iLoveUGuys School Training

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) was designed by the "iloveuguys" foundation to standardize how schools, colleges, businesses, and first responders prepare for and respond to an active shooter or other events. This training has made sure that every school and first responder agencies in the county, know what to do in the event there is a hazard at or near a school.

Officer Butterfield began speaking with Lincoln area school superintendents to see if they would be interested in implementing this program. School training began at the beginning of the 2017-2018 school year starting with Lincoln Schools. Training sessions contained videos, handout materials, posters and PowerPoint's. Chief Deputy Mark Landers also began to assist in training the county schools. All 17 schools in Logan County now are trained and following the SRP protocol.

This protocol is designed by the foundation to be used in schools, colleges, business and churches. The training is nearly the same for every location. Officer Butterfield will be available to business owners and churches to provide them with information and training beginning January 2018.

We are currently training all 23 police, fire and EMS agencies, in the county including the dispatch center and EMA. The new Standard Response Protocol (SRP), formally known as "code blue" books, have been totally revised and standardized and given to all agencies.


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)





Fines

Fines collected, by the Logan County Circuit Clerk, for Lincoln during the month of November were \$5,009.46 bringing the total to \$53,889.17 for the calendar year.

Fines collected for Parking Tickets for the month of November was \$30.00 bringing the total collected this calendar year to \$348.64.

Patrol

While patrolling the streets in November, the officers wrote 10 City Possession of Cannabis/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia Ordinance Violation in addition to the Traffic Citations and other City Ordinance Citations that were written in November.

Criminal Investigations

Monthly Cases Report Summary for November 2017

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on $\underline{17}$ active criminal investigations in the month of November. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (8) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the possession and distribution of cocaine and heroin, drug induced aggravated battery, and the Manufacture/Delivery of Cannabis.
- (6) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adults and children with offenses including criminal sexual assault, predatory criminal sexual assault, and criminal sexual abuse.
- (3) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These investigations involved armed robbery, home invasion, attempted murder.
- (5) Search warrants were executed to further investigations in these cases.

Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

DARE/Community Policing

November 4th: Lincoln Dare donated \$25.00 to the Lincoln Junior High School during the annual book fair and pancake breakfast.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 26 deployments for the month of November. Lincoln Police Department requested the K9 Unit 13 times and the Logan County Sheriff's Department requested the LPD K9 Unit 13 times. The K9 indicated 23 out of the 26 deployments. Out of the 23 indications, there were 10 indications where drugs were found and 7 indications drug paraphernalia were found, 11 items in total. The drugs indicated were Marijuana and Methamphetamines, 12.6 grams in total.

School Resource

Officer Butterfield responded to 98 incidents at LCHS for the month of November. The most common offenses for the month were General incidents were the parents were contacted, Class Misconduct, Theft, Harassment/Bully, and Assault/Threat.

Officer Butterfield went over the new standard response protocol to Hartsburg Fire for school lock down procedures. Officer Butterfield also had training with Logan County Dispatch on the new protocol.
