddix has thrown at least one touchdown pass in five straight games.
- WKU surpassed both 200 yards rushing and passing in posting a season-best 469 yards of total offense against the Leathernecks. The Hilltoppers' average of 8.4 yards per play last time out was their highest since averaging 10 yards per snap in last year's win over West Virginia Tech.

**TOPPER TIDBITS**

- Illinois State head coach Denver Johnson coached ISU's offensive coordinator Justin Fuente and Western Kentucky assistant Eric Mathies while at Murray State during the 1997 season.
- WKU assistant coach Mike Chism was the associate strength and conditioning coach at Minnesota in 2003, where he worked with Redbird receiver Pierre Jackson.
- ISU's Pat Cucci and WKU's Jimmy Caldwell played high school football together at Winter Springs (Fla.) High School.
- Laurént Robinson and Jesse Caesar were both teammates with WKU's Bo Smith at Rockledge (Fla.) High School.
- ISU's Alan Abrams (Mississippi) and WKU's Gabe Wallace (Kentucky) both transferred from SEC schools. Abrams and Western Kentucky's Artis Neal were high school teammates at Apopka (Fla.) High School.
- Illinois State's Clint Keller is the only Redbird on the roster from the state of Kentucky, while Western Kentucky's Jake Gaebler is the only Illinois (Mundelein) native on the Hilltopper roster.

**28 AND COUNTING**

With a catch in tonight's game, Illinois State wide receiver Laurént Robinson will extend his streak of having at least one catch to 29 straight games. The grab will tie the school record, currently held by Vito Golson.

**RUN REMBERT RUN**

Senior running back Pierre Rembert ran through the Murray State defense and then he ran away with the Gateway Football Conference's Offensive Player of the Week honor on Sept. 24. Rembert amassed 184 yards and two touchdowns on the ground, while getting the call 39 times, a new career high for carries. On the first drive of the fourth quarter, Rembert controlled the game by carrying the ball nine straight times during a Redbird drive which took 6:48 off the clock.

**GETTING YOUR PICKS ON ROUTE 66**

With Hancock Stadium located just off nostalgic Route 66, the Redbird defense has been getting their kicks in 2006. Through four games, the 'Birds have intercepted nine passes, which is the second highest total in Division I-AA. The kicker is that the Redbirds are only one interception away from matching last season's total of 10. In addition, the 'Birds are averaging 2.25 picks per game, which would put them on pace for 25 interceptions and break the school record of 22 set in 1984.

**GIMMIE A BREAK**

In Denver Johnson's tenure at Illinois State, the Redbirds have had four off-weeks which occurred during the middle of the regular season, but only two were actually scheduled. The 'Birds had an off-week in 2001 due to the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, and in 2004 had an off-week in late September when ISU's game at Florida Atlantic was postponed due to the threat of Hurricane Jeanne. Including the scheduled off-weeks (2000 and 2002), the Redbirds own a 1-3 record under Johnson with two weeks between games.

**AGAINST ALL ODDS**

In order for the Redbirds to compete for the Gateway Football Conference title, they will need to overcome a pair of slanted statistics in the game at Western Kentucky. First, the 'Birds are winless against the Hilltoppers (0-5) since WKU joined the league. In addition, the 'Birds have only won one of their last six Gateway Conference openers.

**THIS IS A FIRST**

Sure the Redbirds have lost five straight to Western Kentucky, but tonight's game is the first time since the Hilltoppers have joined the Gateway where ISU is the higher-ranked team. In fact, this is the first meeting in Gateway action where Western Kentucky hasn't been nationally ranked.

**OWNING THE OVC**

With the 35-14 win at Murray State, the Redbirds have now accumulated six-straight wins against Ohio Valley Conference opponents. ISU has not lost to an OVC opponent since 2002 when EIU defeated ISU 45-10 in Charleston, Ill., on September 28.

**HE'S BACK!!!**

After missing two games with an ankle sprain, wide receiver Laurént Robinson returned to the Redbird line-up at Murray State and didn't seem to miss a beat. The 2006 Walter Payton Award candidate hauled in six catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns. The performance was his eighth career 100-yard receiving game and he needs one more to tie the school record of nine, held by Rickey Garrett. Robinson's two touchdown catches also increased his school record total to 26.

**HE'S BACK!!! PART TWO**

Kye Stewart was also sidelined against Eastern Illinois with an ankle injury, but returned to his weakside linebacker position at Murray State. Stewart led the Redbirds in tackles with nine, including seven solo stops. He is now second on the team in tackles with 36 and is averaging 12 stops per game.

**REMBERT RUNNING WITH REGULARITY**

Four games into the 2006 season. Four 100-yard rushing games for Illinois State running back Pierre Rembert. With 184 yards against Murray State, Rembert tied the school record for consecutive 100-yard rushing games done by Quincy Washington, Willie Watts and Toby Davis. With a 100-yard game tonight, Rembert would set the school standard.

**CROSS THAT OFF THE LIST**

Both Cameron Siskowic and Leon Kittrell are in their final seasons at Illinois State, but entering the game at Murray State the duo played a combined 63 games in a Redbird uniform without an interception. But, that all changed on Sept. 23. Both Siskowic and Kittrell picked off Murray State quarterback Zach Barnard and recorded the first interceptions of their ISU careers.

**BACK-TO-BACK TRIFECTAS**

With the Redbirds' 35-14 win at Murray State, the 'Birds posted three non-conference victories for a second straight season. It marked the first time the Redbirds have accomplished the feat since the 1998 and 1999 campaigns, which were Illinois State's two previous NCAA I-AA Playoff appearances.

**ACTION JACKSON**

Despite missing all-American wide receiver Laurént Robinson for two games with an ankle injury, senior Pierre Jackson emerged as an alternative deep threat for the Redbirds. "Jelly" notched two consecutive games with 100 yards or more receiving and still leads the team with 21 catches for 364 yards. He has also added three touchdowns.

**IN THE ZONE**

The efficiency the Redbirds have shown in the Red-Zone this season rings like a Hawk Harrelson home run call - "you can put it on the board." Through four games, the 'Birds are 12-for-14 in the Red-Zone with seven touchdowns and five field goals for an 85.7 percent success rate. ISU opponents haven't been in the zone as often, nor have had the success. Redbird foes are 4-for-7 inside the Red-Zone with one touchdown and three field goals.

**NO RUNNING ALLOWED**

It appears the Redbirds have taken a lifeguard approach to the defense this season – no running. In four games, Murray State became the third team ISU has held under 100 yards rushing and the second under 50, when the Racers gained 28 yards on the ground in the Redbirds' 35-14 win. The Redbird defense is allowing just 80 rushing yards per game and ranks No. 6 nationally in that category.

**FOURTH AND FUTILE**

It hasn't been easy converting on fourth down against the Redbirds in 2006. Through four games, ISU opponents are 3-for-9 when "going for it" on fourth down for a 33.3 percent success rate. In fact, opponents haven't had much more success on third down. Redbird foes are 21-for-57 on third down, or 36.8 percent.

**GUNNIN' 'EM DOWN**

Cameron Siskowic is showing why he was named a Buck Buchanan Award watch list member in 2006, as the senior linebacker has recorded 50 tackles in four games. Not only does his total lead the Gateway Football Conference, but he also ranks No. 3 nationally in that category. With a career-high 22 tackles against No. 18 Eastern Illinois earlier in the season, Siskowic has also recorded 3.5 tackles for loss, a sack, an interception and a forced fumble on the season.

**MOVIN' ON UP**

In just his second season as a starter, Luke Drone is starting to creep up the charts in the ISU record book. With his 159 yards passing at Murray State, Drone moved up into sole possession of fourth place on the career passing yards list with 3,868. He needs 511 yards to move into third place ahead of Dusty Burk (1999-01), who passed for 4,378 yards during his Redbird career.

**MAKING MAZUR**

Kevin Mazur is off to a hot start in 2006, as the sophomore placekicker is 6-of-8 in field goal attempts and 12-for-12 in PAT conversions, good for a team-leading 30 points. His 1.5 field goals per game rank him tied for 10th nationally in that category, and he is also making a bid in the ISU record book. Mazur has now made 71.4 percent (15-of-21) of his career field goal attempts, which is just behind school record holder Stephen Carroll's success rate at 71.6 percent.

**APPLYING THE FULL NELSON**

That's exactly what sophomore free safety Tom Nelson has been doing to opposing quarterbacks this season, as he has picked off three passes in the first four games, the first three interceptions of his career. He picked off two of Dylan Meier's attempts down field at Kansas State and snagged a Robbie Park offering in the third quarter against Central Arkansas. Nelson ranks tied for 10th in the country with an average of .75 interceptions per game.

**REMBERT'S RAVE REVIEWS**

Through four games, his first as ISU's featured running back, Pierre Rembert has gotten two thumbs up. With 133.2 rushing yards per game, Rembert ranks No. 5 nationally among running backs. He is on pace to finish the regular season with 1,465 yards on the season, which would rank as the second highest total in Redbird history.

**DRONE: A WORKER QB**

Junior Luke Drone is working the Redbird offense despite all the interchangeable pieces early in the season due to injury. The Redbird offense ranks No. 18 in the national rankings with 379.75 yards per game. The passing offense is No. 19 nationally (232.0 ypg.), while Drone is No. 14, individually, in total offense with 230.25 yards per game.

**THE SISKO KID LOOKS FOR THE FIFTH**

When Brent Hawkins claimed the 2005 Gateway Defensive Player of the Year award, it marked the fourth straight by a Redbird player and tied the league record for consecutive league MVPs with Northern Iowa (1991-94). Cameron Siskowic hopes to extend that ISU streak. The senior linebacker was a finalist for the 2005 Buck Buchanan Award and is a candidate again this year.

**ALL-AMERICA U**

ISU has produced at least one all-American player in 20 of its last 23 seasons. Over the last seven seasons, 27 players from 11 different positions have been honored. Laurent Robinson, Brent Hawkins, Stafford Davis and Cameron Siskowic were all consensus selections in 2005.

**TRANSFERABLE**

Since 1993, when the NCAA rules changed to allow players immediate eligibility at the I-AA level, Illinois State has had 44 players transfer from I-A schools. ISU's I-A transfers on this year's roster include: Alan Abrams (RB, Ole Miss); Adam Blankenship (DL, Nebraska); Pierre Jackson (WR, Minnesota); Brandon Joyce (OL, Indiana); Dan Passarelli (WR, Northern Illinois); Pierre Rembert (RB, Michigan); Cameron Siskowic (LB, Washington St.); Jonathan St-Pierre (OL, Miami (Fla.)) and James Stevenson III (DL, Illinois).

**NOTABLE NEWCOMERS**

Since the Gateway began recognizing an all-newcomer team in 1994, over 42 Redbirds have been cited for achievement in their first season. In 2005, running back Pierre Rembert and defensive back Tom Nelson added their names to the list.

**ANOTHER ONE BITES THE DUST**

With the 44-30 victory over No. 18 Eastern Illinois, the Redbirds have now beaten at least one ranked foe in nine of the last 10 seasons.

**MEN OF HONOR**

The Redbird football team concluded the spring semester with 35 players on the AFNI Athletics Honor Roll, a new team record. The Redbirds also compiled a 2.68 grade point average for the semester, which was the highest team GPA by the football team in over a decade.

**40 DAYS AND 40 NIGHTS**

Actually it is a little less than 67 days – that's how many straight 24-hour days a person would have to work to equal the 1,595 community service hours that the Illinois State football team put in last academic year. Typically, the goal for the entire athletic department is 1,000, but the Redbird gridders put in 1,595 hours themselves.

**SOMEBODY'S WATCHING**

On Aug. 23, both Laurent Robinson and Cameron Siskowic were put on watch. Robinson, a finalist for the 2005 Walter Payton Award, presented to the nation's top I-AA offensive player, was named to the initial watch list for the 2006 award. Likewise, Siskowic was added to the 2006 Buck Buchanan Award watch list after finishing as a finalist last season as one of the nation's top I-AA defensive players.





NORMAL, Ill. - Chris James' 43-yard field goal in regulation and 33-yard field goal in overtime foiled Illinois State's chances to upset No. 3 Western Kentucky, as the Hilltoppers won 37-34 in a Gateway Football Conference game at Hancock Stadium.

**LAST TIME**

Before a Homecoming crowd of 10,416, a 38-yard Kevin Mazur field goal with 50 seconds left put ISU ahead 34-31, but Western Kentucky converted a James' field goal with no time remaining in regulation and held the 'Birds scoreless in overtime to set up James' game-winner.

The Hilltoppers recovered a Redbird fumble on the opening play from scrimmage and marched from the ISU 43 to the Redbird 19-yard line. But a WKU penalty and a Justin Martindale sack pushed the Toppers back and they had to settle for James' first field goal, a 45-yarder, with 11:15 left in the first quarter.

Brian Thompson's 35-yard kickoff return set up the responding drive by Illinois State, which covered 65 yards in 10 plays and was punctuated by Rafael Rice's five-yard run for the score with 6:49 left in the opening quarter. It was Rice's fifth straight game with a rushing touchdown. ISU led 7-3.





**► GAME SUMMARY****ISU Gives K-State a Scare, But Falls 24-23**

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Heading into Saturday's football season opener against Kansas State, the Illinois State Redbirds were determined to give their Division I counterparts a tough game. That is certainly what the Wildcats received from the Redbirds, as a failed two-point conversion with 3:02 left in the fourth quarter left the 'Birds a point short and ISU was defeated 24-23 in front of 47,250 fans at the newly dedicated Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

On the first play from scrimmage, ISU safety Tom Nelson intercepted a long pass from KSU quarterback Dylan Meier and put the Redbirds on offense. The 'Birds took full advantage of the early turnover as Kevin Mazur capped off a 11-play, 53 yard scoring drive with a 35-yard field goal to give the Redbirds a 3-0 lead with 9:42 left in the first quarter.

KSU kicker Jeff Snodgrass connected on a 52-yard field goal to tie the score at 3-3 with 4:54 left in the half. The Wildcats then continued to impress on special teams, as Yamon Figurs returned a Bobby Kelsey punt 81 yards for a touchdown to give KSU a 10-3 lead with just under two minutes remaining in the half.

After receiving the kickoff to start the second half, Luke Drone connected with Pierre Jackson on a 70-yard strike down the sideline to put the 'Birds on the Kansas State six-yard line. Two plays later, Drone found Laurent Robinson in the end zone for a four-yard touchdown pass to tie the score at 10-10.

KSU would answer with 4:35 left in the quarter to re-take the lead 13-10, as Snodgrass connected on his second field goal of the game, this time from 41 yards out. The score would stay that way until the fourth quarter when Drone and Robinson hooked up on their second touchdown pass to put the Redbirds up 17-13. KSU then cut the ISU lead to one 17-16 on Snodgrass' third field goal of the game with 8:36 left to go.

On the ensuing kickoff, however, ISU's Jason Horton fumbled on the return and KSU's Byron Garvin returned the fumble nine yards to put the Wildcats up 24-17. The Redbirds would not go away, though, as Drone then led his team to an 11-play, 47-yard scoring drive that culminated in a three-yard touchdown pass to Jackson to cut the lead to 24-23. Head coach Denver Johnson then made the call to go for the two-point conversion, but Drone was unable to break the plane on the quarterback draw.

**► GAME SUMMARY****Birds Defense Holds UCA Without a TD in 18-3 Win**

NORMAL, Ill. – On a rainy night in the home opener at Hancock Stadium, the Redbird defense shined bright as they did not allow a Central Arkansas touchdown and picked off two passes in a 18-3 victory over Bears in front of 10,262.

The Bears found it extremely hard to run or pass against the 'Birds as junior linebacker Kye Stewart set a career high 14 tackles to lead the team, junior defensive tackle Jarek Thomas recorded three tackles-for-loss and junior free safety Tom Nelson picked off his third pass of the season.

While the defense was close to perfect, holding the Bears to just three points and 63 yards rushing, the offense received strong performances from its receiving core that played without injured All-American wide receiver Laurent Robinson. In Robinson's absence, junior Pierre Jackson shouldered the load, hauling in career highs with 9 receptions for 113 yards and sophomore Jake Rourke hauled in his first career touchdown catch from junior quarterback Luke Drone, who went 16-38 on the night for 228 yards.

The Redbirds got on the board first with a pair of field goals in the first five minutes of the second quarter off the leg of sophomore kicker Kevin Mazur. The Mt. Prospect, Ill., native put the 'Birds up 3-0, following a 23-yard field goal, capping off a 13-play, 83-yard drive at the 14:12 mark. After a quick three-and-out by Central Arkansas, ISU marched 44 yards down the field in seven plays before Mazur booted a 25-yard field goal with 10:04 remaining in the first half to put the Redbirds up 6-0.

The 'Birds quickly scored their lone touchdown just over two minutes into the second half on a 61-yard touchdown strike from Drone to Rourke.

The Bears threatened to get the 12-0 deficit within a touchdown later in the third quarter, but had to settle for a 31-yard field goal by James Paul with 1:25 left.

The Redbirds answered the Bears with a 9-play, 71-yard drive of their own taking 3:40 off the clock. The drive resulted in Mazur's third field goal of the day, this time from 20 yards out, pushing ISU's lead back up to 15-3.

Mazur finished the scoring for the 'Birds, putting them up 18-3 with his fourth field goal at 3:03 left in the fourth quarter. Mazur's fourth field goal of the night set a new career high for a game and tied a Hancock Stadium record.


