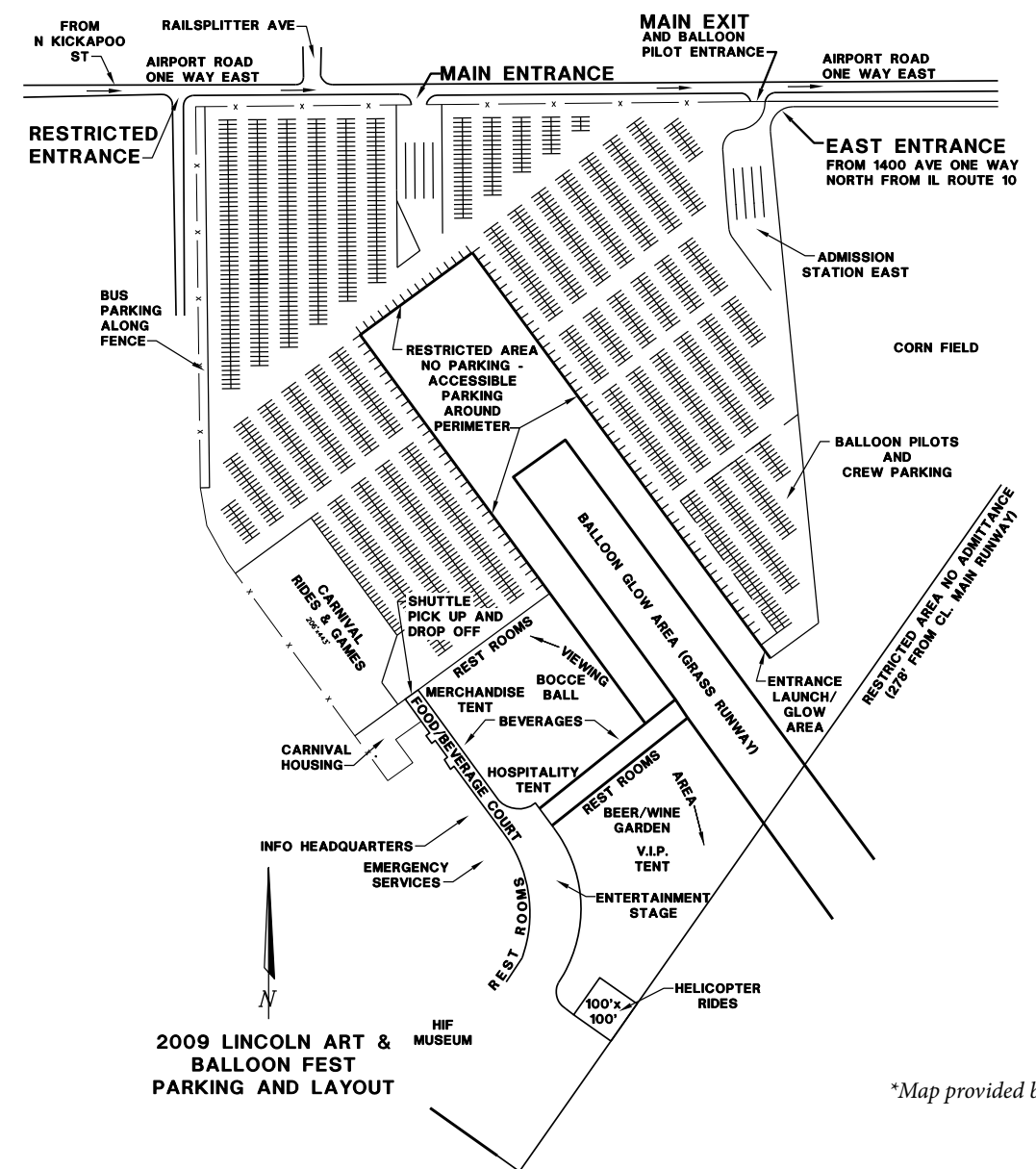

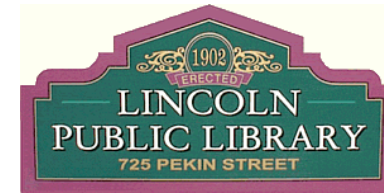

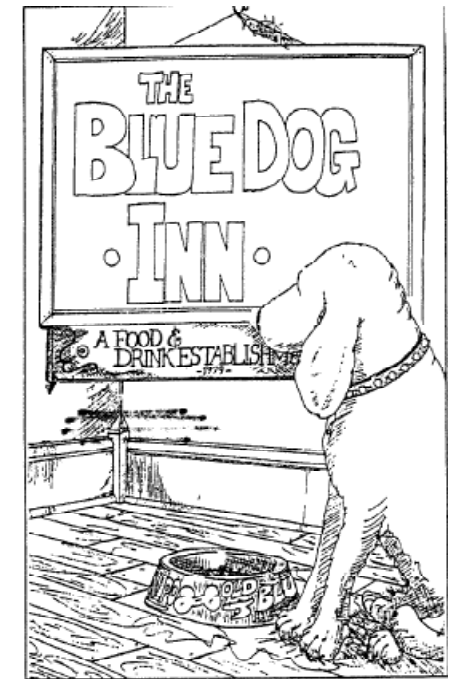

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the cost to attend?

Admission to the portion of the Lincoln Art and Balloon Festival held at the Logan County Airport is \$5.00 for persons over the age of 12. The cost for children 12 and younger is \$1.00. Your admission wristband is valid for both Friday and Saturday night of the event at the airport. Parking is free with your admission.

Admission wristbands are non-refundable in case of inclement weather.

Admissions to the Lincoln Art Fair, Craft Fair/Flea Market are free to the public to enjoy. Activity fees downtown are determined by each individual vendor.

How do I get to the Logan County Airport?

The Logan County Airport is located on Airport Road in Lincoln, IL. Local traffic may access the airport via North Kickapoo Street turning east on Airport Road or 1400th Ave. from Illinois State Route 10.

Out of town guests may access Lincoln via Interstate 55 exits 123, 126 and 133. Ample signage will be provided to provide directions to the airport. See page 19 for complete directions.

Where are the downtown Lincoln activities located?

The Lincoln Art Fair is located in Latham Park on Kickapoo Street. The Craft Fair is located three blocks south in Scully Park. Between the two parks will be activities, food vendors and much more for everyone to enjoy!

Where is the best place to park for downtown activities?

There will be limited parking along streets around the activities. Public parking lots are located on Kickapoo Street at the recycle bins, parking lot next to the Public Library, and Shay Parking lot across from Scully Park off of Clinton Street.

Where can we watch the hot air balloons?

Any spot in the airport is perfect for viewing the balloons! We encourage our guests to walk among the balloons and talk with the pilots. Seating is also available throughout the airport in the Hospitality Tent. Guests are encouraged to bring lawn chairs.

What is a launch?

A launch is the term used when the hot air balloons ascend into the air. The crew and pilot prepare the balloon for the launch which takes approximately 10 to 15 minutes total. All 35 hot air balloons will launch for each flight. Saturday about 6:30 am balloons will launch at different locations around Logan County and fly into the airport for a breathtaking site – weather permitting.

What is a glow?

A glow takes place at dusk on Friday and Saturday night –weather permitting. A selected number of balloons will inflate while remaining tethered to the ground. An announcer will play games and fun activities with the pilots as they light up their balloon – essentially “glowing.”

Are pets allowed at the Lincoln Art and Balloon Festival?

Pets are not allowed at the Lincoln Art and Balloon Festival, except handicap assisting pets.

Is smoking allowed at the Lincoln Art and Balloon Festival?

There is no smoking allowed at the Lincoln Art and Balloon Festival.

Are guests allowed to bring outside food and beverages?

Guests are not permitted to bring outside food and beverages into the gates of the Logan County Airport. Beverage centers are located throughout the airport grounds selling soft drinks and bottled water. A wide variety of concession stands are set-up in the airport as well. We are sure you will find something for everybody!

Throughout downtown Lincoln there will be concession vendors and beverage centers. Latham Park features a concession stand operated by the Lincoln Junior Women’s Club while Scully Park features a stand operated by the Oasis Senior Center.

Are large backpacks and bags allowed at the Festival?

Yes, but any backpack or bag is subject to inspection at any time.

Are lawn chairs allowed at the Festival?

Yes, we encourage guests to bring lawn chairs to find their perfect seat to watch the balloons.

What types of entertainment will be available?

Live Entertainment will be playing at the airport on Friday and Saturday night. For a complete list of entertainment please see pages 16 & 17.

Who organizes the Lincoln Art and Balloon Festival?

The Lincoln/Logan County Chamber of Commerce organizes the Festival each year. The staff includes Executive Director–Andi Hake, Events Coordinator–Heidi Browne, Business Manager–Robin Keys, Member Services–Ally Leesman and Office Assistant–Kelsey Lowman along with hundreds of volunteers.

Is the Festival handicap accessible?

Yes. The airport features handicap accessible parking right by the hot air balloon launch site. This allows for easy viewing of the hot air balloons. There will also be shuttles from the parking lot to the activities for guest that would like to take advantage of this free service.

Downtown, handicap parking is located around both parks and throughout the downtown area.

What do chase crews do?

The chase crew is responsible for assisting the pilot inflate and deflate their balloon for each flight. Once the hot air balloons launch from the Logan County Airport it is essential for the chase crew to depart quickly and follow their balloon on their journey through Logan County. Balloon sponsors provide the chase crew for the balloon they sponsor.

What is the VIP Tent?

The VIP tent is a great opportunity to view the hot air balloons and live entertainment in a prime location at the Logan County Airport. The VIP tent is located adjacent to the Beer and Wine Garden. This tent is only open to sponsors, pilots and crew on Friday evening. Saturday evening at 8:30 p.m. will be the VIP dinner in the tent. This dinner is open to the general public. Tickets need to be purchased in advance of the festival.

What types of competitions do the pilots compete in at the Festival?

There is a competition during each flight. Competitions include bean bag tosses to a target, races and more! In most

cases pilots are required to hit a target placed on the ground with a bean bag. This task can be quite challenging and takes skill.

Where is the ATM located at the Lincoln Art & Balloon Festival?

Downtown Lincoln has several banks that are home to an ATM – Logan County Bank, State Bank of Lincoln and Regions Bank. Please visit the Art & Craft Fair Headquarters tents for more information.

There will not be an ATM at the Logan County Airport. Please be sure to have plenty of cash to enjoy *all* the activities at the airport.

Where can I purchase Festival souvenirs?

Both, downtown and airport locations have booths that sell official Festival souvenirs. The merchandise tent is located at the Logan County Airport across from the food vendors. Downtown, souvenirs and merchandise can be found in Latham Park at the Art Fair headquarters tent. Both locations offer merchandise for adults and children.

What are the dates of future Lincoln Art and Balloon Festivals?

Can we park our RV at the Logan County Airport?

No, but RV parking is available at the Logan County Fairgrounds in Lincoln, Illinois. The fairgrounds are just a short drive to both the airport and downtown activities. To make a reservation for your RV please call the Fair office at (217) 732-3311.

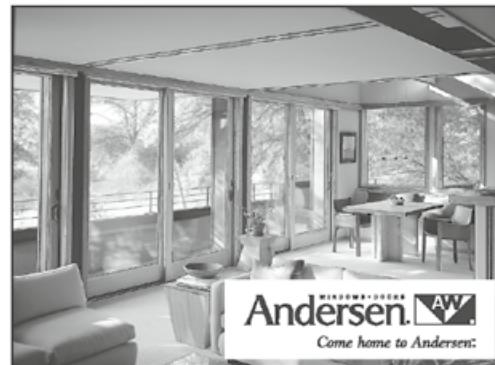

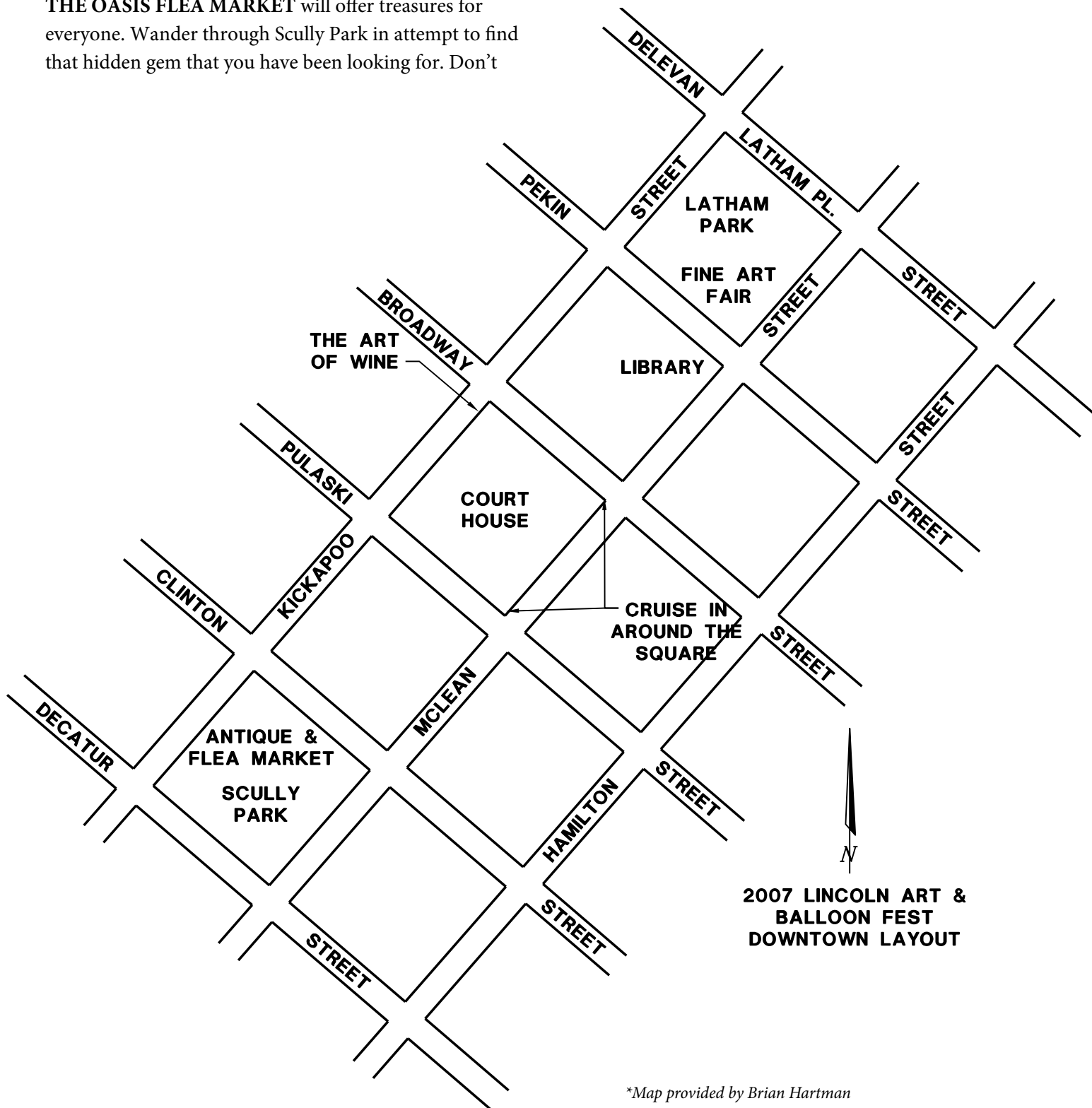

Lincoln Christening Scene

101 N. Chicago St, Lincoln, IL

The town of Lincoln was christened by Abraham Lincoln on August 27, 1853 with the juice from a watermelon. Stop and see the interpretive site. To commemorate the historic event, it will be reenacted on August 27, 2009 at 1 p.m. and 2 p.m.

Lincoln Heritage Museum

300 Keokuk St, Lincoln, IL

This museum located on the campus of Lincoln College houses many rare Abraham Lincoln artifacts. Hours are Monday–Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and Saturday–Sunday, 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Heritage in Flight Museum

1351 Airport Rd, Lincoln, IL

This museum houses aviation and military artifacts dating back to WWI. It has weekend hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m, Friday–Sunday. It will be open during the Lincoln Art & Balloon Festival for festival patrons to explore.

The Mill on 66

738 S. Washington St, Lincoln, IL

Built in 1929, The Mill restaurant was a highlight of Route 66 in Lincoln. It is now on the way to recovery, and will soon be opened as a museum.

The World's Largest Covered Wagon

This covered wagon is recognized by the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest in the world. It is a great place to snap a photo with the family.

HOT AIR BALLOON GLOWS—Friday & Saturday at dusk At dusk the balloons will come back to the airport and re-inflate for evening glows. This glow is a spectacular event that is enjoyed by the young and old alike.

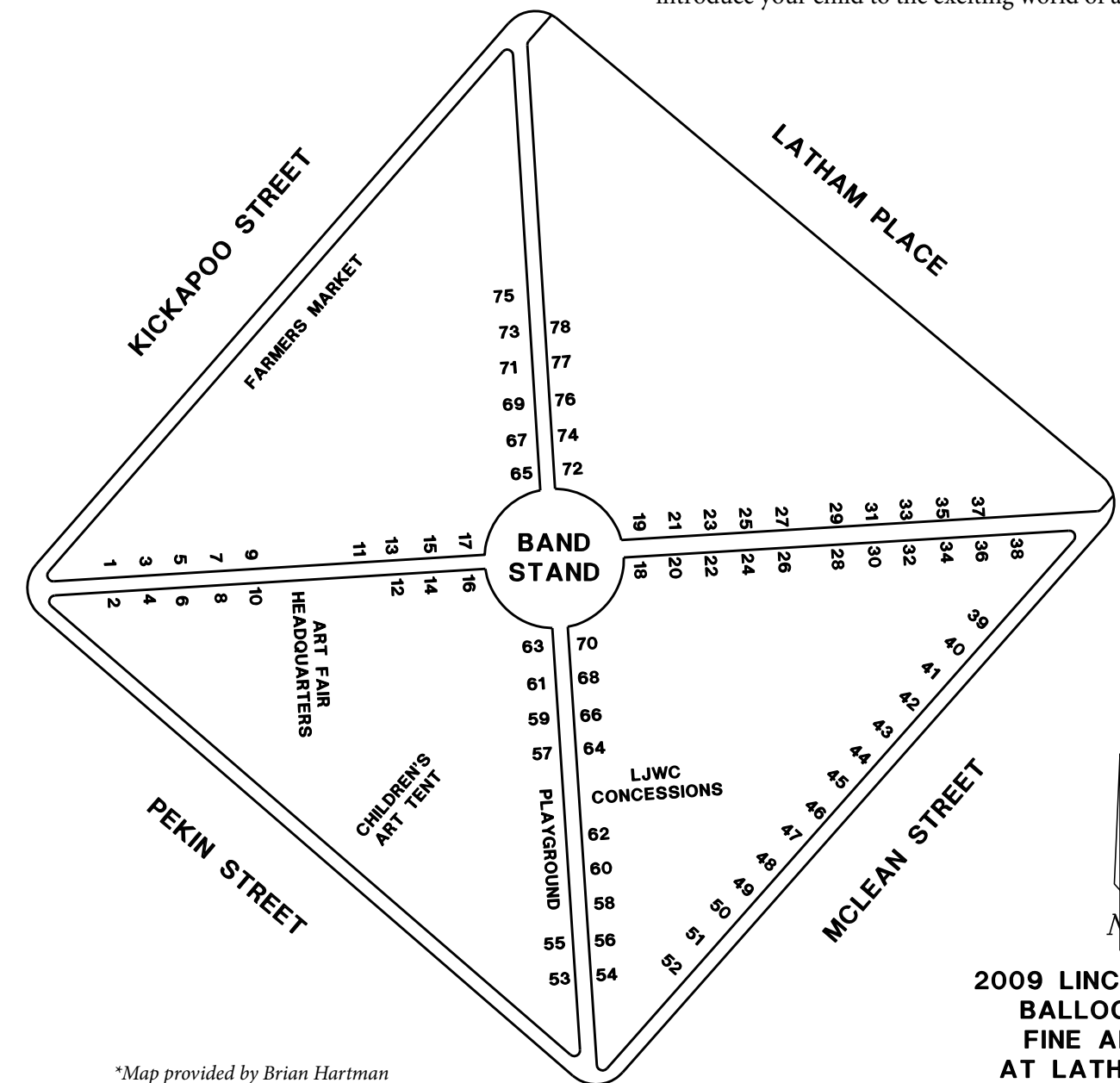

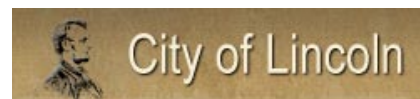
