Report Summary

Social distancing and wearing a mask are critical practices that are essential to help prevent COVID-19 from spreading. The best way to practice social distancing is to avoid public places and to maintain a distance of at least six feet between you and others. In addition, practice frequent handwashing and cleaning of commonly-touched surfaces. If you are sick or have symptoms such as cough, fever and shortness of breath, call your medical provider. Lincoln Police responded to 912 incidents for the month and 95 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 26 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 52 citations and 35 warnings for the month, along with 6 City Ordinance Citation and 2 City Cannabis Ordinance Citation.

Of the 63 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for retail theft, driving while license suspended/revoked, domestic battery, and driving under the influence. Detectives continued investigations on 19 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit had 6 deployments for the month of October. K9 ACE had 5 indications, 3 items seized and 1 arrest. The indicated items seized were drugs, being methamphetamines, and drug paraphernalia.

DARE was able to help support the Youth Hunters Safety Program and the Ryan Williams' Memorial Playground at Washington-Monroe School. DARE has amazing supporters that help our young members of our community.

SRO officers have more responsibilities due to COVID-19 for this school year.

There were 26 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of October.

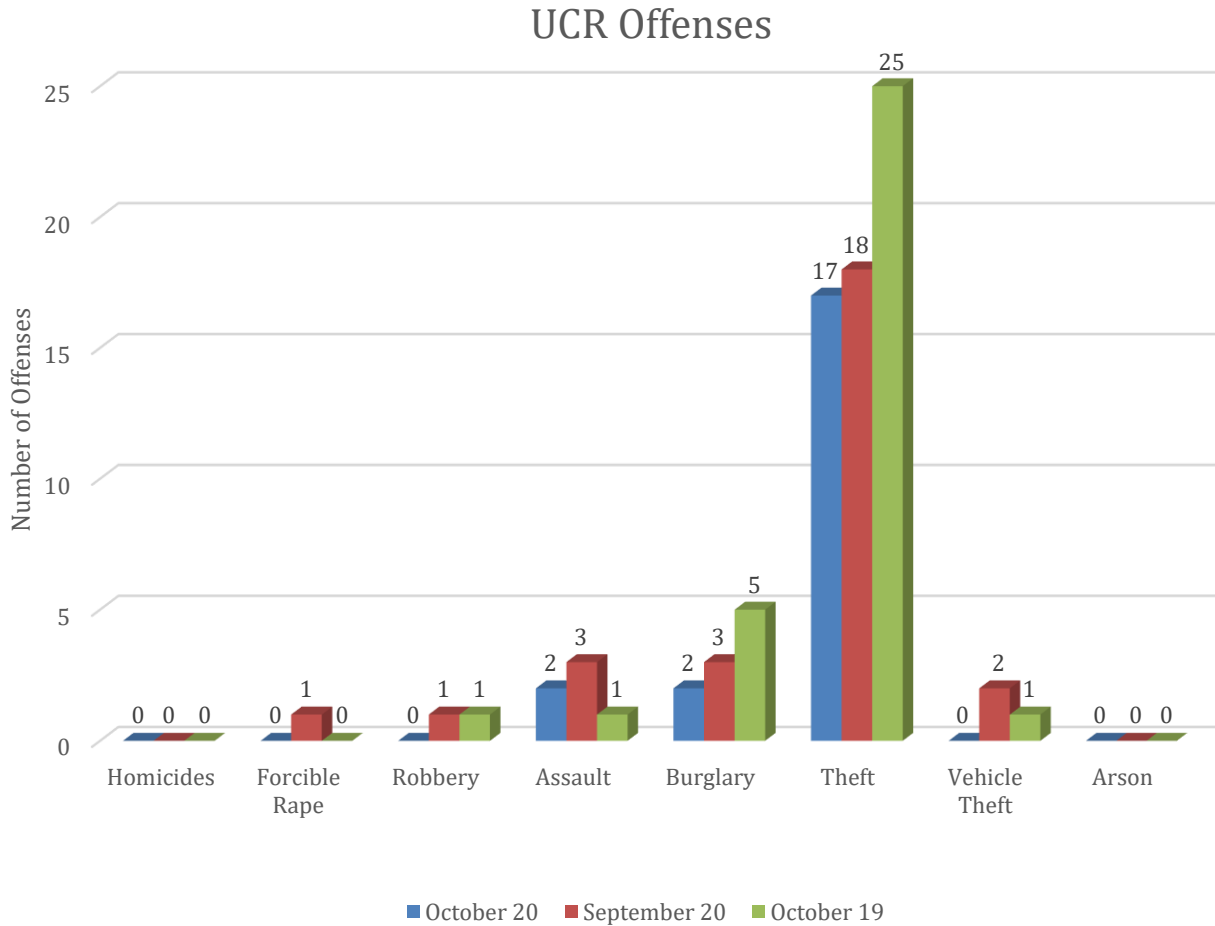

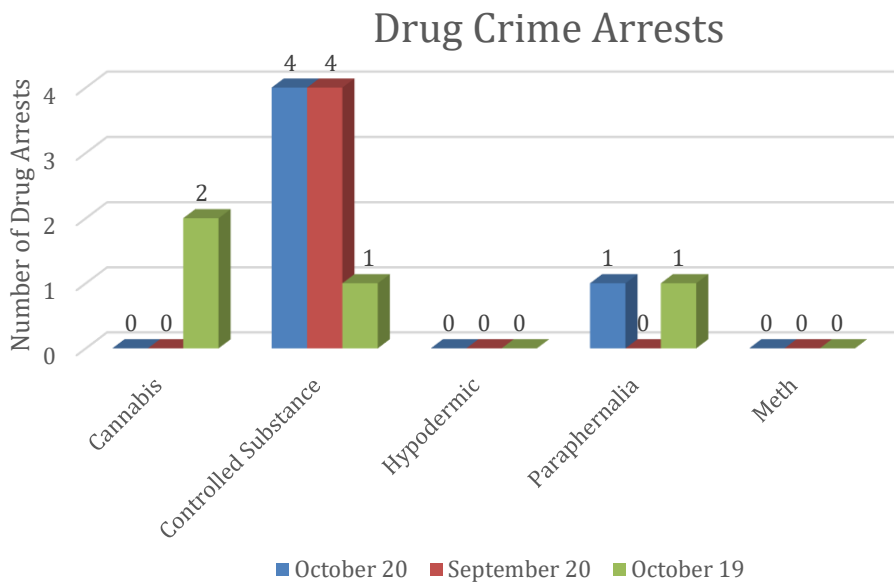
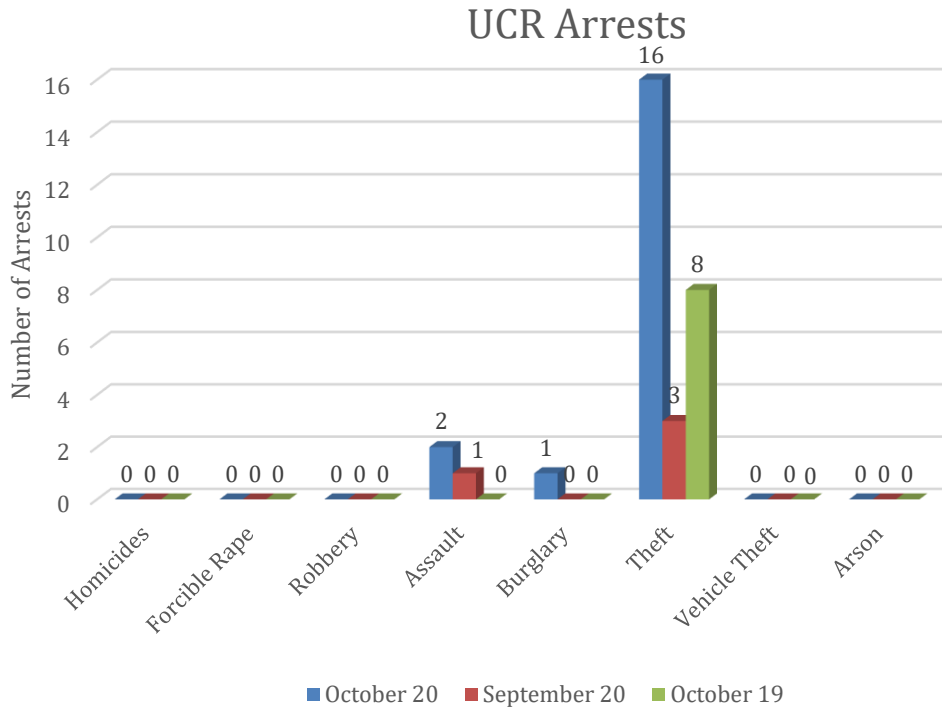
MONTHLY STATISTICS

UCR Report for October 2020





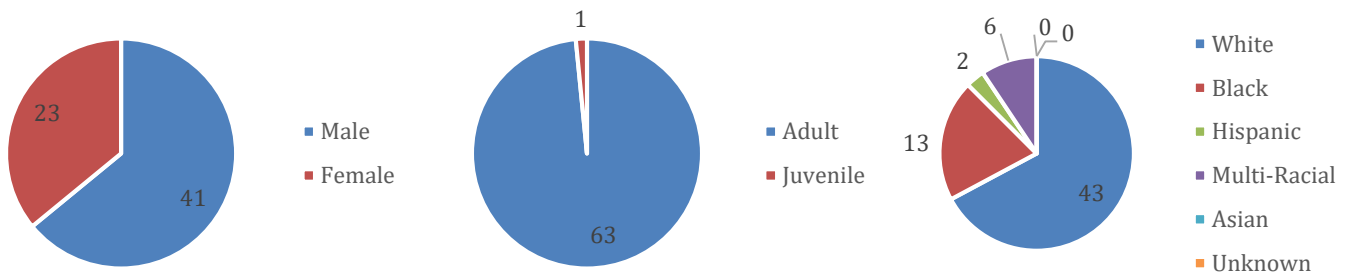

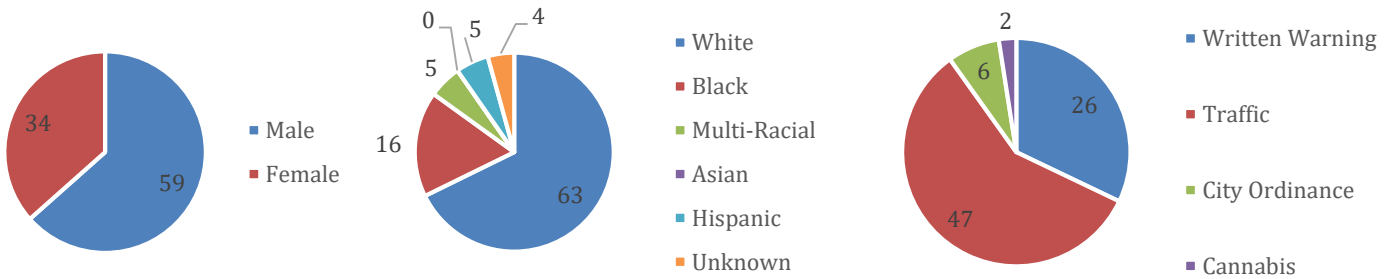

DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 19 active criminal investigations in the month of October. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (6) Search warrants were executed to further the above investigations.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

DARE was able to help support the youth of Lincoln and Logan County with a couple of cookouts this month. DARE sponsored two cookouts, that took place on October 3rd and October 24th, for Hunter Safety Courses. DARE also helped with the Washington-Monroe Gondola Fundraiser for the Ryan Williams Memorial Playground.
