ILLINI CENTRAL COMMUNITY UNIT SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER 189

Shall Illini Central Community Unit School District Number 189, Mason, Logan and Tazewell Counties, Illinois, be authorized to issue \$4,000,000 general obligation alternate bonds of said School District for the purpose of building and equipping additions to, altering, repairing and equipping District facilities and improving the sites thereof, as provided for by the resolution adopted by the Board of Education of said School District on the 17th day of October, 2019, said bonds being payable from (i) collections distributed to the District from those taxes imposed in The Counties of Mason and Logan, Illinois, pursuant to the County School Facility Occupation Tax Law of the State of Illinois, as amended, and (ii) amounts allocated and paid to the District from the Personal Property Replacement Tax Fund of the State of Illinois pursuant to Section 12 of the State Revenue Sharing Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, or substitute taxes therefore as provided for by the State of Illinois in the future, unless said revenue sources are insufficient to pay said bonds, in which case ad valorem property taxes upon all taxable property in said School District without limitation as to rate or amount are authorized to be extended for such purpose?

LOGAN COUNTY QUESTION

To pay for public facilities purposes (courthouse restoration and repairs), shall The County of Logan, Illinois be authorized to impose an increase on its share of local sales taxes by .50% for a period not to exceed 20 years?
