Report Summary

Lincoln Police responded to 885 incidents for the month and 71 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 20 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 66 citations and 49 warnings for the month, along with 9 City Ordinance Citations and 4 City Cannabis Ordinance Citations.

Of the 39 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for driving while suspended/revoked, warrants and domestic battery. Detectives continued investigations on 17 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

Lincoln Police K9 was busy with training the past month. The K9 unit had 4 deployments for the month of January. Out of those deployments, Officer Sullivan and ACE seized 2 items that were both drug related.

We are lucky to have Officer Christy Fruge as our DARE Coordinator. She has gone thru training to be a DARE Program Trainer. She spent 2 weeks in January training other officers to be DARE officers at the DARE Training and Conference in West Virginia. Officer Fruge is not only helping our community but communities everywhere. DARE was able to help support some local Baseball and Softball teams that are getting ready for their Spring Seasons to start. DARE was also able to buy shoes for a child with the Clothing Grant thru International Paper.

The School Resource Officers are continuously working to improve the security at our schools, help with crime prevention and developing relationship with the students.

There were 20 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of January.

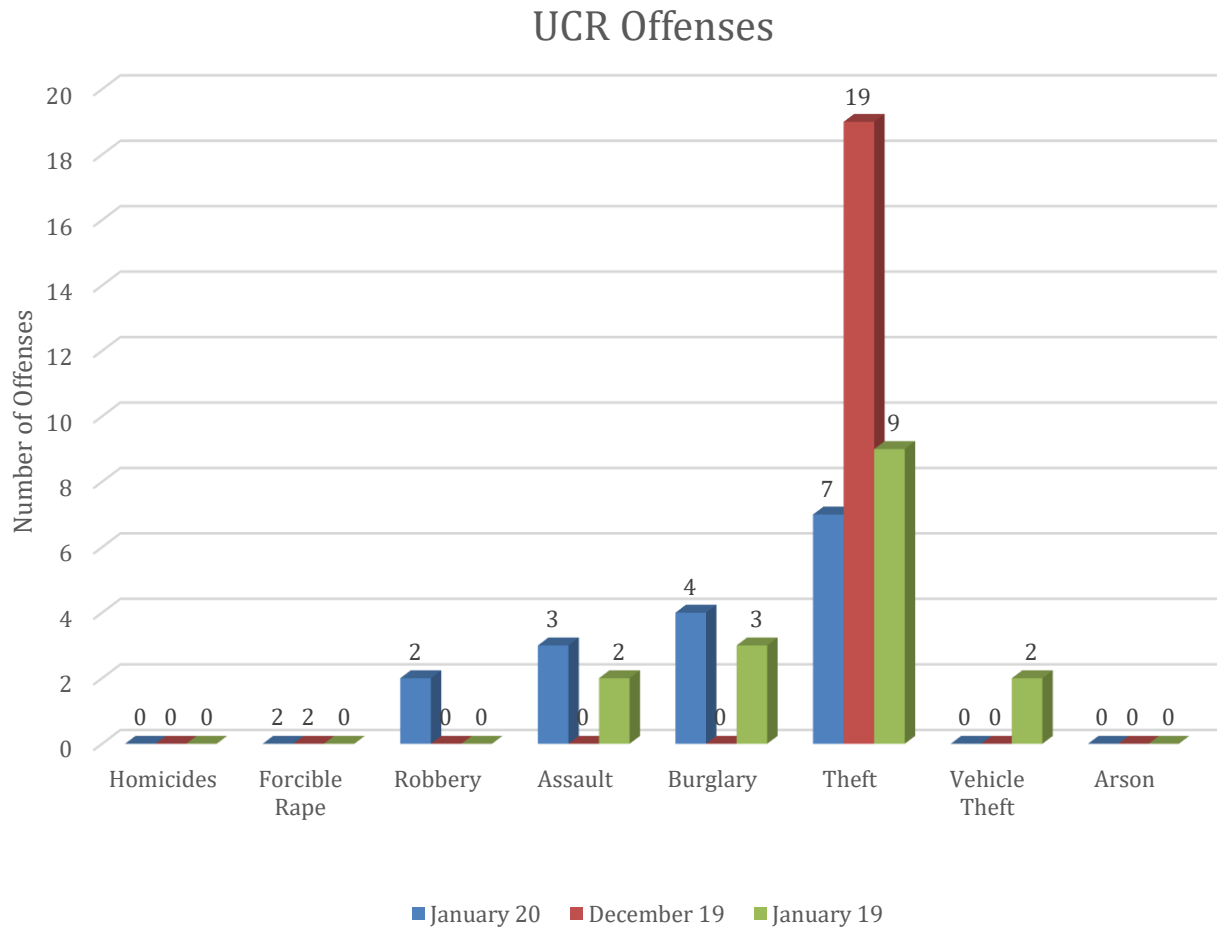

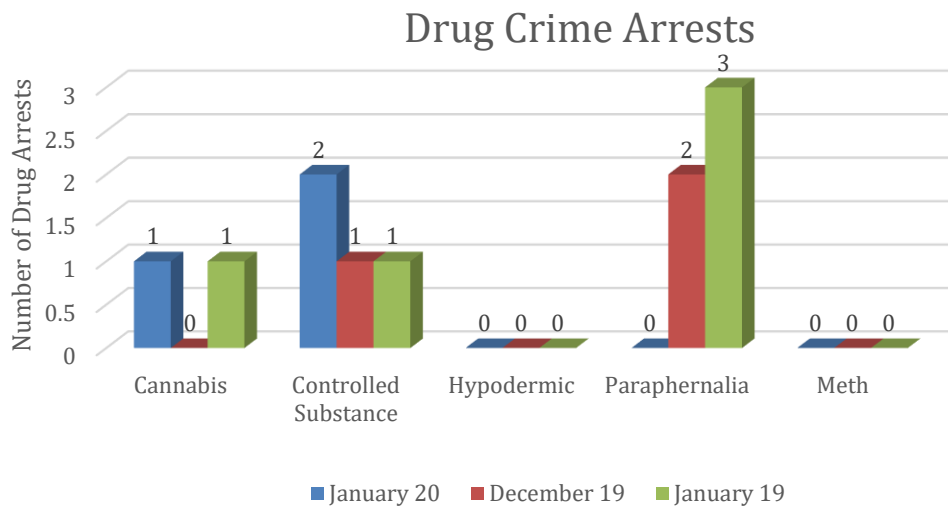
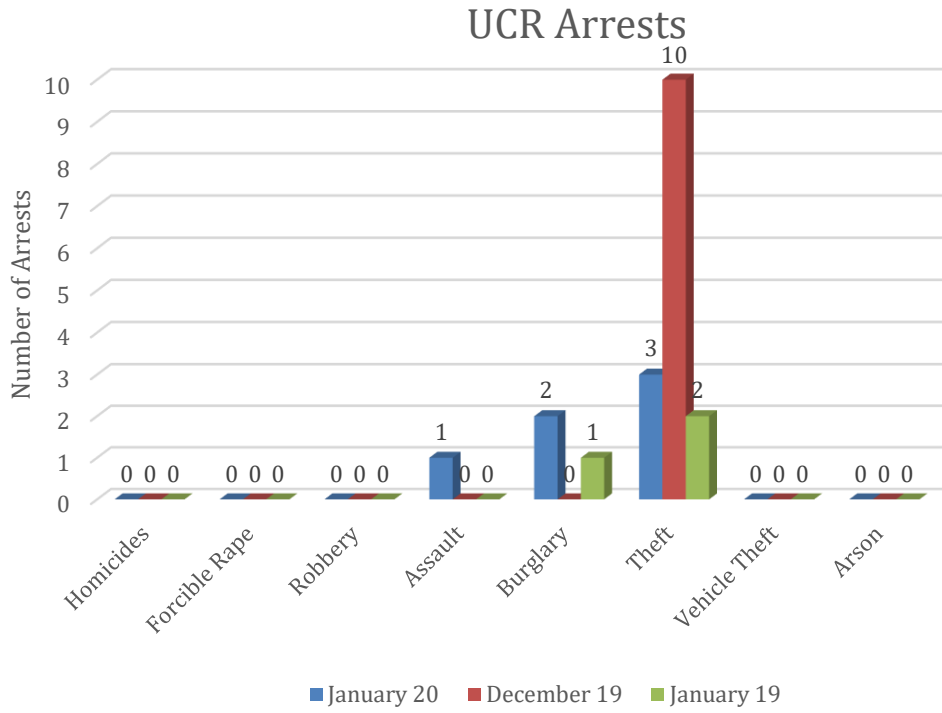
MONTHLY STATISTICS

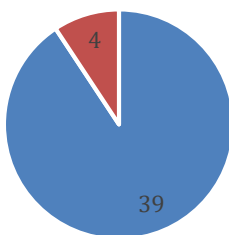

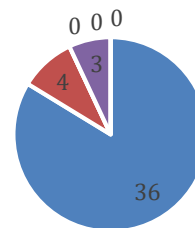

DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 17 active criminal investigations in the month of January. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (4) Investigations were narcotics related.
- (7) Investigations involved sexual offenses. These crimes involved both adult and child victims with offenses of criminal sexual assault, aggravated criminal sexual assault, predatory criminal sexual assault, and criminal sexual abuse, and child pornography.
- (2) Investigations involved crimes against persons. These investigations included robbery and vehicular invasion.
- (2) Investigations were property related. These cases included residential burglary and forgery.
- (2) Miscellaneous investigations which was death investigations and a forfeiture of property.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.
- (4) Search warrants were executed in furtherance of these investigations.

DARE/Community Policing

Officer Fruge spent 2 weeks in Virginia training officers to be DARE Officers. An enhanced curriculum training was hosted by Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) America to instruct D.A.R.E. law enforcement officers on ever-changing challenges.

DARE was able to purchase a pair of shoes for a kid this month with the Grant from International Paper. DARE was also able to support some local Baseball and Softball teams that are getting ready for their Spring Seasons to start.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace have been attending training in January. Ace is constantly perfecting his smelling and tracking skills. The K9 Unit had 4 deployments for the month of January. The deployments resulted in 2 items found and they were drug related.

School Resource for LCHS

Officer Butterfield started off the year on a run. The incidents that Officer Butterfield responded to this month include social/emotional issues, class misconduct, harassment/bullying issues, E-Cig/Vape violations, and general incidents that required parental contact.

School Resource for District #27

Officer Christy Fruge has been going above and beyond for the children of District 27, as it's School Resource Officer. She was gone for the DARE training so the incidents she dealt with are down, but the trust and security she is developing with the children is very beneficial to everyone. The incidents she responded to this month include social/emotional issues, general counseling issues and fighting.
