2021 President's Distinguished Service Award James D. Allison



For the past forty-six years, James D. Allison has embodied this scriptural directive as Professor of Worship Ministry at Lincoln Christian University, lending his powerful God-given voice to the cause of proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ to this generation and generations to come.

Jim's voice was born and bred in Tuscola, Illinois. He entered Lincoln Christian College in August of 1965, studied voice with Marie I. Graham, piano with K. David Hargrove, and travelled extensively to churches and schools throughout the Midwest as a member of LCC's music and drama team, The Restoration Players. In May of 1970, Jim graduated with a Bachelor of Sacred Music degree with a double major in voice and piano.

Four months later, on September 11, 1970, Jim married Glenda Appel, and then entered the United States Army on December 2, serving as Chaplain's Assistant in the Religious Education Unit at Main Post Chapel in Fort Lewis, Washington, attaining the rank of Specialist 5th Class, Acting Sergeant. During his service in Washington Jim continued his voice studies with Florence Orr Klein in Seattle.

After being honorably discharged in June of 1972, Jim returned to the Midwest to pursue a Master's Degree Program at the University of Illinois School of Music, where he studied voice with bass, Mark Elyn, soprano, Frances Crawford, and baritone, Bruce Foote. While there, Jim was selected for special vocal coaching under John Wustman, and studied oratorio under the famed baritone, William Warfield. From 1972-1974 Jim was a performing member of the Illinois Opera Theater, appearing in *The Barber of Seville, Don Giovanni*, and *Amahl and the Night Visitors*.

On July 1, 1975, Jim returned to Lincoln, accepting an offer to teach in the Music Department at his alma mater, moving into C144, the Chapel office he has occupied for the past forty-six years. While at Lincoln, Jim taught several music history courses, spanning every era from the stone age through the 21st century, as well as classes in Hymnology, and Vocal Pedagogy. For a time Jim also sponsored a small traveling drama troupe, and directed several campus plays and musical productions, including *Amahl and the Night Visitors, The Beams Are Creaking, Oklahoma!, The King and I, The Mousetrap, Camelot, Where All Paths Meet*, and *The Music Man*. Jim also assisted many years with Christmas In The Chapel, and co-directed over twenty other campus productions with Tim Searby.

What Jim will be most remembered and revered for are the hundreds and hundreds of private, weekly voice lessons he has given, and at times, endured over the years. Known as the King of the Punsters, Jim has artfully employed his dry sense of humor, patience, and servant's heart to encourage and champion his students' progress. Thanks to his consummate teaching, there are over one hundred of Jim's former students today using their singing voices, serving in leadership roles in churches, public schools, and universities, and as private teachers around the country.

It has been said that a congregation is just as responsible to sing the Gospel as the preachers are to preach it. Thanks to this powerful gift of voice, given to this man of humility and faith, hundreds of students have left this place with the conviction that the greatest story ever told deserves a voice worthy of the task.

For his forty-six years of obedience in the same direction at Lincoln Christian University, we are honored to present the 2021 President's Distinguished Service Award to Worship Ministry Professor Emeritus, James D. Allison.

Bob Hentrich, LCC 1979 President, Lincoln Christian University Alumni Association The origin of academic dress dates back to the 12th and 13th centuries and is one of the most colorful traditions in academic life. In 1895 an Intercollegiate Commission met and adopted a code of academic dress for American colleges and universities. In 1932 the American Council on Education revised the code for academic dress, prescribing color, shape, and texture of the academic costume. The code was further revised in 1959 and 1986.

The cap worn almost universally in academic processions is the Oxford cap, better known as a mortarboard. A different style cap, the Cambridge cap, resembles a large beret. The color of the tassel indicates the level of the degree earned at Lincoln Christian University:

Associate and Bachelor's degrees – scarlet Master's degrees – black Doctoral degrees – gold

The flowing gown dates back to medieval scholars. While it originally may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, today it is symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any dress of rank or social standing. Traditionally, it is black for all degrees, with pointed sleeves for the Bachelor's Degree, long closed sleeves with a slit at the arm for the Master's Degree, and full bell sleeves for the Doctoral Degree. Bachelor's and Master's Degree gowns have no trim. The Doctoral Degree gown is faced with velvet down the front, and with three bars of velvet across the sleeves in the color distinctive of the faculty or discipline that pertains to the degree. Bachelor's Degree gowns are worn closed, while Master's and Doctoral Degree gowns may be worn open or closed.

The satin lining of **the hood** is red to represent LCU. The color of the velvet band around the hood designates the academic degree of the wearer. For Seminary:

MAC – white MRE – light blue MA, MDiv, and DMin – scarlet For Graduate degrees:

Organizational Leadership – beige Bible and Theology and Spiritual Formation – scarlet As each master's graduate of the Seminary descends from the platform after receiving his or her diploma and hood, each is given a **towel**. The "giving of the towel" is not part of traditional academic regalia. The practice began at the Seminary more than 35 years ago at the initiation of Dr. Wayne Shaw, Dean Emeritus. Its roots are in John 13 and the Scriptural incident at the Last Supper when Jesus "wrapped a towel around his waist, poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with a towel..." As Dr. Shaw often said to the graduating seminarians: "This towel signifies that when our students graduate, it is not for arrogance, honor, or prestige, but so that they might go out and wash the feet of the world. This is what we are about."

Each non-Seminary Master's level graduate receives a **bookmark**, etched with the words from 2 Corinthians 10:5 on the back and the LCU Seal on the front, as a reminder that worshipping God is the heart of their education and living their mission in the world. It also reminds them to be a lifelong learner as they journey with Jesus.

As each Doctor of Ministry graduate descends from the platform after receiving his or her diploma and hood, each is given a **basin**. The "giving of the basin" reinforces and complements the symbolism behind the Seminary's towel presentation.

The **Presidential Medallion**, the official seal of the University, is a symbol of the authority vested in the President of the University, and is worn on official occasions. Inspired by the theme, "circling the globe with the Gospel," the Earl C Hargrove Chapel covers the globe and is encircled by arrows to represent all our alumni who have served in the United States and in more than 165 other countries around the world.
