## Report Summary

Overall property crimes were lower this month over last year at this time. Lincoln Police responded to 967 incidents for the month of November and 101 case reports were written for the month.

Of the 63 arrests for the month there were several property crime arrests by the Lincoln Police. Officers made 11 drug arrests that resulted from several CIEG and Lincoln Police drug investigations involving cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine. Detectives continued investigations on 24 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

There were 32 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month. Rear-end crashes were some of the top causes which relate to distracted driving. Simply avoiding internal distractions, watching the road, and taking a few extra seconds at intersections will help curb many of these crashes.

Through DARE, Office Christy Fruge help sponsor several programs in Lincoln including helping the Logan County Sheriff Program with their bowling tournament fundraiser.

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace searched 13 areas, indicated on 7 of those searches, seized 9 items of drug paraphernalia that resulted in two arrests.

School Resource Officer Tim Butterfield responded to 119 incidents at LCHS and continued to implement school safety programs and procedures to help keep our children safe.

There were 32 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month.

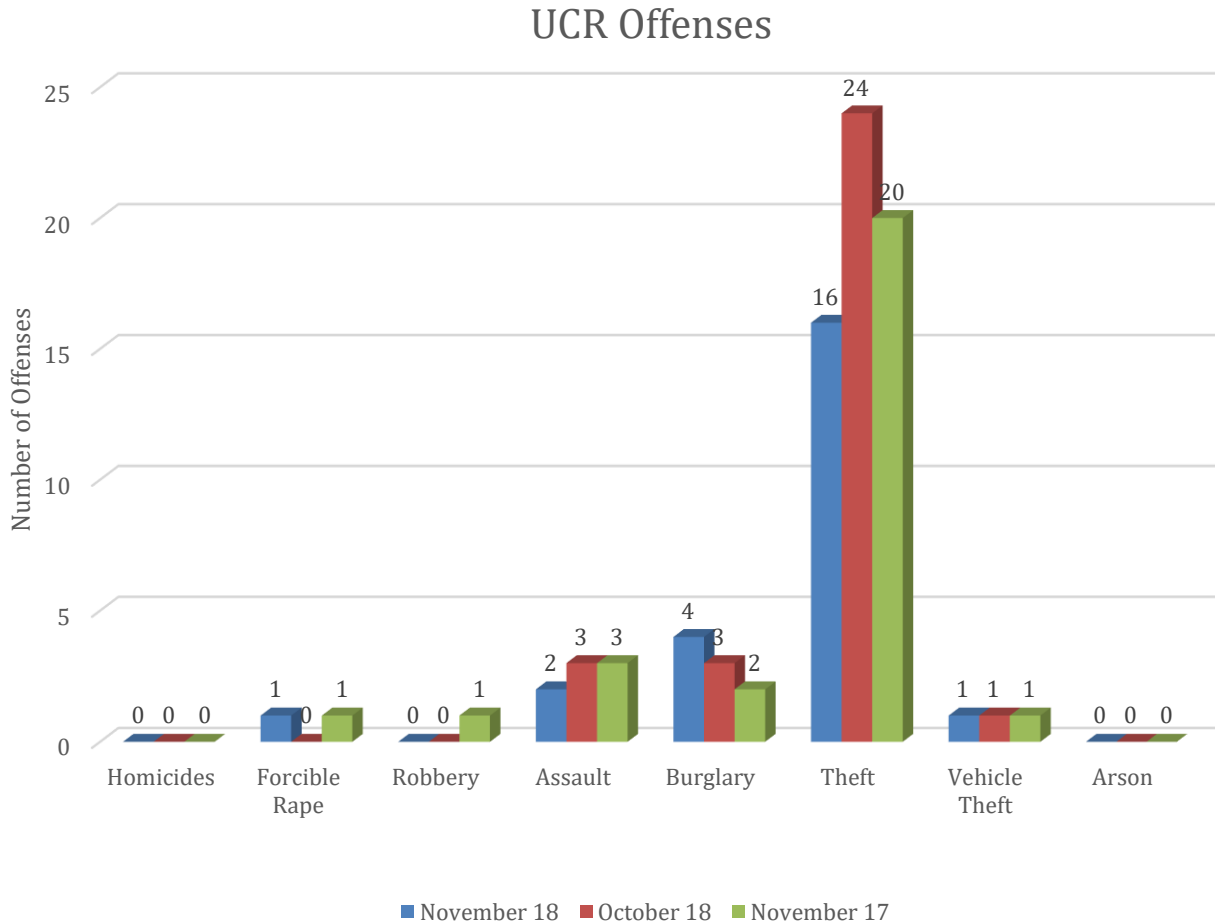

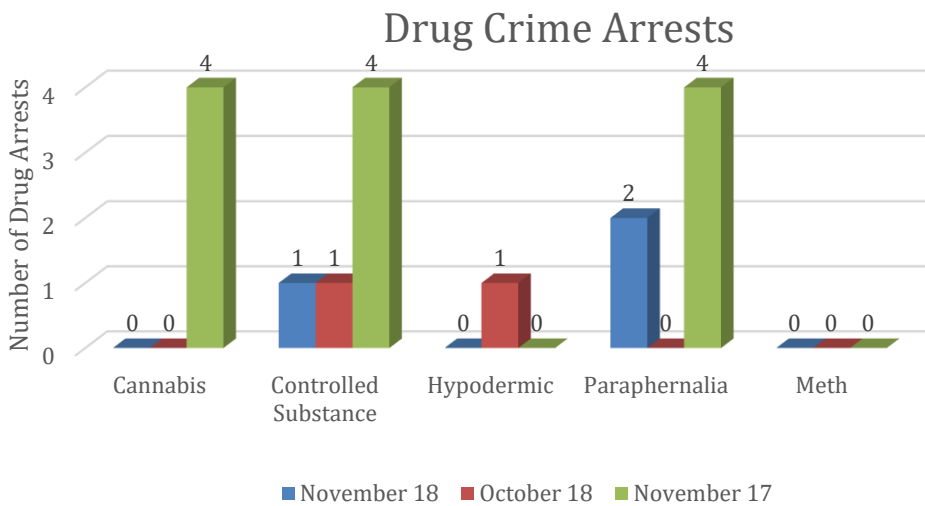
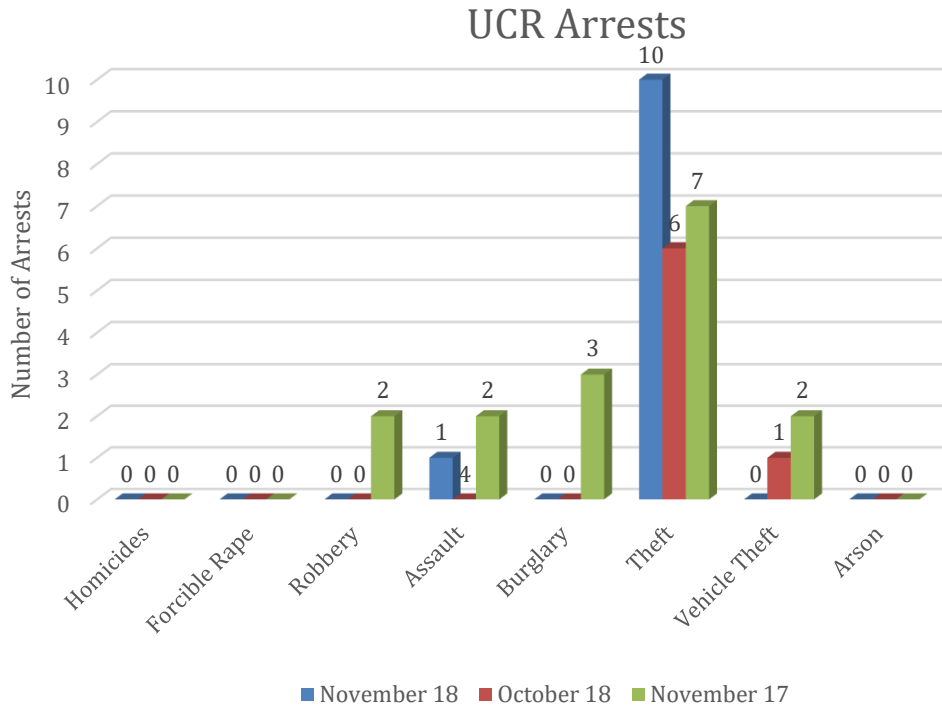
# MONTHLY STATISTICS

### Criminal Investigations

#### Monthly Cases Report Summary for November 2018

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 28 active criminal investigations in the month of November. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available for release.

- (11) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the manufacture/delivery of controlled substances such as heroin and cocaine and the manufacture/delivery of methamphetamine.
- (8) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adult and child victims with offenses of predatory criminal sexual assault, criminal sexual assault and criminal sexual abuse.
- (5) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These investigations involved drug induced aggravated battery, domestic battery, and home invasion.
- (2) Investigations were property related. These cases were burglary and retail theft.
- (2) Investigation involved deaths.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.
- (2) Search warrants were executed in furtherance of these investigations.

### DARE/Community Policing

November 3<sup>rd</sup>: Lincoln DARE sponsored a bowling lane for the Logan County Sheriff's Department DARE program. The Sheriff's Department DARE program had a bowling fundraiser to raise money to build their program. The fundraiser will benefit of the youth in Logan County.

November 9<sup>th</sup>: Sgt. Rob Sherren, Off. Cole Grenlund, Cpl. Brian Clements and Off. Christy Fruge went to West Lincoln Broadwell for their Veterans Day Celebration. The kids at WLB organized and helped to recognize the veterans of our community. Officers assisted in setting up and helping with refreshments.

November 30<sup>th</sup>: Lincoln DARE purchased patches for the West Lincoln Broadwell girls' basketball team. The patches will go on the State qualifier shirts.

## Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 9 deployments for the month. Lincoln Police Department requested the K9 Unit 8 times and the Logan County Sheriff's Department requested the LPD K9 Unit 1 time. Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace, while on their deployments, searched 13 areas, indicated on 7 of those searches, seized 9 items of drug paraphernalia and 2 arrests.

## School Resource

Officer Butterfield responded to 119 incidents at LCHS for the month of November. The most common offenses were Harassment/Bully issues, class misconduct, general disciplinary offenses with parental contacts, fighting, and Social/Emotional issues. Officer Butterfield created the Railer alerts for the high school staff. Officer Butterfield administrated lockdown drills at LCHS. Officer Butterfield administrated a fire drill at LCHS. He met with St. Clara's manor on the SRP program. He attended an EMA meeting about safe school Nixle alerts. He was instrumental in lobbying for new visitor badges, blood stop trauma kits mounted in the school and go bags for site supervisors, which the LCHS School Board approved at the last school board meeting.
