

## Illinois State Postgame Notes

FINAL – #15 Illinois State 17, #14 Indiana State 10 Nov. 3, 2012 • Memorial Stadium • Terre Haute, Ind.

## **PLAYER NOTES:**

- Tyrone Walker tied Laurént Robinson for the Illinois State career lead in touchdown receptions with 29. He finished the game with seven catches for 120 yards.
- With his 120 yards, Walker recorded his second-straight game with over 100 yards receiving and his fifth game this season with 100 yards or more.
- Walker has now recorded 14 career games with over 100 yards receiving.
- **Darrelynn Dunn** scored his team-leading 12 touchdown of the year late in the second quarter against Indiana State. Dunn's 12 rushing touchdowns are the most for a Redbird player since 2005, when **Pierre Rembert** also rushed for 12. The 12 touchdown rush tie Dunn for sixth most on the single-season list with Rembert.
- Dunn finished with 100 yards, marking his fifth 100-plus yard rushing performance of the season.
- Mike Banks recorded a career-high 10 tackles against the Sycamores, which included seven solo stops.
- Shelby Harris recorded his first career interception and finished the game with seven tackles and 1.5 tackles-for-loss.
- Ben Ericksen intercepted his team-leading seventh pass of the season, the most for a Redbird player since E.J. Jones
  tallied seven in 2010.

## **TEAM NOTES:**

- With a victory, Illinois State extended its road winning streak to seven in a row and the Redbirds have now won six straight Missouri Valley Football Conference road contests in a row. Both those marks set new school records.
- With two more interceptions, the Redbird defense now has 15 on the season, tying for 11th-best on the single-season charts. The 15 interceptions are the most for a Redbird team since 1993.
- ISU improved to 5-0 on the road, marking the first undefeated road record for the Redbirds since the 1937 season. That year, ISU was 5-1-2, with the lone loss coming at home.
- The Redbirds improve to 8-2 overall, marking the first eight-win season for the Redbirds since 2006 and just the fourth eight-win campaign since 1998.
- With the victory, Illinois State head coach **Brock Spack** improved his career record at ISU to 27-16. With his 27 victories, Spack now moves past **Gerry Hart** for seventh place on the all-time coaching victories list.
- The Redbirds are now 4-0 on games broadcast on Comcast SportsNet Chicago this season.
