

Lincoln Police Department Monthly Report

Report Summary

Social distancing and wearing a mask are critical practices that are essential to help prevent COVID-19 from spreading. The best way to practice social distancing is to avoid public places and to maintain a distance of at least six feet between you and others. In addition, practice frequent handwashing and cleaning of commonly-touched surfaces. If you are sick or have symptoms such as cough, fever and shortness of breath, call your medical provider. Lincoln Police responded to 919 incidents for the month and 99 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 22 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 58 citations and 39 warnings for the month, along with 2 City Ordinance Citation and 1 City Cannabis Ordinance Citation.

Of the 57 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for warrants, domestic battery, criminal damage to property, and driving under the influence. Detectives continued investigations on 19 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit had 9 deployments for the month of July. Out of those deployments, Officer Sullivan and ACE made 3 arrest and had 8 indications. The 11 items seized were drugs and drug paraphernalia.

DARE has been able to provide children with bicycles. Graue Chevrolet has decided to refurbish old bicycles and donate them to children of the community. Officer Fruge is helping out in the distribution aspect.

Our two SRO officers have been patrolling the streets to help their fellow officers with the influx of calls of service and helping the Detectives on follow up for investigations due to COVID-19 and summer break for the schools.

There were 22 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of July.








UCR Offenses





DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on <u>19</u> active criminal investigations in the month of July. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (4) Investigations were narcotics related.
- (6) Investigations involved sexual offenses.
- (4) Investigations involved crimes against persons.
- (5) Investigations were property related.
- (3) Search warrants were executed to further the above investigations.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multijurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

DARE/Community Policing

Chris Graue, from Graue Chevrolet, is working with Officer Christy Fruge with helping the community by having his service department repairing bicycles to give back to children in the community. The mechanics are repairing, replacing parts and painting bicycles that have been donated by people, due to the bicycles being old and/or needing repair. Graue then contacts Officer Fruge to distribute the bicycles to children in the community, with guidance from local teachers and school resource officers.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 9 deployments for the month of July. The deployments resulted in 3 arrest and 8 indications. Of the 8 indications, there were11 items seized being drugs, cannabis, methamphetamines and cocaine, and drug paraphernalia.
