

Changes in Illinois Cares Rx


The General Assembly passed a budget that include continuing Illinois CaresRx. The program was cut approximately in half.

Beginning September 1, 2011 enrollees must have an income equal to or less that 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level.

The income limits have been reduced for the Illinois CaresRx program. Household size for 1 person is \$21,780.00, for 2 household person is 29,420.00 and a 3 household is 37,060.00. The \$25.00 dollar rebate has been eliminated. Your last check for August will be mailed in September. The Co-payments increased for each 30 day prescription. For generic will be \$5.00, preferred brand names \$15.00, Non-preferred brands \$20.00, specialty drugs \$15.00 and 25 percent cost share after \$2850.00 in drug costs (doughnut hole coverage). The rest of the Program structure will remain in place. Any questions please call the Oasis Senior Center at 732-6132 and ask for Georgina.
