The Missouri State football Bears hit the midpoint of their 2007 season schedule and bid to even their Gateway Football Conference record when they play host to the Illinois State Redbirds Saturday (Oct. 29) at 2:07 p.m. in Gateway action at Plaster Field.

Saturday is one of just two home games in a seven-week span from early September to late October in which Missouri State plays five of seven on the road. The Bears come home to stay Oct. 27 with their final three games at Plaster Field. After hosting Illinois State, the Bears go to Western Illinois Oct. 13 and to Southern Illinois Oct. 20 before returning home for the last three games.

**Saturday's Missouri State-Illinois State game will air on Gateway Football Conference TV package with Mitch Holthus, Danan Hughes and Stephanie Follett describing the action. The game will air on FCS Atlantic (2 pm live), Fox College Sports, WYZZ (Bloomington/Normal) (2 pm live) Mediacom (Springfield) (7 pm taped) Comcast SportsNet Chicago (12 noon - Oct. 7 - taped) FSN Midwest (2 am taped - Oct. 7) FSN Midwest (12 noon - Oct. 10 - taped)**

Missouri State is bidding to get back to the .500 mark in league play after a 49-21 loss Saturday at two-time defending Gateway champ and 10th-ranked Youngstown State in the conference opener for both teams. Missouri State will also be looking for its fourth straight home victory and will bid to keep the current 3-2 season standard on the win side. The Bears opened the season with wins over Division II Missouri-Rolla (62-17) and FCS 16th-ranked Tennessee-Martin (51-44), lost 61-10 at Kansas State of the Big 12 Conference, and got a come-from-behind 42-38 home win over Central Arkansas before opening league play at Youngstown State.

Illinois State opened its season with a home loss to Drake. The Redbirds then beat Murray State and won at Eastern Illinois before dropping a 38-17 decision at Missouri. Illinois State faltered in the fourth quarter Saturday in a 23-13 home loss to pre-season Gateway fa-

vorite #3 Northern Iowa in the league opener for both clubs. ISU comes to Springfield Saturday with a 2-3 season record.

Illinois State's program has shown steady improvement in recent years under coach Denver Johnson. The Panthers last year finished 9-4 and were tied for second in the GFC at 5-2. Illinois State got a first-round NCAA FCS playoff win over Eastern Illinois last year before losing to Youngstown State in the quarterfinals. Illinois State was ranked eighth in the final 2006 FCS poll.

Missouri State has six home games in 2007, including three home league games. In contrast, however, to the last five years, the Bears have non-conference play after their league schedule begins. MSU closes its campaign at home Nov. 10 vs. Southeast Missouri State. That addition to the schedule came when Western Kentucky left the Gateway after the 2006 season for the Sun Belt Conference.

The Bears have nothing but day games the rest of the season after opening with four straight at night and a 5 p.m. start Saturday at Youngstown State.

**Terry Allen's Radio Show** airs primarily on Tuesdays on KWTO (98.7 FM) at 7:00 p.m. from Trolley's Restaurant and is hosted by KTXR sports director Art Hains.

**Missouri State Football Luncheons:** Terry Allen will speak at the Bears' Football Lunches each Friday (first week is Aug. 29, Wednesday) prior to home games during the season at 12 noon at Springfield Brewing Company, 301 South Market. **The Coaches: Terry Allen** (UNI, '76) is 5-11 with the Bears in his second year at Missouri State; 100-70 overall in his 15th year as a college head coach. He's 7-3 vs. ISU. (*Allen detailed bio and Missouri State and Gateway win lists attached*).

**Denver Johnson** (Tulsa, '81) is 43-42 in his seventh year at ISU and 64-54 in his 11th year overall as a college head coach. Johnson is 6-1 vs. MSU.

**Series record:** Illinois State leads, 14-12 with one tie. ISU has had much the better of things in recent years with five straight wins and seven wins in its last eight meetings with Missouri State. MSU last won vs. the Redbirds at home in 2001. MSU had won eight straight and 11 of 13 from Illinois State (1986-98) before the Redbirds made a decisive turnaround in the series. The series began in 1971 with four meetings, all ISU wins, and resumed in 1983. (*series scores attached*).

**Affiliation:** Missouri State is in its 26th Division I FCS season and 22nd Gateway Football Conference year. MSU was in the NCAA College Division from 1956 until Division II was established in 1974. League affiliations have included the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1924-81), Mid-Continent (1981-84) and Gateway (1985-05). Missouri State has had winning seasons 11 of 25 FCS years, and reached FCS playoffs in 1989 and 1990. The 1989 and 1990 seasons included the Bears' only league (Gateway) titles since moving to FCS. The 2005 season marks the 23rd year for Gateway competition in what has become the top FCS league in the country. *The Gateway:*

- Has had two or more teams in the FCS playoffs each of the last 12 years.
- Has had a playoff semifinalist eight of the last 11 years.
- Is the only FCS league in which every league member has had at least one playoff appearance.
- Owns national titles from Youngstown State (1997) and Western Kentucky (2002).
- Became the first FCS league to put four teams in the playoffs the same year (2003).
- Had both the I-AA National Coach of the Year (Jerry Kill of SIU) and the I-AA National Player of the Year (Boomer Grigsby of Illinois State) in 2004.

**Missouri State All-Time:** Missouri State is in its 96th football season with a mark of 423-422-40 (.5001) for 885 games. The Bears first played in 1909 and have had a team all but three years since. MSU has had 45 winning seasons, 47 losing seasons and three .500 years. The longest MSU string of consecutive winning seasons is five, done three times (1947-51, '62-66, '89-93). The Bears' most recent winning seasons were 2001 and 2004.

**Missouri State in 2006:** In their first year under head coach Terry Allen, the Bears finished with a 2-9 season record and were 1-6 in Gateway Football Conference play. Missouri State beat Southwest Baptist in its home opener and clipped GFC foe Western Illinois in the home season finale for the team's only wins. Missouri State lost four games by a touchdown or less and dropped another contest by 10 points. Two seniors--free safety Mike Radon and offensive tackle Justin Williamson--shared the football Coors Player of the Year honor. Radon led the team in interceptions and was third in total tackles while Williamson was the line's top graded blocker throughout the campaign. The Bears began the year with an entirely new quarterback corps and had injuries at that position to compound the inexperience. Matt Krapfl and Tyler Horner, both redshirt freshmen in 2006, wound up starting four games each as the team's signal-caller. Missouri State had 25 seniors on its ballclub in 2006.

**NFL Bears:** Missouri State has two players on current NFL rosters, including **OL Jason Whittle** (Bills) and **LS/TE Brad St. Louis** (Bengals). Whittle spent four years with the Giants, including an appearance in the 2002 Super Bowl. He spent a year with Tampa Bay and two more with the Giants before moving to Minnesota last year and Buffalo this year. St. Louis is in his eighth year with the Bengals.

**Personnel:** The Bears are young. Half the 90 squad members hadn't played in a Missouri State game before UMR, and 29 of the Bears who played vs. UMR were in their first game for Missouri State, including 24 freshmen. Of the rookies, 14 were redshirt freshmen and 10 were true freshmen. There are 26 lettermen back from last season. QB Matt Krapfl, QB Tyler Horner, OC David Tillman, WR Jeremy Nicholson, WR Chris Geisz, FB Jeff Sargent and WR Eric Davis on offense and LB Jeron Poole and CB Marcus Colbert on defense are returning regulars from last year. Geisz has moved from wide receiver to the defensive secondary this year.

**Captains:** The Bears' 2007 captains include LB Jeron Poole, CB Marcus Colbert, TB Gerald Davis and OC David Tillman. All are seniors.

## Missouri State Head Coach Terry Allen

Terry Allen has begun his rebuilding job with Missouri State football and looks forward to the challenge of the changing landscape of the Gateway Football Conference and Football Championship Subdivision as he sets a course to make the Bears a competitive factor at both levels.

Allen has wrapped two solid recruiting years around his first season with the Bears in a league his University of Northern Iowa teams dominated for nearly a decade, and will work to build a personnel base to make Missouri State a contender in the nation's best FCS league.

Allen, who followed more than 20 years of success as player and coach at UNI with five seasons as head coach at Kansas, came to Missouri State in 2006 after four years as associate head coach, tight ends coach and special teams coordinator at Iowa State. Allen is the 19th head coach in the 96-year history of Missouri State football.

In his first year at MSU, Allen and his staff went through a 2-9 season on a squad top-heavy with seniors trying to adapt to new systems on offense and defense. The Bears dropped four games by a TD or less and another by 10 points. With a year under their belts, Allen is ready to move forward to match the type of success he enjoyed at UNI.

Allen's eight years as UNI head coach from 1989 to 1996 have him among the all-time leaders even by the lofty standards the Panther program has had. Allen has the highest winning percentage of any UNI coach who's guided the Panthers for more than one season.

When Allen left UNI in 1996, his 75-26 (.743) record made him the winningest coach in Gateway history. His Panther teams won or shared Gateway titles in 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 and competed in the NCAA I-AA playoffs his last seven seasons at UNI, advancing to the national semifinals in 1992 and 1996. He was Gateway Coach of the Year five times his last six seasons at UNI.

A native of Iowa City, Iowa, Allen was a quarterback at West High School and was the starting UNI quarterback for three seasons. After graduating from UNI in 1979, Allen worked on the UNI staffs of Sheriff, Mudra and Earle Bruce through 1988.

Allen's teams were 20-33 in five seasons at Kansas. His tenure there saw wins over nationally-ranked Colorado, a win over Oklahoma and three wins over arch-rival Missouri.

Moving to Iowa State in 2002, Allen renewed a long relationship with Cyclone head coach Dan McCarney. McCarney and Allen grew up together in Iowa City and McCarney was Allen's prep track coach at Iowa City West. In Allen's four seasons at ISU, the Cyclones went to three bowl games.

Allen and his wife, Lynn, have three children; Angela, Chase and Alex.



### Bruinotes:

- The Bears' 3-2 record includes the four-point win Sept. 22 over Central Arkansas and a seven-point win at Tennessee-Martin Sept. 6. Last year Missouri State was 1-5 in games decided by 10 points or less.

- The loss at Youngstown State Sept. 29 was the Bears' sixth loss in six trips to Stambaugh Stadium and Missouri State is now 1-11 all-time against the Penguins.

- TB Gerald Davis and QB Cody Kirby each ran for a TD at Youngstown State. Through five games, Davis and Kirby have scored seven TDs each. Last year's individual leader for the 11-game season was Jeremy Nicholson with four touchdowns.

- WR Jeremy Nicholson has had four career games with more than the 51 yards receiving he had at YSU Sept. 29, but his seven catches vs. the Penguins set a new career high. Nicholson scored the Bears' third TD at YSU, marking his seventh career scoring reception. (*career receiving statistics attached*).

- The Bears' Sept. 15 game at Kansas State was played before a crowd of 46,825 at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. That marks the third largest crowd ever to watch a Bears' football game, topped only by Missouri State's visits to Arkansas in 2001 and 2005. The Bears' top 15 and 18 of their top 21 all-time crowds have come against FBS teams. The 19,617 at YSU Sept. 29 was the 17th largest MSU crowd.

- With their 3-2 start, the Bears are getting support in FCS polls for the first time in many years, but have fallen from the top 40 after last week's loss. The Bears' point totals had them ranged from 28th to 38th in four polls Sept. 24, 29th to 39th Sept. 17 and between 25th and 34th Sept. 10.

- The Bears started 2-0 with a lot of offense on Thursdays. The Bears' win over No. 16 Tennessee-Martin was their first win over a ranked FCS team since a home win over Northern Iowa in 2005. It was also the Bears' first road win since Oct. 16, 2004, and ended a string of 11 straight Missouri State losses away from Springfield. The Bears were also 2-0 to start a season for the first time since 2004, and the Bears owned the longest active win streak in the Gateway at three before losing at Kansas State.

- At 3-2, the Bears have topped their win total of all of last year in a 2-9 season. They went into Gateway play with

just one non-conference loss for the sixth time in the past seven years. The only year in which the Bears had more than one non-conference loss was 2006.

- The win over #16 Tennessee-Martin came over the defending Ohio Valley Conference champs, an NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoff team last year. The win over Central Arkansas settled the score for a 16-14 loss at UCA last year and evened the series between the Bears and the Bears at 3-3.

- The offensive free-for-all at UTM took three and a half hours to complete and marked the fifth highest combined point total for two teams in a game in the 96-year, 882-game history of Missouri State football. It was the most points an MSU team has ever allowed in a victory, the most a UTM team has ever scored in a loss, and it was the highest point total for a Bear ballclub in a game since . . . 62 against Missouri-Rolla the previous week. It was the first time the Bears have put 50-point games back-to-back since 1978 and also the most points MSU has scored in consecutive games since 1978.

- The two ballclubs amassed 987 total yards between them in the contest with UTM owning a 542-435 advantage for the night but the Bears got some key stops deep in their own territory, protected the football all night and were penalized nearly 100 fewer yards than UTM.

- Offense was still the order of the day Sept. 22 against UCA. The Bears and the Bears amassed 1,052 yards, with UCA having a 562-490 edge.

- Freshman QB Cody Kirby was the Gateway Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the UCA game. He hit 22-of-38 passes for 247 yards and two touchdowns and carried nine times for 40 yards and three more touchdowns, including the game-winner with 21 seconds left in the fourth quarter. It was a complete game effort by Kirby in his first collegiate start. He became only the 12th Missouri State quarterback to complete 22 or more passes in a game.

- MSU guards David Arkin and Seth Reichert shared the Gateway Football Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week honor vs. UCA. Each graded out at 92 percent in blocking assignments, had nine pancakes and allowed no sacks.

- LB Jeron Poole was in on 14 tackles vs. UCA, single-game high for an MSU

player this season. LB Jeremy Dawson and CB Derek Miller were in on a dozen stops each and LB Sam Block had 10.

- Bears' senior K Nathan Stokes was named Gateway Football Conference Special Teams Player of the Week and MSU Coors Player of the Week for his performance at UTM. Stokes provided a record-tying 15 points on three field goals and six extra points against the Skyhawks. Stokes was perfect in his nine placement attempts as his 15 points tied a Missouri State single game kick scoring record set by Richard Grote in 1990 vs. Indiana State and tied by Wayne Boyer in 1996 vs. Tennessee-Martin. Stokes's three field goals tied his career best in that department, matching the trio he kicked last year at Indiana State, and his 44-yarder in the final period was five yards longer than his previous career long. Stokes also had two punts for 31.5 yards and gained six yards for a first down on a fake punt.

- Defensively at UTM, the Bears got nine solo stops among 13 tackles by LB Jeron Poole while CB Derek Miller had nine stops and LB Sam Block eight.

- Gateway teams enjoyed three straight 5-2 weeks before opening conference play last weekend. The loss by Western Illinois to future Gateway member North Dakota State Sept. 29 dropped league schools to 19-10 against outside opposition this season.

- In their first two games, the Bears had the football 27 times. They scored on 18 of those possessions (15 TDs, 3 field goals), punted twice, turned the ball over three times and had the ball when time expired at the end of a half four times.

- The UMR win was the first time since 2004 Missouri State had won its season opener. MSU is 12-14 in season openers in Division I FCS. In beating the Miners, the Bears won their home opener for the 10th year in a row and are 20-4-2 in home openers in FCS. The all-time Missouri State record in season openers is 48-45-3.

- The UMR contest saw 29 Bears make their college playing debuts, including 24 freshmen. Ten of the rookies were true freshmen and the others were redshirts.

- Against Missouri-Rolla, the Bears rolled up their highest point total team since a 63-14 win over Drake in 2001.

- TB Gerald Davis tied a Missouri State record shared by nine others with

four rushing TDs in the UMR contest. He had 110 yards on 15 carries and also caught a pass to get selection as Missouri State Coors Player of the Week and the Gateway Offensive Player of the Week. With Jonathan Davis getting 113 yards on 19 carries, it was the first time two Bears had gained 100 or more yards on the ground in a contest in four seasons.

- WR Tamarkus McElvane had four catches for 139 yards vs. UMR for the most receiving yards for a Bear since 2005. It was also a career best for McElvane at Missouri State. WR Eric Davis had five receptions for 76 yards, matching his career best for receptions while setting a

new best in receiving yards for a game. McElvane came back with 10 receptions for 109 yards against UCA, marking the first time a Missouri State player had had double-digit receptions in a game since Steve Rush did it three times in 2004.

- In the UMR game, the Bears scored touchdowns on nine of their 14 possessions. They turned the pigskin over three times and had the ball at the end of each half on the other five possessions. Missouri State did not punt in the contest.

- For fans who like to get comfortable and watch offense, Bear games this year are the place to be. Sept. 29 at YSU, 70

points were scored in 3 hours. Sept. 22 vs. UCA, 80 points were scored in 3 hours, 20 minutes. Sept. 15 at Kansas State, 71 points were scored in 3 hours, 31 minutes. Sept. 6 at UTM, 95 points were scored in 3 hours, 25 minutes. And, the season opener vs. Missouri-Rolla saw 79 points scored in a speedy two hours, 50 minutes. MSU and its opponents have accounted for 63 scoring plays (52 TDs, 11 FGs), an average of 12.5 scores a game. In 2006, The Bears' and their foes averaged 7.6 scoring plays over the 11-game season.

● And, for all the offensive fireworks, the games haven't been full of giveaways. In five games, the Bears have turned the ball over six times (4 int., 2 fum.) and their combined foes have surrendered it six times (3 int., 3 fum.)

● With 28 points in the first quarter vs. UMR, the Bears tied the MSU record for points in the first quarter of a game, set in 1992 vs. Washburn.

● The Bears' 690 total yards vs. UMR tied the third best single game total on record at MSU. The 35 first downs were within one of a single game team record.

## Robert W. Plaster Sports Complex: Home of the Bears

Missouri State football has been played at its present site since 1930, and the current stadium opened 9/19/41, with a 46-0 win over Southeastern Oklahoma State. The stadium got a facelift at its 50th birthday with addition of an artificial playing surface in 1987, all-weather running track in 1988, more seating and east side facilities in 1990, and a major west side renovation in 1991 which included an upper deck, new press box, skyboxes, souvenir and concessions stands, restrooms, racquetball courts and student activity and weight training areas. The Plaster Strength Center was added in 1998 and the stadium got new FieldTurf in 2006. The stadium was renamed in 1991 for Robert W. Plaster, chairman of the board of Evergreen Investments LLC, of Lebanon, Mo.

**Missouri State at home:** The longest Missouri State home win streak is 18 games (1938-41) and the longest Plaster Field win streak is 13 games (1989-92). Missouri State was 27-3 at home from mid-1988 through 1993 and is 67-37 at home since 1989. MSU has had winning home seasons four of the past six years and was unbeaten at home in 1948, 1963, 1974, 1989 and 1992. Current home streak is three wins.

**Home Attendance:** Missouri State has averaged more than 10,000 fans a game in 10 of the 16 seasons since the 1991 renovation nearly doubled Plaster seating capacity to 16,300. MSU has topped 50,000 in total home attendance the last 15 years in a row. Missouri State has been among NCAA Division I-AA's top 40 schools in average home attendance each of the last 10 years, ranking 31st in 1995, 14th in 1996, 11th in 1997, 39th in 1998, 24th in 1999, 30th in 2000, 34th in 2001, 32nd in 2002, 40th in 2003, 32nd in 2004, 25th in 2005 and 34th in 2006.

## Bears 62, Missouri-Rolla 17

Plaster Field, Springfield, Mo.  
August 30, 2007

The Missouri State Bears punched up a record-tying 28 points in the first quarter and amassed 690 total yards in rolling past the University of Missouri-Rolla Miners 62-17 in the Bears' season opener at Plaster Field. UMR fell to 0-2.

The Bears got rushing touchdowns from four different backs and three of those were true freshmen. Senior co-captain TB Gerald Davis set the tone as he tied a Missouri State record shared by nine other people with four rushing touchdowns in the contest. Rookie tailbacks Stephen Johnston and Kingjack Washington and freshman QB Cody Kirby scored once each and redshirt freshman TB Jonathan Davis and G. Davis each topped 100 yards rushing. It was the first time two Bears had gained 100 or more yards on the ground in a contest in four seasons.

G. Davis started at tailback and had 110 yards and four scores on 15 carries. Washington collected 60 yards on seven rushes, Johnston added 78 on nine carries and J. Davis was the most productive with 113 yards on 19 carries.

Operating with a no-huddle offense from a shotgun formation most of the night, the Bears were effective early through the air, then stayed on the ground most of the second half. QB Matt Krapfl hit 8-of-12 passes for 200 yards and one touchdown with Kirby hitting 5-of-8 and Tyler Horner connecting on all 3-of-3 as the trio combined for an efficient 16-of-23 for 293 aerial yards. Krapfl found WR Tamarkus McElvane on a 55-yard scoring pass early in the second period and Horner threw a nine-yard TD aerial to WR Jared Emery to open the fourth period. The 16 catches were spread among nine receivers. McElvane grabbed four for 139 yards and WR Eric Davis had five receptions for 76 yards.

After G. Davis and Washington scored the first two times the Bears had the ball, UMR's Antonio Williams returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to put the Miners on the board. G. Davis and Johnston then scored to make it 28-7 after a quarter as the Bears tied the MSU record for points in a first quarter, set in 1992 against Washburn. McElvane's long scoring reception and G. Davis' third TD made it 41-7 at halftime, and Davis scored again midway in the third period before the regulars retired for the night.

Defensively, the Bears went three units deep with LB Sam Block and LB Dan Graham coming up with pass interceptions while CB Derek Miller recovered a fumble. LB Jeron Poole and Block led the way with six tackles each. UMR was held to 206 yards in offense.

## Bears 51, UT Martin 44

Graham Stadium, Martin, Tenn.  
September 6, 2007

The Missouri State football Bears jumped on top by 14 points in the first three minutes of the game and stayed in front the rest of the night to record a stunning 51-44 upset of the 16th-ranked and defending Ohio Valley Conference champion Tennessee-Martin Skyhawks Thursday night in Martin, Tenn., at Graham Stadium. It was the Bears' first road win since Oct. 16, 2004, ended a string of 11 straight Missouri State losses away from Springfield and made MSU 2-0 for the first time since the start of the 2004 season.

The Bears were in front 14-0 three minutes into the contest. After a 50-yard kickoff return by Kingjack Washington to open the game, the Bears needed just six plays to score with QB Matt Krapfl going in from the six. An MSU stop got the ball back and Krapfl fired a 61-yard TD pass to WR Tamarkus McElvane to make it 14-0 with 3:08 elapsed. The teams traded field goals and then touchdowns, with QB Cody Kirby scoring on an 11-yard run midway in the second period. A second UTM field goal cut the Bears' advantage to 24-13 at the half.

The Skyhawks scored to open the third quarter but K Nathan Stokes hit his second MSU field goal, WR Eric Davis scored on a 20-yard pass from Krapfl and Stokes nailed a career-long 44-yard three-pointer to make it 37-20 a minute into the final quarter. The two teams swapped touchdowns again with TB Gerald Davis on a five-yard run and Kirby on a six-yard scamper keeping the Bears' side of the scoreboard moving to make it 51-34 with three minutes left. UTM took advantage of a recovered outside kick and one of just two punts in the game by MSU to tack on a late TD and field goal but the Bears had the ball at the end and ran out the clock.

G. Davis with 83 yards and Washington with 80 led the Bears on the ground while Krapfl's 5-of-10 throwing night included his two TD tosses as he finished with 140 yards. E. Davis had five catches for 99 yards to go with his four kickoff returns for 84. The three field goals by Stokes matched his career high for a game, set last year at Indiana State.

Defensively, the Bears got nine solo stops among 13 tackles by LB Jeron Poole while CB Derek Miller was in on nine stops and LB Sam Block had eight.

## Kansas State 61, Bears 10

Bill Snyder Family Stadium, Manhattan, Kan.  
September 15, 2007

The Kansas State Wildcats exploded in the first and third periods and rolled past the previously-unbeaten Missouri State Bears 61-10 in non-conference football action Saturday evening at Bill Snyder Family Stadium in Manhattan, Kan.

The Wildcats amassed a 21-0 lead 12 minutes into the contest. Missouri State got its lone touchdown late in the second period and trailed 27-7 at the half, but critical mistakes after the intermission enabled the Big 12 Conference Wildcats to blow it open. The result left both teams 2-1 for the early non-conference season.

After Kansas State marched the second half kickoff down to score, an errant option pitch gave the ball back to the Wildcats on the Bears' next play from scrimmage. Kansas State punched in another quick score to make it 41-7. The Bears made an onside kickoff attempt after they collected a field goal but K-State got the ball and quickly added a third touchdown of the period. Only with a 47-10 lead through three quarters did Kansas State remove its regulars.

The Wildcats rolled up 546 yards in total offense to 191 for the Bears in the first-ever football meeting between the two schools. The Bears got just 69 yards on the ground.

WR Jordy Nelson spearheaded the Kansas State attack as he caught 15 passes for 209 yards and one touchdown, threw a halfback option touchdown pass for the Wildcats' first touchdown of the contest, and also ran back two punts for 82 yards. The 15 catches Nelson had are the most ever by an individual in a game against Missouri State.

TB Kingjack Washington got Missouri State's lone touchdown with 4:36 left in the second period on a nine-yard run and finished with 45 yards on 10 carries. QB Cody Kirby, also a freshman, completed nine of 17 passes for 62 yards, and TE Clay Harbor was the Bears' leading receiver with four catches for 53 yards.

Kansas State got 114 yards and three touchdowns rushing from TB James Johnson and QB Josh Freeman completed 26 of 39 passes for 287 yards. The Wildcats compounded their offensive attack by adding 181 yards on punt returns and 62 more on kickoff runbacks.

A fake field goal pass from holder Jake Spavital to FB Jeff Sargent gave the Bears the ball on the KSU one late in the third quarter but Missouri State couldn't punch it home and had to settle for a field goal from K Nathan Stokes. It was Stokes' fourth field goal in as many tries this season.

CB Marcus Colbert led the Missouri State defense with 12 tackles and a pass breakup while LB Sam Block was in on nine tackles and S Chris Farrar had a hand in eight stops.

## Bears 42, Central Ark. 38

Plaster Field, Springfield, Mo.  
Sept. 22, 2007

Freshman QB Cody Kirby rolled untouched into the end zone from two yards out with 21 seconds left in the fourth quarter to bring the Missouri State Bears from behind for the third time in the contest on their way to a 42-38 non-league win over the Central Arkansas Bears at Plaster Field.

Kirby's third touchdown of the game provided Bears' second-year head coach Terry Allen the 100th victory of his coaching career. Central Arkansas fell to 1-3 with the loss.

Central Arkansas took a 31-28 lead on a field goal with 9:41 left in the game as the Bears punted four straight times in the second half after punching up four straight touchdowns in the first half for a 28-21 halftime lead. A tipped pass was intercepted by UCA after Central Arkansas took the lead but MSU forced a punt and then drove 80 yards on eight plays to regain the lead. TB Kingjack Washington got 63 yards on four carries and TB Gerald Davis went in from the four to give MSU a 35-31 edge with 3:10 left.

UCA started on its own 10 and covered the last 78 yards on four straight pass completions by QB Nathan Brown. Brown hit WR Cedric Logan for the final 30 yards and a TD to slip UCA back into the lead at 38-35 with 1:20 to play.

FB Waylon Richardet returned a short kickoff 26 yards to the UCA 39. Kirby then hit McElvane for three passes to get MSU to the UCA two. Kirby then went over the left side of the line and in for the winning TD with 21 seconds left.

Central Arkansas got on the board with a TD midway in the first period before Missouri State answered with three straight touchdowns. Kirby threw a five-yard scoring pass to TE Clay Harbor and then scored twice himself on one-yard runs for a 21-7 lead midway through the second period. UCA got a 53-yard TD throw from Brown to WR Willie Landers to close to within 21-14 but Missouri State went 66 yards in six plays with Kirby getting a nine-yard TD pass to McElvane with 2:55 left before halftime. Central Arkansas came right back and marched 56 yards in just over two minutes to score with 22 seconds left before halftime.

While it was slowing MSU in the third quarter, UCA got a 66-yard TD pass from Brown to Landers with 8:33 left to tie the game and set up four lead changes the last period.

The offensive show produced 1,052 yards to go with the 80 points the two teams had, with UCA enjoying a 562-490 edge in total yards. For Missouri State, Kirby was 22-of-38 for 247 yards. McElvane caught 10 passes for 104 yards, WR Eric Davis had six catches for 62 yards and TE Clay Harbor caught five for 80 yards. G. Davis rushed for 121 yards on 16 carries and K. Washington had 82 yards.

## Youngstown St. 49, Bears 21

Stambaugh Stadium, Youngstown, Ohio  
September 29, 2007

Youngstown State combined a strong defense and solid ground game to roll past the Missouri State Bears 49-21 in the Gateway Football Conference opener for both squads. The Penguins rushed for 304 yards and scored five times on the ground while limiting MSU to 305 yards total offense.

Trailing 7-0 after Missouri State's Gerald Davis bolted 51 yards for a touchdown on the Bears' first offensive possession of the contest, Youngstown State reeled off 28 unanswered points and held MSU's offense in check for most of the evening to post its fourth consecutive victory.

Youngstown State took control of the contest in the second quarter, thanks largely to a defense that was able to get consistent pressure on MSU QB Cody Kirby. YSU sacked the Bears' freshman signal-caller three times in the period, and free safety Dorian Chenault's interception near mid-field at the 2:17 mark set up a crucial Penguin scoring drive. Two plays after Kevin Smith's 19-yard run gave Youngstown State a first-and-goal, Ferlando Williams, Jr. ran five yards to give the Penguins a 21-7 cushion.

Williams's touchdown put the finishing touches on a dominant second-quarter performance by YSU that saw the Penguins outgain the Bears 144 to 29 in total yardage. The home team racked up 299 yards of total offense to the Bears' 130 in the opening half.

The Penguins kept the pressure on to start the second half. A deep punt by YSU's Ben Nowicki pinned the Bears inside the five to open the second half. After the Penguins' defense held MSU, Youngstown marched the ball 41 yards in four plays. Smith carried for the final seven yards to top the 100-yard rushing mark and score his third touchdown of the evening to extend YSU's lead to 28-7 with 10:38 to go in the third period. Smith finished the night with 102 yards on 15 carries to lead the YSU ground game.

The Bears responded with a 74-yard scoring march that trimmed the deficit to 14 after Kirby found Jeremy Nicholson in the end zone for a six-yard strike. But YSU answered, scoring on a three-yard run by Williams to take a 35-14 lead. The Penguins recovered a fumble on the ensuing kickoff and only had to go 28 yards for another score, a three-yard pass from Tom Zetts to Ben Lane that capped an 11-minute span in which YSU outscored the Bears 28-7.

Missouri State got off to a quick start in the first half when Davis broke loose on a third and short from the MSU 49 to give the Bears a lead just two minutes into the ballgame. Youngstown State answered with a touchdown on its first possession of the game when Smith finished off a 65-yard drive with an 11-yard run up the middle to pull the Penguins even.
