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**Bottom Line Up Front** 

What	Where	When	Impacts
Turning colder with a chance of snow	Entire area	Friday night	Snowfall does not look significant at this time.
Snow showers	Much of area	Christmas Eve (Sunday)	<ul> <li>Too soon to say if snow threat will be significant.</li> </ul>





**Forecast Highlights** 

- Generally quiet weather is expected across central and southeast Illinois over the next several days.
- The next chance for widespread precipitation is not expected before late in the week.
- Temperatures will average above normal until the end of the week. Colder air is expected to spread across the area starting Friday night.
- A weather disturbance may bring snow to the area Christmas Eve (Sunday). It is too soon to say if snow threat will be significant.




