Report Summary

Lincoln Police responded to 1055 incidents for the month and 111 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 19 vehicle crashes.

Of the 64 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for warrant arrests, domestic battery, driving while suspended/revoked, and disorderly conduct. Detectives continued investigations on 19 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations. Patrol officers wrote 63 citations and 52 warnings for the month.

Lincoln Police K9 had four deployments in the month of May. There were three indications out of those deployments with all items seized being drugs and/or drug paraphernalia.

DARE continues to donate to multiple youth organizations and local schools to benefit the children of this community. The annual DARE Pizza and Dance Party, for 6th graders of Logan County, was held on May 17th with the Lincoln Park District again donating their facility for the party.

Officer Butterfield responded to an array of incidents during the month of May. The most common offenses were Harassment/Bully, class misconduct, general disciplinary offenses with parental contacts, social/emotional and theft.

There were 19 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of May.

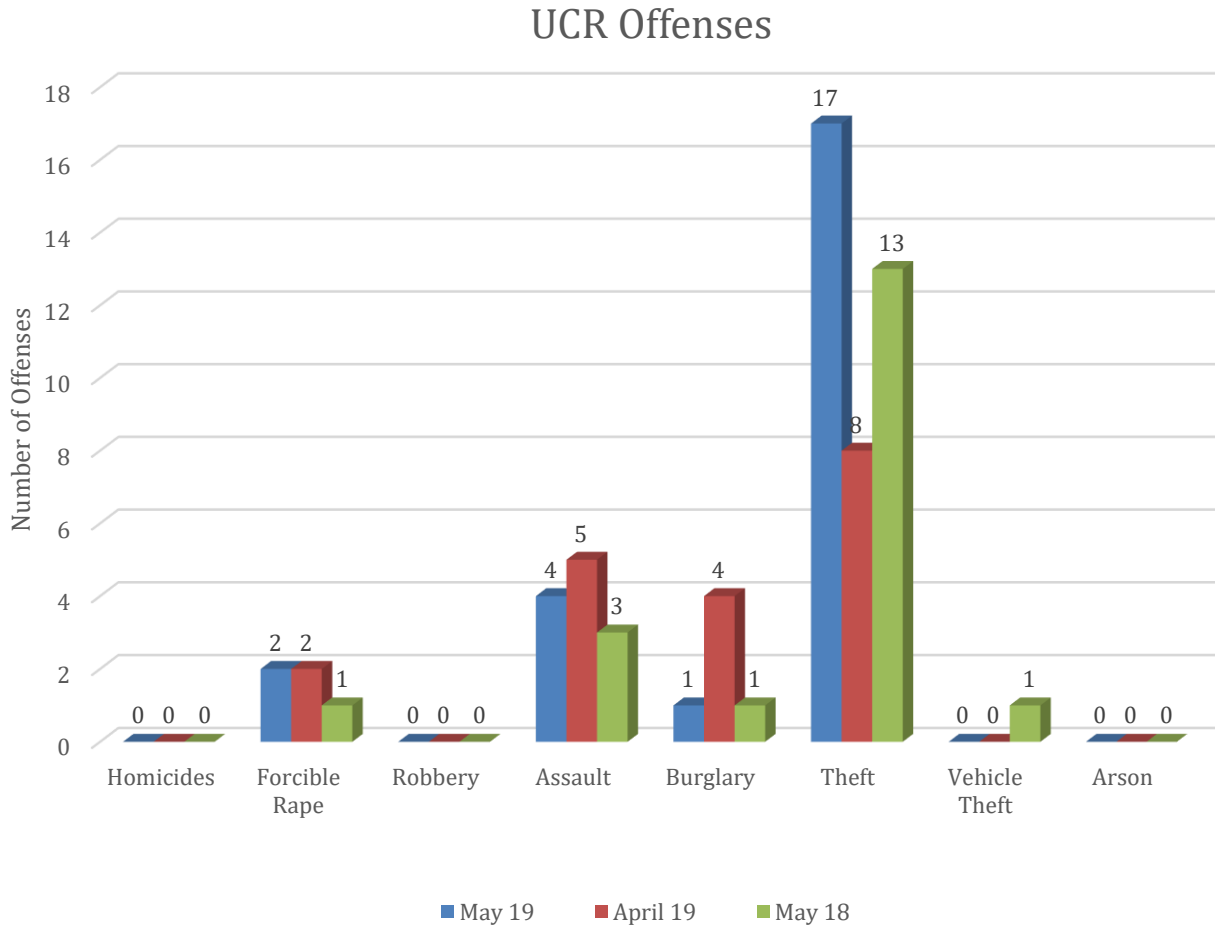

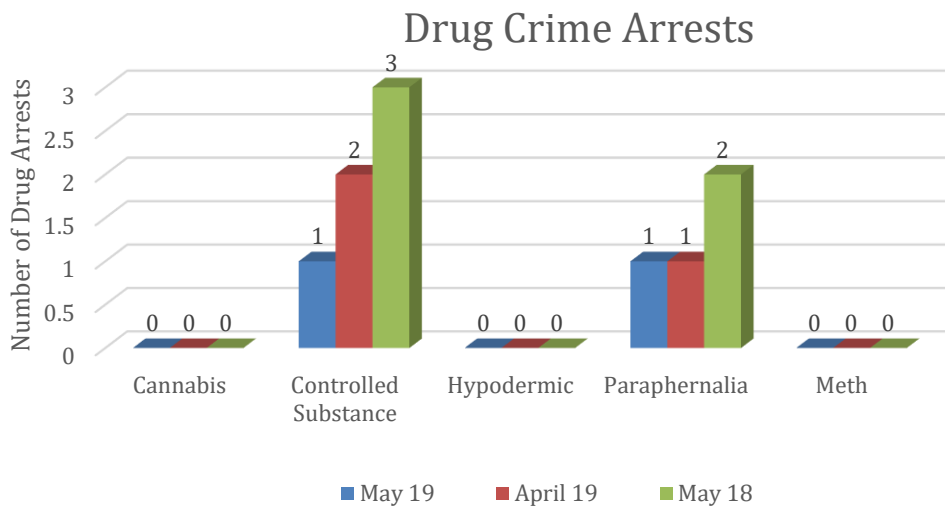
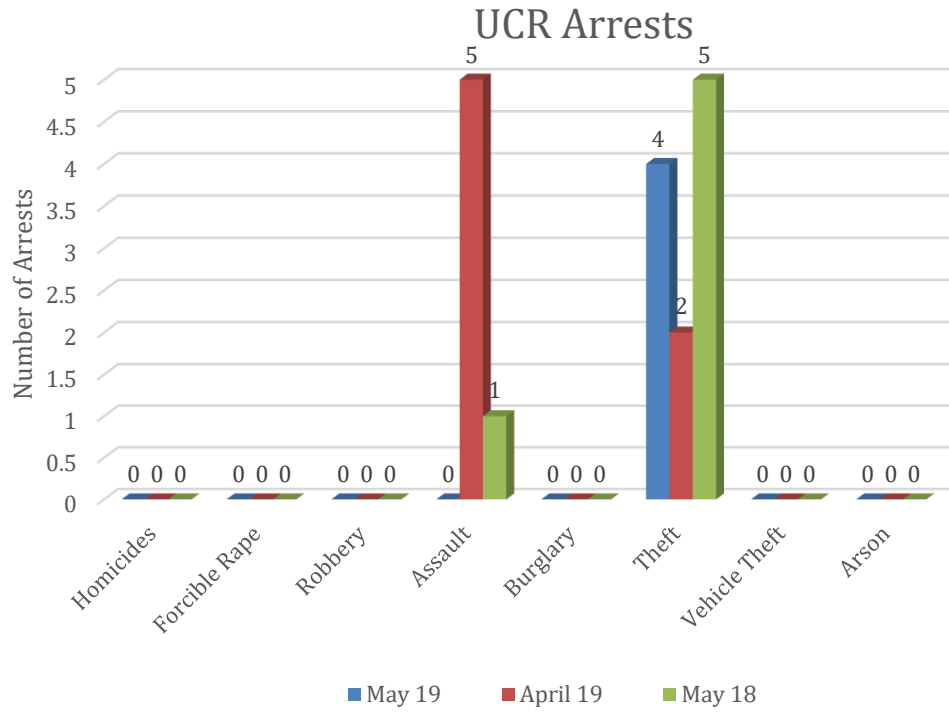
MONTHLY STATISTICS

UCR Report for May 2019





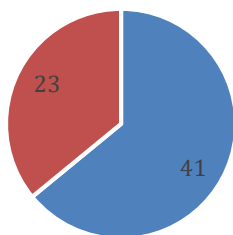

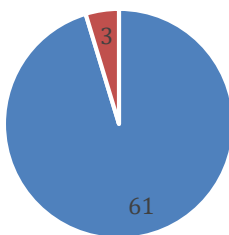

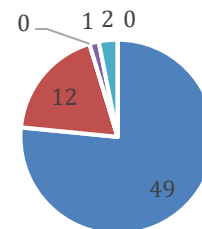

DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 15 active criminal investigations in the month of May. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (3) Investigations were narcotics related. These cases involved the manufacture/delivery of controlled substances and methamphetamines.
- (3) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adult and child victims with offenses of criminal sexual assault, aggravated criminal sexual assault and criminal sexual abuse.
- (6) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These investigations involved aggravated battery, drug induced homicide, domestic battery, and child abuse.
- (3) Investigations were property related. These cases were arson and felony theft.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.
- (9) Search warrants were executed in furtherance of these investigations.

DARE/Community Policing

During the month of May DARE made donations to the Special Olympics and Lincoln Youth wrestling. On May 17th DARE hosted its annual pizza and dance party. Northwest, Washington Monroe, LJHS, Carrol Catholic and Central School were all given DARE T-Shirts. Officer Fruge is working very hard on the upcoming DARE Golf Outing that will take place on June 14th.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 4 deployments for May. The Lincoln Police Department is always using the benefits of our K-9 unit but Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace are being requested by other agencies also. Of the deployments is month, there were 8 search areas with 3 indications. All items seized were drug or drug paraphernalia related.

School Resource

Officer Butterfield handled an array of disciplinary offenses during the month of May. The most common offenses were Harassment/Bully, class misconduct, general disciplinary offenses with parental contacts, social/emotional and theft. Officer Butterfield helped with the Health Department on creating a vape/tobacco and addiction course. Officer Butterfield completed a search and seizure course that will benefit the collection of evidence for offenses.
