


Lasso up some Books at the Wild West Book Fair !



FUN WITH SLIME



Snails and Caterpillars

Snails

- Celery stalks
- Peanut butter or cream cheese, at room temperature
- sliced apple
- Sliced orange
- Sliced kiwi
- sliced cucumber
- Sliced tomato
- cashews

Caterpillars

- celery stalks
- Peanut butter or cream cheese, at room temperature
- Grapes
- blueberries
- grape tomatoes
- Candy eyes
- Celery

Snails: Fill celery stalks with peanut butter or cream cheese and top with an apple, orange, kiwi, cucumber or tomato slice. See picture above.

Caterpillars: Fill celery stalks with peanut butter or cream cheese and top with grapes, blueberries or grape tomatoes for the body and head. Use peanut butter or cream cheese to glue on candy eyes and celery or radish matchstick for antennae.

HOW TO MAKE SLIME

large bowl
cup of Elmer's white glue
cup of shaving cream
Contact lense solution
If you want you can add food coloring or glitter to accessorize

Stir together glue and shaving cream. Stir the mixture until it has a creamy consistency. Add 1 tbs. of contact lense solution. Stir together. You may need to add more contact solution if the mixture is still runny. Need the slime with your hands. If your slime is not stretchy you can add lotion.

You can add food coloring or glitter to accessorize your slime.
