



Background

Law Enforcement throughout the Country is in great demand of qualified applicants for hire. Retention of good employees along with recruitment of new employees is very difficult given the media's negative portrayal of law enforcement. Throughout the Country officers are retiring earlier and not enough young people want to pursue careers to fill the gap creating opportunities nationwide for officers to "lateral" to other agencies with better pay, benefits, and location.

We are also in great demand for diversity in our departments and with such a small diverse population in our own community we have to look outside for applicants.

We are currently accepting lateral applications and the past two lateral testing resulted in only one applicant for each test.

Analysis/Discussion

Nationwide law enforcement agencies are relaxing residency requirements to attract applicants for new police cadets and those that are already experienced officers. Our current 15 miles residency requirement limits the City of Lincoln. Anyone living outside that may have established residence would love to work here, but do not want to move due to a multitude of personal restraints.

In discussion with the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council, Lodge #208, although it would be a benefit for officers to be able to live further away from Lincoln, most would **not** move further away as it will be more of a drive to an already long day. We may see officers move inside or close to Lincoln after being employed due to the longer drive. However we would have some that may move closer to a larger city due to a significant other's commute to a larger city. Nonetheless the FOP has proposed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) that would benefit the City of Lincoln by requiring officers who leave within two years of being hired to reimburse the City of Lincoln for training, non-reusable equipment, and other expenses at a prorated rate over the two years. In response they requested that officers may live anywhere within surrounding counties of Logan County.

Fiscal Impact

Although officers not living in Lincoln, IL, may not be contributing to local sales and property taxes, the City needs a qualified diverse police department which is immeasurable to growing our community and keeping our citizens safe. We are currently understaffed and need to hire an employee immediately with several retirements in the next few years along with those officers already leaving as they pursue better salaries and benefits, which the City is not in a financial position to offer.

The City will save up to \$3000 for officers that do get hired and then "bounce" to another agency within two years, but otherwise this agreement would not affect the current budget.

Recommendation

Approve the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council, Lodge #208, Memorandum of Understanding in regards to Residence and Training Reimbursement.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING entered on this ____day of _____, 2021 by and between the City of Lincoln, Illinois ("the Employer") and the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council ("the Union") or collectively ("Parties") is as follows:

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize the need to expand the Employer's residency requirement in order to appeal to a larger amount of applicants; and

WHEREAS, the Employer also desires a training reimbursement provision be added to the contact; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to commemorate those understandings without making changes to the body of their existing collective bargaining agreement.

THEREFORE, the parties agree:

- 1) <u>Contract to be Amended:</u> This Memorandum of Understanding shall amend the parties' current collective bargaining agreement. Disputes shall be resolved through the grievance procedure of the collective bargaining agreement.
- 2) <u>Amendment</u>: The parties' collective bargaining agreement shall be amended in the following manner:

A) 27.9 Training Reimbursement

- (a) The following shall take effect upon ratification of this MOU and apply to any employee hired thereafter:
- (b) During the first two (2) years after receiving initial training at a police academy, should an Employee leave the employment of the Employer for any reason, other than disability or layoff, the Employee shall repay non-reimbursed monies spent by the Employer for training and non-reusable equipment provided.
- (c) Such reimbursement shall be pro-rated as follows:

Employee leaves within the first six (6)	100% of costs
months after completion of police academy	
Employee leaves between six (6) and twelve	75% of costs
(12) months after completion of police academy	
Employee leaves between twelve (12) and	50% of costs
eighteen (18) months after completion of	\ &
police academy	

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> Employee leaves between eighteen (18) and 25% of costs twenty-four (24) months after completion of police academy

Any and or all the above may be waived by the Chief of Police and Mayor.

Reimbursement shall be provided through a deduction in the applicable employee's final paycheck. Should the reimbursement amount owed be greater than the final paycheck, the remaining amount shall be paid by the applicable employee within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of the final paycheck.

B) 27.6 Residency

Officers shall establish and maintain a primary residence anywhere within the following counties: Logan, Tazewell, Mason, McLean, DeWitt, Macon, Sangamon, or Menard fifteen (15) miles of the corporate limits of the City of Lincoln; verified through mortgage documents, title documents, property tax records or lease agreement. For newly hired officers, the primary residence shall be established within 90 days of completion of their probationary period. Any time extensions of residency requirement must be approved in writing by the Chief of Police or his designee. Regardless of the provisions of this Section, employees shall not be subjected to any residency requirement which is stricter than the requirement in place at the time of their employment, as provided in Illinois statute.

Any sections of the current collective bargaining agreement that are not specified above, 3) shall remain the same.
