Treasurer Conzo started in on the subtotal relating to investments and a surplus in the account. He said part of the reason there is growth is because the city was able to modify their investment policy in 2017, however, it was not possible prior to that. He mentioned that the checking account balance was lower. He mentioned an annuity and that there's been relatively larger amounts seen in checking, he said not all of it was growth from the stock market.

He said they have avoided taking money out of investments, due the receipts from annuities. He then mentioned the property tax levy and the remains of a flat tax levy. He touched on page two and how expenditures have gone up, there is a cost of living increase built in for annuitants. He mentioned revenues are still under expenses. He talked about what pensions are being paid out—24 pensions and 20 active participants.

He touched on one fund that has reached \$10 million—and retired officers on the police retirement pension board. He said money in the checking is better than it was last year—\$103,000. He said the same applies to the revenue streams.

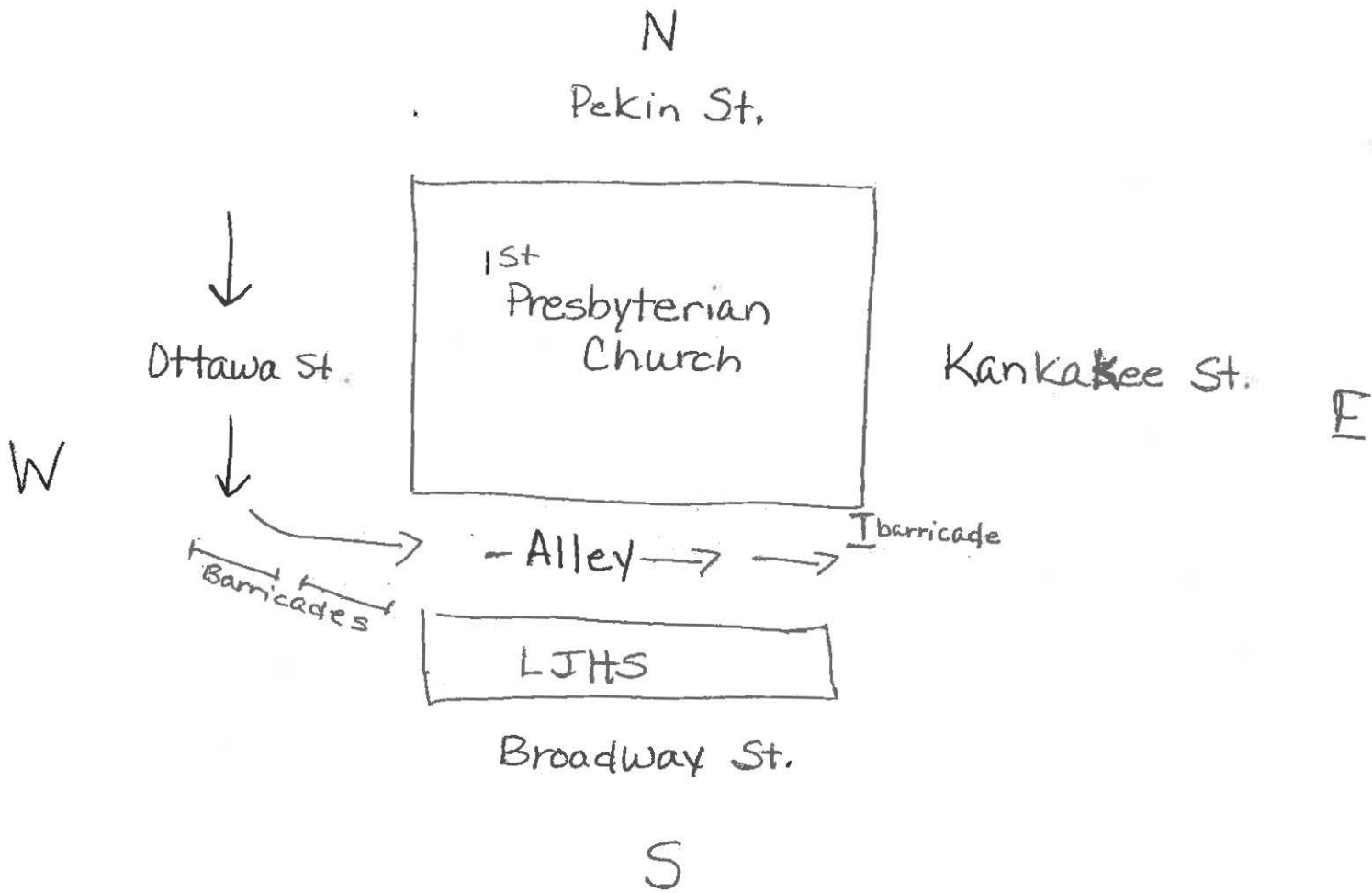

RE: Preliminary Scarification/Oil & Chip Targets

Background

Each year the Lincoln Street Department Staff and contract engineer Farnsworth Group put together a list of targets for street maintenance to help repair and preserve streets throughout the City.

Analysis/Discussion

Below are a description of the processes used while performing these operations. A/1 being just a surface treatment to seal the roadway and A/2 will actually allow provide base repair and leveling of the driving surface

1. (A/1) - A basic oil and chip coating, this is when a thin layer of oil is applied to the roadway followed by a thin layer of rock to create a wear surface. This seals the roadway and prevents moisture from penetrating and causing damage.
2. (A/2) - The existing roadway is pulverized and regraded then compacted. A primer is then applied and allowed to dry then followed by two layers of oil and chip, the first layer is often a larger stone and the second a finer stone to create a smother driving surface. Often with this process repairs can be made to any base failures that exist.

This is the initial list, once we get cost estimates back for these targets can be added or reduced to fit our budget of approximately \$300,000.00, and the additional \$60,060.00, Reimbursement from Illinois American Water. Once bids are received we can look at adding other targets as long as bids come in under budget. In the past we have asked contractors to hold their unit prices for additional targets and they have always been willing to do so. Logan County Highway Department has also agreed to assist the City with some of these operations so there could be some additional benefit to the program from that agreement.

\$300,000.00, from the Capitol Improvement Fund Cap Exp- Micro Surfacing 60-3600-7827 and \$60,060.00, Reimbursement from Illinois American Water.

On May 20, 2019, a request for proposal (RFP) was advertised on the City Website and Deputy Chief Vlahovich hand delivered the RFP to the local dealers and sent the RFP via electronic mail to surrounding area dealerships.

Analysis/Discussion

The City Clerk's office received two bids from local dealers with the following pricing:

Lincoln CDJR -	\$221,552 minus \$19,200 for trade-ins = \$202,352 final
Graue Inc -	\$266,904 minus \$11,800 for trade-ins = \$255,104.00 final

Both bids appear to meet the requirements of the RFP. The only discrepancy between the two bids are the vehicle year. Lincoln CDJR indicates 2019 pricing, which is within the RFP requirements and Graue indicated 2020. However looking through the pricing sheet of Graue it listed a 2019 Chevrolet truck and 2019 was crossed out 2020 written in, see attached.

Lincoln CDJR indicated that the last opportunity to order a 2019 is July 20, 2019.

Fiscal Impact

The City budgeted \$78,617 this year and based on financing amount will budget the necessary amount for the following two years to pay the lease for the eight vehicles. If you extend \$78,617 to three years this would total \$235,851.

Once approved the Police department will seek bids for financing for the vehicles which will be approved in subsequent meeting. Given the bid amount from Lincoln CDJR we will be well under budget with financing.

COW Recommendation

Place on Council Agenda for June 17, 2019: Approval to accept the bid from Lincoln Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep, Ram for eight new police vehicles not to exceed \$202,352.



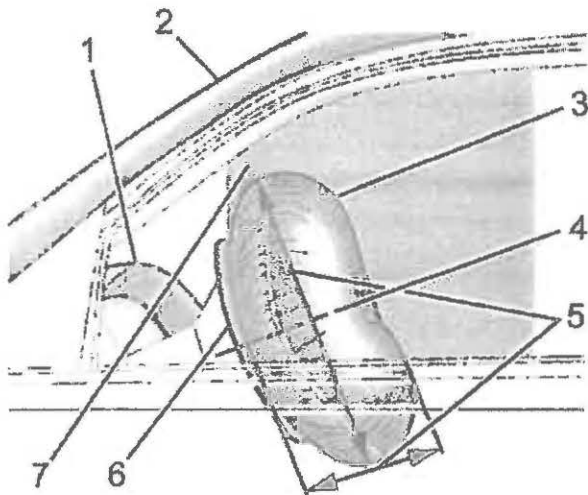

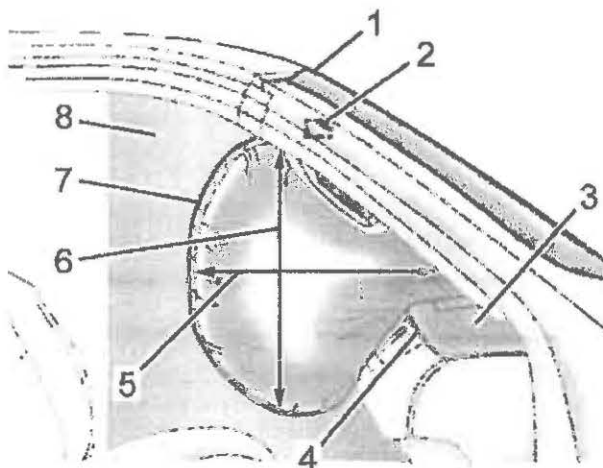

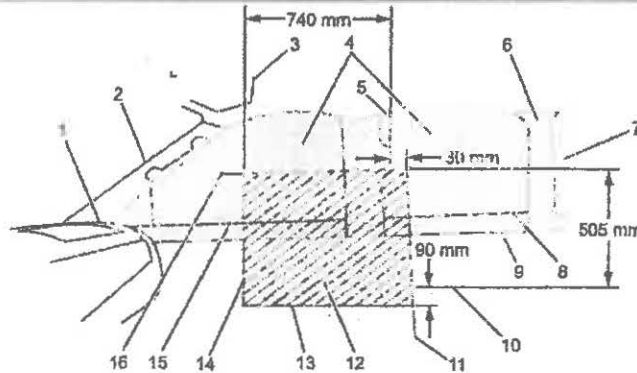

AIRBAGS FAQ

Q: Can equipment such as radar devices, video cameras, and radio trees be mounted in a specialty vehicle equipped with a right front passenger frontal airbag?

A: Yes, but care must be taken to properly mount the equipment outside of the airbag "deployment zone."

Q: What is the airbag "deployment zone"?

A: The term "deployment zone" describes the space an airbag takes up when fully inflated. Airbags need room to work properly, and anything in the "deployment zone" – such as improperly mounted equipment – can greatly affect the performance of the airbag.

Q: How can I identify the airbag "deployment zone" in my vehicle?

A: See Airbag Deployment Diagrams for more information. The diagrams provide the approximate dimensions of the "deployment zones" for your specialty vehicle. Before doing any service work, including the installation of any equipment, consult the appropriate service manual.

Q: Is it possible to shield equipment so it does not interfere with airbag deployment?

A: While shielding may protect certain equipment from being damaged or dislodged, it may also negatively affect how an airbag inflates. Therefore, we cannot recommend the placement of any equipment in the deployment zone, even when shielding.

Q: Can the installation of push bumpers on the front end of the vehicle affect the deployment of the airbag?

A: It is not likely that installing push bumpers will affect sensing for the airbag as long as the vehicle structure itself is not modified. GM is not aware of any adverse defects from the many push bumpers that have been installed on current model GM police vehicles with airbags.

See "Adding Equipment to the Airbag-Equipped Vehicle" in the owner manual for more information.

Customer-Installed Equipment

Before installing equipment, read the following.

Airbags inflate with great force, faster than the blink of an eye. No objects, such as shotguns, should be placed over or near the airbag covers. Equipment mounted too close to an inflating airbag could prevent the airbag from operating properly to protect the occupants or could be forced into an occupant or break and become a dangerous projectile, causing severe injury or even death. To help prevent injury and to allow the airbag to perform as it was designed, do not mount equipment inside the airbag deployment zones.

Do not install equipment in the inflation path of any airbag. The equipment may interfere with the deployment of the airbag, may damage the airbag, or otherwise be damaged or forced into an occupant, all of which may cause severe injury or even death.

Do not attach anything to the steering wheel hub or mount any equipment within the deployment zone for the driver airbag.

Do not mount equipment on the passenger side of the instrument panel top pad deployment zone. Equipment should not be mounted on or around the passenger airbag opening because of a deploying airbag. To allow the airbag to perform as it was designed, do not mount equipment inside the airbag deployment zone.

Do not use seat accessories that block the inflation path of the driver or passenger seat-mounted side impact airbag or install equipment in the seat-mounted side impact airbag deployment zones.

Do not mount a security barrier such that the ends of the barrier or brackets are within the roof-rail airbag deployment zones.

Avoid installing wiring for roof-rail emergency lighting or radio antennas that may restrict the proper deployment of the roof-rail airbags.

Do not use seat accessories, console accessories, or other accessories that block the inflation path of the driver seat front center airbag (if equipped). Do not remove the front center console to install a police package center console, or otherwise install equipment or mount equipment between or just behind the front bucket seats on vehicles equipped with the driver seat front center airbag.

GM approved service procedures must be followed to remove and reinstall the instrument panel to the pad to ensure proper airbag deployment.

The police vehicle has a rollover sensor mounted on the centerline of the vehicle between the driver and front outboard passenger positions. If the vehicle has individual front seats, the rollover sensor will be exposed. Do not mount equipment within 25 mm (1 in) of the rollover sensor. This may affect the performance of multiple restraint system.

ELECTRONIC STABILITY CONTROL SYSTEMS (STABILITRAK)

StabiliTrak systems help drivers maintain control of their vehicles, especially during emergency lane changes or avoidance maneuvers. StabiliTrak uses various sensors, such as steering wheel angle, wheel speed, yaw velocity, etc., to detect any difference between the path requested by the steering wheel position and vehicle's actual path. When appropriate, the system selectively controls brakes, engine power, and even suspension settings to enhance control of the vehicle's direction and help keep it on course.

Independent studies conducted by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, and others have found StabiliTrak to be highly reactive in reducing vehicle crashes. General Motors offers StabiliTrak systems on many of its passenger car and light truck models.

See your owner's manual for additional information about the operation of StabiliTrak.

Q. How do I use StabiliTrak?

A. StabiliTrak operates independently of the driver.

You should continue to drive your StabiliTrak equipped vehicle with caution and care. GM's StabiliTrak system, StabiliTrak is designed to be as seamless as possible in operation, and part of the overall vehicle response to make a good vehicle better

Q. How does StabiliTrak work?

A. StabiliTrak has the ability to apply control forces to the vehicle independent of the driver. StabiliTrak uses sensors to continuously compare the path indicated by the steering wheel position to the vehicle's actual path. If a discrepancy is detected, StabiliTrak selectively controls vehicle brakes and engine torque to create a yaw moment that helps restore the vehicle's actual path to the path indicated by the steering wheel position. StabiliTrak has the ability to help correct both understeer (where the vehicle is not turning as much as the steering wheel position indicates) and oversteer (where the vehicle is turning more than the steering wheel position indicates).

Q. Will a tire change affect StabiliTrak?

A. Use of tires other than original equipment may affect StabiliTrak performance. StabiliTrak is designed to make the best use of available traction. The performance characteristics of the original equipment tires are part of the overall system effectiveness. When you replace tires check the recommendations in your owner's manual. On GM vehicles, the original equipment tires have a "TPC" (Tire Performance Criteria) code on the sidewall. Replacing the tires with the same "TPC" code will help assure proper StabiliTrak performance.

DRIVER OPERATED TRACTION CONTROL BUTTON

An advanced computer controlled stability enhancement system assists the driver with directional control of the vehicle in difficult driving conditions. Each time the vehicle is started, the StabiliTrak system is fully on. StabiliTrak can be controlled by a Traction Control Button. The condition system is displayed by a StabiliTrak indicator light and Driver Information

Center (DIC) Message. Push once to disable Traction Control. Push and hold to disable both Traction Control and StabiliTrak. In this condition, StabiliTrak will automatically turn ON when the vehicle speed exceeds 35 mph (56km/hr) while the Traction Control remains OFF. Push again to enable Traction Control and StabiliTrak.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3 SECTION 15 OF
THE LINCOLN CITY CODE

THIS ORDINANCE is made and adopted by the CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN, LOGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, at a regular meeting held in the City Council Chambers in said City on the ____ day of _____, 2019, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the CITY OF LINCOLN is a municipal corporation located in Logan County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF LINCOLN acknowledges that State Statute has been amended to raise the legal age for the sale and distribution of nicotine and alternative nicotine products effective July 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF LINCOLN feels that it is in the best interests of local health, safety, and morality that the city retains a civil fine for those under the legal age who are found in possession of nicotine products and alternative nicotine products; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF LINCOLN that it is the best interest of local health, safety, and morality that City of Lincoln comport with state statute thereby raising the legal age to sell and possess nicotine and alternative nicotine products to 21; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN, as follows:

1. The City of Lincoln will amend Title III Chapter 15 Part 1 of the Lincoln City Code to change the legal age of sale and possession of nicotine products and alternative nicotine products to the age of 21 (See below Exhibit).
5. Effective Date. That this Ordinance is effective July 1, 2019.

EXHIBIT A

3-15-1: SALE, USE AND POSSESSION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCTS:

- (A) **Providing Tobacco Products and Alternative Nicotine Products To a Minor:** It shall be unlawful for any person, whether acting individually, or as an owner, officer, employee or agent of, or on behalf of, any person to sell, buy for, distribute samples of, furnish, exchange or give away any tobacco or alternative nicotine products in any form to any individual under the age of twenty-one (21) years.
- (B) **Before selling, offering for sale, giving, or furnishing tobacco or alternative nicotine products, or any cartridge or component of tobacco or alternative nicotine products, to another person, the person selling, offering for sale, giving, or furnishing the products shall verify that the person is at least 21 years of age by:**

 - (1) examining from any person that appears to be under 27 years of age a government-issued photographic identification that establishes the person is at least 21 years of age or
 - (2) for sales made through the internet or other remote sales methods, performing an age verification through an independent, third-party age verification service that compares information available from public records to the personal information entered by the person during the ordering process that establishes the person is 21 years of age or older.
- (C) **Possession of Tobacco Products and Alternative Nicotine Products By A Minor:** No individual under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age shall have in his or her possession or use any tobacco product or alternative nicotine product in any of its forms. It shall not be a violation of this section for any such person to have in his or her possession or use of any tobacco products or alternative nicotine products while in the presence of his or her parents or legal guardian, or in the performance of a religious ceremony.

WHEREAS, the City Council has directed the Corporate Authorities to prepare an Appropriation Ordinance; and

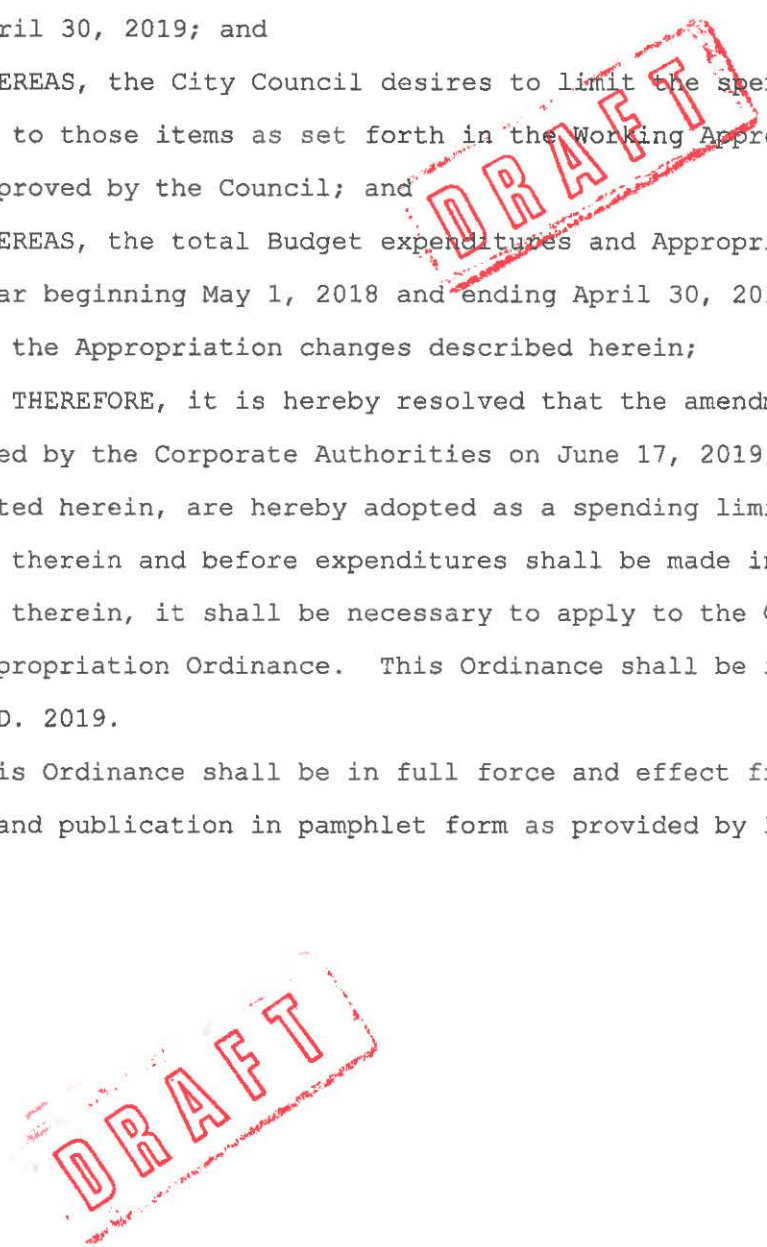
WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities worked diligently in the preparation of The Appropriation Ordinance for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2018 and ending April 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to limit the spending of the City according to those items as set forth in the Working Appropriation Ordinance unless approved by the Council; and

WHEREAS, the total Budget expenditures and Appropriation expenditures for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2018 and ending April 30, 2019 will not be exceeded as a result of the Appropriation changes described herein;

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved that the amendments within the Appropriation, as proposed by the Corporate Authorities on June 17, 2019, as attached and incorporated herein, are hereby adopted as a spending limit for the items contained therein and before expenditures shall be made in excess for items not contained therein, it shall be necessary to apply to the City Council for a modification of the Appropriation Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be in effect the 17th day of June, A. D. 2019.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

Dear City Officials:

As you know, a working budget document is adopted for each fiscal year by the City Council in the form of a Resolution which is adopted prior to the beginning of the fiscal year. The purpose of this Resolution is to project our best estimates of revenues for the ensuing fiscal year and, to describe in detail, a plan for expenditures for each fund, sub-fund and expenditure line.

Further, our city is governed by an annual Appropriation Ordinance which is enacted during the first quarter of each fiscal year. The purpose of this ordinance is to reaffirm, certify and, if necessary, to correct our revenue estimates and to set limits for spending by the city for each fund, sub-fund and, to the extent possible, for each expenditure line.

As in past years, the City may also enact Ordinances Amending the Appropriation Ordinance, if and when additional sources of revenue become available, or in those cases where expenditures for a specific line exceed the amount specified in the original Appropriation Ordinance. Such amendments may be enacted to transfer unused expenditure amounts from lines in which the Appropriation amount exceeds the actual expenditures to lines within the same fund in which expenditures have exceeded the amount specified in the original Appropriation Ordinance.

Unfortunately, during the preceding fiscal year we have encountered a situation within our Building & Grounds Fund where our expenditures have exceeded our Appropriation for this fund. As a result, it is not possible to amend the Appropriation Ordinance within the Building & Grounds Fund, as described above, because the amount of expenditures that exceeds the Appropriation in certain lines exceeds the total of funds available in the other lines within the same fund. Please refer to the attachment which describes the above situation in greater detail.

There are several factors which should be noted in regards to the above problem. First, the lines where our expenditures have exceeded our Appropriation are utility costs and the cost of the contract for custodial services. Second, it is important to note that F.Y. 2018-2019 was the first year during which we had incurred significantly increased utility and custodial expenses for additional buildings which have been added


to the assets of the city. Third, we correspondingly increased our budget for these lines for F.Y. 2019-2020 in order to remedy this situation. Fire Chief Mark Miller (Ret.) worked diligently, prior to his retirement, to calculate the costs for these lines for the current fiscal year. His efforts should result in a budget and Appropriation which more accurately reflects the amounts that we will spend for these lines in the year ahead.

It is also significant to note that these additional expenditures, while somewhat greater than in previous years, are outweighed by the benefits gained by the addition of these buildings which are tremendous assets to our city. In addition, these increased costs are offset, in part, by savings in other lines within our budget, the elimination of other expenditure lines and by the increased revenue generated by these assets. Also, these assets have made it possible to address several long-term problems faced by our city and they enable our city to operate more efficiently and with greater effectiveness.

Finally, it is very important to note that our General Fund expenditures for F.Y. 2018-2019 were far below both our budget and our Appropriation Ordinance requirements.
