Report Summary

Overall property crimes were lower this month over last year at this time. Lincoln Police responded to 989 incidents for the month and 106 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 29 vehicle crashes.

Of the 74 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for driving while suspended, theft, and domestic battery arrests. Detectives continued investigations on 20 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations. Patrol officers wrote 123 citations and 97 warnings for the month.

Lincoln Police K9 had 17 deployments that comprised of 12 vehicles. There were 12 drug indications out of those deployments with 9 items being seized (including currency, drugs, and drug paraphernalia) and 9 arrests were made.

DARE Officers continued teaching in the local schools as Corporal Shawn Pettit taught at Central School. Officer Christy Fruge is currently sending out letters for donations for the DARE program with the help of West Lincoln Volleyball girls.

Officer Butterfield responded to an array of incidents during the month of January. The most common offenses were Harassment/Bully issues, class misconduct, general disciplinary offenses with parental contacts, fighting and tobacco/E-Cig violations. Officer Butterfield continues to be instrumental in keeping our high school safe.

There were 29 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of January.

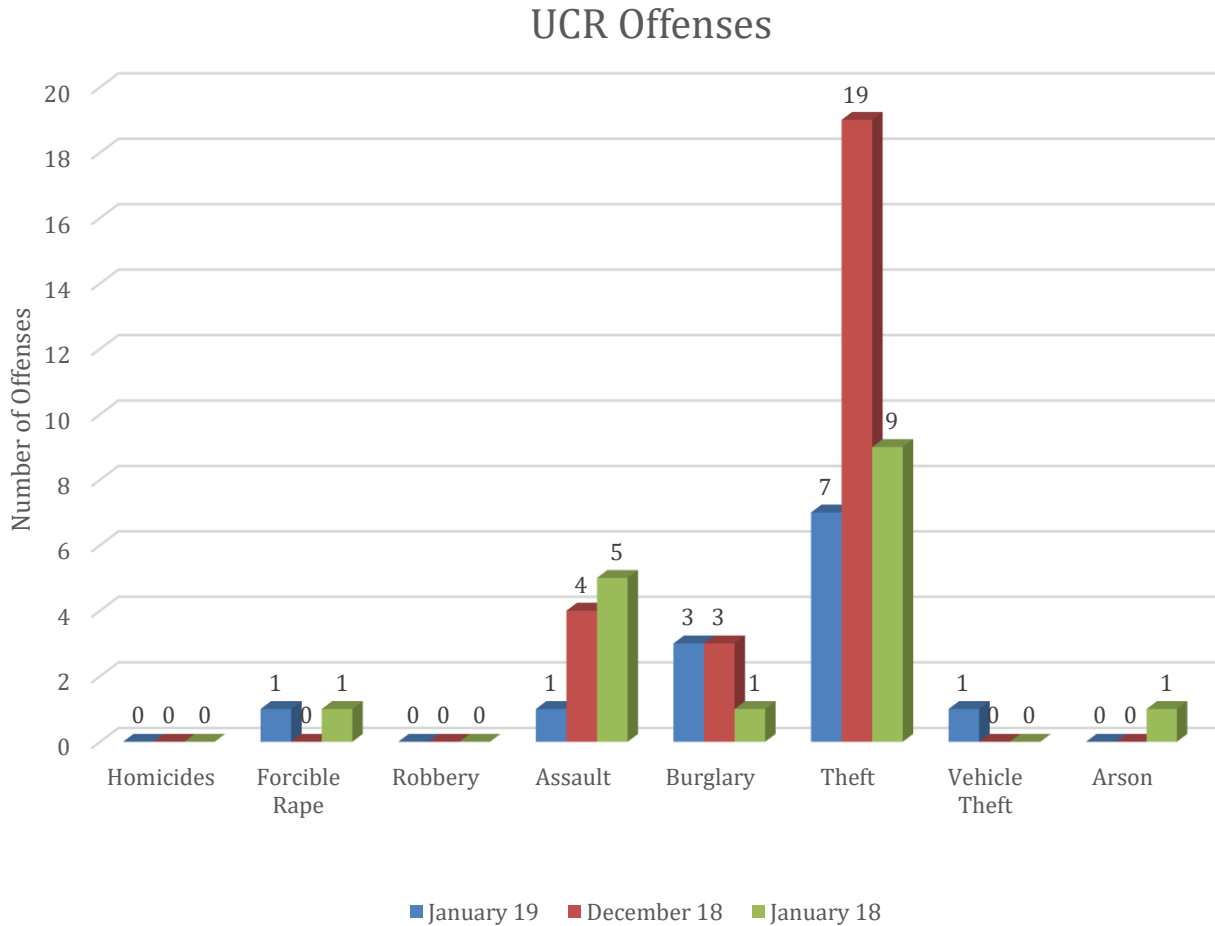

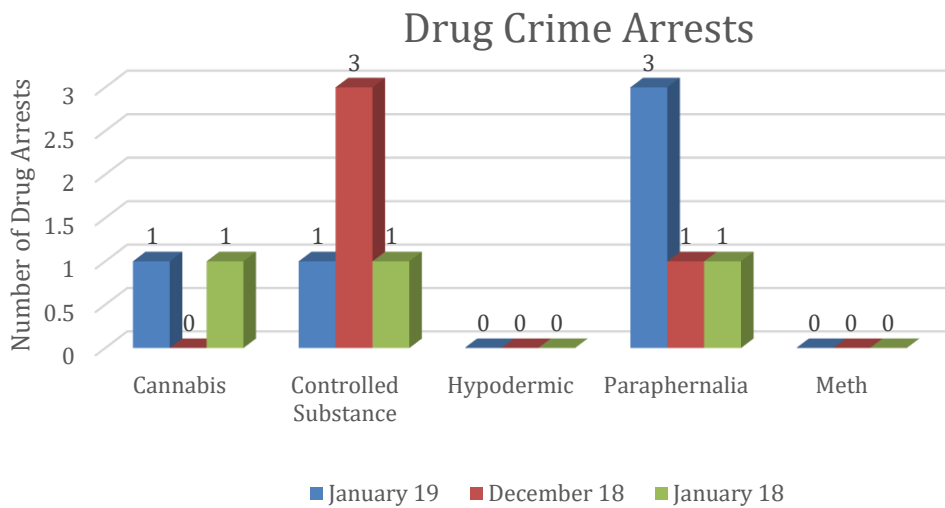
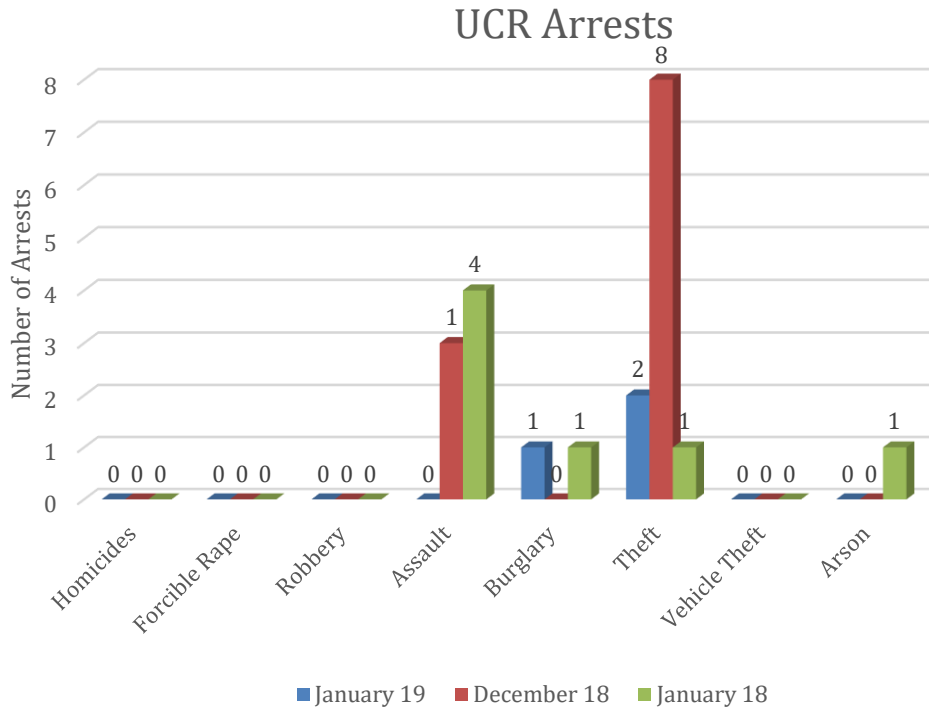
MONTHLY STATISTICS

UCR Report for January 2019





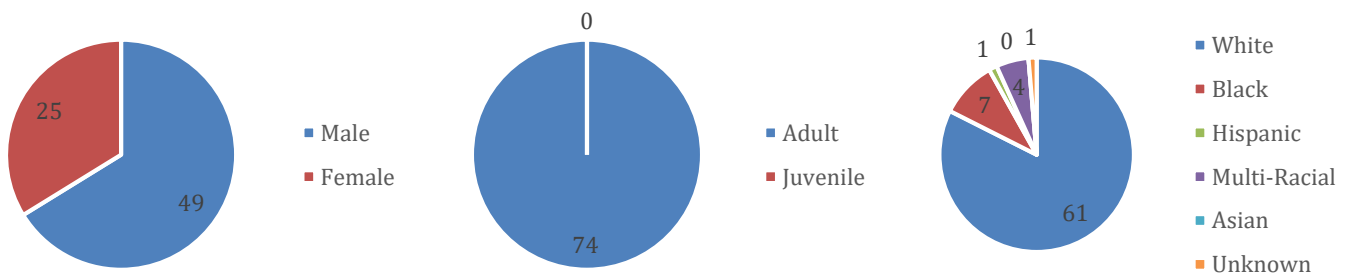

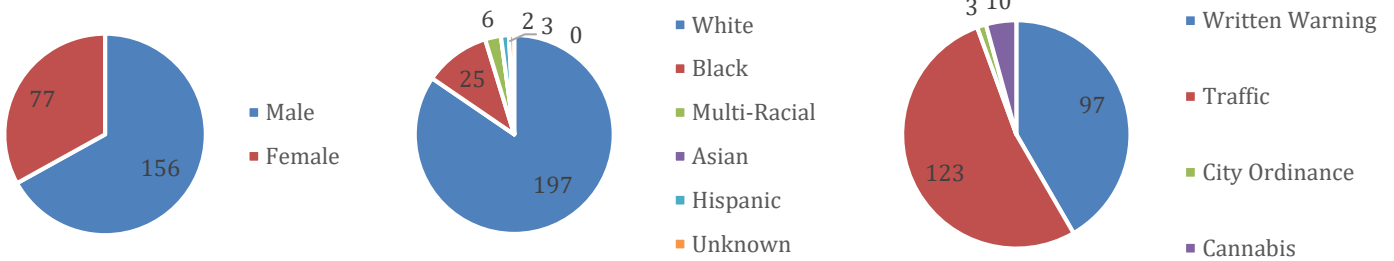

Criminal Investigations

Monthly Cases Report Summary for January 2019

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 20 active criminal investigations in the month of January. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (3) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the manufacture/delivery of controlled substances such as heroin and cocaine and the manufacture/delivery of methamphetamine.
- (6) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adult and child victims with offenses of predatory criminal sexual assault, criminal sexual assault and criminal sexual abuse.
- (5) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These investigations involved drug induced aggravated battery, domestic battery, and child abuse.
- (4) Investigations were property related. These cases were burglary, retail theft, and forgery.
- (2) Investigations involved the assistance of outside agencies. Those investigations involved aggravated kidnapping and homicide.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.
- (4) Search warrants were executed in furtherance of these investigations. Officers also attended 32 hours of continued training.

DARE/Community Policing

January 2nd: Lincoln DARE teamed up with 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade girls' volleyball players at West Lincoln Broadwell to raise money. The girls are looking for ways to give back to the community and at the same time earn money for the volleyball program. The girls spent hours addressing and stuffing envelopes with letters to citizens and businesses in Lincoln and Logan County. The letters explained how the Lincoln DARE program works and asked for any donations that could be given to the program. The girls earned \$300 for all of their hard work and helped out the DARE program as well.

January 14th – 25th: Cpl. Shawn Pettit spend 2 weeks at the Lincoln Junior High School. He was in each of the 6th grade classrooms daily teaching the DARE curriculum.

January 18th: Lincoln DARE donated money to the LCHS Cheerleaders.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace continue to be an extraordinary benefit for the entire Lincoln Community. The K9 unit has had 17 deployments for January. On those deployments, there were 17 search areas with 12 being vehicles. There were 12 indications out of the deployments with 9 items being seized (including currency, drugs, and drug paraphernalia) and 9 arrests were made.

School Resource

Officer Butterfield responded to an array of incidents during the month of January. The most common offenses were Harassment/Bully issues, class misconduct, general disciplinary offenses with parental contacts, fighting and tobacco/E-Cig violations. Officer Butterfield attended training on CPR and Responding to People with Mental Health. Officer Butterfield, along with LCHS, is working with the health department on vaping (E-Cigs) and opioid awareness information for the students next school year.
