Report Summary

Bicycle and Kick Scooter Safety: Children and Adults need to practice safety as they ride. A bicycle and a kick scooter needs to follow the rules of the road just like any other vehicle. This includes riding in the same direction as the flow of traffic and making a complete stop at stop signs. It is always a good idea to wear a helmet.

Lincoln Police responded to 899 incidents for the month and 96 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 27 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 36 citations and 28 warnings for the month along with 1 City Cannabis Ordinance Citations.

Of the 40 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for, driving with suspended/revoked drivers license, warrants, domestic battery, aggravated assault, DUI and methamphetamine possession. Of the 40 arrest, there were 3 incidents were the officers had to use force to gain control of the offender. Detectives continued investigations on 16 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit had 2 deployments this month which resulted in an arrest.

DARE has been very active in training new officers and receiving training for existing officers this month.

The goals of well-founded SRO programs include providing safe learning environments in our community's schools, providing valuable resources to school staff members, fostering positive relationships with youth, developing strategies to resolve problems affecting youth and protecting all students, so that they can reach their fullest potentials.

There were 27 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of June.





MONTHLY STATISTICS

UCR Report for June 2021









DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 16 active criminal investigations in the month of June. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available for release.

- (7) Investigations involved sexual offenses.
- (4) Investigations involved crimes against persons.
- (1) Investigations were property related.
- (4) Investigations were narcotics related.
- Investigators executed 2 search warrants.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

DARE/Community Policing

DARE held an 80 hour DARE Officers Training Course at the Lincoln Police Department. There were 14 officers from various parts of the country that completed the course.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace had 2 deployments for the month of June. The types of deployments were a building search and a tracking. One of the deployments resulted in an arrest.

School Resource for LCHS and District #27
