Bob worked as an insurance broker for Aid Associations for Lutherans Life Insurance Company and later as a Technical Advisor with the Illinois Department of Transportation, retiring in 1989. His hobbies included traveling with his wife in their motor home, gardening and watching sports, especially when his children and grandchildren were playing.

Bob was a member and attended Zion Lutheran Church, Lincoln, Illinois. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, The American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, American Ex-Prisoners of War.

Mr. Werner was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers, Edward, Frederick and John Werner and a sister, Esther Wild.
