Bicycle Safety

With the summer months and children using bicycles, please follow some simple rules:



WEAR A HELMET

Helmets dramatically reduce the risk of head injury in a bicycle accident.



RIDE ON SIDEWALKS ONLY WHEN NECESSARY Always yield to pedestrians. Riding on the sidewalk is illegal in downtown Lincoln, IL.



FOLLOW ALL TRAFFIC LAWS Bicyclist are required to obey all regulatory signs and traffic lights.



USE HAND SIGNALS

Indicate your actions to tell motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians what you intend to do.



BEWARE OF PARKED CAR DOORS

Ride at least 5 feet away from parked vehicles and don't dodge in an out between parked vehicles.



BE CAREFUL AT INTERSECTIONS

Use caution since most collisions occur at intersections. Watch for turning vehicles.



NEVER RIDE AGAINST TRAFFIC Ride with traffic to avoid potential crashes.



RIDE IN A SINGLE FILE

Except with passing and stay to the right to allow traffic to safely pass.

MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)





Fines

Fines collected for Parking Tickets for the month of May was \$20.00 bringing the total collected this calendar year to \$163.64.

Patrol

While patrolling the streets in May, the officers wrote 6 City Possession of Cannabis/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia Ordinance Violation in addition to the Traffic Citations and other City Ordinance Citations that were written in May.

Criminal Investigations

Monthly Cases Report Summary for May 2017

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on <u>22</u> active criminal investigations in the month of May. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (3) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the possession and distribution of controlled substances and drug induced homicide and drug induced aggravated battery.
- (2) Investigations involved property crimes. These cases involved residential burglary and commercial burglary.
- (10) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adults and children with offenses including predatory criminal sexual assault, grooming, criminal sexual abuse, and criminal sexual assault and child pornography.
- (2) Investigations involved the death of an individual.
- (2) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These cases included child abuse and domestic battery.
- (3) Cases involved the assistance to other agencies with fugitive location, surveillance, and arrests. These fugitives were involved in cases consisting of homicide and aggravated discharge of a firearm as well as drug offenses.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multijurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

DARE/Community Policing

May 10th: Cpl. Johnson was approached by a little boy at By the Bean. The boy told him thank you for protecting everyone. Cpl. Johnson contacted me to meet him at By the Bean. We gave the little boy a stuffed animal and he picked out a blanket for his baby brother.

May 11th: Officer Christy Fruge gave a Chester East Lincoln girl a ride to school. The girl won a free ride to school, from a raffle prize, at a pancake/sausage breakfast at a local school.

May 12th: Lincoln DARE hosted a pizza party for 6th grade students from Lincoln Jr. High, Chester East Lincoln, West Lincoln Broadwell, Carroll Catholic and Mt. Pulaski schools. The students enjoyed pizza and cookies. After the pizza party, they were able to take over the tennis courts at the Rec and played basketball, volleyball and dancing, with music provided by a hired DJ.

May 13th: Lincoln DARE hosted its first painting event for kids. 25 kids from local schools painted a master piece for their mom's for Mother's Day. It was a huge success and I plan to host a similar event later in the year.

May 24th: Officer Christy Fruge was invited to attend a showing of diorama projects. She was able to speak with each child individually about what the project is about. She gave out pencils to each of the kids.

May 24th: DARE sponsored the West Lincoln Broadwell girls' basketball team. The girls had a free throw competition to raise money for new uniforms.

May 26th: Officer Christy Fruge and Chief Adams attended the Little Lambs Daycare for the annual St. Judge Trike-A-Thon. The kids at the daycare raised money for St. Jude by riding laps on a track. She "directed traffic" around the lamps and helped the kids work on their bikes.

May 26th: Sgt. Rob Sherren, Officer Shawn Pettit, and Chief Adams attended the Field Day at West Lincoln Broadwell. They helped with the end of the school year party.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 9 deployments for the month of May. Lincoln Police Department requested the K9 Unit 10 times and the Logan County Sheriff's Department requested the LPD K9 Unit 2 times. The K9 indicated 9 out of the 12 deployments. Out of the 9 indications, there were 3 indications where drugs and/or drug paraphernalia were found. There were 6 indications where drugs were not found but the target odor was present. The drugs that were indicated were Cocaine and Marijuana, along with drug paraphernalia.
