There were 32 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for February 2018.

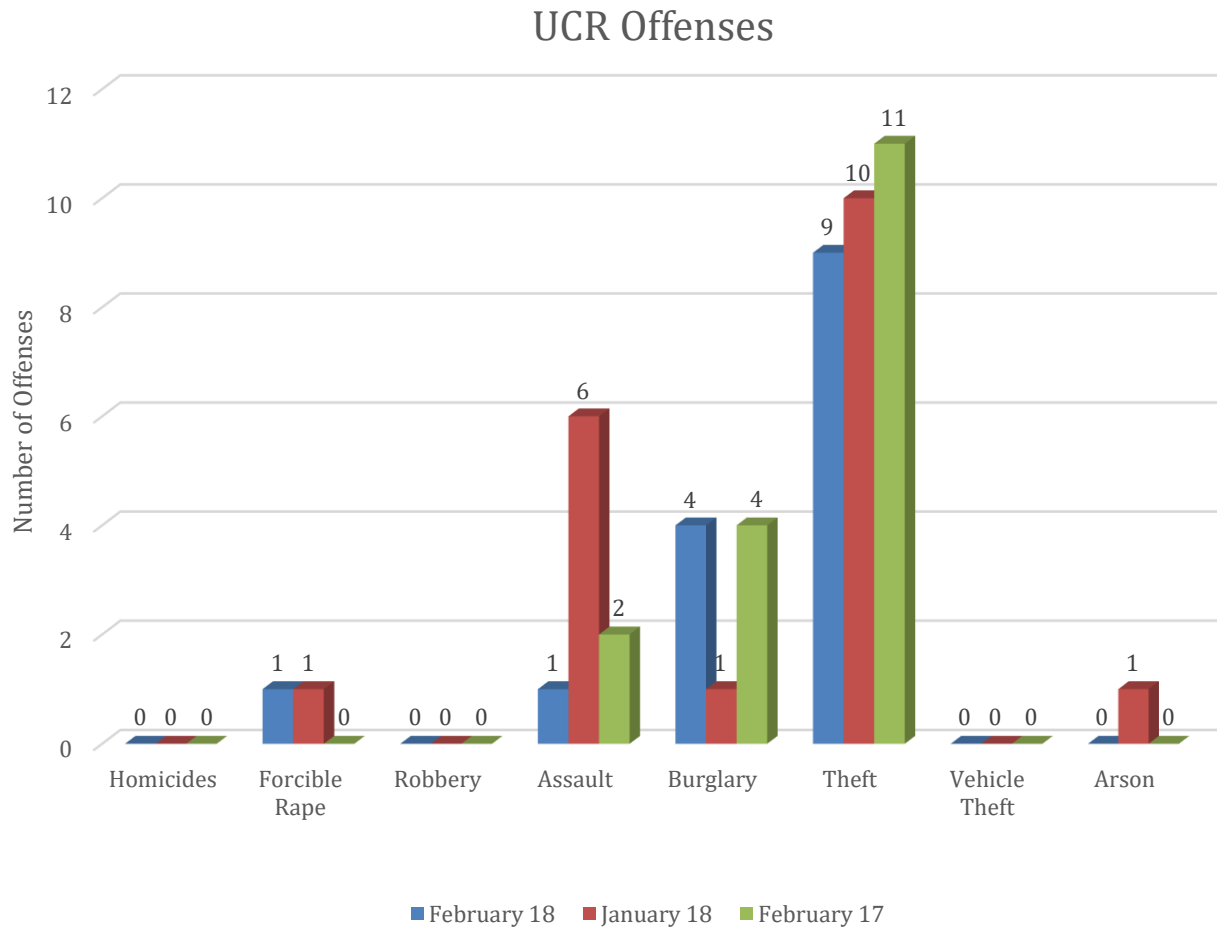

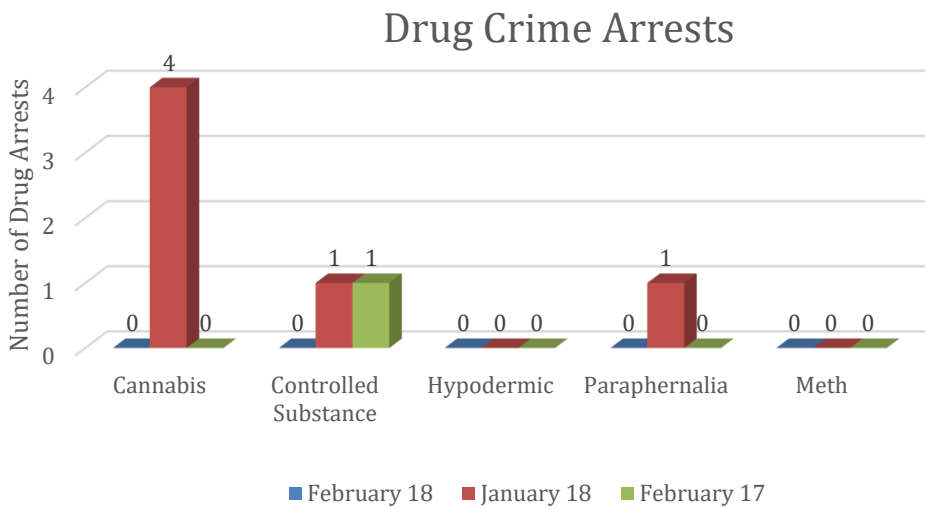
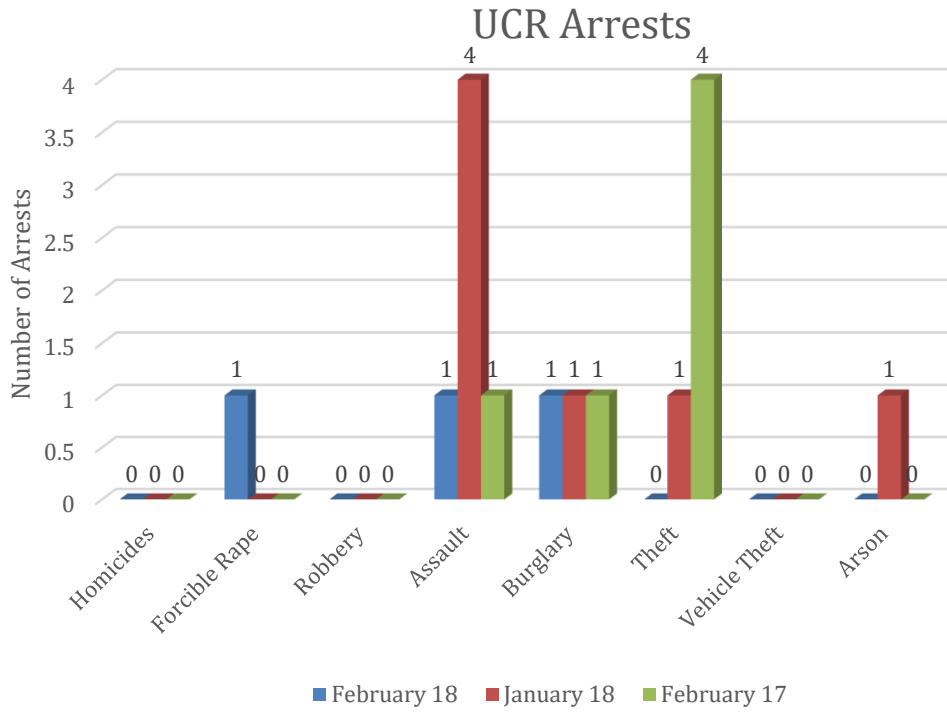
MONTHLY STATISTICS

UCR Report for February 2018





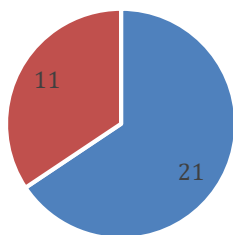
Lincoln Police responded to 1113 incidents for the month of February and 63 case reports were written for the month.

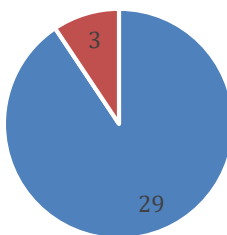

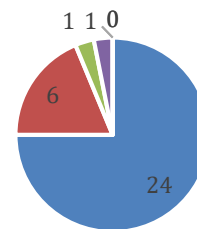

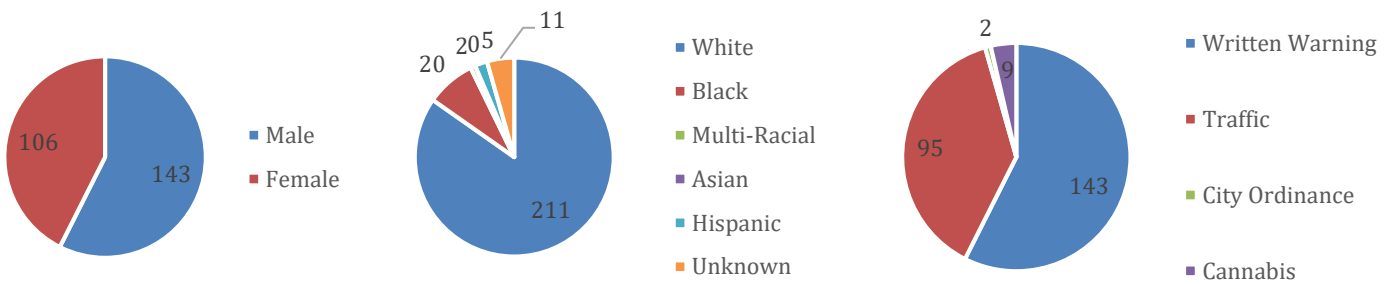

DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

Monthly Cases Report Summary for February 2018

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 24 active criminal investigations in the month of February. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (5) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the manufacture/delivery of cocaine, the production of methamphetamine, the manufacture/delivery of heroin and drug induced aggravated battery.
- (5) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adults and children with offenses including predatory criminal sexual assault, criminal sexual assault and criminal sexual abuse.
- (7) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These investigations involved armed robbery, aggravated arson, child abuse, attempted murder, and assist other agencies on murder investigations.
- (2) Investigations were property related crimes. Those involved Theft and Forgery.
- (5) Search warrants were executed to further investigations in these cases.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

DARE/Community Policing

February 2nd: Lincoln DARE purchased patches for the West Lincoln-Broadwell boys' basketball team. The boys made it to state and to help offset the cost of the state t-shirts, the patches were purchased.

February 13th: Lincoln DARE donated \$150 to the Lincoln Railer Baseball Booster Club.

February 16th: Lincoln DARE purchased uniforms for a child who wanted to play in Lincoln Chill Softball.

February 16th: Lincoln DARE participated in the 5th grade Wellness Expo at the Lincoln Park District.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 18 deployments for the month of February. Lincoln Police Department requested the K9 Unit 12 times and the Logan County Sheriff's Department requested the LPD K9 Unit 6 times. The K9 indicated 13 out of the 18 deployments. Out of the 13 indications, there were 10 items seized and a total of 27.3 grams of drugs seized. The drugs indicated were Marijuana and Crack Cocaine.

School Resource

Officer Butterfield responded to 92 incidents at LCHS for the month of February. The most common offenses were Harassment/bullying, general disciplinary offenses with parental contacts, Class Misconduct, and parking issues. Officer Butterfield was a guest speaker in a Business class and in Civics class this month. Officer Butterfield went over the new standard response protocol with the Lincoln Library and St. Johns Church.
